Izgleda, da je Peiping s tem, da je odprl začasno vrata v svobodo, dosegel, kar je hotel. — Pomanjkanje hrane je čisto, prav tako tudi nezadovoljstvo lačnih množic.

HONG KONG. — Sedaj, ko se je val beguncev iz rdeče Kitajske ustavil in vlada na prehodnih v Hong Kong je nekaj dni "normalno" stanje, prihaja na dan, kaj je hotela rdeča Kitajska s tem, da je za tri tedne odprla vrata skozi bambusovo zaveso, doseči. Vse kaže, da je vlada v Peipingu s nenavadnim korakom več pridobila kot izgubila.

Na eni strani je svetu jasno pokazala, da trpe kitajske ljudske množice pomanjkanje hrane, ki jo ima posebno svob. svet na pretek. Namesto da bi tega prosila naravnost za pomoč, je pokazala s prstom na potrebo češ, pomagajte, če ste res taki, kot trdite. Na drugi strani se ji je posrečilo prikazati Hong Kong, ki je v rdeči Kitajski na glaslu kot Zahodni Berlin v Vzhodni Nemčiji, "okno svobodnega sveta," kitajskim množicam v slabi luči. Preko 50.000 vrtnjenih beguncev priča proti njemu in njegovim angleškim gospodarjem, čeprav so jih najprej nasitili, pa jih seje nato poglaj nazaj preko meje.

Množice beguncev niso vedele in ne vedo, da v Hong Kongu za nje ni "mogoče dobiti prostora," da je malo ozeblje prenapajeno. Vedo le, da so jih ob prihodu v svobodni svet prijeli in jih peljali nazaj v pomanjkanje.

Pomanjkanje povzročilo padec discipline

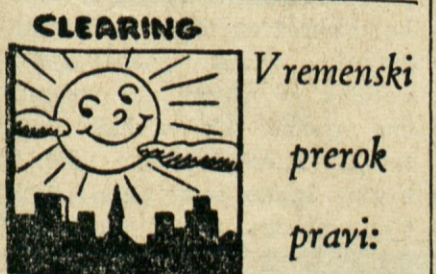

Železniška nesreča v Italiji - 62 mrtvih

Tovorni vlak se je zaletel od zadaj v potniški vlak na progi Milan-Genoa. Vzrok nesreče nepazljivost strojevodje.

VOGHERA, It. — Nagli tovorni vlak, katerega strojevodja je spregledal znak za zaporo proge, se je zaletel od zadaj na tukajšnji postaji v potniški vlak. Ta je bil prav na tem, da zapusti postajo. Tovorni vlak je bil sestavljen iz 12 tovornih voz naloženih s cementom. V potniški vlak se je zaletel z brzino okoli 50 milj.

Ves zadnji del potniškega vlaka je bil zdrobljen in zvit. Po poročilu policije je bilo najmanj 62 oseb mrtvih, okoli 70 pa ranjenih. Strojvodja in njegov pomočnik sta tik pred nesrečo skočila iz stroja in ostala neupoškovana. Najprej sta zbežala s kraja nesreče, pa se nato predala sama oblastem, ki ju bodo verjetno obtožile množičnega uboja zaradi nemarnosti v službi.

Jugoslavanski zunanji minister Popovič prosi za pomoč in dolarje

CLEVELAND, O. — Hruščev je najbrže iz hudobnosti poslal Titu povabilo, naj ga obišče, ravno dan pred obiskom jugoslavanskega zunanjega ministra Popoviča v Washingtonu. V Beogradu so uradno objavili, da je zunanje ministrstvo dobilo povabilo, da pa uradnega odgovora še niso dali. Da bo pozitiven, je jasno, saj je vse skupaj dogovorjena igra.

Ministru Popoviču gotovo ni bilo prijetno, ko je zvedel za to ravno, ko se je pripravljaj na obisk v državno tajništvo. Tam je bil okoli dve uri in pol. Najprej ga je sprejel Ruskov pomočnik Ball, ki dejansko vodi našo politiko v zunanji trgovini in je goreč pristaša Evropske gospodarske skupnosti.

