Sen. Taft ob strani
gen. Eisenhower
v Clevelandu, O.

Nastop sen. Tafta naj simbolizira pokop bojne sekire med obema možema zaradi Taftovega poraza v Chigagu.

CLEVELAND. — V torek zvečer bo nastopil v Public Hallu kot govoril ob strani generala Eisenhowerja senator R. A. Taft, s čemer naj bo simboliziran konec gremnosti, ki je zavladala med Taftovimi pristaši proti Eisenhowerju zaradi Taftovega poraza na konvenciji v Chicagu.

Taftov načrt za nastop v Clevelandu je naznanih v sredo G. H. Bender, okrajni predsednik republikancev, ki je izjavil, da bo dramatiziran pokop bojne sekire med obema možema, ko bo Taft osebno predstavil Eisenhowerja občinstvu.

MOSKVA. Publikacija "Smeana" je pod naslovom "Bejbol" pojasnila svojim bralcem, da je ameriška narodna igra Baseball "bestialna bitka in krvav boj, cigar posledica so pohabljenja in umori ljudi" ter da ni prav za prav nič drugega ko yankeeska pverzija starodavne ruske vaške igre "lapta".

Publikacija opisuje dalje baseball kot surovo in nevarno igro, ki se često konča s pohabljenjem in celo smrtnjo igralcev. EISENHOWER NA A. F. L. KONVENCIJI

Konvencija s hladnostjo vzela na znanje njegove nazore o Taft - Hartleyjevem zakonu.

NEW YORK. — V sredo je nastopil na konvenciji Ameriške delavske federacije republikanik Eisenhower, ki je povabil delegatom, da je proti preključku Taft - Hartleyjevega zakona, je pa za njegovo amendiranje.

Delegatje so mu ploskali ob njegovem vstopu v dvorano, — prav tako, ko je odšel iz nje, in trinajstkrat so s ploskanjem prekinili njegov govor, niso mu pa ploskali, ko je govoril o Taft-Hartleyjevem zakonu, glede katerega je zavzel stališče, ki je direktno nasprotno stališču demokrata Stevensona.

Preje v tem tednu so delegati navdušeno ploskali administracijskim urednikom, ki so napadali Taft-Hartleyjev zakon.

Prihodnji torek bo konvencija indorsirala predsedniškega kandidata, kar bo privržen v zgodbini AFL. — Z gotovostjo se lahko reče, da bo indorsala Stevensona.

Predvidovan konec izdelovanja atomskega orožja v Zdr. državah

Z izdelovanjem se bo končalo, ko bo tega orožja toliko, da se bo že njim lahko uničilo vsakega agresorja.

SAN FRANCISCO.—Gordon Dean, predsednik Komisije za atomsko energijo, je izjavil, da bo prišel čas, ko bo Amerika prenehala izdelovati atomsko orožje, ker ga bo imela dovolj, "da bo z njim popolnoma uničila sovražno moč za vojskovanje". Toda medtem pa morajo Zdr. države pospešiti izdelovanje tega orožja, dokler ne dosežejo maksimalne atomske moči.

Mr. Dean je dalje dejal, da bo napočil dan, ko bomo imeli toliko atomskega orožja, — "da nam bo možno že njim uničiti ne samo industrijsko moč sovražnika, temveč tudi njegove čete na bojišču."

V vsem tem času pa si bo Komisija prizadevala, pospeševati načrte za proizvodnjo atomske energije za miroljubne slike.

HAMBURG, Nemčija. — Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, največji nemški finančni izvedenec, ki je s svojimi načrti omogočil oborožitev Hitlerjeve Nemčije, se je pravkar vrnil iz Teherana, kamor ga je pred dnevi povabil premier Mossadegh, da bi mu bil svetovalec v zadevah petrolejskih transakcij z Anglico. — Dr. Schacht je ob svojem povratku dejal, da smatra Mossadegha "za enega najmodrejših in najbolj dalekovidnih državnikov, ki sem jih kdaj poznal."

Po Websterjevem besednjaku pomeni kompromis sporazum, ki temelji na vzajemnih ali obojestranskih koncesijah! Ne prezrite: Na vzajemnih in obojestranskih!

"Appease" ali "apizjanje", katera beseda se je udomačila med ameriškimi Slovenci in ki se je pojavila s prvim poizkuškom apizjanca nacistov v Monakovem, pa pomeni na podlagi istega besednjaka — žrtvovanje moralnih principov, da se odvrne in prepreči agresijo!

