### Delavski zakon bo volilni program prihodnje leto

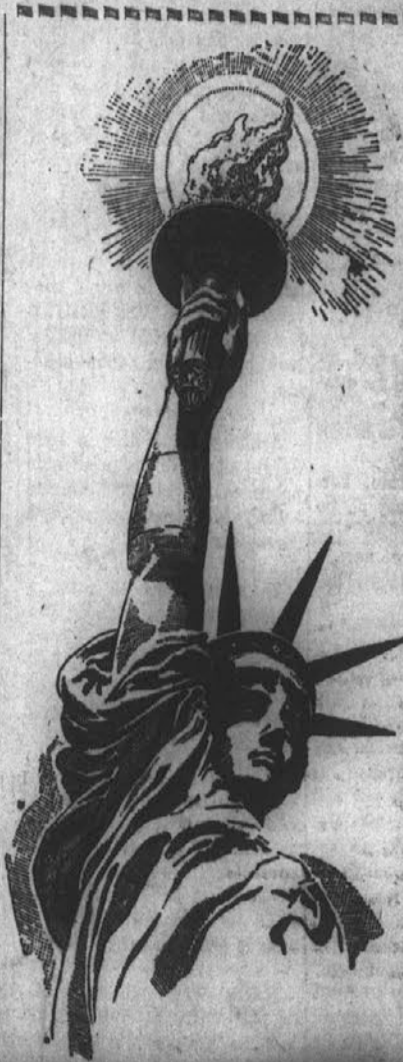
Washington. — Delavske organizacije, posebno CIO in A. F. of L. so napovedale najostrejšje politično nasprotovanje vsem senatorjem, ki sedaj glasujejo proti delavskemu zakonu in odredbam, ki jih federalna vlada zagovarja in predlaga v korist svobode delavskega gibanja. Unije in njihove zveze napovedujejo, da bodo to vprašanje predložile volilcem v prihodnjem letu in jih pozvale, da naj povesel glasujejo proti tem senatorjem, ki so nastopali proti delavskim pravicam. Delavci zahtevajo da predsednik zakon vetira, če bi prišel v sedanji obliki iz kongresa na njegovo mizo v podpis.

### Češki komunisti gnali papeževga zastopnika na policijo

Praga, Češka. — Policija je silo vdrla v avtomobil Mngr. Gennaro Verolina, ki je svetnik in odpravnik poslov papeške nunciature v Pragi. Policija mu je ukazala, da mora voziti na policijsko direkcijo, kljub temu, da se je izkazal z vsemi diplomatskimi papirji. To novo nasilje kaže, da hoče komunistična vlada v Pragi onemogočiti bivanje papeškega zastopstva v Pragi in želi njegovo situacijo tako poslabšati, da bi se diplomatski odnosi med Českoslovaško in Vatikanom prekinili.

### USA ne priznava kitajske komunistične vlade

Washington. — USA ne priznava odredbe komunistične vlade o blokadi kitajskih voda, ki so pod komunistično zasedbo. USA pravi, da komunisti nimajo nikalnih sredstev, da bi blokado izvedli. Za papirnatu odredbo se bo nihče ne zmeni, ker to sploh nikaka priznana vlada ni.

### Višinski o svoji zmagi na pariški konferenci

Moskva, Rusija. — Zunanji minister Višinski je v uradnem listu Pravda pojasnil pariško konferenco kot uspeh sovjetske politike. Pravi, da je on popolnoma zmagal na konferenci. Trdi, da je Marshallov načrt obnovitve Evrope propadel in zato je USA bolj popustljiva. Marshall je moral odstopiti radi slabega uspeha svojega obnovitvenega načrta. Višinski napoveduje, da bo morda treba še kaj medsebojnih koncesij glede potsdamskega sporazuma. Rusija je napravila edin odstop v tem, da je popustila v zahtevah Jugoslavije glede Avstrije. To pa je storila, ker je zvedela, da se je Jugoslavija že leto dni pogajala z Veliko Britanijo v tej stvari.