Pri Ballu je imel Popovič najtežje delo. V začetku mu ni bilo težko dokazati, da je jugoslavansko gospodarstvo v grozni zmagati, to vedo v državnem tajništvu brez jugoslavanskih uradnih izjav. Težje mu je pa bilo prodati Ballu jugoslavansko stališče, zakaj je do tega prišlo. Popovič je trdil Ballu, da tega ni kriva samo Jugoslavija, ampak tudi Evropska gospodarska skupnost! TEL AVIV, Izrael. — Včeraj dve minuti pred polnočjo so v Ramleh jetnišnici izven Tel Aviva obesili načističnega morilca Judov Adolfa Eichmanna, potem ko je predsednik Izraela zavrnil prošnjo za pomilostitev. Njegovo truplo so sežgali in pepel raztresli po morju.

Eichmann je do zadnjega zavračal krivdo za množični pomor Judov pod Hitlerjem. Tik pred smrtjo je zatrjeval, da je veroyal v Boga in da veruje sedaj ter da ne bo dolgo, ko se "bomo vsi srečali". Nato je zaklical: "Naj živi Nemčija, Naj živi Argentina, Naj živi Avstrija! To so države, s katerimi sem bil najtesneje povezan in jih naj ne pozabim. Pozdravljaj mojo ženo, moje družino in moje prijatelje. Moral sem se pokazati ukazom vojne in zastave. Jaz sem pripravljen."

Lausche skušal pomoč Indiji znižati za 25%

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Sen. Frank Lausche, demokrat iz države Ohio, je v zunanjepolitičnem odboru Senata predložil znižanje ameriške gospodarske pomoči Indiji za eno četrtino poleg drugega tudi zato, da bi druge države videle, da Amerikanci nimajo radi, če kdo grize roko, ki mu nudi pomoč.

Lauschetov predlog je bil najprej sprejet, nato pa spremenjen v toliko, da bo Indiji odščipnjena le desetina predložene pomoči. V predlog o pomoči je skušal vključiti tudi dolžbo, da morajo države, ki dobijo ameriško pomoč, tudi v Ameriki kupovati potrebščine, ki jih nimajo doma.

Bus v brezno na Filipinih - 30 mrtvih

MANILA, Filip. — Avtobus poln študentov na izletu je zletel z lesenega mostu kakih 800 čevljev globoko v jezerce Alalom slapu. Oblasti so objavile, da je bilo 30 oseb mrtvih, 10 pa ranjenih. Potapljači skušajo spraviti iz vode trupla ponesrečencev.

Delovski delež porastel

Delovski delež narodnega dohodka v Združenih državah je od 50 odstotkov leta 1929 porastel na 67 odstotkov leta 1950.

Da je Popovič dajal samo take odgovore, ki so upravičevali jugoslavansko zunanjo politiko, se razume. Da dokaže svojo nevtralnost, se je menda Popovič skliceval celo na to, da ni hotel obiskati Castra na Kubi, ker se mu zdi, da se je preveč zapletel v moskovske mreže.

Popovič je gotovo nekaj dosegel: Amerika bo še naprej podpirala Jugoslavija, ker je Tito "neodvisen" komunist. Amerika bo pa verjetno mogla zelo malo pomagati Titu s posredovanjem pri Evropski gospodarski skupnosti. Ako jim tam ni dosti celo za Anglijo, kako naj se potem vnamejo za Jugoslavijo?

RUSK OBSODIL SOVJETSKO ZAVLAČEVANJE V ŽENEVI

Državni tajnik Dean Rusk je na tiskovni konferenci obsodil sovjetsko izmikanje v razgovorih o razorožitvi v švicarski Ženevi. Razorožitvena konferenca se je začela sredi marca, pa ni dolej prišla še do nobenega zaključka.

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Na včerajšnji tiskovni konferenci, prvi po enem mesecu, je državni tajnik razpravljaj največ o delu razorožitvene konferenca v švicarski Ženevi, ki se je sestala 15. marca in je sedaj končala svoj prvi del razprav. Pri tem ni dosegla nobenega sklepa kljub vrsti resolucij in predlogov, ki sta jih stavila oba politična tabora, v kateri je svet danes razdeljen. Rusk je obsodil sovjetsko izmikanje od kakršnih koli obveznosti in spreminjanje stališča, kar je bilo posebno očito pri delu za sestavo in odobritev resolucije, ki poziva svet, naj se odpove vojni kot sredstvu za reševanje mednarodnih sporov.

