### Praznik naše vojske

Tajnik Rozyll misli, da bi nova vojska trajala dvajset let in več — Na praznik naše vojske so vsi voditelji povendarjali potrebo vojsko krepke Evrope.

Washington. — Kakor smo že poročali, je tajnik za državno obrambo odredil, da morajo se oborožene sile Ameriške priznavati isti svoj praznik, kot dan oboroženih sil. S tem hoče tajnik postaviti nov simbol enotnosti v ameriški državni brambi, ki je dobila glas, da je v njej polno nepotrebnih in škodljivih sporov. Ta odredba je prišla ob zaključku "Dneva ameriške vojske," ko je tudi predsednik Truman prisostvoval mogočni vojni paradi. Na dan vojske je govoril kot najkompetentnejši, tajnik za vojsko, Royal. Tudi on je povdaril potrebo enotnosti v celjem obrambenem sistemu Amerike in potrebu, da Amerika pomaga na noge Evropi, da se bo mogla tudisama braniti proti morebitnemu napadalcu. Royal je rekel, da samo oborožena Evropa lahko prepreči napadalca vzhoda, da se napad ne spleča, ker ne more uspeti. Samo oborožena in močna Evropa lahko prepreči vojno, "ki bi vanjo neizgibno bila zapletena tudi Amerika in ki bi trajala gotovo dva dana, če ne še več," je dejal Royal.

S tem sklepom hoče Amerika manifestirati, da ostane še vedno najmočnejša podpornica Zvezne Narodov, čeprav je za svojo varnost in uspeh svoje politike poskrbelo tudi izven Zvezze v pogodbi, ki brani z zdroženimi navedenimi članiki Amerike in Evropo na svetovni polotoku.

### Nič več ne bodo odgovarjali Rusiji

Washington. — State Department je izjavil, da ne bo nič odgovoril na zadnje ruske proteste proti atlantskemu paktu. Stvar je bila dovolj pojanjena za vsakega, ki hoče razumeti. Rusija ponavlja svojo razlag in je nihče ne more vzeti pravice, da to dela, če že hoče.

Kakšen big business je v ozadju te reči? Vsekakor so zagovorniki tega zakona dobili precejšnji udarec s tem pričevanjem.

### O pokojnihinah

O zakonskem načrtu Kongresnika Rankin se je že mnogo pisalo in govorilo. Pa ni nič posebnega v tem zakonu razen tega, da so stroški za izvršitev zakona preračunani na kakih stotin petindvajset bilijonov dolarjev. Kakšen interes je imel nacionalmobil odbor republikanske stranke, da je plačal nagrado posebnemu odvetniku prav za ta zakon, ki je zelo političen.

### Vzroki spora v Bolgariji

Zakaj je voditelj komunistov postal "sovražnik Sovjetske zveze in diktator," ki je delal v "korist zapadne reakcije" — Zapor in preganjanja po celi Bolgariji. WASHINGTON. — General Eisenhower je klical vse šefov stavov v Key West, kjer je radi bolezni na oddihu. Hoče, da se čim prej rešijo vse spori med posameznimi vrstami obrambnih sil. Tajnik za narodno brambo se bo sedaj tudi udeležil.

WASHINGTON. — Predsednik Truman je imenoval Stephen T. Early, bivšega tajnika Bele Hiše za podtajnika državne obrambe. Early je sedaj 60 let star, je služil pod Rooseveltom od leta 1933 do njegove smrti in še par mesecov pod Trumanom.

LAKE SUCCESS. — Sovjetski delegat Malik je že začel napadati zapadne sile radi atlantske obrambe in radi intervencij proti procesom proti cerkevni dostačnikom v državah za železno zaveso. Imenoval je pogodbo "kuliso" za katero se skrivajo napadni načrti Združenih Držav. O kardinalu Mindszenty je rekel, da ni bil samo domač kriminalac, ampak hujšač na novo vojno.