### Krščanski demokrat sestavlja belgijsko vlado

Bruselj, Belgija. — Na osnovi izida volitev je princ regent Karl prosil zastopnika krščansko socialne stranke, da naj sestavi novo vlado. Pozvan je bil bivši predsednik vlade, znani ekonomist Van Zeeland. Dosedanji predsednik Paul Henry Spaak je odstopil. Končni rezultati so dali krščanskim demokratom še en mandat, skupno 105. Razmerje politične moči je torej: Krščanski demokrati 43.53%, socialisti 29.78% liberali 15.52% in komunisti 7.5%.

Shanghai, Kitajska. — Avijoni kitajske narodne vojske so bombardirali Shanghai. Poročajo, da je bilo 43 mrtvih in 63 ranjenih. Avijoni so očividno obema paroma v novem stanu.

### Razne najnovije svetovne vesti

**ATENE, GRČIJA.** — Vodja liberalne stranke Aleksander Diomedes je sestavil novo grško vlado. V novi vladi bodo isti ministri kakor so bili v dosedanji vladi pokojnega Sophulisa, ki je pred tednom umrl.

**BERLIN, NEMCIJA.** — Vprašanje preskrbovanja Berlina s hrano in drugimi življenjskimi potrebščinami je zopet odprto. Rusi so si zopet prilastili pravico, da kontrolirajo blagovni promet med zapadom in Berlinom in med zapadnim in vzhodnim Berlinom. Ustavili so vse tovorne avtomobile, ki se niso mogli izkazati z ruskim dovoljenjem, da smejo v Berlin, bilo v vzhodno, bilo v zapadne cone. Rusi pravijo, da so prisiljeni na nek način preprečiti, da bi Berlinčani prodajali svo hrano v zapadni Berlin, ker je zapadna marka štirikrat močnejša kot sovjetska.

**PRAGA, ČESKA.** — Komunistične oblasti so začele napadati slovaške škofo češ da so med vojsko sodelovali z nacisti. Napadi na nadškofa Berana so začasno ponehali. Prišlo je do večjih nemirov v Moraviji, kjer so hoteli komunisti aretirati več duhovnikov, pa se je ljudstvo uprlo in protestiralo. Morala je priti oborožena policija, da je z orožjem napravila red in mir.

**WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS, W. VA.** — Vodja premogarjev je odredil naj premogarji delajo med tem ko teko pogajanja za novo pogodbo, do nadaljnjega po tri dni na teden. Prvega julija poteče pogodba z lastniki mehkega premoga. Po dosedanji Lewisovi praksi bi morali rudarji ta dan stopiti v stavko.

**WASHINGTON.** — Finančni odbor senata je izglasoval predlog, da se znižajo nekatere takse na višino kakršne so bile v letu 1942. To so zlasti takse na telefonske račune, na železniške vozne listke, na srebrnino in podobne pol luksuzne stvari.

Nedeljsko pismo

Dragi prijatelj.

Se se spominjaš kako slovesno smo leto za leto v domovini obhajali praznik sv. Petra in Pavla? Kajne, lepo je bilo. Tu, kjer sem jaz, tega praznika ne poznamo.

"Pojdite po vsem svetu in učite vse narode" — to je bila zadnja zapoved našega Odrašenika. Sv. Peter in Pavel pa sta bila prva, ki sta to Kristusovo naročilo tudi v dejanju izvršila.

Peter stoji pred Rimom, tedanjno prestolico sveta. Pogledajte ga, tega preprostega, neukega galilejskega ribiča kakov ves potan in zaprašen stoji na široki Apijski cesti.

Kajnega bova skušala to veliko nalogo izvršiti, kamorkoli naju je Bog postavil? Ali si se morda tej nalogi odpovedal? Poslušaj. Legenda pripoveduje, da je nekoč Peter v Rimu omagal od silnega boja s poganskim svetom, pa je na skrivaj Rim zapustil.