Ameriški in sovjetski zastopnik sta se sporazumela o besedi razorožitvene konferenca. Ko je prišla ta v končno razpravo pred glasovanjem, je sovjetski zastopnik sklepni pti v Moskvi zahteval njeno "dopolnitev" v obliki, ki je demokratskim državam nesprejemljiva, ker je v nasprotju s pravico svobodnega izražanja, svobodne besede in svobodnega tiska.

Konferenca v Ženevi brez zaključkov

Konferenca za razorožitve je končala svoje prvo razdobje, dva in pol meseca, in pripravila poročilo za ZN. Rusk je k poročilu o delu razorožitvene konferenca dejal, da so Združene države razočarane nad negativnim stališčem Sovjetske zveze do zahodnih predlogov. Omenil je posebej sovjetsko odklonitev sodelovanja pri razpravi o dogovoru o končanju preskušanja atomskega orožja, o začetku razorožitve, o oboroženi sili ZN, ki naj bi nadzirala svetovni mir in o končanju hujskanja k vojni.

Predlog Hruščeva zavrnjen

Državni tajnik je v nadaljnjem razgovoru s časniki zavrnil predlog predsednika sovjetske vlade o ustanovitvi skupnega svetovnega trga, v katerem naj bi bile vključene vse države nezviraže se na svojo notranjo politiko in družbeno ureditev.

BLUEPRINT FOR LIFE

Now that vacation time is here, make sure it's carefree and accident-free.

Greater Cleveland's Blueprint for Life safety campaign is making extra efforts during June to remind people of hazards that can ruin a vacation.

The safety council recommends following these suggestions to insure summer fun for all the family:

Use special care in using power tools and ladders when working on home repair projects. Wear hard-toed shoes and keep children and pets at a distance when operating a power lawn mower.

Don't let an overdose of golf, swimming or other sports put you in the hospital. Select clean, uncrowded sites with good sanitary facilities when camping out. Have a member of the family take a Red Cross first aid course to prepare for possible vacation emergencies.

Take a first aid kit on family outings for quick treatment of bites, burns, cuts and tumblers. Use hot-mitts and long handled tools for barbecues, and make sure your camp fire is carefully extinguished after use.

Keep perishable picnic foods like meats and potato salad refrigerated right up until meal time. Be especially watchful of children when vacationing away from home. Strange pets, swimming areas and poisonous plants are standard vacation hazards.

Important Questions and Answers about Sabin Oral Sundays

- Q.—What are "Sabin Oral Sundays?"**
A.—A series of Sundays when Sabin oral polio vaccines will be administered to every man, woman and child in Cuyahoga County, in a voluntary mass immunization program that can wipe poliomyelitis out of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County. May 27 and June 3, 1962 are the first Sundays in this 3-part program.
- Q.—What is Sabin Polio Vaccine?**
A.—A "live" virus vaccine developed by Dr. Albert Sabin and licensed by U.S. Public Health Service. There are three types; each gives lasting protection against a certain kind of polio. Over 283,000,000 people in the world already have received Sabin vaccines; not a single polio case has been reported among them.
- Q.—What types of Sabin vaccine will be administered here?**
A.—All three types. Type I, to be given June 3, protect against the common type of polio. Type III will be given June 24 and July 1; Type II, July 22 and 29. You should take all three for complete protection.
- Q.—How is the Sabin vaccine taken?**
A.—By mouth—3 drops on a tiny sugar cube. Infants over 6 weeks and very young children receive the vaccine by dropper directly in the mouth. It is odorless, colorless, tasteless, causes no side reactions or after-effects, regardless of age, sex or allergy. Even diabetics, pregnant women, mildly sick person can take it safely.
- Q.—Where will the vaccine be available?**
A.—At about 100 locations, mainly schools, between 12 P.M. (noon) and 6 P.M. It is suggested you walk to the location nearest you to avoid traffic congestion.
- Q.—How long will it take to get the vaccine?**
A.—Only a few moments. A simple registration form will be delivered to your home, or can be found in your local newspaper or in various public places. Fill it out and bring it in to your nearest polio prevention center; pick up your sugar cube with the 3 drops of Sabin vaccine or it, pop it into your mouth. That's all! Trained doctors, nurses and pharmacists will staff each location.
- Q.—How much will it cost to get the vaccine?**
A.—Contributions are voluntary. 25c or more is suggested. If you can't pay that amount, the vaccine will be provided free of charge.
- Q.—Can members of my family go on different Sundays?**
A.—Certainly. Go either May 27 or June 3 for Type I vaccine.
- Q.—Can I get Sabin vaccine from my own doctor?**
A.—Of course. But your doctor is co-operating with Sabin Oral Sundays because he knows mass immunization is far more effective than individual treatment.
- Q.—What if I've already had Salk Polio Vaccine injections?**

