## Kongres bo zmanjšal davke za 5 bilijonov do 1. januarja

Washington. — Senator George, ki je načelnik senatnega finančnega odseka, je rekel, da bo kongres do božiča zmanjšal dohodninske davke za kakih 5 bilijonov dolarjev. Korporacijam bodo znižani davki za kake \$2,000,000,000, posameznikom pa za kake \$3,000,000,000.

Odpravljen bo najbrže tudi davek na avtomobile, to je tista zoperna znamka za \$5, ki jo je več kot 5,000 vprašalo državo za brezposelno odškodnino.

## MacArthur se je vozil brez straže po ulicah japonske prestolnice.

Tokio, 8. sept. — General Douglas MacArthur je stopil danes v zmagovalnem pohodu v japonsko prestolnico Tokio in njegove čete so takoj dvigile ameriško zastavo na poslopju ameriškega poslaništva, nekaj blokov od palace cesarja Hirohitija. Ceremonije pri dviganju zvezdnate zastave so trajale 7 minut.

Ameriška zastava je zaplapala nad Tokiem danes ob 11:09 dopoldne (kar je po ameriškem času ob 10:09 zvečer v petek). To je bilo natančno 3 leta in 9 mesecev potem, ko so Japoneci začeli vojno z izdajalskim napadom na Pearl Harbor.

To je prav tista zastava, ki je ob času napada na Pearl Harbor vihrala nad kapitolom v Washingtonu. To je prav tista zastava, ki je zaplapala nad Rimom, ko so stopile tje ameriške čete in nad Berlinom, ko je kapitulala Nemčija.

Izkuseni veterani prve konjeniške divizije so stali v pozoru, ko so potegnili zvezdnato zastavo na drog.

MacArthur se je pripeljal v avtu pred poslopje ameriškega poslaništva ob 11:05 dopoldne. Dospel je tje štiri ure zatem, ko sta prišla prva dva trupa ameriških vojakov v Tokio, ki je tretje največje mesto na svetu.

Narednik je zavpljal vojakom v pozor, gdbo konjeniške divizije je zaigral generalovo korenico in MacArthur je stopil k drogu, pred katerim je stal mikrofon. MacArthur je stopil k mikrofonu in spregovoril:

"Dvignimo zastavo naše dežele in naj plapola v Tokijskem soncu v vsej svoji gloriji kot simbol upanja zatiranim in kot znak zmagе pravice."

S tem je prevezel MacArthur kot vrhovni poveljnik okupacije, oblast nad Tokiom in vso Japonsko.

Ameriška zastava vihra na vzhivenem kraju, kjer jo lahko vidi velik del prebivalstva in kjer jo lahko vsak dan gleda tudi Hirohitu iz svoje palče.

## SPORTS

Detroit, Sept. 2—This was the day Manager Lou Boudreau told his Indians they had to "win or else"—and his team didn't fail him.

With Jim Bagby scintillating when the chips were down, the rebounding tribe once again halted the Detroit Tigers, 3 to 2, before a disappointed crowd of 30,656 and scampered off with the series, 2-1.

Amazingly effective, considering this was his first mound appearance since Aug. 18, Bagby earned the reluctant, but sincere, plaudits of the crowd, which boosted Detroit's home attendance figure for the year to 1,106,754.

Overwhelmed by an attack of fielding jitters, the Indians Labor Day ruined an elaborate home-coming party in the stadium.

Blanketing the enthusiasm of 39,075 fans—second largest turnout of the season—the Indians gave both ends of the double-header to the St. Louis Browns, 6-3 and 5-4, the finale in 10 innings.

It was an extremely costly afternoon because the Indians now are seven games behind the Detroit Tigers—and that probably will prove too much of a handicap to overcome.

Al Smith and Steve Gromek were the losers, while Bob Muncrief and Al LaMacchia emerged with the victories.

Gromek, still limping, replaced Mel Harder as Manager Lou Boudreau gambled all the way. Steve gave up the winning run produced from George McQuinn's single, Vern Stephens sacrifice and Frank Mancuso's single.

Of small consolation was the fact that Dutch Meyer poled the only homer of the long day, his sixth, in the opener.

Boston, Sept. 5—Bob Feller sustained his first major league defeat since 1941 today, but Allie Reynolds came across with his 10th victory to give the Indians a split with the Boston Red Sox before 11,241 spectators.

Feller dropped a 2-1 decision to Otis Clark, although the Indians outhit the Sox, 11-7. Clark, incidentally, had been roundtipped by the tribesmen when they first saw him in Cleveland.

Bob, who deserved a better break, entered the contest with a 2-0 mark,

Reynolds, tying Steve Gromek at 16 triumphs, tossed a six-hitter to win handily, 5-2. Cleveland made 10 hits off Randy Hellen, the loser, and Francis Barrett.
