"Vsak vojak, ki ne more napredovati, naj rajši na mestu umre, kakor da bi se umaknil z onega dela francoske zemlje, ki mu je izročen v obrambo.

Norwood, Mass. — Francis Conton, eden izmed dveh dvojčkov, star 41 let, je večer umrl na stolu sedeč, zadet od kapi. Dve uri zatem je prišel njegov brat-dvojček, da pripravi vse potrebno za pogreb. Toda komaj je stopil v stanovanje, se je od kapi zadet zgrudil mrtev na tla.

### PODMORNICA SQUALUS ZOPET V SLUŽBI

Portsmouth, N. H. — Podmornica Squalus, ki se je pred meseci pogreznila, pri čemer je izgubilo življenje mnogo njenih mornarjev, je bila postavljena zopet v službo mornarice Zedinjenih držav. Podmornico so dvignili iz globine in jo popravili; stroški popravil so znašali \$1,400,000.

### BELGIJSKI FAŠISTI POSLANI V FRANCIJO

Pariz. — V Dunkerque, Francija, je prispelo v spremstvu oborožene straže sedemdeset belgijskih fašistov, med njimi tudi njihov voditelj Rex Degrelle. — Degrelle je znan simpatiziralec Nemcev in zagovornik totalitarnega režima. Degrelle-a in ostale njegove pristase so prijela belgijske oblasti nekaj dni prej, preden so podvzeli Nemci invazijo Belgije.

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OB TEDNU...

Pretekli teden je bil v Moskvi podpisan jugoslovansko-ruski trgovinski pakt, zdaj pa se iz verodostojnih jugoslovanskih virov zopet poroča, da odpotuje v kratkem v Moskvo jugoslovanska vojna misija, ki bo razpravljala tudi o vojaški pogodbi med obema državama.

Ruski državniki v Moskvi so izrazili jugoslovanski misiji željo po sklenitvi nenapadnega in vzajemno obrambnega pakta med Rusijo in petimi balkanskimi državami, češ, da bi bil tak pakt "naravna" posledica ruske želje za prijateljstvo v Balkanu.

"Naj nikar nihče ne pretaka krokodilovih solz nad 'ubogo Belgijo' ali nad 'ubogo Holandsko,'" je zapisal neki komentator v italijanskem listu "Resto del Carlino" dan ztem, ko se je pričela nemška invazija Belgije, Holandske in Luksemburga.

Da to ni bilo osebno mnenje kakega fašističnega ognjezreca, temveč oficijelna linija vsega italijanskega kontroliranega časopisja, je bilo jasno, ko je list "Popolo di Roma" izjavil: "Belgijska in nizozemska zahteva zaveznikom po oboroženi pomoči ni ničesar drugega kot priznanje, da je med temi državami obstojala že v naprej dogovorjena oborožena solidarnost."

Docim si je fašistična stranka sistematično prizadevala, da razbija javno mnenje proti zaveznikom ter je dala v ta namen celo šolarjem in dijakom prosti dan, da bi spontano demonstrirali, pa ni oficijelna Italija storila ničesar.

Dejstva, ki so prisilila tekoči teden Mussolinija k molku, so sledeča:

Dasi je Mussolini sam s seboj že davno na jasnem, da se mora Italija pridružiti Nemčiji v vojni, pa so kraljeva rodbina in široke ljudske mase proti vojni. Ne samo, da je Marie-José, žena prestolonaslednika Umberto, sestra belgijskega kralja Leopolda, temveč je tudi apel nizozemske kraljice Viljemine, ki ga je naslovlila na italijanskega kralja, mnogo doprinesel k mrznji italijanskega kralja do Nemčije.

Na Balkanu delujeta čas in izpreminjajoči se pritisk politike nasilja proti Italiji. Rumunski premier George Tatarescu je rekonstruiral svoj kabinet ter nadomestil nemške simpatičarje s frankofili. Jugoslavija je podpisala z Rusijo trgovsko pogodbo, zdaj pa naznanjajo nepotrtene vesti, da je Rusija obljubila poslati Jugoslaviji svoje čete na pomoč v slučaju, če bi bila Jugoslavija od kogar koli napadena.

Švicarsko javno mnenje, ki dobiva čedalje bolj jasen izraz v švicarskem tisku, odkrito priznava, da bodo postopne invazije nevtralnih držav in tistih držav, ki se ne marajo ukloniti pred zahtevami Berlina ali Moskve, le še bolj utrdile odločnost Švice, da se vsakemu našljju upre z vso svojo močjo in sredstvi slehernemu napadaleu.

