**BONUS FOR VETERANS ASSURED

Your duty as a veteran and citizen is to go to the polls on election day, November 5th. Not only that, see to it that your folks, brothers, sisters, and neighbors do likewise. Let's go all out for Lausche, and put him there to finish the job.

NOVICE IZ JUGOSLAVIJE

Ponatis iz "Slovenskega poročevalca"

LJUDSKA SKUPŠČINA NA RAKEKU

V ponedeljek 26. avgusta so se v okrašenih dvorani Kulturnega doma na Rakeku zbrali poslanci iz notranjskih krajev k tretjemu zasedanju okrajne ljudske skupščine. Diskuzija po govoru okrajnega poslanca Haceta je pokazala, koliko zdravega duha je v slovenskem ljudstvu, ki se živo zanima za vse probleme. Z ustanovitvijo za drug in kaznovanjem večjih špekulantov je bila onemogočena črna borza. Za dvig kmetijstva so zadruge dobavile kmetom po zelo nizki ceni otrobe, živinsko sol, oves itd. Ker je v okraju zelo malo vprežne živine, mu je bilo dodeljenih tudi 128 UNRRA-inih konj. K obnovi gospodarstva mnogo prispeva tudi okrajna načrtna komisija.

Kar se tiče šolstva in obnove šolskih poslopj, ob tem času obnavljajo pet šol, tri nove, pa imajo v načrtih. Prav tako obnavljajo zdravstveni dom v Cerknici. Mladino vzgajajo razen v šolah tudi v političnih in gospodarskih tečajih.

Vojni dobičkarji v rakeškem okraju so morali oddati nad 3 milijone din vojnega dobička. Tehnična baza je pomagala pri obnovi 515 hiš. Mlekarske zadruge so zbrale nad 90.000 litrov mleka in 900 kg masla. Pri delitvi zemlje je dobilo zemljo 945.000 din.

V diskuziji je bilo govorjeno o okrajnih in krajevnih podjetjih. Za sedaj ima rakeški okraj v načrtu, da ustanovi taka podjetja v Starem trgu, Begunjah in na Rakeku. Za ustanovitev teh podjetij bodo najeli posojilo 450.000 din.

NA KOROŠKEM ZAPIRAJO SLOVENSKE DJAKE

Iz Celoveca poročajo, da je nacifašistični režim vsa leta onemogočal šolanje slovenske mladine na Koroškem. Deželna vlada v Celovcu tudi v jeseni 1945 leta ni odprla šol, so se koroški dijaki odločili, da bodo nadaljevali šolanje v Sloveniji. K temu so jih silile tudi prilike na Koroškem, ker ni deželna vlada kazala volje, popraviti po nacističnih slovenski mladini povzročeno škodo in uvesti v učni program slovenski jezik. Ko so se med počitnicami vrnili domov na Koroško, so jih aretirali avstrijski orožniki in angleška policija. Daljšo dobo so bili zaprti v Borovljah, nato pa jih je obsodilo britansko vojaško sodišče zaradi prekoračenja meje na denarno kazen, nekatere tudi na zapor. Poleg teh kazni je vojaško sodišče dijakom naložilo, da se morajo vsak mesec javljati na mladinskem uradu v Celovcu.

Krivdo teh žalostnih razmer na Koroškem nosi deželna vlada, ker še do danes ni poskrbela, da bi Koroški Slovenci dobili svoje pravice na področju strokovnega in srednješolskega pouka.

TUJEZEMSKÉ DELOVNE BRIGADE V LJUBLJANI

Dne 28. avgusta zvečer so prispele v Ljubljano albanska, madžarska, poljska in francoska izseljeniška mladinska delovna brigada, ki so dva meseca delale na Mladinski progji.

Naslednji dan sta albanska in madžarska brigada obiskali Ljubljanski grad in pa Gramozno jamo. V obeh brigadah je študentovska, gimnazijska, delavska pa tudi kmečka mladina.

V razgovoru je albanski mladinec med drugim rekel: "To, kar smo doživljali ta dva meseca na Mladinski progji, se ne da povedati. Od jugoslovanske mladine nismo pričakovali take ljubezni in tovarištva, kakor smo ga bili deležni. To lahko razume samo tisti, ki je sam delal na Mladinski progji in to doživljal."

Mladinec iz madžarske brigade pa je pripovedoval o svojih vtisih v Jugoslaviji; "Kamorkoli smo prišli, posebno pa sedaj, ko smo potovali v Slovenijo, nas je ljudstvo sprejemalo tako prišerno, da smo bili iznenadeni. Že na Mladinski progji smo videli, da smo med jugoslovanskim ljudstvom priljubljeni, vendar takega sprejema nikoli nismo pričakovali. Tako dobrih in tovariških ljudi, kot smo jih srečali na Mladinski progji, še nismo videli. Kar smo potrebovali, smo dobili, še prositi ni bilo treba. Ljudje so nam vsako željo čitali iz oči. Dajali so nam še več, kot smo potrebovali."

Na gradu so jih iznenadili grajski pionirji. Pred grajskim poslopjem so imeli postavljen zasilni oder, kjer so brigadama recitirali, peli in plesali. Z Gradu sta se brigadi odpravili še v Gramozno jamo in si ogledali prostor, kjer so fašisti streljali borce za svobodo. Dne 30. avgusta se se odpejali v Zagreb, kjer so si ogledali razne zanimivosti, nato so se vrnili v Beograd, od koder so se 2. septembra vrnili domov.

STOP, LOOK, LIVE!

Mayor Thomas A. Burke by proclamation has designated the week of October 20 to 26 as Pedestrian Safety Week in Cleveland. The proclamation calls attention to the loss in life and injury caused by traffic accidents.

Pedestrian fatalities and injuries constitute the greatest portion of the traffic toll. Consider the following facts: Two out of three pedestrians killed in traffic are over 50 years of age. One half of the injury toll is traced to the lack of attention or carelessness on the part of the walker.

Cleveland Police records indicate the closing months of the year will be the most hazardous for motorists and pedestrians. The longer hours of darkness coupled with bad weather conditions increase the chance of traffic accidents. This threatened accident rise can be prevented.

Drivers are urged to use all possible caution and care in traffic. Pedestrians must stop at the curb and look before crossing the streets. Always take time for safety. Remember — Stop, look, live!