Prizadevanja za kompromis s komunisti nas privedejo nazaj k besedi "vzajemno". Vsa zgodovina poizkusov, sporazumeti se s Sovjetijo namreč dokazuje, da nima slednja nikakega razumevanja za pomen resnične vzajemnosti. NA PRAGU NOVE GROZE IN MORDA TRAJNEGA MIRU

Iz daljave kontrolirano letalo brez pilota je poneslo dva tisoč funtov težko bombo v Koreji na tarčo, ki je bila oddaljena 150 milj. — Televizijska kamera na letalu brez pilota je posnela in oddajala ves polet in svoj lastni konec.

S KROVA ameriške letalonosilice BOXER so v sredo izstrelili vodljivi izstrele na tarčo, ki je bila oddaljena 15 milj. — S tem smo stopili na prag nove varnosti in večje možnosti miru.

Ta vodljivi izstrele je bilo letalo brez pilota, ki je neslo 2 tisoč funtov težko bombo. Letalo so izstrelili na ladji s posebno pripravo, ki je pogurala letalo v zrak. Ko je v zraku doseglo zadostno višino, pa je prevezelo njegovo kontrolo drugo letalo s pilotom, ki je letel za brezpilotnim letalom in tisoč čevljev nad njim. Na brezpilotnem letalu je bila nameščena TV kamera, ki je posnemala celotni polet ter zadnje trenutke ob eksploziji na tarči. Ta kamera je oddajala posnetke nazaj na prizorišča ali "screens" televizijskih aparatov, nameščenih na ladji in na glavni komandi v Tokiju.

Ko je iz daljave kontrolirano letalo priletelo nad svojo tarčo — komunistično vojaško koncentracijo v neki dolini med dvema hriboma — se je v trenutku obrnilo s "kljunom" proti zemlji ter se pognalo v veliko naglico navpično navzdol na tarčo. Prizorišče na televizijskih aparatih se je zatemnilo, tuljenje padajočega letala je utihnilo, letalo je trešilo na tarčo ter se dobesedno razpletelo v 'sončni prahu.'

Vsi prisotni na ladji so stali s pridržano sapo ter spremljali za zgodovinski potek. Vsi so se namreč zavedali, da vojna s poljubno kontroliranimi izstrelki ni več fantazija bodočnosti, — marveč da je dejansko tu in da so bili pravkar priča njenemu prvnemu dejanju.

Taft-Hartley zakon

V Združenih državah je zaposlenih okrog 61 milijonov oseb. Ti predstavljajo večino volilcev v državi, kar naravno igra veliko vlogo v naši notranji politiki, posebno ob prilikih volitve predsednika.

Nekako jabolko spora in predmet političnih debat ob vsakih volitvah tvori zadnja leta znani Taft-Hartley zakon. Ta je bil sprejet leta 1947, ko so imeli republikanci večino v senatu, proti ugovorom predsednika Trumana.

Zakon je nekako posredno naperjen proti delavstvu in naprednjaku, ker določa, da mora po neuspešnih pogojanjih med delodajalcem in zastopnikom delavstva preteči vsaj 80 dni, predno sme delavstvo pričeti s štrajkom. Ta nekakohlajevalni termin kaj lahko vzame delavstvo iz rok močno oranje. V 80 dneh se namreč v industriji, kjer vlada mezdrni spor, razmreje kaj lahko spremene v škodo delavstva, da postane štrajk lahko nemogoč ali vsaj ne tako učinkovit. Štrajk je namreč le takat uspešen, če prične ob času, ko je podjetniku najbolj neprijeten. Tukom 80 dni pa se podjetnik kaj lahko pripravi na štrajk. Radi tega je razumljivo, da je vse delavstvo v državi proti temu zakonu.

Delavske unije so se pa tudi bale, da je ta zakon naperjen proti njim, da hoče oslabiti njihovo moč. Tukom petih let pa se je pokazalo, da se to ni zgodilo. Ni se uresničil strah delavstva, pa mogoče tudi ne želje onih krogov, ki so si želeli ta zakon. Vsled zunanjopolitičnega položaja so se razmreje v naši industriji zboljšale, zaposlitev je narastla radi obnovitve vojne industrije. V tem času je bilo v interesu podjetnikov in delavstva, da se čim več producira. V takih časih konjunkture pa mine veselje delavstva za štrajke in delodajalcu, da bi se upiral delavskim zahtevam. Tako se v praksi še ni pokazalo, kake posledice bi nastale, če bi se dejansko uporabil ta zakon.

