italijanske čete tepeni v Afriki

Angleški letalci bom-
bardirali Sardinijo
GRKI ZASEDLI NA-
DALJNE POZICIJE

Kairo, Egipt, 4. februar. — Angleški čete in motorne kolone prodrijo naprej proti Bengaziju, dokaj letalci mječejo bombe na bliskih mest ob obrežju. Angleški so odločili za zlom italijanskega odpora na vseh afriških frontah, preden nastane deveta doba. V včerajšnjih navadah na italijanske pozicije so Angleški vrgli na stotine bomb. Tar- bombardiranje je bil poleg drugih mest tudi Tripoli. Italijanska vojaška letalica in drugi militarični objekti so bili tudi napadeni.

Kairo, Egipt, 4. februar. — Angleška oborožena sila je zabilo zadnjo v italijansko Eritrejo, potem poveljstvo te sil. Na treh drugih afriških frontah so bili Italijani tepeji in se po bitkah, katerih so utrpieli velike izgube, umaknili. Angleška sila na opnom in v zraku jim je zadala več udarcev.

Angleži so včeraj okupirali Bar- rento, mesto v severnem delu Eritreje. Italijani so pobegnili v keni, ki leži v notranjosti Eritreje in 50 milij severozapadno od Asmara, glavnega mesta, proti kateremu zdaj prodrijo angleške čete.

Z okupacijo Agordata, važne težnikega križišča v Eritreji, so Angleži dobili kontrole nad cestami, ki vodijo proti zahodu, severu, zapadu in jugu. Druge angleške kolone so oddane le okrog 60 milij od Massauja, italijanske luke ob Rdečem morju.

Druge angleške kolone so prodrijele deset milij daleč v Abesinejo in kolonijo Kenje ter okupirale dve italijanski vojaški postopek pri Dukani. Italijani bežejo v Gondaru in angleške čete so jih na petam.

Glavni stan v Nairobi poroča, da angleške čete operirajo tudi v italijanski Somaliji. Doslej niso nikjer naleteli na odločen odpor s strani fašistov. V včerajšnjih bitki pri jezeru Rudolfu, Abisiniji, so Angleži ujeli 43 italijanskih vojakov in dva častnika.

London, 4. februar. — Tu je bilo napovedano, da so angleški letalci bombardirali Sardinijo z bombardiralkami, ki so porušile več skladilskov in muničij ter drugih vojaških objektov. Samo eno letalo je po napadu na vrnilo v svojo.

Admiraliteta poroča, da je bil več italijanskih vojnih ujetnikov ubitih in ranjenih, ko je nemški bombarde napadel angleški parni, na katerem so se nahajali ujetniki. Kje se je parni nahajal, ko je bil bombardiran, ne omenja.

Alene, 4. februar. — Odpor italijanskih čet je bil zlomljen v bitkah z Grki severno od Klisurice, Albanija, pravljeno v drugo poročilo. Grki so zasedli verigo hribov in originalni fašiste z utrjenih pozicij.

Razprava o Rooseveltovem načrtu

La Follette in Thomas pred senatnim odsekom

Washington, D. C., 4. februar. — Včeraj se je pričela v nižji kongresni zbornici razprava o Rooseveltovem načrtu za večjo pomoč Veliki Britaniji. Zaslisanje o tem načrtu pred zborničnim odsekom za zunanje zadeve je bilo zaključeno zadnjo soboto in večina tega odseka je pripravila načrt v sprejetje.

Ofenzivo proti načrtu je otvoril kongresnik Hamilton Fish, republikanec iz New Yorka, katero so podprli drugi republikanci. Debata se bo nadaljevala danes in jutri, o amendmentih pa se bo pričelo v četrtek. Kongresnik Sol Bloom, demokrat iz New Yorka in načelnik odseka za zunanje zadeve, je odgovoril kritikom in poudarjal, da bo ameriška svoboda zaščitena, če bo konгрес sprejel načrt. On je tudi pobil očitke opozicije, da Roosevelt potiska Ameriko v vojno.

Pred senatnim odsekom za zunanje zadeve, ki vodi zaslisanje o Rooseveltovem načrtu, sta včeraj nastopila Philip La Follette, bivši governer Wisconsina, in Norman Thomas, vodja socialistične stranke. Oba sta izjavili, da bo Amerika potisnjana v evropsko vojno, če bo kongres sprejel načrt. Thomas je naglasil, da bo Amerika dobila Hitlerja, če bo načrt sprejet. La Follette je izjavil, da bo kongres s sprejetjem načrta dal Rooseveltu mandat, naj požene Združene države v evropski konflikt.

