### JAPONCI UVAJAJO TEROR NA FILIPINSKEM OTOČJU

Amerikanci in Filipinci so podvrženi za najmanjše prestopke smrtni kazni.

### SKRAJNO NEUGODNE VESTI Z DALJNEGA VZHODA

WASHINGTON, 23. januarja. — Japonsko poveljstvo je dalo vlado terorja v zavzetih rajih na Filipinih ter odredilo za Amerikance in Filipince smrtno kazen že za take prestopke, kot če se da japonskemu vojaku, ki vpraša za pot, napočiti informacijo, če si da kdo v ravnaku z vojaškimi znaki in pisli, ali če se noče sprejeti vrednega denarja, katerega so uvedli Japonci na Filipinih.

**Avstralija v nevarnosti**

Avstralski premier Francis Deakin je danes na javni konferenci izkrcal na otoku New Britain, ki je pod avstralskim mandatom. To je zdaj že tretja točka v Avstraliji, kjer so se izkrcali Japonci.

Ameriški in angleški letalci večeraj sestrelili 21 japonskih letal izmed 60, ki so napadli Rangoon.

### Delni diplomatični Konferenca SDD, poraz Zedinjenih držav Waterloo Rd.

Snoči se je pričela in končala letna seja delničarjev S. del. Dalo se bo dvorano brezplačno za dve prireditvi v korist Rdečemu križu. Sklenilo se je tudi, da se pošlje resolucijo na gubernerja Brickerja, katero je predložil John Lokar in v kateri se gubernerja poziva, da prične takoj z gradnjo veleceste od Gordon parka do E. 222 St. Lokarjev načrt je zelo važen glede smeri, po kateri bo tekla cesta, ter skuša preprečiti gotov načrt, ki bi škodoval našim ljudem oziroma posestnikom.

Resolucija, ki je bila sprejeta po ameriških republikah, ne zahteva, temveč samo priporočila prekinenja stikov z osiščem.

RIO de JANEIRO, 23. januarja. — Danes je bila na panameriški konferenci sprejeta kompromisna resolucija, ki priporočila, toda ne zahteva prekinenja stikov z Nemčijo, Italijo in Japoncem.

Ta izprememba, ki je bila narajena na ljubo Argentini in republiko Čile, je porušila upanja Zedinjenih držav, da bi vse ameriške republike nemudoma prekinile svoje diplomatske odnose s osiščem.

Sumner Welles, državni podtajnik Zedinjenih držav, je javno priznal, da bi dale Zedinjene države prednost bolj odločni akciji, toda je kljub temu tudi on podpisal resolucijo.

Republika Urugvaj je zelo silila obe državi, naj ne vztrajata pri svoji modifikaciji resolucije ter je izjavila, da bo, kar se nje same tiče, napovedala osišču vojno še preden bo resolucija sprejeta.

### Razne vesti iz Slovenije

WASHINGTON, (JCO) — Iz zanesljivega vira prejeli smo naslednje vesti iz okupirane Slovenije:

Dne 29. septembra 1941 je bil v Ljubljani na ulici izvršen atentat na Johana Notar, uradnika Gestapo. Notar je bil ubit, storilci so pobegnili.

Dne 3. oktobra 1941 je bil v Ljubljani otvorjen Ljubljanski jesenski velesojem. Se pred pričetkom vojne je velesojemska uprava gradila ogromne nove zgradbe in razstavne paviljone, ki žalibog sedaj služijo Italijanom. Dne 7. oktobra ob pol osmih zvečer je v glavni zgradbi pri vходу eksplodirala bomba, ki je porušila vhod in glavno zgradbo.

Na dan otvoritve velesojema so bile po nalogu italijanskih okupatorskih oblasti v vseh izložbah in hišah nalepljene slike kralja Viktorja Emanuela in Mussolinija. Že drugi dan pa je mestna policija odstranila vse te slike s hiš, prav tako pa tudi lastniki lokalov iz svojih izložbenih oken. Zakaj? Vsaka hiša je tu jutro dobila odlobo mestnega poglavarstva, podpisano od magistratnega direktorja, da se morajo te slike takoj odstraniti in to že po želji in zahtevi italijanskih vojaških oblasti. Ta odlok je bil ponarejen, napravil je veliko zmedo, mnogo smeha — toda slike so bile odstranjene in se niso povrnilo.

