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## NEMČIJA ZNIŽALA PODPORO BREZPOSELNIKIM

Odredila je zvišanje dohodninskega davka, da poveča vladne dohodke in zniža izdatke. Naredba, s katero je prejšnja vlada razpustila fašistično armado, bo odpoklicana. Vznešenje v delavskih krogih

Berlin, 14. jun. — Vlada kanclerja Franz von Papena je včeraj odobrila zasilno naredbo, od katere pričakuje znižanje vladnih izdatkov za \$24,000,000 na leto potom reduciranja brezposelnostne podpore in novih davkov, ki jih bodo prineali \$95,000,000 na leto. Nova odredba bo danes objavljena.

Brezposelnostna podpora bo reducirana za 24% in plačevala se bo samo trinajst tednov na mesto dvajset kot doslej. Neporočene brezposelne osebe so dolej prejemale devet dolarjev podpore na mesec. Ta podpora bo sedaj znižana za dva dolarja.

Temu znižanju bodo sledila nadaljnje redukcije brezposelnostne podpore. Vlada je poleg tega odredila dodatni davek 1½% na letne dohodke pod \$375 in 6½% pod \$8,750 in več. Davek na sol je bil tudi zvišan za 20%; računajo, da bo vlada iz tega vira dobila \$9,500,000 novih dohodkov na leto.

Provizije, katere je sestavila prejšnja Brueningova vlada glede znižanja izdatkov in se nanašajo na redukcijo subvencij metrom v veleposnetnikom v slučaju, da bi se upirali reorganiziranju nedobičkošnih poslov, niso uključene v novi naredbi.

Nemško delavstvo, ki je pravno apeliralo na svoje voditelje, naj ne ovirajo novega kabinta pri njegovem delu, da bo lahko pokazal, kaj more napraviti, je vzrušano vsled nove naredbe, ki znižuje brezposelnostno podporo. Delavstvo sedaj zahteva od radikalnih političnih skupin, naj vodijo opozicijo proti aristokratični vladi. Ti voditelji molče, ker pričakujejo, da bo Papen z novimi naredbami še bolj pošgal ljudstvo, da se bo izreklo proti njegovemu vladu in fašističnemu gibanju.

Druga naredba, ki jo vlada pripravlja in bo danes objavljena, bo ponovno priznala legihterjeve armade rjavašrajanjnikov. Fašistično armado je razpustila Brueningova vlada 1. aprila t. l. s posebnim dekretom, ki bo sedaj odpoklican. Prejšnja vlada je izjavila, da fašistična privatna armoda ogroža javno varnost in red. V smislu nove naredbe bo 400,000 članov fašistične armade spet smelo nositi uniforme.

Minister za notranje zadeve baron Gayl je naznani, da bo ublažil cenzuro časopisov in odpoklical nekatere restrikcije. Od sedaj naprej, je dejal Gayl, ne bo vlada cenzurirala časopisov in ne ovirala razpečevanja na ulicah razen v izrednih situacijah, ako bodo podani dokazi, da časopisi potvarjajo poročila in s tem ogražajo interese nemškega naroda.

Socialisti zahtevajo državno podporo za brezposelne

New York. — Louis Waldman, načelnik socialistične organizacije za državo New York, je poslal govorju Rooseveltu pismo, v katerem ga urgira, naj takoj sklice izredno zasedanje državne legislative, ki naj bi sprejela ukrepe glede pomočne akcije za brezposelne. Waldman zahteva takojšnjo vladno pomoč 50 milijonov dolarjev, krajši delovnik in izvajanja programa državnih javnih del. V svojem pismu pravi, da so mestne vlade izčrpale svoje blagajne in je državna pomoč absolutno potrebna.

## Veterani vzirajo pri svojih zahtevah

Pravijo, da se ne bodo umaknili iz Washingtona, dokler ne dobre "zaostale" plače

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — "Ostali bomo tukaj in nadaljevali bitko," je odgovoril W. W. Waters, poveljnik "bonusne armade," ki je prispeval v kapitol in zahteva izplačitev, na apel mestne policije, da jim bo predkrbel avtotruke, da se z njimi odpeljejo iz Washingtona. "Veterani, ki so prišli sem, se zavajajo svoje naloge. Vedo, da jih čaka težak boj, toda ničje jih ne odvrne od njihovega cilja. Mislimo rdečkarji, kot se nas skuša prikazati, in se bomo obnašali mirno. Naše vrste postajajo močnejše in v prihodnjih par tednih bo naša armada narašala na 50,000."

Waters je tudi izjavil, da so socialisti in komunisti prav tako dobrošli v njihovih vrstah kot demokrati in republikanci. "Vsakdo, ki je bil častno odpuščen iz armade in se styrna s nameni veteranov, je naš tovaris," je reklo Waters. "Govorimo o rdeči nevarnosti nas ne bodo odvrašali od našega cilja. Mi zahtevamo izplačitev bonusa in se ne bomo umaknili, dokler tegu ne dosežemo."