Komaj gre skozi mestna vrata, pa že sreča Kristusa, s križem obloženega. "Kam greš Gospod?" ga Peter vpraša. In Kristus odvrne: "V Rim, da se dam spet križati." Gospod je izginil, Peter pa je razumel Gospodovo besedo, osramočen se je vrnil v Rim, oznanjal spet Kristusa in zanj umrl. Zdi se mi, da je tudi marsikaterega od nas že srečal Kristus na begu z njegovega vinograda. Pa smo se ga izognili. Prijatelj, Peter ti jasno pove, kaj ti je storiti. S prisrčnim pozdravom Tvoj prijatelj.

Poslal sem predsedniku Kongresnega odbora za ne-ameriške aktivnosti, kongresniku John S. Wood-u, odločen protest proti taki insinaciji. Obzor je bil protikomunističen od vsega začetka, že takrat, ko je večina ostalega časopisja še "apizala" Stalina in Tita. Istočasno pošiljam kopijo tega protesta tudi na New York Times in na našega kongresnika Zablockija, s katerim sva tu v Milwaukee vso vojno skupno delovala v raznih protikomunističnih gibanjih in organizacijah ter me osebno pozna že blizu dvajset let.

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## Ob tridesetletnici polovanja iz Rusije v Jugoslavijo

(Jože Grdina)

(Nadaljevanje.) Tisti dan ni potem noben vlak več vozil proti Preserju, razen "vrhničana," ki pa je vozil le do Brezovice, od tam na Vrhniko. Ta vlak je imel odpeljati z ljubljanskega kolodvora ob 7:30 zvečer. Potem grem pa na "vrhničana," se peljem do Brezovice, od tam pa še nad tri ure časa do odhoda vrhniškega vlaka, sem šel na izprehod po Ljubljani, kjer me je vse tako zanimalo, pa sem hotel, da si ob tej priliki še

posebej ogledam Ljubljano v novi Jugoslaviji. Kolikokrat sem se prej sprehaljal po Ljubljani kot vojak; imel sem namreč tako službo, da mi je preostajalo dosti prostega časa. Svoje delo sem kar brž opravil, potem pa po Ljubljani. Tovariš; so bili čisto na vežbah, kar pa meni radi opravkov ni bilo treba, pa sem šel na izprehod, kjer sem srečal marsikatero znanca z dežele, pa celo iz Amerike. Neki dan, ko se sprehajam pred Katoliško tiskarno, srečam Rev. B. J. Ponikvarja, župnika fare sv. Vida v Clevelandu. Takrat namreč še ni bil Monsignor kot je danes. Nisem vedel, da je tudi on v Ljubljani, zato sem mislil, da me oči varajo in da je tisti duhovnik, ki je stal v družbi drugih, le podoben Rev. Ponikvarju. Po vojaško oddam pozdrav in hočem naprej, ko me z druge strani ceste pozdravi Rev. Ponikvar in pravi: "No, kaj pa vi delate tukaj?" Ja, saj je res on, sem si dejal in sva si brž podala roko. V Clevelandu sem namreč bil njegov faran, zato je bilo to snidenje tembolj zanimivo zame. Po krajšem razgovoru pravi Rev. Ponikvar, da gre ta in ta čas nazaj v Ameriko. Jaz grem pa na vojsko, sem dejal, in se potem ne vidimo več. Naročim mu še pozdrave za strica, za sestre in druge znanca v Clevelandu. Potem pravi: Ako imate morda kaj za oddati ali kaj posebnega naročiti za Ameriko, me dobite pri Jezusovemu Srcu; tam sem pri bratu, pa se kaj zglasite. Pri cerkvi Presvetege Srca Jezusovega v Ljubljani je kot misijonar - lazarist služboval Rev. Jakob Ponikvar, ki je brat Monsignora Ponikvarja. Tako je imel tam nekako svoj dom, ko je bil na odhodu v Ameriko. Tako sem se temu povabilu odzval ter naročil po-