DEMANDS FOR MORE POWER. President Kenned., by latest count, has made in his 1962 messages to Congress 62 demands for more spending and 25 demands for more Presidential power. This situation brought former President Eisenhower to Washington recently to warn against this trend in government. He cited as particularly dangerous President Kennedy's proposal that the President be given (a) authority to modify income taxes whenever he might choose without coming to Congress for approval, (b) authority to regiment all agriculture, a request for authority, according to the former President, "more sweeping and repressive than any authority ever before sought over any segment of the Nation's economy," and (c) authority to finance, wherever and whenever the President pleases, large-scale emergency public works by using funds dedicated to other purposes by the Congress.

In a statement issued to warn the people and their elected Representatives and Senators about the dangers inherent in the strenuous efforts of the Administration to increase the power of the Executive Branch of the government, former President Eisenhower said, "It has long been my judgment that the real threat to liberty in this Republic will come not from any sudden, calculated assault; rather the threat to our liberties will be primarily found in a steady erosion of self-reliant citizenship, and in excessive power concentration, resulting from the lodging of more and more decisions in an ever-growing Federal bureaucracy." Abraham Lincoln also warned: "At what point then is the approach of danger to be expected? I answer, if it ever reach us, it must spring up amongst us. It cannot come from abroad. If destruction be our lot we must ourselves be its author and finisher."

to become recognized as an individual has had its greatest culmination in America, and that this has been made possible because in every generation and in every emergency the young men of our country have been willing to sacrifice their lives for freedom.

The American Battle Monuments Commission has again reminded me that next of kin of World War II servicemen who died while overseas, may be furnished a colored lithographed aerial photograph of the cemetery in which the serviceman is buried, or where his name is recorded upon the memorial, together with an attached photograph of the grave itself, or of the appropriate part of the engraved list of the mission. It would be my privilege to assist those who have not availed themselves of this fine service of the Commission. The following information is necessary to service requests: name of the serviceman and his service number (if known), and the name, relationship and mailing address of the person making request.

HOUSE OFFICE BUILDINGS GET NAMES

Both the House and the Senate have adopted H. J. Res. 711 to designate the two existing House Office Buildings and the third building now under construction. The Old House Office Building, in which I have my office, will be called the Cannon House Office Building in honor of the late Joseph Cannon of Illinois, Speaker of the House during 1903-08, when the building was being constructed. The New House Office Building will be known as the Longworth House Office Building. It will be named after Nicholas Longworth of Ohio, the Speaker from 1929-31, when the building was constructed. The third House Office Building, slated for occupancy in 1964, will be named after the late Speaker Sam Rayburn of Texas.

These are significant names in the history of Congress, names of men who wielded immense influence, men of strong will and unique character, who left their marks on the country's laws and policies. The appropriateness of this action cannot be challenged.

Special Stamp for Christmas Season

Postmaster General J. Edward Day disclosed in a speech on May 25th in Chicago that a special stamp to be used during the Christmas season, and a new 50-Star Flag stamp will be included in this year's issues, according to Acting Postmaster Nelson E. Sundermeier.