Sodišče obsodilo osem unionistov

Spoznani so bili za krive zarote

Chattanooga, Tenn., 4. februar. — Organizator unije Mine, Mill & Smelter Workers, včlanjene v Kongres industrijskih organizacij, in sedem članov te unije je bilo spoznanih za krive zarote in da so nameravali z dinamitom pognati v zrak električne naprave, ki so zlagale z električnim tokom premogovnik družbe, proti kateri je unija oklicala stavko. Obračnavni, katera je rezultirala v obsodbi obtožencev, je predsedoval federalni sodnik Leslie R. Darr.

Dve leti zapora so dobili organizator M. C. Anderson, Ed Simonds, Felton Woodward, Earl Hubbard, John Queen, R. L. Ballew in R. L. Rhodes, Marion L. Ellis pa je bil obsojen na petnajst mesecov ječe. Anderson je bil obsojen tudi na plačitev kazni \$5000, ostali pa sestavili Ellis na \$1000.

Električna napeljava je bila razdeljena z dinamitem v zadnjem aprili in 1500 delavcev, uposlenih pri Tennessee Copper Co., je moralno počivati, dokler ni bila škoda popravljena. Unija je šla v boj proti kompaniji, ko je ta odbila zahtevo glede zaprte delavnice. Prej je federalni delavski odbor odredil volitev glede reprezentacije pri kolektivnih pogajanjih, pri katerih je dobila večino unija ADF. Pozneje je odbor odredil nove volitve pri katerih je zmagača unija CIO. Ko kompanija klub temu ni hotela prisjeti unije CIO, je ta oklical stavko.

SPORAZUM MED FRANCIJO IN NEMČIJO BLIZU?

Laval bo morda postal član Petainove vlade

ITALIJA NE BO PODVZELA AKCIJE

Vichy, Francija, 4. februar. — Izgleda, da bo kriza, ki ki jo je izvralo vprašanje kooperacije med Francijo in Nemčijo, kmalu izvravljena. Nastala je 13. decembra, ko je premier Petain pognal Pierre Lavala iz svojega kabineta, v katerem je imel pozicijo zunanjega ministra.

Tu je bilo naznanjeno, da se admiral Jean Darlan, mornarični minister in Petainov zaupnik, pogaja z Lavalom v Parizu. Prisluhujec se, da se bo Laval, ki odobrava stališče Nemčije v kontroverzi s Petainovo vlado, vrnil v Vichy in postal spet član kabineta.

Anglija bo dobila danske parnike

Argentina se pripravlja na akcijo

New York, 4. februar. — Tu poročajo, da bo Anglija kmalu dobila 58 danskih parnikov, ki se nahajajo v ameriških in drugih nevtralnih lukah. Transakcija bo izvedena preko danskega vladnega sveta, ki bo formiran v Londonu in kateri si bo prisvajal lastninske pravice.

Ce bo kupčija izvedena, bo Anglija dobila parnike, katerih skupna tonaga znaša 450.000 ton. Petajst danskih parnikov se nahaja v newyorskem luču, 23 v drugih ameriških pristanih in 20 v lukah Centralne in Južne Amerike.

Anglija je dobila zadnjo pomlad vse razpoložljive norveške in holandske parnike, sklenili pa ni pogodbe z Dansko, ker ni ta postavila režima v Londonu.

Formiranje danskega vladnega sveta v Londonu bo odprlo pot za transferiranje parnikov. Svet bodo tvorili prominentni danski delavci in trgovci v Londonu. Ti so imeli že več razgovorov s premierjem Churchillom in drugimi angleškimi voditelji.

Buenos Aires, Argentina, 4. februar. — Avtoritete bodo morda aplikirale staro rimljansko pravilo Greenove deklaracije. On je dejal, "da Green in drugi uradniki ADF ne govorijo v imenu delavcev, uposlenih v tovarnah Ford Motor Co. Oni niso stavili nobenih zahtev Benettonu in to pojasnjuje, zakaj ta konferira z njimi. Unija CIO bo na dalejši organizacijski kampanji ignorirala konflikt med Greenom, Benettonom in Homerjem Martinom, ki hočejo ustvariti konfuzijo."

(Martin je bil nekaj predsednik unije avtovih delavcev).

Uradni krogi niso povedali, koliko časa bo Darlan ostal v Parizu in se pogovarjal z Lavalom.

Namignjeno je bilo, da se bo sta skupno vrnila juži v Vichy, zato bodo pogajanja uspešna.