zdrave in ne vem kaj še vse za Ameriko, češ, saj Clevelanda itak ne bom več videl. Pa se je zgodilo, da smo spet skupaj, čeprav sem mislil, da se nikoli več ne vidimo. Monsignorju B. J. Ponikvarju pa še danes, lepa hvala za njegovo uslugo. Pa sem spet špansirao po Ljubljani, to pot ne več v lepi vojaški uniformi, kot takrat, pač pa v ruskem vojaškem plašču, kot sem hodil po Rostovu, potem po Budimpešti in Dunaju; spet sem ogledoval Ljubljano in gledal, če srečam kakšnega starega znanca, pa nisem nobenega.

Pot me pripelje do šent-peterske kasarne ali vojašnice. Tja sem nekoč "prijaznik" in tam sem potem odložil svojo civilno obleko ter oblekel vojaško uniformo; tam me je potem tudi dohitela novica: Vojska bo! Avstrija je poslala Srbiji ultimatum; do 6. ure zvečer dne 25. julija 1914 je imel priti odgovor. Ker odgovor za Avstrijo ni bil zadovoljiv, je tri dni nato sledila napoved vojne Srbiji, a nekaj dni pozneje pa Rusiji. Iz te kasarne sem šel potem v Galicijo. V tej kasarni je bil nastanjen prvi bataljon 17. pešpolka. Zopet sem gledal pred seboj to kasarno, ki je bila za časa mobilizacije kakor eno veliko mravljišče. Dne 27. julija leta 1914 je bila pred to kasarno maša naroda, največ fantje in možje, ki so bili kot rezervisti poklicani k vojakom. Velika vrata kasarne so bila kot se je zdelo, vsa premajhna za množico naroda, ki je bila pred kasarno. Fante in možje, ki so prihajali, so spremljali svojci: očete in matere so spremljali svoje sinove, žene svoje možje, sestre in mlajši bratje svoje brate; bili so ginljivi prizori. Tako je imel tam nekako svoj dom, ko je bil na odhodu v Ameriko. Tako sem se temu povabilu odzval ter naročil po-

drugim na bojišče, eni preje, drugi pozneje; skoro vsi so šli. In dosti od teh se jih ni vrnilo več. Marsikateri se je vrnil po-habljen, a nekateri pa so ostali na Ruskem, nekateri pa se vračajo in med temi sem bil jaz, ki sem imel to srečo, da sem zopet gledal to kasarno povsem zdrav. Zdaj je stala ta kasarna tu pred menoj kakor zapuščen; zaman se oziram okrog, da bi videl kak znan obraz; tudi vojakov, kakršni so bili nekdanj, ni bilo. Vojaštvo kakršno je bilo to pot na splošno, se niti po uniformi in ne po dostojanstvu ni moglo meriti z nekdanjim ponosnim avstrijskim vojaštvom. Jaz bi prav za prav moral to pot po vojaških predpisih v kasarno, ker sem bil še vedno pod vojaško oblastjo; toda nisem šel. Najrvo grem domov, se preoblečem, si dam na glavo klobuk, potem pa pridem in se javim: Vrnil sem se. — Mislim, da sem bil do tega koraka popolnoma upravičen, kajti sam sem se prostovoljno odločil tam na Tihem Donu: grem in sam odločam, kdaj grem v kasarno, in nadaljeval sem s svojim izprehodom po Ljubljani. Na tem sprehodu sem prišel mimo cerkve Presv. Srca Jezusovega. Že prej sem omenil, da mi je takrat kot vojaku rekel Msgr. Ponikvar, ko sva se srečala, da če imam kaj za naročiti, da pridem k Jezusovemu Srcu. Pa nisem bil samo takrat. Bog ve, kolikokrat sem bil takrat kot vojak v dotični cerkvi; če sem le čas imel, in tega sem imej kot vojak precej, pa sem šel na obisk k Presv. Srcu Jezusovemu ter bil tam večkrat pri sv. maši. Še zadnjo noč pred odhodom v Galicijo sem šel tja pa sem prosil in se priporočil, da me pošljejo v varstvo, pomoč in srečno vrnitev. Pobudo za to sem dobil