Dasi so bile policijske straže krog Bele hiše in kongresne zbornice počaščene, se ljudstvo v Washingtonu ni polastiла panika. Člani kongresa in administracije so vznešeniji. Videli bi radi umaknitev "bonusne armade," ki pa noče nič slišati o tem.

Jasno je, da je bojazen pred rdečo nevarnostjo neutemeljena. Med bivšimi vojaki je več takih, ki so v svojem domačem kraju pomagali pri izganjanju radikalnih govornikov, kot pa komunistov.

Zbornica kapitulirala pred "bonusno armado"

Washington, D. C. 14. jun. — Nižja kongresna zbornica je pristala na zahteve vojnih veteranov glede takojšnje izplačitev bonusa v vstopi \$2,400,000,000, ki je z 226 proti 175 glasovom porazila načrt odseka za pot in sredstva, da vprašanje bonusne zakonodaje ne pride na dnevni red na tekočem zasedanjem.

Poraz načrtu pomeni, da bo predloga kongresnika Wright Patmana prišla danes na diskuzijo v spodnji zbornici. Ta predloga določa izplačitev bonusa in bo nedvomno sprejeta, toda v senatu bo najbrž porazena, in tudi v slučaju, da bi bila sprejeta, jo bo Hoover vetriral.

Fašistične obsođbe v Rimu

Rim, 14. jun. — Izredni vojnički tribunal za začito države je obosil pred antifašistov, kateri so bili obtoženi protivljudnih političnih aktivnosti in zarote v zvezi z bonitom napadom na brovnikov v bližini Milana, na težke kazni. Dva obtoženca sta bila obsojena na trideset let zapora vsak, dva na šestnajst let in eden na petnajst let.

V zadnjih devetih mesecih so se vršile obravnavne pred tem tribunalom proti več kot šestnajst obtoženim, ki so bile arretirane. Samo eden član kabinetova, F. Gordon Bradley, je bil ponovno izvoljen. Novi premier bo najbrž F. C. Alderice, voditelj narodne stranke, ki je izbran zmagovita v volilne bitke.

## REPUBLICA ČILE DOBILA NOVEGA PREMIJERA

Ljudje, ki so kupovali delnice njegovih podjetij, izgubili milijone

Chicago. — (FP) — Kapitalistična struktura, katero je dolga leta gradil Samuel Insull, se je podrla in pokopala svojega graditelja pod seboj.

Insull, pred katerim se je vzel klanjal, ko je bil na višku svoje moči, bo odšel v Anglijo. Vse kar mu je ostalo od njegovega ogromnega bogastva, je penzija \$18,000 na leto. Penziji pa druge je on vedno nasprotoval, sedaj pa zapušča za seboj velikanake dolgove, finančne razvaline in obubožane investitorje, ki so kučovali delnice njegovih podjetij.

Insull je bil tipičen predstavnik kapitalističnega sistema, špekulant s tujim denarjem.

Njegove finančne špekulacije so bile hazardna igra. Ljudje so kupovali delnice njegovih podjetij po sto in več dolarjev; te delnice so sedaj skoraj brez vsake vrednosti.

Ako ne bi prišla depresija, bi bil Insull najbrž tudi sedaj najmogočnejši magnat na srednjem zapadu in bi se lahko ustavil Morganovim interesom, ki so delnice so sedaj skoraj brez vsake vrednosti.

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"Vse finančne in ekonomske probleme bo reševala vlada," pravi La Garrique v svoji izjavi.

"Pri distribuciji dobrin in profitov v svesi z industrijsko prodkojijo se bo država strogih pravil. Kapital bo moral deliti dobrič s producenti.

"V doseglo resnične socijalne pravice je potrebno, da tisti, ki so v prošlosti pridržali vse profite zase, doprinesajo žrtve. Na ta način bo nadprodukcija, stvar, ki jo mnogi napačno toimajo, izginila. Zvratiti se mora kupovalna sila velikega dela ljudstva, da bodo ljudje lahko kupovali producirane dobrine."

Finančni minister je tudi načinil, da bo oredja banka, katero je vlada pred par dnevi povrnila v teku enega tedna, drugač bo ustavila obrat. Kompanija je nekaj časa obravnavala svoje premogovnike s pomocijo stankovskov, katero so na delo in z delom spremil milijonik.

iz Chicago. — Dr. Charles F. Goren, tajnik FBI in upravitelj Protektorata, je bil na teden obvezan iz starega kraja, da je 15. maja v Zagrebu umrl njegov brat Josip Fagorec, star 68 let in doma iz Zimarice pri Sodražici na Dolnjem Savinjskem. V Zagrebu je bil okrog 40 let in vodil je lesno trgovino; tam zapušča ženo in sina, v Sloveniji dva brata, v Ameriki pa tri brata in sestro. Ana Majsel, 1515 W. 16 Place, starca 61 let, se je v zadnjih petih tednih dvakrat poskusila zavduši s plinom, a obskrat so jo rešili. Zadnji teden je bil drugi poskus, zvoden istega dne se je pa med pogovorom s hčerjo zgrudila s stola na tla in običala mrtva. Zadela jo je srčna kap. — Umrla je rojakinja Almilia Gornik, ki zapušča družino.

