





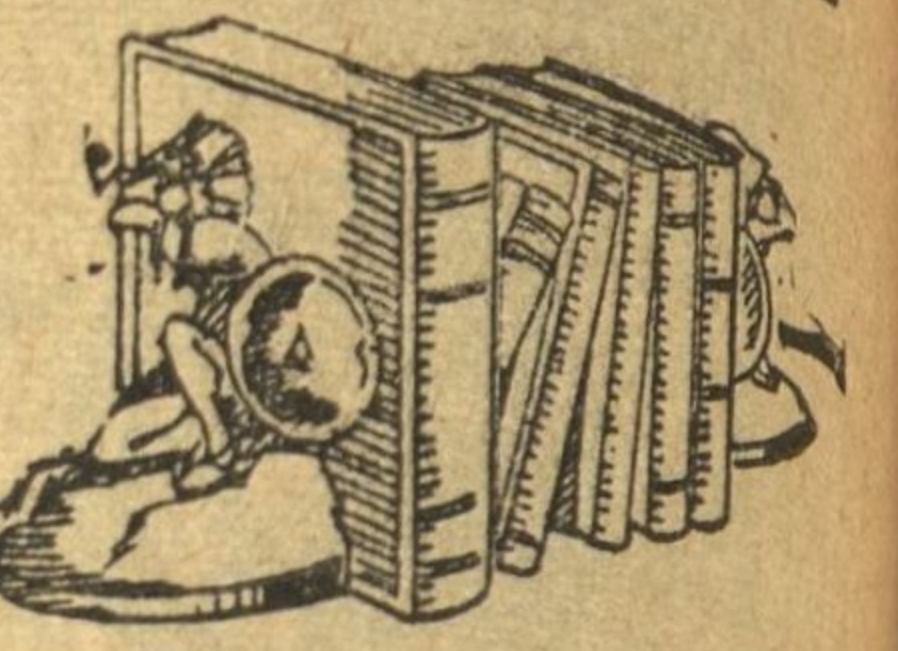

Because the applications are inadequately filled out, the Main Office is experiencing many inconveniences with the applications for admittance of both Departments. Some of the applications fail to mention the plan of certificate that the members desire...

The greatest inconvenience is caused by new candidates, who reconsider their plans of insurance following their admittance to the Society. Usually, when the records of the new members are complete and the certificates ready to be mailed to the Lodges...

Further, the Secretaries are instructed to follow the provisions of the By-Laws by forwarding all Adult and Juvenile applications for membership, including those who transfer from the Juvenile to the Adult Department, TO THE SUPREME MEDICAL EXAMINER AND NOT TO THE MAIN OFFICE.