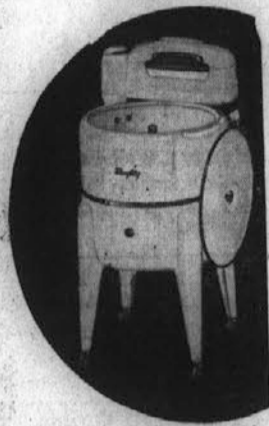
ni se ni zgodilo nič. In potem tja po Rusiji v mrazu in pomankanju, zlasti v tistem gozdu, potem na Donu in pa na težavni poti spet nazaj v Ljubljano: nepoškodovan, tak kot sem odšel. V zaupanju do Presvetege Srca Jezusovega nisem bil varan, pač pa sem prejel od Gospoda veliko nagrado: Zdrav sem prišel nazaj. (Dalje prihodnjič.)

### Program for Slovenian Catholic Day

More than 6,000 persons are expected to attend the first annual Slovenian Catholic Day program to be held Sunday in St. Vitus church and on the grounds at Brae-Burn, 25000 Euclid Ave., Euclid, Ohio, Sunday.

Sponsored by the lay organizations and societies of four Slovenian parishes in the dioceses — St. Vitus, St. Lawrence, St. Mary's Collinwood and St. Christine's — the program has a three-fold objective:

**TO HONOR** the memory and the work of the late Bishop Frederick Baraga, Slovenian missionary to this country on the 100th anniversary of his death. Preaching among Indians and pioneers in the wilds of Michigan, Bishop Baraga founded the diocese of Marquette.

**TO MILITATE** against the Communist-athletic forces which are attempting to destroy the Catholic church in Yugoslavia by the persecution of its priests and hierarchy.

**TO PLAN** a program of Slovenian Catholic action for the year 1950 which has been proclaimed a Holy Year by Pope Pius XII for a worldwide crusade of prayer against the forces of atheism.

The day's program will open with a solemn high mass by Msgr. B. J. Poni-kvar, pastor of St. Vitus church, 6019 Glass Ave., at 10 a. m. The Very Rev. John Kraljic, professor of theology at Quincy College, Quincy, Ill., will preach.

Lunch will be served for the out-of-town delegations coming from Lorain, Barborton, Girard and Madison, at Brae Burn, starting at noon. Refreshments will be served throughout the afternoon.

The business meeting will be called to order at 3 p. m. by Matt F. Intihar, president of the Slovenian Holy Name Union and chairman for Slovenian Catholic Day.

Speakers will include Monsignor Albert J. Murphy, director of diocesan Catholic Charities and the diocesan Resettlement Council; Monsignor Kraljic, and Joseph Basaj, of New York, recently arrived in this country from Yugoslavia where he was former president of the Actio Catholica and president of the Slovenian Catholic Youth Union in Slovenia. He is now working with the National Catholic Welfare Conference in New York.

Ivan Zorman will direct a musical program which will include the as-

ssembled voices of choirs from the four Catholic parishes and their singing societies.

Girls in native Slovenian costumes and members of the Catholic War Veterans in uniform will participate in the program which will include a parade and exhibition by drill teams.

The band of St. Joseph Lodge, KSKJ will give a concert and provide musical accompaniment for the singing program.

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# WASHINGTON REPORT

By SENATOR ROBERT A. TAFT

In these weekly columns I shall try to tell the people of Ohio in the fairest possible way some of the developments in Washington. I shall try to report just what goes on in Congress, and to clarify the issues on controversial subjects.

From time to time I shall also set forth my own philosophy of government and the beliefs which lead me to vote as I do, and to feel an intense indignation when certain other policies are advocated.