ALBANY. — Gouverner Dewey je razpisal nadomestne volitve za mestno kongresnika, ki je izpraznjen s smrto Sol Bloom, za 17. maja. Pri teh volitvah bo kandidiral mladi Franklin oziroma vozač. Taksa za triletno licence za vožnjo z avtomobili, namesto sedanjih enoletnih dovoljenj. Vsaka nova licence bo po novem zakonu potekla na rojstni dan lastnika, ki je s sestro zgodil.

da je svetnik poljskega poslanštva v Rimu Witold Wiscinsky podal ostavko radi neznošnega terorja v domovini. Isto je storil tajnik bolgarskega poslanštva v Londonu Peter Uvaliev.

da je vseh članov KP v Sloveniji samo 29,959 ali 2% celokupnega prebivalstva.

da beži v Jugoslavijo v zadnjem času mnogo madžarskih in rumunskih protikomunistov - veri, da je Tito po sporu s Stalinom postal demokrat in da je razočaranje teh ljudi v taborišču Vršac vse prej kot majhno.

da se češka smučarska prvakinja Alexandra Nikropoleva noči vrnila iz Švice, ker vladajo doma nemogoče razmere, kot je izjavila časnikarjem zapadnega sveta.

da je nov angleški proračun za vojsko zvišan za 150 milijonov funtov sterlingov.

da čehoslovaške politike ne vodi Gottwald, temveč agent Kominforme in Stalini 100% vdani Geminder. Tako piše v ameriškem časopisu bivši generalni tajnik čehoslovaškega zunanjega ministrstva Arnošt Heidrich, ki je pred časom pobegnil na zapad.

da so v zadnjem času Sovjeti "zpopolnili" poljski oficijski kader s častniki rdeče armade. To velja zlasti za zrakoplovstvo, kjer je vsak četrti oficir Sovjet v poljski letalski uniformi. Nikdar mi ni glede tega odgovorila, jaz pa sem moral plačevati najemnino za "Storage" več kot dve leti. Potem ste bili vi tako dobri da ste spravili omenjeni film. Storage za omenjeni film sem plačeval od februarja 1934 do avgusta 1936, in imel stroškov s prevozom vred, okrog \$70.00. ### CONFLAGRATIONS

During 1948, there were 36 fires which were classed as conflagrations—that is, blazes which did damage of \$1,000,000 or more each.

These first struck many kinds of installations—a gas plant, a huge grocery warehouse, a naval installation, a department store, and so on. Some of them were in big cities. Others were in small towns. Fire is no respecter of size or locality.

The causes of the fires were varied. According to the National Board of Fire Underwriters, "Some of the year's costliest fires could have been brought under control quickly with proper fire protection. Owners of one building which suffered a disastrous fire reportedly had been considering the installation of a sprinkler system since 1911. Another heavy loss resulted when a sprinkler system was discontinued during winter "as an economy move."

Here is more proof of the fact that the human element underlies, in one way or another, most fires. Carelessness, lack of foresight, an inadequate understanding of the causes and prevention of fire—these and related factors account for much of our \$700,000,000 annual waste. And that is usually true whether the fire does a few dollars worth of damage or many thousands.

To the individual, even a relatively small fire may be a "personal conflagration." It may deprive him of his home and his savings. It may put him out of business, or cost him a job. That's why everyone has direct interest in fire prevention.

### Seek Aid for Crippled Children

**LEGION NEWS**

A goal of \$125,000 has been set by the Citizens Committee of the Society for Crippled Children in its 1949 Easter Seal drive. The campaign opened on March 17 and will continue until Easter Sunday, April 17. More than 500 volunteers from 27 communities of Cuyahoga County are helping in the drive to raise funds to carry on health and welfare service for crippled and cardiac children in Greater Cleveland.

In his appeal for public support of the Society, Frederick T. McGuire, Jr., President, pointed out that there are an estimated 7,000 crippled children living in the Cleveland area and that three-fourths of this entire group have been disabled by some cause other than infantile paralysis. The work of the Society for Crippled Children is primarily concerned with youngsters who have become handicapped thru birth injury, accident, or one of the 200 diseases which cripple children.

Mr. McGuire pointed out that 200 babies will be born crippled in Cleveland during 1949, and the task of serving these children and their families represents a major community responsibility. The Society for Crippled Children does not receive any financial help from the Cleveland Community Fund although its program is closely allied with other private and public organizations in the county. The majority of the funds needed for the program of the Society for Crippled Children are raised through the Easter Seal Drive, and in 1948 877 cents of every Easter Seal dollar contributed in Cleveland was used to benefit youngsters in our community. The remaining 123 cents was allocated to further medical research and to carry on educational and personal training programs in Ohio and at the national level.

George Gund, President of the Cleveland Trust Company, is serving as Treasurer for the 1949 Easter campaign with headquarters at 1900 Euclid Ave., Cleveland 15, O.

Washington. — Congress has provided a legalized American spy system — replete with a secret visa quota to enable helpful foreigners to enter this country. Congress provided secret funds for this purpose upon the unanimous recommendation of Members of the Armed Services Committee.

The question of national security is involved. 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
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