Ob prilikah zadnjega jeklarskega štrajka, je predsednik Truman ta zakon, ki ga ne mara, obšel naravnost mojstrovsko. Delavstvo je vsekakor na željo predsednika prostovoljno odložilo štrajk za več kot za 80 dni. Republikanci so v senatu vedno glasno klicali, da naj predsednik uporabi najprej Taft-Hartley zakon, potem še druga sredstva, toda Truman se je temu upiral na vso moč in je — v veliko zadovoljstvo delavstva s svojim stališčem zmagal.

Kljub temu, da se dejansko še ni uporabljal ta zakon in da se niso pokazale ne slabe in ne dobre njegove strani v praksi, igra v sedanji volilni borbi veliko vlogo.

Republikanci so v svoji platformi proti željam delavskih organizacij postavili zahtevo, da ta zakon ostane v veljavi. Ta stranka je polna simpatij za ta zakon in so to, da se spremeni le v toliko, kolikor bi "obravnavne in skušnje" zahtevalo kako spremembo. Ker pa takih obravnav in skušenj dosedaj še ni bilo, naj bi torej ta zakon ostal v svoji moći.

General Eisenhower je kmalu spoznal, da mu bo strankina platforma zelo škodovala v volilni borbi, ker odibi delavstvo od republikanske stranke. Zdaj je mož med dvema stoloma: na eni strani Taft, ki ima veliko moč v republikanski stranki in njegovi reakcionarni pristaši, ki so vsi za Taft-Hartley zakon, na drugi strani pa so glasovi delavcev, ki so pa skoraj vsi proti temu zakonu. Eisenhower se zvija sem in tja, da bi ustregel na obe strani. V svojem govoru na konvenciji delavskih unij A. F. of L. je obljudil, da se bo ta zakon prilagodil delavskim zahtevam. Toda, če bo republikanska večina v senatu proti, Eisenhower v slučaju zmage ne bo mogel izvesti svojih obljub.

Na drugi strani pa je demokratska platforma za odpravo tega zakona, ki je trn v peti delavstvu. Je pa tudi med demokrati nekaj takih, ki so za ta zakon. Demokratski kandidat Stevenson je sicer dolžan po strankini platformi nastopati proti temu zakonu. Na shodu na praznik dela v Detroitu se je tudi izjavil, da sprejema v bistvu določila strankine platforme glede tega zakona, vendar pa se zdi iz njegovega govora, da ne simpatizira z nekaterimi preostriimi kritiki tega zakona. Kolikor se more sklepati iz njegovega govora v Detroitu, je on sicer za odpravo tega zakona, toda mesto tega bi bil on za drug zakon, ki bi preprečil neprimerne nastope tako podjetnikov proti delavstvu kot delavcev proti podjetnikom. Točno, kako si on to predstavlja, se pa demokratski kandidat ni izjavil.

Štrajki so, kakor kaže praksa, škodljivi vsem: delavstvu, podjetnikom in državi. Vsi so v interesu skupne blaginje poklicani, da iščijo potov, kako štrajke čim boljomejiti.

Na vsak način bi bilo v korist delavstva in podjetnikov, če bi se to vprašanje reševalo le s strokovnega, socialnega stališča in da ne bi bilo predmet strankarske politike. Delavstvo in podjetniki imajo skupne interese. Kakor se je pokazalo ob koncu jeklarskega štrajka, bi bilo najbolje, če bi se najprej organizacije podjetnikov in delavskih unij med seboj sporazumela za obliko zakona, ki naj bi ga potem sprejel zakonodajec. Ustvarila naj bi se zakonito nekaka korporacija, kjer bi sedeli kot enakopravni zastopniki podjetnikov in delavstva njih delegati. Ta korporacija naj bi bila nekako vrhovno razsodišče, obvezno za obe strani. Tako bi se ta vprašanja izločila iz dnevne politike.





The Beginning of Foreign Rule of Slovenia

The territory settled by the Slovenians and occupied by them until about 900 was three times larger than the present Slovenian territory. At the beginning of the 10th century the Slovenian territory with the exception of the mountainous regions was invaded by a Mongol people — the Hungarians. The Hungarians finally broke the territorial connection between the South and Western Slavs and made an end of the Slovenian settlements in present South-West Hungary, the former center of duke Kocel's country.