What happens in Washington is of vital concern to every resident of Ohio. A fully-informed citizenry is the greatest safeguard we have for the future of our country.

CONGRESS has now been in session almost six months. In the Senate we have passed the public housing and alum clearance bill and the bill for Federal aid to education which goes, for the most part, to the poorer states of the Southeast. I was one of the authors of both these measures. They were both passed by the Senate of the 80th Congress and I have felt that both of them are necessary to give something like equality of opportunity to families, and particularly to children, who do not have the income to provide a minimum decent living.

The Senate has also passed a bill giving Federal aid to States to enable them to make universal the program of examining all children in school once a year and providing standard treatment for defects found. The broader health program is being studied by the two Congressional committees, but because of the wide difference between President Truman's national compulsory medical care plan, and the voluntary State-aid plans, the Administration apparently plans to put off until next year any basic action on health. We may, however, be able to provide some State aid for the extension of local public health units and some aid to personnel.

The Spence bill gives the President power to fix prices, fix wages, ration commodities and put the govern-

ment into business has almost been forgotten by the Democratic leaders themselves. The farm plan proposed by Secretary of Agriculture Brannan has only just been presented in bill form, and seems to have the opposition of the leading farm organizations. The plan to socialize and nationalize medicine has been postponed until 1950. Shortly after the session started, the Labor Committees of both Houses by a strict party vote reported out the bill to repeal the Taft-Hartley law without even permitting the minority members of Congress to offer amendments. The bill was defeated and sent back to the House Labor Committee. The Administration is still trying to pass its bill in the Senate. The civil rights program has gotten nowhere.

In short, it appears that very little progress has been made on the enactment of the Truman program, except on the measures supported by the Republicans. This, in spite of the fact that the President's party controls Congress with a majority of 12 votes in the Senate and 92 in the House of Representatives. Of course a large number of Democrats differ from President Truman on his more radical proposals.

In future weeks I hope to discuss in detail the status of important issues like labor, social security and relief, the Atlantic Pact, agriculture, aid to Europe, civil rights, housing, education, expenditures and taxes and many others.

## Socialism Brings Disillusionment

An article in The Atlantic Monthly observes that socialism has brought a good deal of disillusionment to Britain. The coal mines are an especially apt example. Absenteeism is as frequent and disputes as great as under private management. The slight increase in output per man-shift is attributed to progress that has been made in copying American production methods, rather than any increase in worker morale. The article goes on to say, "Nationalization, to the ordinary miner down in the pit, has always meant that the industry would become his own. Now the miners claim it is not nearly the same thing to discover it is the nation's industry. In fact, they claim that the old private owner was always present to be conferred with—he was not the helpless agent of a remote and soulless board in London."

Can anyone believe that American coal miners would have made such remarkable progress in bettering their lot if we had had a socialized industry? Under private enterprise, the mine union has grown enormously powerful. Management is always present to confer with union heads over wages, working conditions, and any other controversial point. The result is that the average American coal miner earns some \$75 a week, and many earn \$100 and upwards. Living standards in our typical mining towns would seem unbelievable to the British miners.

The Atlantic's article also said, "In Britain today such old-fashioned ideas as enterprise, efficiency, and thrift are at a dangerous discount. The British community has come to put other economic and social ideals a long way ahead of productivity." That always happens when socialist and communist ideologies take over. ## Have Your Fireworks and Eat Them Too

Show in winter and sun in summer usually spell playtime for week ends. Since Fourth of July falls on a Monday this year the holiday will be lasting from Friday night through Monday night. Holiday, that is, for most workers but not for Mom unless the family plans to "eat out."

Chances are that at least one picnic supper will be held in the backyard, on the terrace, or under cover should the day be wet or chilly. How does this menu sound for such a supper, served buffet style?

**Fireworks Fiesta Food**  
Tomato juice cocktail  
Firecracker rolls  
Pinwheel pie  
Potato chips  
Grilled Hamburgers  
Radish Torpedoes  
Punk Sticks  
Watermelon  
Coffee

Here are recipes and helps.

