### Taking Stock

For in spite of the present day mass production and relative inventions, the shoemaker must stick also to his waxed thread, his awl, his hammer and pegs as well as to the rest of his necessary equipment that belongs to his business. In like manner our membership cannot afford to overlook any of the needs of its own organization by regarding them with too narrow a vision. And that is the lesson which the present deplorable economic and industrial conditions, showered upon us by the all-wise captains of industry, today more than ever before should have brought home to us all.

The average member in the past, in the boom times, has been inclined to pay light and scant attention to the character and ability of the men chosen to represent him and his lodge members at the conventions and to deal with our organization's affairs which necessarily and in a very real sense are the affairs of every member. If our members are to emulate the

shoemaker who sticks to his last in the proper manner, they must acquaint themselves by an intelligent survey with the true proportions of the all-important task confronting them at the next convention in May. The members and the delegates must tackle the manifold problems with a steadfast devotion to the organization and not deviating from the organization's principles, its constitution, its resolutions and its traditional labor spirit as embodied in the present by-laws.

Our organization is a democratic free-thinking fraternal institution. Its pioneers, in their wisdom, established for its members a carefully devised constitution and principles with a representative form of government. And their succeeding leaders with the help of the members have always strived to modify the by-laws, when necessary, for the best interest of the entire membership. It is sincerely hoped and expected that the new generation now gradually stepping to the front, with about twenty representatives at the next convention, will possess the necessary clear vision of the things they are morally and fraternally obligated to perform.

The young SNPJ world, in taking stock at the close of the four-year term which shall terminate in the most distressing times, should co-operate with the elder progressive element and resolve to give attention loyally henceforth to the many extremely important problems concerning every member—to the promotion of sound, efficient advancement of our organization and for the best interest of its members as a whole, and to strive at all times to preserve its standards.

Chicago.—Last week people the world over were commemorating the 201st birthday of George Washington. A leader, with a handful of people, was able to free a downtrodden country from a tyrannical government. A man with principles and theories so high and farsighted that if today they were carried out, these United States would not be entangled with Europe nor would this country feel the effect of the depression so acutely.

Some thirty years ago a new beneficial order was organized for the purpose of consolidating the Slovene race into one mutual benefit order.