The center of the Slovenian resistance became Carinthia. The anti-Hungarian policy brought the Slovenians once again like two centuries earlier the anti-Avarian policy in a closer connection with the German speaking Bavarians. Slovenians — in Carinthia at that time known as Carantanians — fought successfully the Hungarians. In 949 a Slovenian — Bavarian army reached the Pannonian plainland and started a counter-attack. The Hungarian defeat on the Lechfeld near Augsburg in Germany in 955 meant an end of the Hungarian attacks and the Slovenian territory became once again a military border territory of a mighty foreign power.

The Hungarian were pushed back to the Pannonian plainland and the

remaining Slovenian territory was divided into marches. Among the marches the history mentions for the first time the name Carniola (Kranjska).

In 843 in Verdun in present France the Frankish Empire was divided into three parts. The great majority of the Slovenians came under Germany, which developed into the so-called Holy Roman Empire of the German nation. In 976 the Eastern March (present Austria) was given to the dynasty of Babenberg and many German settlers started to settle it.

The division into marches left a

part of the Slovenians under the Hungarians and started to draw a border between the Slovenians and Croats. During the 10th century the Slovenian territory was further divided and the history mentions Carinthia, Styria, Carniola, Istra, and Gorica.

German families became rulers of these provinces which lost a common background. The fief given in the first by the Emperor of a special favor became hereditary. During that period the Slovenian nobles and peasants were put aside and the country was ruled by foreign born families.

The family Eppenstein became the most important family in Carinthia, when it died out its successor became the family Spannheim. Other masters of Carinthia were the bishops of Salzburg and Freising, the family Traungau, the

bishops of Brixen, and the family of Vobvre (German: Heuenburg).

Masters of Styria were the Spannheim, the bishops of Salzburg, and the family Traungau. In the Savinja valley the masters of the castle Žovnek, later known as the counts of Celje, became important.

In Carniola at the end of the 11th century the patriarchs of Aquileia had large possessions, but their political power has never been strong. The bishops of Freising became the masters of Škofja Loka and the Poljanska and Selška Sora valleys, while Bleib and Bohinj was given as fief to the bishops of Brixen. Among the ruling families the most important were the Andechs-Meran with the center in the present town Kranj, then capital of Carniola. The family Spannheim also had some castles in Carniola, among them the castle of Ljubljana. Besides, the families of Turjak (German: Auersperg), and the family Ortenburg (Ortenegg near Ribnica) were important.

Kras and the Soča valley belonged partly to the patriarchs of Aquileia and the bishops of Gorica. The most important rulers of the Soča valley became the counts of Gorica with the Gorica castle as their center.







Tamale Pie, a favorite main dish in the Southwest, is a satisfying way to make the most of a pound, or even less, of ground beef. It also is a delicious way to give variety to the menu.

The yellow cornmeal "crust," flavored and made even more sunny with a sprinkling of cheese, seems to absorb the well-seasoned meat flavor.

Browning the meat in margarine is a smart flavoring trick. Modern margarine is especially satisfactory for all sorts of pan-frying. It does not spatter, and it gives a beautiful brown color to foods fried in it.

With this gold-and-brown Tamale Pie, serve a green vegetable—perhaps green beans, and cold, thick slices of ripe tomatoes. An easy meal, it is also colorful and appetizing.

While the pie bakes, warm some rolls or well-margarined slices of bread. Every tablespoon of margarine in the menu adds its quota of vitamin A. It's a good idea, before winter sets in, to make sure the youngsters get all the vitamin A they need. Food specialists say this is the vitamin of which most folks, especially children, need more than most of them now get.

TAMALE PIE
½ cup yellow cornmeal
2 cups boiling water
2 tablespoons margarine
1 small onion, chopped
½-¾ pound ground beef
1 small can tomato paste
½ cup sliced stuffed olives
½ cup sliced ripe olives

Stir cornmeal into rapidly boiling water. Cook and stir until thick. Remove from heat. Add ground beef. Stir and cook until meat is no longer red. Add tomato paste, olives, green pepper, chili powder, bouillon, corn, cayenne and salt. Taste to be sure this is enough salt. Stir well. Line a shallow well-margarined baking dish or individual bakeware with cornmeal mush, reserving some for top. Pour meat-vegetable mixture into lined dishes. Drop remaining cornmeal mush by spoonfuls around edge of meat, or cover entire top, if preferred. Sprinkle shredded cheese over top. Dash paprika liberally over all. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) 1 hour. Serve piping hot. (Makes 8 servings.)