"Dvanajst nas je bilo, danes nas je samo še četvero, in jutri bomo morda le še trije. V mislih imam namreč tri majhne nevtralne države v srednji in severni Evropi. Ako nas bo hotel kdo napasti, naj ve, da bomo streljali pri nas iz vsake hiše in je v veliki zmoti tisti, ki misli, da bo lahko zasedel kaj drugega kakor razvaline, ki jih bomo zapustili."

Heraldika angleških bojnih ladij

Angleškim vojnim ladjam izbira in določa imena admirali-teta, ki vsako ime prouči z vseh strani ter zlasti pazi na to, da bi bilo v skladu z ugledom ponosne britanske mornarice.

Vsaka ladja ima tudi svoj grb ki ga takisto določi najvišja oblast mornarice, v prejšnjih časih pa ni bilo tako. Izbor imena in grba je bil prepuščen kapitanu, ki je seveda vpošteval želje mornarjev, kolikor se je le dalo.

Angleški humor je tu često prišel do takega izraza, kakor bi ga nedvomno ne dopustil nikjer drugje na svetu.

Tako ima iz tistih časov britanski torpedni lovec "Tormenter" (mučitelj) v svojem grbu bolho.

Moštvo je namreč bilo mnemnja, da je slika te nadležne žuželke najbolj v skladu z imenom ladje.

Drugi torpedni lovec "Vanity" (gizdavost) ima v grbu si-reno, ki se gleda v zrcalo, kar je zopet lepa skladnost med imenom in grbom.

Vkljub velikemu razumevanju, ki ga admiraliteta vedno kaže za humor pomorščakov, pa je morala véasih le poseči vmes, kadar je vojaški humor presegl meje dopustnosti. Tako si je bila posadka torpedovke "Sepoy" vtepla v glavo, da mora imeti v grbu mlado, plavalaso natakario, ko ravno odpira steklenico piva.

Tega predloga admiraliteta ni pevojila na veliko žalost pomorščakov, ki so proglašili, da "mumije v admiraliteti nimajo nikarkršnega smisla za humor.

Vendar pa tudi danes, ko ravno omenjene "mumije" določajo imena in grbe britanskim vojnim ladjam, humor nikakor ni izločen. Vojna ladja "Sezan" ima v grbu ključ, kar je lepa aluzija na arabsko bajko o Alibabi in 12 razbojnikih.

Znamenitna matična ladja "Arc Royal", ki so ga neki radijski napovedovalci že tlikrat potopili, pa še vedno plava po površini morja, ter ima za grb Noetovo barko, okrašeno s kraljevske krono. Lovca "Cyclope" ima v čast enookemu Polifemu v grbu oko, lovca "Greenwich" pa ima precej zamotano simboliko: uro, višič nad zvezdo, s čimer se daje čast griniškiemu poldnevniku in tamošnjemu zvezdoznanskemu zavodu.

NAROD V JUGOSLAVIJI NA VSE PRIPRAVLJEN

BELGRAD. — Iz vseh krajev Jugoslavije prihajajo soglasna poročila o sijajnem obnašanju našega naroda v teh težkih in usodnih časih. Srbi, Hrvatje in Slovenci so strnili svoje vrste ter so pripravljani spoprijeti se z vsako nevarnostjo, ki se morda pojavi.

Poleg vsega drugega priča o tem tudi pisanje hrvaškega lmečkega lista "Glas Primorja" ki izhaja v Splitu in ki pravi: "V teh dneh so vse naše politične, strankarske, verske in razredne razlike padle v morje. Med nami ni sedaj nobene razlike več. Nam vsem je v tem času najbolj potrebna država, njena svoboda in neodvisnost. Danes smo mi enega duha, ene duše in pripravljene odgovoriti na prijateljstvo s prijateljstvom, ali neprijateljstvu se bomo postavili po robu z voljo in močjo vsakomur, ki bi skušal ustvarjati nam našo usodo. Zvestoba, vera in odločnost celokupnega naroda za njeno obrambo so najboljše jamstvo veličine in moči Jugoslavije". (J. K.)

Razveljavljen poziv učenjaku

Znani angleški matematik in filozof Bertrand Russel, ki pripada angleški aristokraciji, a je po svojem prepričanju precej na levi, je bil pozvan na City College v New Yorku za profesorja matematike.

Ta poziv pa je sodna odločitev razveljavila. Najvišje sodišče države New York je upeštevalo namreč priziv neke ge. Jean S. Kayeve iz Brooklyna, ki je nastopila proti Russellu, prvič zato, ker je inostranec, drugič zato, ker mesto, na katero so ga pozvali, ni bilo razpisano, in tretjič zato, ker moralno baje ni primeren za takšno mesto.