Addressing the Combined Philatelic Exhibition of Chicago and Inc. (COMPEX), Mr. Day promised the Christmas stamp would be available in time for use on greeting cards next Christmas. It will be the first time in United States postal history that such a stamp has been issued.

The Postmaster General advised the COMPEX audience that a 50-Star Flag stamp, as part of a regular series, has been awaiting the outcome of legislation now pending in Congress, which would increase postage rates.

Denominations of both new stamps will hinge on whether the first-class rate is increased to five cents, he noted, adding that he was "confident" that new postal rates will be enacted.

The decision to issue the two new stamps swiftly followed the recommendation of the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee which met in Washington, D.C., May 14. This 12-man committee of fine and graphic arts and philatelic experts serves the Post Office Department in improving both the design and utility of stamps.

Designs or colors of the two new stamps were not disclosed. However, the Postmaster General hinted that the Christmas issue will represent a departure from the norm in stamp art.

"There is an almost irresistible tendency for stamp issues to fall into a pattern," he said. "As our Christmas stamp will illustrate, our efforts in the stamp field are to avoid this kind of stereotyping... we are deliberately seeking opportunities to widen the horizon of stamp art and design. We have tried new color combinations, new approaches to design and, as in our bleed stamps (Arizona Statehood and Century 21) of this year, new production techniques."

In the bleed process, printing extends beyond the conventional borders and in the instance of the Arizona Statehood stamp, it artistically symbolized the vastness of the desert.

Noting that the Post Office Department annually receives nearly 1,000 letters requesting a stamp appropriate to the Christmas season, Mr. Day said the two new issues will be made "in response to heavy public demand."

with a value of \$32,827.03. There were 771,856 first day covers canceled at Seattle, Washington, on April 25, 1962, when the 4-cent Seattle World's Fair stamp was initially released. A total of 1,535,092 stamps was sold with a value of \$61,403.68.

Under the current regulations, Section 145.4 of the Postal Manual, postmasters are prohibited from holding mail to comply with requests for cancellation on a specific date, except in the case of first day and inaugural covers. Collectors should, therefore, refrain from submitting stamped addressed envelopes to postmasters with the request that they be postmarked and dispatched on a certain day.

Placement Tests

A new round of Peace Corps Placement Tests will be given at 3:30 a.m. Saturday, June 9, in Civil Service Commission testing centers throughout the country.

Persons taking the tests will be considered for many new Peace Corps projects in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Peace Corps opportunities abroad cover many fields—teaching, nursing, engineering, plumbing, carpentry, agriculture, medicine, home economics, architecture, city planning, geology, physical education.

Applicants must be American citizens and at least 18 years of age. There is NO upper age limit. Married couples without dependent children may apply, providing both qualify.

Many who take the tests will be applicants who have sent in a Peace Corps questionnaire since the last round of testing. But interested persons who have not yet filled out a questionnaire will also be permitted to take the tests on a "space available" basis at the testing centers.

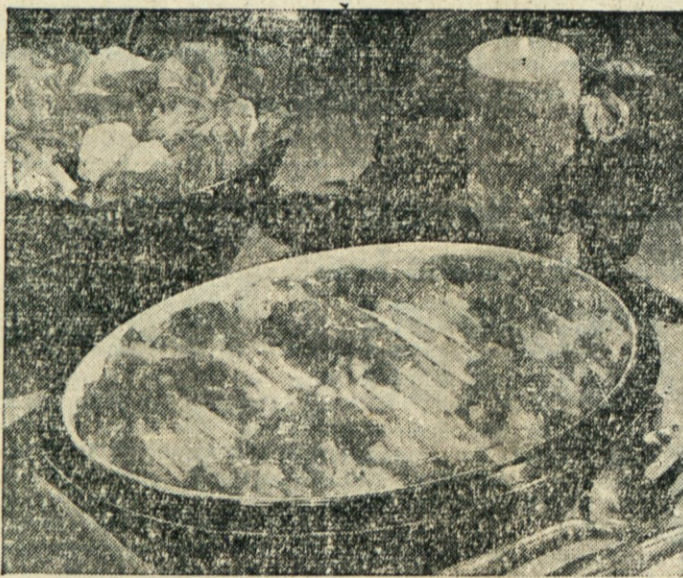
Each person will be given his choice between two types of Placement Tests. One is for men and women who would like to be considered for positions as teachers. For this, a bachelor's degree is generally required, but you do not need to be an accredited teacher.

