









# Wallace Replies to Questions Of Yugoslav Newsmen

## No Country so Poorly Understood Here, Says Former Vice-President

NEW YORK, July 17—Anton Smole, correspondent of "Tanjug" (Telegraph Agency New Yugoslavia) and the Yugoslav representative to the United Nations, addressed to Henry A. Wallace, former vice-president of the United States, six questions in regard to various problems of present-day significance.

The questions put to Mr. Wallace and his answers were as follows:

**Question 1. Could you tell us something about the internal situation in the U. S. A.: developments in the political field, and in the field of legislation (primarily labor legislation), the economic field and the cultural field?**

Answer: I shall not answer your first question. You can get that from the daily press. In brief, I may say that the American economy is producing at a very high level, that there are more people engaged in producing peacetime goods than ever before, that the cost of living has gone up about one-third in the past year, and that the big outcry against the high cost of living will probably begin in 1948. Labor, while apparently much aroused against the Taft-Hartley Bill, will not become really aroused until there is a great increase in unemployment.

**Question 2. What is your opinion of the Marshall plan?**

Answer: Answering your second question, I will say that when the Marshall Plan was first announced, I was for it. But I am not for it if it divides the world into two parts. If the primary purpose of the Marshall Plan is to rehabilitate Germany for the primary purpose of fighting Russia, I am against it. No one can tell what the Marshall Plan really is until a definite proposal is put up to Congress. The prospect of large appropriations under the Marshall Plan has, in my opinion, served to delay depression in the United States. If Congress fails to appropriate money for carrying out the Marshall Plan, depression may begin sometime in 1948. Otherwise, it may be delayed until 1950 or 1951.

## Proces v Zagrebu je razkrinkal včerajšnje in današnje sovraznike

Ko sem odhajal kot poročevalec na proces v Zagreb, se mi ni niti sanjalo, da se skriva za imeni Lisak, Šalić, Šimečki itd. kaj več kakor običajno zločinsko početje izkorinjenih ustaško-fašističnih plačancev in pustolovcev. Toda ne samo jaz, tudi angleški, ameriški, francoski in številni drugi tuji novinarji, ki so prišli kot poročevalci svojih listov in mednarodnih poročevalskih agencij na ta proces, so ostrmeli, ko se je v razvojem procesa razgallila pred nami širokopotezna zarota v službi mednarodne reakcije proti svobodi in neodvisnosti jugoslovanskih narodov.

Aretacija zagrebskega nadškofa dr. Alojzija Stepinca je bila sama logična posledica razkritja tega procesa in ni prese-netilo nikogar, ki je pazljivo sledil razpravam.

Križarsko-ustaške tolpe, ki so dale povod za kazensko postopanje, so v bistvu le nezaten zunanji izraz široko razpredene zarote, ki se je pričela kovati že v stari Jugoslaviji in katere glavno središče je bil Vatikan. Z zlorabo vere in cerkvenega aparata so se že trikrat sistematično pripravljali dogodki, ki so sledili in ki bi; če bi se ti načrti uresničili, pomenili konec ne samo nove Jugoslavije, marveč tudi nacionalni pogin vseh jugoslovanskih narodov.

Zagrebski proces je dokazal, da je bilo vse, kar je sledilo po letu 1941, naravna posledica v sistematičnem izvajanju njihovega zarotniškega načrta. Sklicujoč se na svetopisemski izrek, da je vsaka oblast od boga, je zagrebski nadškof takoj izdal pastirsko pismo in pozival vernike k pokorščini fašistični vladni. Njegovemu zgledu so sledili ostali škofje.

Visoki kler se je tesno oklenil fašistične okupatorske oblasti, ker je pričakoval zmago fašizma in računal na to, da bo sedaj mogoče uresničiti stare načrte, to je iztreti ljudi, ki streme za napredkom in za boljšimi življenjskimi pogoji ljudstva, uničiti pravoslavje in ustvariti na Balkanu blok, ki naj bi postal poslušno, sredstvo vatičanske ekspanzijske politike. Tu ni šlo ne za vero ne za interese katoliške cerkve, marveč v prvi vrsti in edino samo za oblast nad ljudstvom.