Bivši ban dr. Marko Natlačen in bivši minister Ivan Pucelj sta odstopila kot člana posvetovalnega odbora ljubljanske province. Ostavki sta motivirala s tem, da so se razmere v tej provinci bistveno poslabšale in da okupatorske oblasti ne drže dane besede in obljube, zato nočejo več nositi nikake odgovornosti.

### "Zviti" Rommel je zopet zavzel Agedabijo v Afriki

Nemški general Rommel je zopet zavzel kraj, iz katerega se je moral pred tedni umakniti.

KAIRO, 23. januarja. — Angleški glavni stan poroča, da so čete osišča z nenadnim sunkom zopet zavzele Agedabijo, ki leži 90 milj od Bengazija.

Sovražna kolona, ki je zavzela Agedabijo, iz katere se je nemški general Rommel nedavno umaknil s svojimi četami tekom silnega peščenega viharja, je bila močno zaščiten po nemških in italijanskih bombnikih in bojnih letalih.

Vojaški komentatorji v Londonu zljaj ugibajo, kaj ima "zviti" Rommel v rokavu, ker je tako nenadoma udaril nazaj na Agadabijo. Sodi se, da so Nemci pozvali mnogo svoje zračne sile iz Rusije, da so mogli zaščiti ž njo svoje kolone v Afriki. Tankov in drugih potrebnih niso mogli dobiti v nobeni znatni množini zaradi uspešne angleške blokade Sredozemskega morja.

### RUSKE ARMADJE SO ODDALJENE ŠE 120 MILJ OD LATVE

MOSKVA, 23. januarja. — Ruske armade na severno-centralni fronti so v svoji gigant-ski ofenzivi prlomastile 120 milj do meje Latvije ter ogrožajo v svojem obkroževalnem pogonu vse nemške pozicije v Beli Rusiji.

### 17,000 Nemcev pobitih

Zaščitene po silnem snežnem metežu, so ruske armade planile na nič sluteče Nemce, katerih so 17,000 pobile in več sto ujele ter v svojem napadu, ki jih je zanesel 65 milj daleč v ozemlje, katerega je držal sovražnik, so zavzele nad 2,000 krajev in vasi.

Ost sovjetskega pogona je dosegla že mesto Holm, ki leži ob reki Lovat, severno od železniške proge, katera teče skozzi Smoljensk, kjer je glavni stan "maršala" Hitlerja.

### Vse nemške zaloge izgubljene

Z objavo, da je bilo 17,000 Nemcev ubitih, je gotovo, da niso mogli Nemci rešiti ničesar od svojih ogromnih zimskih zalog, ki so jih imeli tu nakupičene. Še večje izgube pa pretijo Nemcem, ako bodo mogli Rusi s svojimi svežimi rezervami, ki so jih vrgli na fronto, nadaljevati s svojim presenetljivim prodiranjem.

LONDON, 23. januarja. — Danes se je tukaj obelodanilo zgodbo, kako je letel v velikem angleškem pomorskem letalu, v tako zvanem Catalina letalu, ki je bilo izdelano v Ameriki, poleg posadke letalcev tudi neki angleški pomorski častnik. Letalo je letelo nad morjem, nad katerim je ležala gosta megla. Pomorski kapitan je zamišljeno zrl skozi okno na meglo, nato pa dejal letalskemu poveljniku: "Če bi jaz poveljeval podmornici, bi vozil danes na površini. Pet šilingov stavim z vami, da je pod to meglo na morju kakibsi pomorski častnik."

"Prav!" je rekel letalski poveljnik. "Stava velja!" Pri tem je obrnil nos letala nizdol ter pričel leteti skozi meglo proti morju. In glej: skoro natanko pod letalom je plula po morski površini podmornica csišča, ki se je čutila v gosti megli popolnoma varno. ## PROGRESS OF COMMUNITY INSTITUTION

To thousands of young people not only in the immediate neighborhood but in other sections of Cleveland as well the Slovene National Home on St. Clair and E. 65th Street is familiar primarily as a place where numerous dances are held during the winter season in its spacious auditorium. Hundreds of dance enthusiasts, sublimely ignorant of all things Slovene, know the place well and like it. They like the music, especially the snappy polkas and ingratiating waltzes as played by Slovene dance bands, they like Slovene food, "potica" and "klobase," its atmosphere of informality and friendliness, and having come once they come again and again.