The other test is for everyone who wants to serve in the Peace Corps. While some projects call for technical skills, many others require men and women without such formal or specialized training. Among these are liberal arts graduates for community development projects and people with general farming backgrounds for agricultural projects.

The test in Cleveland will be held in Room 4244, New Post Office Bldg., W. 3rd and Prospect Ave.

2 eggs, beaten slightly
2 cups shredded Parmesan cheese
Combine first 3 ingredients in saucepan. Scald—do not boil! Add farina in a fine stream, stirring constantly during addition. Cook, stirring, until thickened. Beat in eggs and 1/2 of cheese. Press into greased square pan, 9 x 9 x 2 inches. Chill until firm. Cut when firm into slices 1/2 inch thick. Overlap slices in greased shallow baking dish, 11 1/4 x 7 1/2 x 1 1/4 inches. Dot with remaining butter or margarine and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake in hot oven (425°F) until hot and brown, about 25 minutes. Serve with Spanish sauce. Yield: 6 servings.

Spanish Sauce

3 tablespoons fat
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1/2 cup diced celery
1 1-pound 13-ounce can (3 1/4 cups) or (3 1/2 cups) tomatoes, undrained
1/2 to 1 teaspoon salt
Pepper as desired

Melt fat, add onion, green pepper, and celery. Cook slowly until onion browns. Add remaining ingredients and cook slowly until thickened. Yield: About 2 cups.

Secretary Amends Rulings for Youth Retail Jobs

Washington, D.C. — Secretary of Labor Arthur J. Goldberg has amended Child Labor Regulation No. 3, governing the employment of minors of 14 and 15 outside of school hours.

The amendments, effective June 1, result from a hearing held last September after changes in the Fair Labor Standards Act brought an increased number of retail stores within the scope of the act's child labor provisions.

Jobs that youths of 14 and 15 will be permitted to do in retail establishments outside of school hours include office and clerical work, selling, price marking, packing, bagging, and errand, delivery, and clean-up work.

In food service, they will be permitted to prepare and serve foods and beverages at soda fountains, lunch counters, snack bars, or cafeteria serving counters. They will also be allowed to operate such machines as dishwashers, toasters, dumb-waiters, milkshake blenders, and coffee grinders.

In gasoline service stations, the youths will be permitted to dispense gas and oil, perform courtesy service, and do car washing (by hand), but not to do work involving the use of pits, racks, or lifting apparatus.

Other occupations which will not be permitted are jobs performed in boiler or engine rooms, maintenance or repair of the establishment or equipment, outside window washing, cooking and baking, operating power-driven food slicers or choppers and bakery-type mixers, work in freezers and meat coolers, loading and unloading trucks, and all occupations in warehouses except office and clerical work.

Hazardous occupations orders issued by the Secretary of Labor, which require an 18-year age minimum for certain jobs, continue to apply to employment in retail trade. The amended regulation also retains the hours standards, which prohibit employment after 7 p.m. and limit the number of hours minors 14 and 15 years of age may be employed.

Text of the amendments was published in the May 2 Federal Register. Copies may be obtained soon from the U.S. Department of Labor's Wage and Hour and Public Contracts Divisions.

Birds' Poisoner Sought by Protector

Columbus, O. — A recent incident of placing poisoned grain, presumably to destroy pigeons, brought a stern warning that, when song birds are killed by such operations, the person who caused it is liable to prosecution.

Franklin County Game Protector Walter Evans issued the warning as a follow-up on his investigation of the poisoning of about 100 mourning doves, 65 pigeons, a cardinal (official state bird of Ohio), and some bronze grackles and redwinged blackbirds. Evans received the anonymous tip on Saturday, April 28. When he arrived at the railroad yards in eastern Columbus, he found the above mentioned dead birds and a quantity of grain.