Jugoslavija je bila Vatikanu že od nekdanj trn v peti. Zato so leta 1941 z navdušenjem pozdravili njen razpad. Paveličeva Neodvisna država Hrvatska naj bi postala jedro nove katoliške države. Krvoločni ustaški režim ni Vatikanu nič motil. Nasprotno, Vatikan je temu režimu nudil vso podporo in pomoč in postal v njegovo službo ves svoj cerkveni aparat. NDH naj bi postala jedro bodoča katoliške podonavske federacije. Zato je bilo treba napraviti NDH čisto katoliško.

Ustaška mržnja proti pravoslavnim Srhom je nadškofu Stepincu to nalogo zelo olajšala. Dobil je proste roke, da pokrsti vse pravoslavne. Kjer se niso hoteli ukloniti Stepincovi volji, so jih ustaši poklali. Tako tudi to po-

krščevanje ni imelo nobene zveze z vero, marveč je bilo izrazito politična akcija za učvrstitev NDH in vatičanskega vpliva.

Ko pa je narodno osvobodilno gibanje v Jugoslaviji zavzemalo vse večji obseg in ko so ti krogi spoznali, da postajajo njihovi načrti neizvedljivi, so si prizadevali dati svoji akciji širši temelj. Zato so poskušali združiti vse reakcionarne sile od Mihajlovičevih četnikov preko ustašev do Rožmanove bele garde v Sloveniji

Z združenimi silami so hoteli ob podpori fašističnih okupatorjev, kakor se je to pokazalo že na Mihajlovičevem procesu v Beogradu in Rupnikovem procesu v Ljubljani, razbiti narodno osvobodilno gibanje in zaustaviti nadaljnje prodiranje "vzhodnega škornja," kakor se izraža nadškof Stepinac v svojem poročilu papežu. Toda volja svobodoljubnega ljudstva je bila močnejša od njihovih peklen-skih načrtov.

Videč, da propada njihov glavni zaveznik, nacistična Nemčija, so tik pred zlomom obrnili jadro in zaplavali v zapadne vode. Po navodilih Vatikan in v dogovoru z ustaško vlado je nadškof Stepinac marca 1945 izdal pastirsko pismo, namenjeno zapadnim zaveznikom, v katerem slika velikansko nevarnost, ki grozi v primeru zmagave svobodoljubnega jugoslovanskega ljudstva ter poudarja nujnost, da se NDH obvaruje kot zanesljiv katoliški branik proti nevarnosti z vzhoda.

Vodilni reakcionarni krogi na zapadu so to pobudo takoj sprejeli in tako se je začela komaj dan po skupni zmagi nad fašizmom sistematična gonja proti novi ne odvisni Jugoslaviji. In prav tisti nadškof, ki je trdil, da jet udi fašistična ustaška oblast od boga, je izdal pastirsko pismo, v katerem hujska vernike proti ljudski oblasti nove Jugoslavije.

Tudi to se ni zgodilo samovoljno, marveč po določenem načrtu. Ti zarotniki se niso mogli pomiriti s tem, da vlada v Jugoslaviji red, da se vsestransko razvija delo za obnovo, da ugled nove Titove Jugoslavije stalno narašča. Hoteli so za vsako ceno izzvati zmedo in nered ter s krvavimi terorističnimi akcijami dati pobudo za tujo oboroženo intervencijo. Ker za to dona niso mogli najti ljudi, so jih pošiljali od zunaj. Drug za drugim so prihajali razni ustaški teroristi preko meje in se oglašali v z a g r e b š k e m nadškofijskem dvorcu, kjer so dobivali pojasnila in navodila, kam naj gredo.

