

STRAH PRED VOJ-
NO PREŠINJA
ANGLIJO

Poziv lorda Cecila, da mora Anglija za vsako ceno učiniti italijanski pohlep v Abesiniji, je povzročil vznemirjenost med ljudstvom.

LONDON, 13. avgusta — Poživ bivšega pomožnega notranjega tajnika in ognjevitega zagonovnika Lige narodov, Lorda Roberta Cecila, da mora Anglija "za vsako ceno" ustaviti Italijo na njeni nameravani vojni ekspediciji v Abesiniji, je silno pretesel Anglijo ter prešna ljudstvo s strahom, da dežela stoji na pragu vojne.

"Mi moramo povedati Italiji v odločilih in jasnih besedah, da ne blufamo in da smo v resnici pripravljeni izpolniti našo slovensko obligacijo pod paktom Lige narodov, neoziraje, se kako drastična akcija bo potrebna," je izjavil Lord Cecil. "Edino jasna beseda nas bo rešila pred ponovljivo usodnih napak, ki smo jih napravili pred dvajsetimi leti. Svetovno vojno bi se bilo utegnilo preprečiti, ako bi bila Anglija leta 1913 jasno povezala, da ne bo mirno gledala, ampak Nemčija prične z invazijo v Francijo."

"Daily Express" in "Daily Mail" sta danes zjutraj ostro napadila Lorda Cecilla in Unijo Lige narodov. "Organizacija Lorda Cecila je objavila klic na vojno," piše "Express". "Njegova izjava bo anglikanski domov," pravi članek listy "Daily Mail".

Glasovanje je izpadlo 2 proti 1 proti izdaji bondov, s katerimi bi se bilo zgradilo novo mestno hišo in policijsko postajo ter popravilo ceste. Del denarja za izboljšave bi bila dala zvezna vlada in bo za odobritev bondov je vodil župan Ely. Opozicijo so tvorili demokrati, kateri so vodili G. S. Dunbar, C. T. Bird in I. H. Stranahan. Župan Ely je izjavil, da je za poraz odgovorno dejstvo, da republikanci sploh niso imeli kandidatov v primarnih volitvah, vsled česar so se jih vdeležili povečini le demokratje. Nova postava določa, da ako ste sposobni plačati obresti od dolga za eno leto, tekoče davke za eno leto in pa zavarovalnino proti ognu, in to ne vse naenkrat, ampak v dvanajstih mesečnih obrokih, potem vam upnik doma ne more vzeti. Prošnje za tak moratorij lahko vložite na sodnji vsak čas, predno se sodna prodaja izvrši. Doba med vložitvijo tožbe in pa sodno prodajo običajno znaša sedem mesecev, in ima torej vsak lastnik doma toliko časa priliko, da se posluži omenjene postave. Ta postava je veljavna do 1. aprila 1937. Ugodnosti, ki jih nudita ta postava za ljudi, ki jim preti izguba doma, nam je sporočil odvetnik Mr. Leopold Kušhan.

TURIN, Italija, 13. avg. — V malem mestu Ovado v bližini Alessandrije se je danes pod silnim pritiskom nalivov v Alpinkem gorovju podrl hidro-električni jez, nakar je sledila katastrofalna povodenj, v kateri je našlo smrt od 600 do 1000 oseb.

V mogočnih tokih vode, ki delo preko pokrajine, se vidi plavati človeška trupla, mrtvo živino in druge živali.

Mnoga ljudi se je brezupno držalo streh svojih domov in mahalo in klicalo na pomor, dokler se domovi niso rušili pod njimi. Neki človeški most se je podrl komaj osem minut potem, ko je šel preko njega potniški vlak in uničeni so bili tudi trije drugi mostovi, med katerimi je tudi največji most v provinci.

Večino žrtev tvorijo ženske in otroci, ki so bili zajeti na svojih domeh, ko je prihromela voda.

Nekaj časa po katastrofi so novi nalivi otežkočali rešilno delo, nocoj pa je voda nekoliko padla.