Ga. Keyeva, ki je žena nekega zobozdravnika, ima dva otroka in pravi, da bi se njena hči nekoč lahko vpisala v omenjeni kolegij — v tem primeru pa se je bati, da bi jo Russellovo naziranje pohujšala.

Tudi z druge strani so vstale slične obožbe proti angleškemu učenjaku, tako da je moral ta končno stopiti iz rezerve. Med drugim je odločno zanikal, da bi bil imel kdaj najmanjši opravke z angleškimi nudišti.

Newyorško sodišče pa je bilo drugačnega mnenja in je razveljavilo poziv na mestni kolegij.

Bertrand docira ta čas na kalifornijskem vseučilišču in bo predaval tudi na Harvardovem vseučilišču o filozofskih problemih. Željo, da bi predaval na newyorškem mestnem kolegiju, so izrekli nekateri njegovi tamkajšnji prijatelji, on sam pa se nikoli ni potegoval za to mesto.

da je ameriški senat odobril kredit 15 milijonov dolarjev za nove jezove v Panamskem prekopu;

da so privedli v Buenos Aires dva nemška oficirja, bivša častnika na oklopnici "Admiral Spee", ki sta bila pobegnila iz internacije v Santosu;

da bodo holandske oblasti izvedle racioniranje bencina;

da sta angleška in francoska vlada naročili v Ameriki 5000 vojnih letal, in sicer polovico bombnikov, polovico pa lovcev; da je mladi švicarski skladatelj Sutermeister uglašil Shakespearov tragedijo ljubezni "Romeo in Julija";

**THE SOCIALIST PARTY AND WHAT IT IS**

To many people, the Socialist Party is an organization of atheists, communists, free-lovers, and anti-Christians. It's against religion, say many. This in spite of the fact that there are usually more ministers seeking office on that ticket than on any other. Of course, there are sections of the party which are against the clergy; the Yugoslav and the Czech sections, for instance. But regardless of all the explaining that has been done to clear up the question as to what the party stands for, the former impression still exists and thrives in the minds of our backward Balkans and, of course, in the opinion of the general public.

The Socialist party is none of those wild things people say it is. It is an organization of people who expect to change the order of our society so that the needs of man will be distributed for use instead of profit. This is what the Socialists say distinguishes their party from the Republican and Democratic parties. On other matters, such as methods to achieve these ends and how to react to the present problems there is such a diversity of opinion, in this little group, that it would occupy one's mind full time just trying to make sense out of it all.

The Socialist party is against helping the Allies in this present war, and some of its members are for helping the Allies. Some of its members, like Anton Garden of the Prosveta, are so confused that they can't make up their minds one way or t'other.

Another convention of Socialists, the Social Democratic Federation, whose organ is the Jewish Daily Forward, went on record to have the United States give all possible aid to the Allies. This group of Socialists split from the parent body some time ago after a convention held in Detroit.

It seems quite likely now that when the Yugoslav Socialist Federation meets in Cleveland, in July, that that organization will also approve giving aid to the Allies. If that does not happen, there will be another split in the much split up Socialist party.

The Socialist party's biggest headaches are the splitting kind. The minority disagrees with the majority decision, and so another splinter group is born. When the split occurs, the Socialists seem to forget their ultimate aims and fight like cats and dogs against each other. These splits hardly speak well for a body which sponsors the slogan, "Workers of the world unite," since even the paltry few Socialists cannot forever stop fighting each other.

The Socialist party of America and of the world was given a serious set-back when Dolfus, with Mussolini's help, suppressed the Socialists of Vienna. When MacDonald, as prime minister of England, failed to keep the faith, the parties over the world suffered. When Blum, as the Socialist premier of France, failed to go to the help of the beleaguered Spanish Republic, the Socialist cause was not only lost in Spain, but also in France and in the rest of the world.

These developments have had telling effects on the American movement. Hoan, the Socialist mayor of Milwaukee, was defeated in the last election considerably due to these factors. With Hoan's defeat, the Socialists have lost their shining example of how well they can run things once given a chance.

With a divided convention; with little respectable influence; no cash on hand; slight chances of getting on the ballot; and with the world in a sad plight, the Socialist Party of United States nominated Norman Thomas for president and Maynard Krueger, a member of the SNPJ, as vice-president.

The Socialist Party in 1940 is on the march!... Hither?... Thither?... Whither? R. I. P.