Med tem, ko je Mačkova klika v zunanjem svetu klevetala našo državo, je nadškof dr. Stepinac doma vodil akcijo proti ljudski oblasti in preko Vatikanu pošiljal mednarodni reakciji izmišljena klevetniška poročila o položaju v Jugoslaviji.

Kljub vsem naporom te zarotniške družbe pa so se razmere v Jugoslaviji bolj urejevale. Tedaj so se v mržnji do ljudske oblasti in nove svobodoljubne Jugoslavije zatekli k terorizmu. Pod vodstvom nadškofa dr. Stepin-

ca, so iz vrst katoliških križarjev začeli ustanovljati teroristične tolpe, ki so jim postavljali za poglavarje iz inozemstva poslani izvežbane ustaške teroriste.

Z atentati na vodilne predstavnike ljudske oblasti, požigi in umori, z nasiljem nad našim mirnim prebivalstvom so hoteli izzvati nered in nemire ter tako ustvariti povod za zunanjo oboroženo intervencijo in ponovno okupacijo Jugoslavije, ki naj bi odstranila ljudsko oblast in znova ustoličila staro protiljudsko oblast.

Toda tudi tokrat so delali račun brez krčmarja. Ljudstvo samo je razkrinkalo križarsko-ustaške zločince in njihovi voditelji so se znašli na zatožni klopi ter prejeli zasluženo plačilo. Še važnejše pa je pri tem procesu, da je bila s tem razkrinkana domača in tuja zarotniška družba, ki je skušala z najgršo zlorabo vere in cerkve rovariti proti naši državi. Ta proces je hkrati pokazal, da je bil velik del duhovščine zapeljan po svojem vrhovnem cerkvenem poglavarju.

Odprl pa je brez dvoma oči tudi vsem tistim, ki so doslej slepo verjeli vsaki besedi, ki je prišla iz duhovniških ust, kajti prav iz tega procesa se jasno vidi, da vse hujskanje proti ljudski oblasti nima prav nič skupnega z vero in cerkvi in da pri nas o kakem preganjanju vere in cerkve ni niti govora.

Tudi nadškof dr. Stepinac ni prišel na zatožno klopato, ker je nadškof, marveč zato, ker se je tako strašno pregrešil zoper svoj lastni narod in državo.

Vsi, ki smo prisostvovali temu procesu od začetka do kraja, smo odhajali iz Zagreba s pričrnanjem, da je ta proces mnogo pripomogel k razčiščenju pojmov ter da ni sile na svetu, ki bi mogla še kdaj odstraniti ljudsko oblast. Mednarodna reakcija, ki streže po svobodi in neodvisnosti jugoslovanskih narodov in Titove Jugoslavije, pa je s tem procesom doživela nov hud poraz, ker je bila s tem procesom razkrinkana vsa peklen-ska zarota združene mednarodne reakcije.

who preached the inevitability of war are criminals against the general welfare of the world.

**Question 4. The course of the debate in the Security Council on the Greek question is well-known. One section of the American press published a number of articles stating that the relation of the United States to Greece will only make internal conditions there worse. According to the opinion of Greece's northern neighbors, internal conditions in Greece are the principal cause of all frontier incidents, the principal cause of all obstacles and problems in the mutual relations of the four countries. What is your opinion of this question?**

**Answer:** With regard to your fourth question, I will say that I am no expert on either the internal situation in Greece or the border problems. I do know, as a result of having attended the Institute of Politics of Williams-town, Massachusetts in the decade of the 20's, that the border problems between Greece and her northern neighbors come out of the very distant past and are not solely the result of recent events. To my mind, the all important thing in all of eastern Europe is to produce more goods, both agricultural and industrial. When this is done, many of the causes of friction will disappear.

**Question 5. The American press publishes various items and articles in connection with the so-called future third party of the United States. Could you tell us something about this?**

**Answer:** With regard to your fifth question, I will say that the thing which most of the so-called progressives are interested in doing is making the Democratic Party a truly liberal party. If this fails in 1948, we shall consider a third party.