Za katastrofo se dolži strahovito nevihto, ki je divjala v gorah nad mestom Ovado. Jez, ki se ga je zgradilo pred tremi leti, da vzdrževanje hidro-električne centrale, je vrglo celo pokrajino v tem, kar je povečalo grozo katastrofe. Električna postrežba dalec na okrog je paralizirana.

Konkordat in Jugoslavija

Starokrajska "Delavska Politika" z dne 31. julija prinaša o pravkar sklenjeni pogodbi med Vatikanom in Jugoslavijo naslednji članek:

Dne 25. julija 1935 je v Vatikanu podpisal pravdni minister dr. Auer za Jugoslavijo konkordatno pogodbo z Vatikanom, to je, z rimske katoliške cerkvi. Konkordat je pogodba, ki jo sklepa Vatikan s posvetnimi državami, da si ž njo zagotovi politične svobodščine v državah za svoje versko in cerkvenoorganizacijsko delovanje. Velik del cerkvene politične moći sloni ravno na konkordati.

Besedilo konkordata še ni bilo objavljeno, vendar so že znane glavne točke pogodbe.

V prvem delu govori ta o notranji organizaciji rimske cerkev v Jugoslaviji, o soodločevanju države pri imenovanju škofov in ustanovitvi novih škofov.

Drugi del pogodbe je javnopravnega in političnega značaja. V imovinskih vprašanjih uživa rimska cerkev isto avtonomijo kakor vsa druga priznana verstva. Cerkvena posest (imetje mrteve roke) je nadotakljivo, se torej ne more zapleniti in lastiti s kakršnimkoli agrarneformnim zakonom, če cerkev v to ne privoli.

Verski pouk je zajamčen v vseh državnih šolah ter ga vodi cerkev.

Cerkvenim zakonom se priznava javnopravni značaj, to je cerkveni zakon ima pred državo zakonito veljavo in so discipline zakonskega življenja s tem za vso državo unificirane.

Jako pomembna je določba o "katoliški akeiji," ki se navaja kot nadstranska ustanova, ki je podrejena edino škofov.

V konkordatu izjavlja papež, da je pripravljen prepovedati duhovnikom aktivno udeležbo v političnem življenju in pristopanje k političnim strankam, če bo to veljalo obenem tudi za druga verstva.

Pogajanja za konkordat med Jugoslavijo in Vatikanom so trajala več let. Konkordat ima značaj meddržavne pogodbe, ki dovoljuje cerkvi v okviru države suvereno stališče. Mnogo držav stojí na stališču, da konkordat s pojmom državne suverenitete ni v soglasju in odklanjajo njega sklenitev. Zakaj s sklenitvijo konkordata postane cerkev soodločajoči in odločajoči činitelj v mnogih javnopravnih vprašanjih, torej faktor moči v državi. Ne pripada ji le odločanje v verskih vprašanjih, marveč tudi v vprašanjih vzgoje, zakonov, privatno-posesnih pravic, kakor je to že iz zgoraj navedenih glavnih točk jasno razvidno.

Mi smo proti konkordatu, ker stojimo na stališču ločitve cerkve od države. Cerkev naj bo, kakor vsaka druga organizacija, svobodna in neodvisna, v okviru popolnoma svobodomislenega koalicjskega zakona. Imeti ne bi smela predpravje, pa tudi omejevati bi se ne smelo nje svobode. Za svojo eksistenco naj skrbi iz svojih sredstev, ne iz državnih. Verski pouk naj ne bi bil obvezen ter naj bi se vršil izven šole. Za cerkveno posest naj bi veljale iste omejitve in isti pridržki, kakor za vsako drugo privatno posest.

Records show that only one-fourth of the lodges really showed any activity during the present campaign, while the remaining three-fourths so far have done nothing. Should these lodges too come to life and produce to the extent that the other one-fourth did, then the success of the Million Dollar Campaign is unquestionable.

Minutes of Proceedings

On the request of the Insurance Department (Illinois), the Supreme Board decided that all minutes of the proceedings of the Supreme Board and Committees shall be recorded in Slovene and English languages. The English text shall be considered as the original.