In napak se učimo in izpopolnimo pravila na konvencijah, ki so tudi širši izraz demokracije.

Dosedaj se članstvo še ni dočitalo z razprave o naših problemih — sicer je časa dovolj. Od par strani je bilo sugestirano, naj se predvsem tajniki udeležejo te razprave o pravilih, ker imajo največji in najboljši upogled vanje poleg glavnih uradnikov. Torej bom skusil po svojih izkušnjah razpravljati o dobrih in slabih straneh naših pravil. S tem ne rečem, da bom zadel stodostotno v pravo. Pri tem tudi mogoče ne bo komu ugajalo vse, toda ničato, to so le moja mnenja; ako se kdo ne strinja, naj se posluša glasila in pove svoje. To je demokratično in tako končno tudi pridemo do najboljšega rezultata. S tem tudi pripomoremo delegaciji, da bo na konvenciji lahko razumno sklepala v korist naše organizacije.

Dotaknil se bom najprvo vprašanja "20 year endowment" in naše mladine. Izkusenje me uči, da komu ugajalo vse, toda ničato, to so le moja mnenja; ako se kdo ne strinja, naj se posluša glasila in pove svoje. To je demokratično in tako končno tudi pridemo do najboljšega rezultata. S tem tudi pripomoremo delegaciji, da bo na konvenciji lahko razumno sklepala v korist naše organizacije.

Zelim se dotakniti tudi zavarovanja na podlagi 20-letnega plačevanja, ki ga je uvedla zadnja konvencija. To zavarovanje se meni ne vidi preveč praktično, je celo ovira, ker ustvarja jezo od strani članov. Na podlagi tega zavarovanja ima član pravico do posojila v slučaju potrebe na podlagi nabranne rezerve, namreč kolikor je že posojilna vrednost njegovega certifikata. Ampak do sedaj se posojuje iz te rezerve le za smrtninski sklad in seveda tudi za upravne stroške, ne pa za bolniško podporo, kar ni pravilno.

Na primer član je zavarovan v tem razredu za \$1000 smrtnine in za dolar ali dva bolniške podpore; toda v slučaju potrebe lahko iz svoje rezerve dobi posojilo le za kritje asesmenta v smrtninskem skladu, nikakor pa ne za bolniški sklad. To ni praktično in tudi ne pošteno. Ako član želi posojilo za asesment za nekaj mesecev, ko pride v finančne stiske, naj ga dobi za vse skide, zato je tudi stopil v razred. In zakaj mu odrekati pravice do nekaj, kar je njegovega?

Seveda, tukaj so bili že argumenti, češ da tak član ima popolno pravico vprašati za posojilo za asesment iz sklada izrednih podpor. Yes, to je resnica, ampak je veliko članov, ki tega ne žele, ker morajo v smislu pravil društva predložiti prošnjo v odobritev. In tako se dobre člani, ki ti v obraz povedo, da ne želijo beračiti, ampak oni zahtevajo le svoje — poslušanje svoje rezerve. So člani, ki ne žele, da vedeni drugi člani, da so prišli v finančne potrebe in da žele le začasnega posojila za asesment. Torej pač gledajo s svojega stališča kot ponosni ljudje in smatrajo to kot nekakšno "feharno".

Zakaj bi torej tega ne uredili tako, da v takem primeru imam član v tem razredu polno pravico, da dobi posojilo iz svoje rezerve za celoten asesment, ne samo za smrtnino. Saj se venjam do posušju svojega in nič več. Naletel sem že na argument, da bi se v takem primeru član lahko posluževal rezerve toliko časa, da bi jo izvrpal in potem pustil organizacijo. To je slab argument in pri meni ne drži. Imel sem izkušnje pri drugi organizaciji, pri kateri ni bilo tako. Ne trdim, da se tu pa tam zgodi takakega, toda to je bil redek slučaj. Vsak član bo v takem primeru raje dvakrat pomisli predno bi šel toliko dače in sam se oškodoval. Do take primere bi kvetljemu prislo pri velikem nežadovljivezu in ruvarju naše organizacije. To da v tem primeru organizacija

ne bo imela nobene škode, pač pa sam član.

Tudi o tem vprašanju naj bi tajniki razpravljali, ker sem prepričan, da imajo slične izkušnje kot jih imam ja. Priznanje delavskih pravic

Federalni odbor za produkcijo obrambne opreme je zadnje dni lopnil po Fordovi avtnej družbi, katera za nobeno ceno nočje priznati delavskih zakonov. Ford je predložil vladni najcenejšo ponudbo za 11,781 avtotrukov za armado, odklonil pa je delavskih klavzul v pogodbi na podlagi Wagnerjevega zakona in drugih postav, nakar je omenjeni federalni odbor odklonil Fordovo ponudbo in je dal naročilo drugi detroitski družbi, katera je sprejela delavske določbe.