**Question 6. The relationship of the peoples of Yugoslavia and the United States during the war and the role which Yugoslavia played in the War of Liberation, as well as its role today, are well-known. We feel that certain post-war changes have occurred in the attitude of the United States toward Yugosla-**

via. What do you think of this? What is your opinion of the causes of this change of attitude?

**Answer:** With regard to your sixth question, I will say that probably no country is so completely misunderstood in the United States as Yugoslavia. When I was in Paris in April, I met the French Correspondent of the London Times, a young Englishman by the name of Basil Davidson, who had written a book entitled "Partisan Picture." This book gives such a totally different idea concerning Yugoslavia than the prevailing view in the United States that I thought it ought to be published in the United States. So far, I've been unable to get anyone to publish it. This book not only gives an account of the observations of a non-partisan observer of the heroic efforts of the Yugoslav people during the war, but also indicates the splendid way in which the Yugoslavs are now meeting their current problem. I regret greatly that there is not more friendship between the United States and Yugoslavia. I feel that such friendship would contribute enormously to world peace.

The city will provide the facilities such as concert shells at Edgewater and Gordon Parks, band stands, lighting, etc. The musicians will be paid from the fund allocated to the local by the A. F. of M. from recordings.

The band will be known as the Cleveland Municipal Band and will consist of 40 pieces. Conductors will be the three well-known band leaders, August Caputo, Angelo Vitale, and Al Russo. Present plans call for two concerts per week for a six-week period beginning Sunday evening, July 27, 7:30 p. m. at Brookside Park, and then at Forest Hill, Edgewater, Lincoln, Gordon, Wade, and Woodland Hills Parks. The entire program will give the general public an opportunity to hear the finest music, classical, light opera, and popular airs.

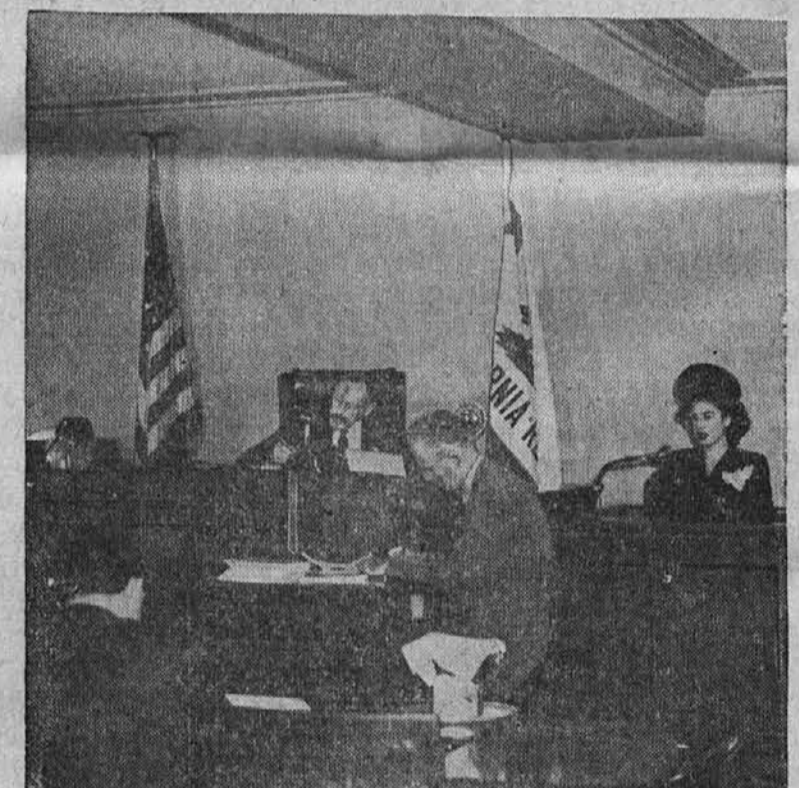
It is expected that the swings will be ready that day. Joe Zalkar, oldest Comrade member will be asked to cut the ribbon after the presentation ceremony.