**Tomato Juice Cocktail**  
Chill well flavored tomato juice. Four some of it into the ice cube tray. At serving time add a cube or two to each glass of cold juice. Serve with firecracker rolls. To make these, slice fresh bread. Cut off the crusts. Butter the slices generously. Spread with mustard or horseradish. Roll and hold in shape by inserting a toothpick. Wrap and keep cold. At serving time remove the picks and insert a slender strip of pimiento for fuse.

**Pinwheel Pie**  
Buy the largest round loaf of rye bread you can find. Cut off the bottom crust. Cut two round slices, about 1/4 inch thick. Remove crusts. Butter each slice. Spread a thick layer of deviled ham on the bottom slice. Top with second slice of bread. Spread three bands of colored food on the top slice. First band uses sliced hard cooked egg white mixed with softened cream cheese, horseradish, and chives. Second band is made of sliced hard cooked egg yolk mixed with mayonnaise. Add a little anchovy paste, if desired. Third band is made of chopped cooked beets held together with a suggestion of a gelatin base. Soften 1 teaspoon plain gelatin in 1 tablespoon cold water. Heat 2 tablespoons vinegar with 1 tablespoon beet juice. When boiling pour it over the softened gelatin. Stir to dissolve the gelatin. Add beets. Chill until rather firm, then use as the outside or third band of color. Remove a slice from a peeled hard-cooked egg. Take out the yolk. Fill the opening with washed, perky parsley. Set the egg cup in a hole made at center of top bread slice. Put slices of stuffed olives on white band. Cut narrow strips of pimiento or pickled green peppers and radiate these from the center hole to outer edge of round slice in a pinwheel effect. Place the "pie" in a large platter. Surround with crisp potato chips, the more the better. Years ago Fourth of July torpedoes were in the form of small balls. Small stones and a mild explosive were wrapped in gaily colored tissue paper. When thrown to the sidewalk the torpedo exploded with a bang. Round radishes may be called today's torpedoes. When fireworks are to be set off, the fuses are lighted by applying a slender stick of a slow burning material which used to be called "punk." The carrot sticks can be of the same size, but not the un-bread. Spread three bands of colored food on the top slice. First

disbanded. Miracles of miracles! The reports are hard reading but they do give infinitely valuable information. No wonder letters are pouring in upon the Congress urging the setting in motion of the suggestions contained in these reports!

House Republicans adopted a resolution relative to the Hoover Commission Recommendations pledging support of "all endeavors to obtain prompt consideration" of these recommendations.

Two things come to mind when one reads these reports: (1) the need for long overdue reorganization in the Executive Department of the government and (2) the fact that no move has as yet come from the Executive to make the economies that efficiency of management would bring about. One and one-half billion to be saved in one Department alone just by putting in a modern accounting system! How many more billion could be saved by the same modernization in the eight other Departments?

This isn't "chicken feed" the Commission is talking about, it is dollars by the billion. Have we forgotten what we were told when "billions" first took over? One billion then equalled one dollar for every minute from the birth of

Christ to the present day, and it still does. That's a lot of money!

SUPREME Court rulings are always interesting. One affecting Ohio: A 7-2 decision reaffirmed past decisions that corporations are to be considered "persons" within the meaning of the due process clause of the Constitution. By this ruling the Court threw out an Ohio tax at the request of two corporations.

SECRETARY Brannon's Utopia apparently presents problems even to New Dealers! His predecessor, Senator Anderson of New Mexico, who was expected to help direct the Democratic drive for farm votes, is said to have shied off from commitments. An astute politician, the Senator said he would have "to study the new plan, receive cost estimates and consult farm organizations before endorsing it."

GROUND was broken recently for the much needed new C. S. Gulbenkian Infirmary at the American University of Beirut in Lebanon. Mr. Gulbenkian of Lisbon, Portugal, gave 10,000 pounds sterling for the construction and equipment of this addition to the beautiful University campus.

