### TRW's Shepard tells of business' new role in serving community

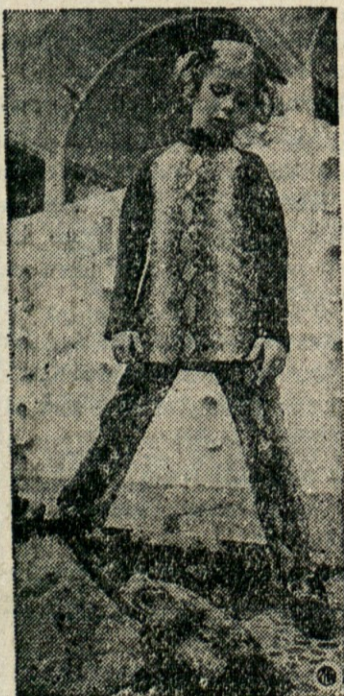

"Therefore, you must enter into social and health activities of the type supported by US to insure good employees and an acceptable tax structure for local businesses," he said.

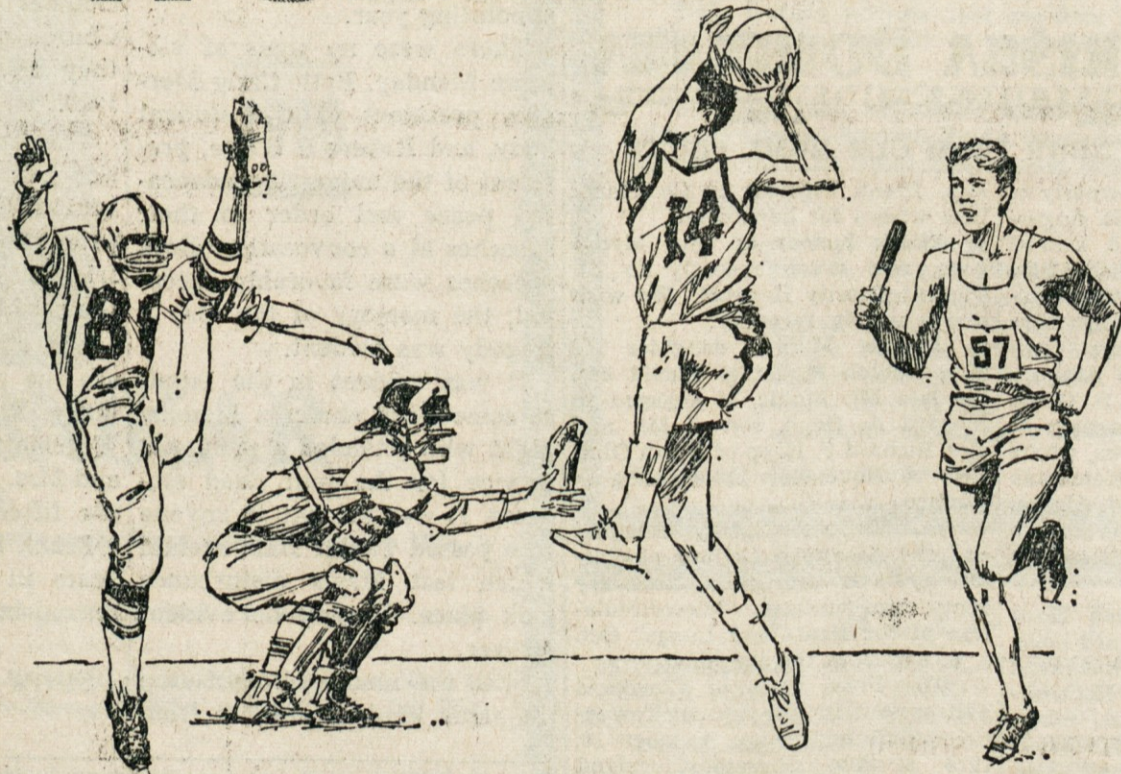

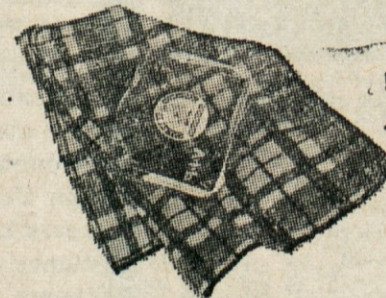