Evans collected samples of the birds and grain which he took to the Reynoldsburg Laboratory of the Ohio Department of Agriculture for analysis. The laboratory report stated that the grain had been treated with strychnine and that the birds had been poisoned by the same material. The game protector contacted

agencies engaged in the control of harmful or destructive animals but was unable to locate anyone who had placed the poison. He is continuing the investigation and would welcome information on the identity of the poisoners. Evans cautioned that this type of control where needed should be done in the winter and only by professional experts.

Evans also pointed out that "these poisoned birds, if eaten by dogs or cats, could poison the pets. Furthermore, the presence of poisoned grain placed where children could get at it, could be fatal. Since this operation was unattended, it was dangerous."

A Crack at Quacks

The duck and his quack are familiar to everyone. Unhappily, the cancer quack is not. He (or she) may be disguised in a doctor's white coat or may hide behind a realistic, although false, title; or behind testimonials from supposedly cured "cancer patients." No one can prove that such patients had cancer when they came to him, or that they haven't died since writing their testimonials for him.

The harm quacks do is not limited to their taking money under false pretenses. Time is a vital factor in cancer, and often means the difference between life and death. The time wasted by a cancer victim on the quack's fanciful gadgets and cures may be the margin that could save him if he spent it under the care of a reputable physician. Some quack treatment is even thought to be a factor in causing cancer to spread more rapidly.

How can quacks be avoided? Dr. J. Glen Smith, Cleveland's Commissioner of Health, and the American Cancer Society offer the following symptoms of "quack behavior." If a "doctor" offers a cancer treatment that he claims is available only from himself—watch out! If his treatment bears his own name, or is offered in the name of his research organization whose other members, if any, are not listed—watch out! If he claims he is being persecuted by the "medical trusts"—watch out! If he says that his "cure" is being sabotaged by the medical profession—watch out! If you are offered a "secret cure" for cancer or other diseases, check with your county medical society.

The only known cures for cancer are surgery, radiation, and chemotherapy. If cancer is detected in its early stages, hope exists for its cure by these methods. Asking your physician to give you a 5-point Cancer Detection Examination every year is the wisest insurance of early cancer detection. In addition, cancer examinations should be given when indicated by any of the seven "danger signals" of cancer. These are: a sore that doesn't heal, a lump or thickening in the breast or elsewhere, unusual bleeding or discharge, change in a wart or mole, persistent indigestion or trouble in swallowing, prolonged hoarseness or cough, and any change in normal bowel or bladder habits.

In 1961, 1,865 Clevelanders died of cancer, making this disease once again the second leading cause of death. If these people had consulted a reputable physician in time,

some of them would be living today.

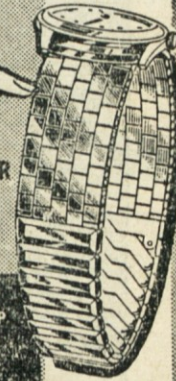

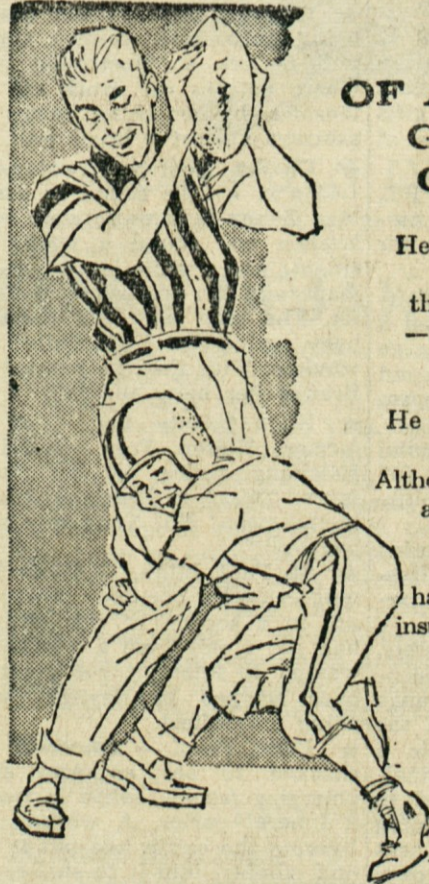
