## ACTIVITY OF CLUB "YUGO-FORWARD" OF DETROIT

In May, 1947, the American Yugoslav youth club "Yugo-Forward" of Detroit, Michigan, initiated a five month campaign to raise \$11,000.00 for the purchase of a Mobile Hospital Unit to be sent to the heroic, needy boys and girls of Yugoslavia. The campaign was projected on a nationwide (U. S.-Canada) basis. More than 200 form-letters of appeal, have been sent to progressive organizations and individuals, youth and seniors, throughout the U. S. and Canada inviting and urging participation. The immediate response was good particularly in Detroit and vicinity.

However, of late the campaign has lagged. We understand how conflict arises from the fact that currently there are many such drives in progress, especially among the senior groups; but, we also know that if each Yugoslav youth in the U. S. and Canada contributed (or collected) just one dollar (\$1.00) our goal and purpose for the drive would be easily achieved, i. e., to send this sorely needed Mobile Hospital to the youth of Yugoslavia, from all the Yugoslav youth in the U. S. and Canada.

It is an empty sounding phrase—to the youth belongs the world—if we fail to assume our responsibilities, all of which

have been borne, through the years, by the older folks.

Let's grab the bull by the horns, so to speak, and unitedly and individually make a concerted effort to achieve our goal before the deadline of September 30, 1947. We have two full months left in which to plan socials—picnics, dances, banquets, concerts, plays, vaudeville shows, card parties, carnivals, weenie roasts, hayrides, etc. Collection lists work well, particularly among non-Slavic friends (Continued on page 6)