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Bivši senator Aurelio Nunes Morgado je bil imenovan za glavnega upravitelja industrije nitratov. On je poskan proti ameriški kombinaciji Coates, ki je doslej kontrolirala industrijo nitratov, in drugih inovativnih interesov.

Emerson L. Richards, voditelj republikanske večine v sij. zbornici, je postal James Simpson, predsednik veletrgovine Marshall Field & Co. On je sedaj načelnik direktorjev treh kompanij — Commonwealth Edison, People's Gas and Public Service of Northern Illinois, katere je Insull gradil in vodil do vrata let.

Ljubljana, 27. maja. Fajmošter Barie odložil poslanški mandat

Ljubljanski šentjakobski fajmošter Janko Barie je bil pri novembarskih volitvah kot edini kandidat v okraju Kranj izvoljen za poslanca v skupščini. Dne 25. maja letos pa je izjavno v listih sporočil "svojim volilcem v vsej slovenski javnosti," da odlaže mandat narodnega poslanca v Narodno skupščino in da naj se v poslanskih zadavah obračajo poslej na njegovega namestnika Ivana Lončarja, župana v Tržiču.

Fajmošter Janko Barie je torek odložil mandat poslanca. Zajal je to storil, tega v izjavi nisti omenja.

### Two Soldier Marches, in 1917 and 1932

In 1917 the war god raged and soldiers were on transports on their way to Europe to make us all safe for democracy. In 1932 ragged and hungry soldiers to the number of 20,000 march into Washington to "collect our back wages." The politicians are frightened and yet some use the demonstration for their own purposes. Senator Thomas of Oklahoma, voting to shift the taxing of the power gauge to the 24,000 users of electricity, a few hours later posed for a photograph with a group of these soldier outcasts. That photo should be useful in gathering some working class votes.

On the other hand Senator Robinson and some other Bourbon Democrats roar "Communism." That a few Communists have marched is certain. No doubt Socialists and Socialists and a few Farmer-Laborites will also be found crowded in the "jungle camp" of Washington as well as "loyal" veterans. The huddled mass in the White House is perceived as the hour approaching for the vote on the bonus bill in Congress.

These soldiers, however, would do better to work for general relief for the workers than for a special gift for themselves. What we face is not a problem that affects the soldier section of the workers but one that affects the whole working class.

## Studying the Situation

What is the cause of the present depression? That's a question that has been asked so frequently by innumerable millions. Is it the stock market crash? Or perhaps the machine era? Is it due to overproduction? Or to the oversupply of labor? Does the extravagance of government share the blame? And the grafting and stealing of the public officials? Is it overtaxation? Or the exploitation of the workers? This depression has already shown its grave consequences. The subject, therefore, is of vital importance to the young men and women of today. Why? Are you not the builders of the future? Will you not have to rebuild the countless millions of structures which this torrent, this depression, has incapacitated? Why, certainly you will. And just like we all are still paying for the outrageous and enormous expenditures for trying to make this world safe for democracy, we will toll for generations to come, to square up the losses of the present panic. That is inevitable. Regardless of what happens in the immediate future, great damage has already been done, millions of lives have been ruined, millions more are on the brink of ruination; the most severe penalty will fall upon the young of today.

Every question in the first paragraph can be answered in the affirmative. To these we can add books full of other questions which might have some bearing on the issue, either directly or indirectly. But when you sum up the whole situation, all of these queries and answers are only stepping stones to the final and important major factor.

*Who then is responsible for the panic?—THE SYSTEM UNDER WHICH WE LIVE, HAVING US BOUND HAND, FOOT AND BRAINS WHICH PERMITS A FEW TO OWN AND POSSESS EVERYTHING AND THE ASSUMED RIGHT TO EXPLOIT THE MANY.*

How then can we rid ourselves of the depression? What remedy can we apply? How can we change the system?

Before anything further is said, I must declare, that the democratic form of government which was constituted by the founders of this Republic is the best that the human mind has conceived. However the politicians, elected to run this Democracy, for the people, have become

as unscrupulous that they have made it a government for and by the rich. Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg address eulogizing the heroes of the Civil War so that "this government of the people, by the people and for the people, shall not perish from the earth," is made a mockery by those

who run our present government to save, protect and enrich the richest and do nothing to stave off starvation for the millions.

And just like the thirteen colonies rebelled against the oppression of the English rule in 1776, just as Abraham Lincoln wouldn't allow landowners to torture the poor negroes any longer in 1861, so we must now in 1932 rebel against this rule of capital, which is sending millions to their undeserving graves.

The second requisite is, study the difference between public ownership and private ownership. Give us government ownership. With efficient management of all the basic industries run for service and the benefit of all the people instead of piling up the riches for the few monopolists, planned production will assure everyone a job and the billions now given to the millionaires will go back to the workers in higher wages and better service. Doesn't public ownership seem feasible