The head of the Dental Department there, Dr. Don Clawson, is on leave of absence so that he can do a truly superb job at the Meharry Medical, Dental and Nursing College for Negroes in Nashville, Tennessee.

I had the privilege of giving the commencement address at Meharry very recently to a fine group of young men and women at any college could want to graduate. Yes, the intertwining of east and west has wonderful possibilities.

# STRAIGHT FROM WASHINGTON

Washington. — The answer to the financial problems of this nation is not higher taxes but careful and cautious use of the money made available by present taxation.

## JUNIOR

Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr. has now become a Member of Congress. The American people during recent years, cast close to one hundred million votes for Franklin D. Roosevelt. There is magic in that name. Millions of people will be watching with curiosity and interest to see how much of a chip off the old block Franklin D. Jr. really is. He made a sound and forthright campaign for election. He announced support of Administration policies; in fact, he has been in the forefront of the fight for low-cost housing. If he applies the same tremendous energy in the House of Representatives as he did in his campaign to get here, this may indeed be the first rung in the ladder of his political progress.

The House of Representatives is an intellectual and political arena in which men struggle to the utmost for their political traditions and convictions, for their constituents and for the welfare of their nation. The Member who gets along has to fight for it. He who forges to the front wins and wears the agomen of a strong and able man. Young Roosevelt not only is endowed with a magic name but he is persuable, well educated, has a superb war record and apparently is endowed with real ability and great energy. If he can take it as well as hand it out, his is a promising future.

REPUBLICANS TO GAIN IN SOUTH Progressive liberal Northern Democrats in Congress who have created TVA by their votes have moved the south forward at great strides, industrially and financially. Notwithstanding his Southern Democrats frequently defeat progressive legislation. For example, a coalition in the House of

Representatives between the Republican members of the important Rules Committee, with the three Dixiecrat members blocked for several weeks reporting out the Administration Housing Bill. This important and needed legislation was about to be brought up for consideration by petition because of delay caused by this combination when two Dixiecrats and one Republican on the Rules Committee changed their votes.

Perhaps adoption of the proposed Constitutional Amendment providing that the electoral vote for President and Vice President be counted in proportion to the popular vote will eventually break down the Court House rings running politics south of the Mason-Dixon Line. As matters now stand, the only contests in the South are at the Democratic Primary. Under the proposed Constitutional Amendment, the electoral vote of every State would be according to the percentage of popular vote. Therefore, minority voters in so-called "sure" states who might not bother to vote at all would have an incentive to work and vote for their candidates because their work and votes might actually affect the results.

Last November President Truman carried Ohio by a small margin, yet he received all of our State's electoral votes. The proposed amendment, sponsored by Senator Lodge, has been recommended for adoption by both House and Senate Committees. The amendment, if approved by Congress and ratified by three-fourths of the states, would abolish the Electoral College as such but each state would continue to have as many electoral votes as it has Members of Congress.

## GOOD HEALTH, A NATION'S PROBLEM

The question of adopting a nationwide health program will be debated in Congress later this year or next January. The object of the Administration's health program is two-fold: (1) to make available enough medical services to go around and (2) to see that everybody has a chance to obtain medical care at reasonable cost. American medical science provides the best medical care in the world. European nations are many years behind us. It is contended that this service is now provided for anyone who can spend unlimited funds for treatment and for

charity patients who can spend nothing whatever but that millions of families in the small income group go longed illness. Without a doubt, it would be beneficial to all ever your

Government to provide more medical training facilities and try to have trained medical men and clinics available, everywhere in our country. Public health facilities and scientific research should be expanded. Preventive medical care should be encouraged. Increased Federal aid for hospital construction should be provided. A program of this sort could be enacted without making doctors employees of the Federal government. The main purpose of the Administration public health program is to bring medical care within reach of all. A nationwide system of prepaid medical care is likely to be considered next year.