Unpaid Monthly Assessments

Lodges which will not remit their monthly assessment on time provided in the by-laws shall be notified through the Official Organ. Their number will be published every month. In case of shortage of the assessment remitted, the Home Office will notify by mail the Lodge President and Treasurer. The duty of Lodge Officers should be to see that the correct amount of assessment is forwarded to the Supreme Treasurer in proper time.

Subvention From Benevolent Fund

Due to the fact that more and more members apply regularly for benefits out of the benevolent fund to pay their assessments, and because many of these applications come from members insured in mortuary class B, who have already exhausted all premium loan value of their certificates, the Supreme Board decided that not more than three assessments shall be paid from the benevolent fund to any such member.

It is common sense to state that the Society cannot be insuring members who cannot pay their assessments nor is it the benevolent fund sufficiently strong to be used for such purposes indefinitely. In some cases the Society has been helping them for three or four years. First they were passive for two years and the mortuary assessment to cover their insurance during these two years has been drawn from their reserve when they commuted their certificates. Then they kept on borrowing for the assessment from the society until their loan value has been exhausted. When such a member cannot provide the means of keeping his insurance after he was insured for three or four years without his effort to pay anything in cash, there is hardly any salvation for him. Insurance and donation of two or three months' assessment from the benevolent fund will not prevent him from lapsation.

Vrtec

In order to stimulate the activities of Vrtecs and its members, especially of ACTIVE Vrtecs, the Supreme Board decided that the monthly assessment payable for the month of October, 1935, shall be refundable to each Vrtec the following month for the purpose of its treasury. All administrators (for secretaries) should send in the assessment for October as you delay much longer.

NATIONAL OLYMPIC MEET BASEBALL RULES - (Continued)

Rule 22

When Base-Runner Is Out

shall be declared out. If he occurs in foul territory it shall be called a foul ball.

Note—Rule reads: "If a ball just batted rebounds and hits batter in fair territory he shall be declared out." If the batted ball strikes in fair territory and rebounds and strikes batter, before he is on fair ground, he is not out, as the batter is always on foul ground while he is in the batter's box.

Sec. 4. If the person or clothing of the umpire, while stationed back of the bat, interferes with the catcher in an attempt to throw.

Sec. 5. If the umpire declares the batsman or another base-runner out for interference.

Sec. 6. If the coacher intentionally interferes with a thrown ball.

Sec. 7. In any and all of these cases the base-runner is not required to touch the intervening bases in returning to the base he is legally entitled to.

Sec. 8. First base is the only one which the runner is allowed to overrun after he has touched it. If, after overrunning to first, he shall forfeit such exemption from liability to be put out.

Sec. 9. If, in case a fair or foul hit fly be caught by a fielder and the ball be returned to the base the runner occupied, before said runner can return to that base, provided he starts too soon.

Sec. 10. There shall be no double play on a tip foul (caught) unless the catcher throws the runner out, stealing the base ahead; or unless base-runner be touched by ball in hands of a fielder.

Sec. 11. If any base-runner be hit by a fair batted ball before such ball is touched by fielder.

Sec. 12. If he fails to touch each base in order, first, second, third, and home, he shall be called out; if the ball is returned and held by a fielder, touching that base, which the runner failed to touch. This omission must be called to the attention of the umpire for a ruling.

Sec. 13. If he intentionally declares any foul not legally caught.

Sec. 14. If the umpire declares the batsman or another base-runner out for interference.

Declaring Outs

Section 1.

The umpire shall declare the batsman or base-runner out, without waiting for an appeal for such decision, in all cases where such players be put out in accordance with any of these rules.

Sec. 2. An appeal must be made to the umpire when a runner "cuts a base," either in trying for a long hit, or in returning to the base that he held originally. The umpire may see the failure to touch a base, but he must not rule on it unless players of the team in the field have been observant as he and ask for a ruling. Likewise, if a runner turns toward second base, after he has passed first base, the attention of the umpire must be called to it by an opposing player before the runner is declared out. There are times when the runner omits to touch a base. If a player of the opposing side asks for the ruling, it is in the province of the umpire to declare the runner out if the runner failed to see the runner miss the base.