Another group of Clevelanders which is no stranger to our Home on St. Clair are the politicians. Since its opening in 1924, many important political rallies, especially Democratic, have taken place in the Slovene Auditorium. Organized labor also frequently makes use of the hall for mass meetings and social affairs.

Briefly, this institution in the heart of Slovene community on St. Clair has become one of the better known landmarks of the entire East Side of our city.

However, for Cleveland Slovenes, this institution has a special significance because it is the center of their cultural and fraternal activities, in which the American-born generation is taking an increasingly important part. In due time, also the ownership and control of the Home will pass into the hands of sons and daughters of the pioneers, which will happen automatically, since the stock in the corporation is held either by lodges or individual members of the community.

In this connection it may be opportune to point out that, according to the report given at the recent annual stockholders meeting, the total indebtedness of the Home, representing an investment of approximately \$300,000, now amounts to only \$48,000. From this it may be safely concluded that the American-born generation will get the valuable community center free and clear of all indebtedness, when they're called to take place at the helm.

### CHICAGO SLOVENE GIVES Victory Book Campaign in Full Swing

According to "Prosveta," official organ of the Slovene National Benefit Society published in Chicago, the first member of the society to give his life for America in the present war was Lieutenant Frank A. Kobal of the U. S. Air Force, who was killed Dec. 30 with eight other fliers in the wreck of an army Martin B-26 bomber in the San Bernardino Mountains, Calif. His body was found on Jan. 15. Lieut. Kobal was 25 years old and his home was in Clarendon Hills, a Chicago suburb where his parents operate a market and resort. He was a graduate of Wabash College and enlisted in the Air Corps about two years ago.

Besides parents, he leaves his wife, a brother who is in the army, and a sister. His body was brought home for burial at Clarendon Hills Cemetery.

### RANDOM REMARKS

George W. Sanford

By the time this is published Donald M. Nelson may have announced the particulars for the conversion of the automobile industry's entire output to military goods. The competitive companies will be brought together to form a single pool of productive capacity.

In December, 1940, Walter P. Reuther, director of the General Motors division of the C. I. O. United Automobile Workers, was knocking on doors and hammering on desks in Detroit and Washington with a plan for winning the war on Detroit's assembly lines. He got polite pats and angry brushoffs. The idea was as simple as it was dramatic: to pool the facilities of the auto industry for mass defense production, to convert Detroit into an "arsenal of democracy," producing planes in as vast proportions for an age of war as it produced autos for an era of peace.

Under such a system, the task of retooling would be immensely simplified. Buick might put out so many crank shafts, Dodge might be held responsible for so many cylinders, Hudson might make the valves. Each shop would have a final inspection department to see that every part was up to specifications before it went to the assembly plant.

There has been more than a year of delay. The aircraft industry wanted to keep up the price of planes, the automobile manufacturers feared the Reuther plan might interfere with the production of automobiles and feared even more that it might spoil their chance of obtaining new government-financed engine and body plants.

As the Truman report has shown, capital has not always been satisfied with the reasonable profit, even on patriotism. After more than a year's delay, (Continued on page 3)

### Soldiers in Camps Need Books

The soldiers in camps and the sailors in training stations and on vessels are in need of reading during the brief spells from intensive training. Camps, and stations have some books already but when a group of boys really got down to reading the amount of books soon is circulated. With the increased service forces many more books will be needed to supply the demand that already exists. Calls from individuals long before this have been coming to libraries from private individuals who have made offers of books but invariably the offer was rejected and postponed until the proper channels for the work in connection with the collection of books could be arranged.

### Metcalf Local Campaign Chief

The USO and the ALA have now set up the machinery for a national campaign to collect books which citizens wish to give.

Locally Mr. Clarence S. Metcalf is the chief of the campaign for the whole county. Under his direction each library and station has been designated as the center at which books will be accepted and from those points forwarded to the Victory Book Campaign headquarters at 1819 East 13 street. Books may be either brought to the branch library or sent directly to headquarters.

### Bring Books to Norwood Branch

School children and schools are waging local campaigns and the books will be turned over to the branch library or sent to headquarters. Citizens wishing to help in the campaign are invited to bring their books to Norwood Branch Library or if a large number of books are to be sent, the Library will have Boy Scouts pick up the books. See your telephone directory for the telephone number.