Radijski poročevalci, ki je objavil to vest, je pripomnil, da je to postopanje federalnega odbora proti Fordu zasluga Sidneyja Hillmana, ki v omenjenem odboru zastopa organizirane delavce. Hillman je predsednik unije oblačilnih delavcev CIO in v odboru za produkcijo obrambne opreme na deli oblasti s Knudsenom, kateri zastopa delodajalce; Hillman in Knudsen imata enako moč v tem odboru.

Prvič v zgrovini Združenih držav se je torek zgodilo, da imajo organizirani delavci svojega zastopnika v vladi, in to na takoj važnem mestu, to pa le po zaslugu predsednika Roosevelta, ki je imenoval Hillmana v omenjeni važni odbor.

Dejstvo, da je odbor za produkcijo dal breco zadrženemu Fordu, je dokaz, da se danes zahteva v pravice organiziranih delavcev upoštevajo. Prepričani smo, da tako ostane, dokler bo Hillman v federalnem odboru za produkcijo. Velika večina delavcev v unijah CIO in ADF to dobro ve in tudi podpira program obrambe.

Nič ne bo škodilo, če povemo, da je Hillman demokratičen socialist — in tudi ne bo škodilo, ako dodamo, da je v širšem federalnem odboru obrambe uposlen tudi Dan Hoan, ki je bil 24 let socialistični župan mesta Milwaukee.

Se ena delavska zmaga

Federalno vrhovno sodišče je ta teden razsodilo, da je zakon za minimalno mezzo in maksimalno delovnik ustaven. Ker je v tem zakonu tudi določba, katera omejuje otroško mezdno delo, pomeni ta razsodba; da je zdaj prepoved otroškega dela tudi ustavna — in ratifikacija dodatka k ustavi glede otroškega dela, katera se na sramoto demokracije vleče domača do 17 let (največ zaradi nasprotnosti katoliške hierarhije v Ameriki), je po tej razsodbi nepotrebna. Nadalje je vrhovno sodišče ustavilo tožbo proti delavskim unijam na podlagi antitrustnega zakona.

To je nov dokaz, da je vrhovno sodišče, kakršno je danes, naklonjeno organiziranemu delavstvu. Vrhovno sodišče ima danes čut socialne odgovornosti.

Our Society's Sports Activities

The SNPJ is ever on the alert for new fraternal features as well as for new social, cultural and recreational trends.

This has often been demonstrated by our Society's leadership in originating new ideas and by incorporating them within its framework of permanent institutions which today are its valuable assets.

With the organization of our young people in their own separate English speaking branches, the Society was quick in recognizing the value of sports activities among our young members. Thus we see that from the very start of our youth movement fifteen years ago, sports has been adopted as an integral part of our Society's manifold endeavors.

Today our Society is the promoter of several sports activities, notably baseball (softball), bowling, basketball and lawn bowling (balina). Softball is the most popular outdoor sports activity and bowling is by far the favorite indoor recreation of the greatest number of our male and female members.

Nearly every ESL of the SNPJ is now engaged in regular weekly bowling contests. And rightly so, for in recent years bowling alleys, once considered on the same social plane as a pool room, have become respectable, modern places of healthful recreation.

It is interesting to know that recently discovered data show bowling as being 5,200 years old! From its research the American Bowling Congress had placed the age of bowling at around 2,000, believing it originated with the Romans. However, it has recently been discovered that the game dates much farther back.

Prof. Flinder Petrie, famous Egyptologist, states in his book, "The Making of Egypt", that bowling was played as far back as 5200 B. C. Of course, the game then was somewhat different: on a small level surface with nine pins arranged in a diamond pattern. The ball was rolled through a small arch which probably was set up as a substitute for a foul line.

As stated above, our ESL's have been active in bowling since their beginning. Regular annual tournaments are staged at different cities. The annual Western Pennsylvania Bowling (duckpin) tournament opens the bowling season on New Year's Day. Then there are several sectional tournaments; the Midwest in the Chicago area, the Eastern in Cleveland, and the Handicap tournament in Chicago.

Quite logically, the annual National SNPJ Bowling tournament is held each year at the end of the bowling season either late in April or early in May. This year's tourney will take place in Detroit on May 3 and 4.

It is a known fact that our Society is promoting sports and backing them financially for recreational value they offer to our members and for the purpose of attracting new members.

The latter purpose should this year be especially emphasized because of the Fifteenth Anniversary of our ESL's.

My Week

A newsletter I read in the daily Prosveta of January 28 caused me to reflect on the many cases of applied fraternalism which we never hear about. I am certain that many a member could furnish an interesting account of an act of kindness or assistance accorded by a brother or sister member.

The item I refer to was written by Mary Tomic, member of SNPJ lodge 128, Strabane, Pa., and relates of a serious accident met by Mike Kruse of Strabane on a construction job in Washington, D. C. SNPJ member Mary Suglich, formerly of Chicago and now living in Washington, read the news in her local paper and decided to visit the injured man to see if she could help in any way. At the hospital she also encountered his hastily summoned family and offered them her hospitality.

In the last few years there have been increasing number of women contributors to Prosveta Daily. Some of them write of their youth in the Old Country, or of their experiences when they came across. Others write on their lodge and club activities, on everyday problems and happenings. It is an indication, I think, that many of our women have more leisure now than their children have grown and many labor saving appliances are more generally accessible.

The lease-lend bill is still the main bone of contention in Congress as well as throughout the land among the people who are interested in its passage and those who lead the obstruction. It is safe to say that the bill will have comparatively easy sailing when Congress will finally decide to vote upon it.

Last Monday labor won a decisive double victory when the Supreme Court unanimously upheld the federal wage-hour law. At the same time, by knocking out a 19 year old reactionary decision, the court gave the government power to abolish child labor in America. By this act the long-pending child labor constitutional amendment—submitted to the states in 1924—will now virtually become unnecessary. It prohibits the interstate transportation of child-made goods.

There are compelling reasons for the conscription of labor in Britain, as recently announced by Ernest Bevin, Minister of Labor. Britain has today some 4,000,000 men under arms and most of them have been taken out of trade and industry. Maximum production cannot be obtained unless every man is employed in the kind of work most needed by the country. British labor is carrying the largest financial as well as production burden in the struggle.

The Elusive Pocket by THE GUTTER BALL

CLEVELAND, O.—Throughout the country thousands of pins are crashing, but does everyone know how this came about? Authorities agree that bowling first originated about 1000 to 1500 years ago in northern Italy. There were different versions of the game at that time in each country. The object of all of these games was to knock pins or objects with a ball which originally was as spherical a stone boulder as could be found. The version which came the nearest to our present day game was created by the Dutch. It was the game of nine-pins. It was bowled upon beds of clay or cinders. Later, about 1200 A.D., a 12 to 18 inch board was used as the alley bed. At one end of this bed was a 36-48 inch square board platform upon which were set three rows of pins three deep. The pins were reset after each ball.

This form of bowling was first introduced to America by the Dutch on Manhattan in 1623. Unfortunately, gamblers gained control of the game which resulted in legislation prohibiting playing of this game. To circumvent this law another pin was added creating a ten-pin combination with pins set in a triangular form. This was the beginning of the modern version of 10-pin bowling. In 1875 a National Bowling Association was formed in New York to standardize this game. A foul line was established; alleys were made 60 feet long from foul line to center of head pin, and all dead wood was removed off the alley. After this fine bit of work the National Bowling Association disintegrated in a few years. In 1890 the American Amateur Bowling Union was organized, but it also failed to function. Then in 1895 the American Bowling Congress was organized. Through the efforts of this Congress bowling has been completely standardized and induced to grow in popularity with each passing year.

A number of years ago the SNPJ Lodges of Cleveland started their own history of league bowling. At first the men organized, later the women did. However, something seemed to have happened to the men's league, which caused them to disband. Imagine my surprise, when I called up Mollie Koren, Sec'y of the still functioning Ladies' League, for her league scores, to hear her suggest that I write something about the Comrades' men's team. I was informed that the Comrades are bowling in the CFU League under the captaincy of Edward Grum, who was kind enough to give me some dope about his team. This team is composed of Grum, Koren, Prijatel, Sila, and Golob. To date this team has won 26 games and lost 35, which places them in a tie of sixth place. On Jan. 26, the Comrades won one and lost 2 games. The scores rolled were as follows: Koren 473; Sila 364; Prijatel 409; Grum 492; Golob 462. Golob bowled the highest single game, 199.

On the girls' front the leaders clashed with the Comrade 3 team taking 3 games from the Strugglers 1, thereby gaining undisputed first place. Margaret Sakas with 449 and Fran Spik with 446 set the pace for winners; while T. Dolak with 418 and A. Karlinger with 407 were high for the losers.
