Nacionalistična bolezen

Ameriški tisk se že teden dni, bil Aleksander Karadžić ubit v Franciji, veliko v Hrvati v starem kraju. v članki opisujejo vrate kot druge Irce, ki silno pod srbskim režimom v Jugoslaviji. Pisci kličejo v spodbujanje umor Radića in dveh drugih hrvatskih poslancev v belgijski skupščini in konsekventne progone ter potlačitev vseh nacionalnih strank v Jugoslaviji. Ta potlačitev demokracije, ki je bilo, je provocirala teroristične akcije, iz katerih je izšel marseljski atentat pred teden.

Ameriški listi so tudi objavili nekega Košutića na Duple, ki je rekel, da Hrvatje ne bi mirovali, dokler ne dobe absolutne neodvisnosti. Kar je Lloyd George pripisal o pokojnem Aleksandru Hrvatih, ne bo všeč vladi v Beogradu; George pravi, da je Aleksander uničil svobodo Hrvatov.

Čikaški dnevnik Daily News nekje pobral, da so Hrvatje preprijetivi ljudje. "Ko bodo živeli zadnji trije Hrvati, bo imeli štiri politične stranke..." Daily News je mnenja, da federativna republika bi bila najboljša rešitev Jugoslavije. V obeh te sodbe o Hrvatih bi tudi federativna republika ne pomagala!

Da ameriški Hrvatje dosledno mislijo starokrajako slamo sodeč po njihovem časopisu je res; ameriško življenje narajoje in neprehajajo "rešitve" stare domovine. Njihova telesa so v Ameriki, ampak njihove misli so noč in dan v Beogradu. Ljudska lobija kritizira predsednika Roosevelta

Napada njegovo prizadevanje za zvišanje cen, ker bi to še bolj znižalo življenjski standard delavskih mas

Washington. — (FP)—Ljudska lobija se je spravila nad predsednika Roosevelta, ker je zadnje čase zopet pričel poudarjati potrebo zvišanja cen. Po njegovih nazorih cene potrebščinam še niso dovolj visoke ter jih je treba še bolj naviti. Namen tega zvišanja cen naj bi bil, da se tovarnarjem in drugim kapitalistom pomaga plačevati obresti in dividende na "nemogoče dolge in bilijonsko fiktivsko ter napihnjeno kapitalizacijo". Posledica tega bo "zadavitev porabe in znižanje standarda pod zdravstveni minimum," pravi lobija.

Zvišanje cen v ta namen ni nič drugega kot golo "ropanje žepov konzumentov." Lobija pravi, da kar je najbolj potrebno, je redistribucija bogastva, ne pa zvišanje cen, da se bo bogastvo še bolj kopičilo v rokah privilegirane sloja. Od narodnih dohodkov, ki so leta 1932 znašali \$48,952,000,000, je delavstvo, vključivši farmerje, prejelo le \$31,595,000,000, nad 17 milijard je šlo pa za obresti in dividende.

Omenjenega leta je imelo 339,407 oseb, ki so plačale dohodninski davek, nad 3,173,901,000 dohodkov. V tej skupini so osebe z nad pet tisoč letnih dohodkov. "Ta krivična distribucija kupne sile že v naprej onemogoča vsako ravnesveje med produkcijo in konzumacijo," zaključuje lobija.

Mlekarski trust izgubil svojo "unijo"

Delavci so se z veliko večino izrekli proti skemi za "notranjo unijo"

New York.—Delavci pri Borden's Farm Products kompaniji, ki dominira mlekarski trg v ameriški metropoli in farmerje v širokem pasu, so se s 4295 glasovi izrekli proti kompanijski uniji. Za skemo je glasovalo 1969 delavcev.

Družba je skušala spremeniti svojo bratovščino v kompanijsko unijo. V to bratovščino spadajo vsi njeni delavci, plačujejo asessment in prejemaajo podporo v slučaju bolezni. Ker so se pa posebno vozniki pričeli organizirati, je družba prišla na idejo, da ne potrebuje nobene "zunanje" unije, ampak lahko porabi bratovščino v ta namen. V vsakem okrožju naj izvolijo pet zastopnikov in "unija" je tukaj.

Glasovanje je pokazalo pa drugače. Izpadlo je neugodno za kompanijsko unijo kljub temu, da ni bilo posebne agitacije s strani delavske organizacije. Družba do zdaj še ni pričela izvajati diskriminacije napram delavcem, ki se pridružijo svoji uniji, pravi T. F. Murphy, tajnik unije mlekarskih delavcev v okraju Westchester.

PREGLED KONVENCIJE AMER. DEL. FEDERACIJE

Konvencija je napravila več važnih zaključkov in dala veliko moč eksekutivi. Progressivni element je bil porinjen na stran

San Francisco. — (FP) — Pri pregledu dela konvencije Ameriške delavske federacije, ki je bila zaključena zadnji petek, mora tudi najstrožji kritik priznati, da se je federacija pomaknila nekoliko naprej.

Njen najvažnejši zaključek je sigurno sankcioniranje industrijskih unij v industrijah z masno produkcijo. Ta zaključek so diktirale razmere bolj kakor pa kakšna radikalna orientacija. Sploh o kakem "radikalizmu" tudi na zadnji konvenciji ni bilo sluha. Stara garda je imela popolno kontrolo nad njo in je pazila, da progresivni element ni dobil dosti prilike za govore in izražanje svojih misli.

V 30 minutah je konvencija opravila z vsemi "rank and file" resolucijami, ki so jih predložili bodisi konservativni ali pa "levičarski" delegati. Šle so večinoma vse v koš brez vsake debate. Mašina je bila izborna namazana in je po vsakem prečitavanju "rank and file" resolucij zagrmelo: "Glasovanje!" Green je pa tudi drugače skrbel, da ni noben militant ali levičar dobil besede.

Le Philipu Randolphu, predsedniku Sleeping Car Porters unije, se je prve dni posrečilo, da je dobil besedo in predlagal izključitev vsake unije iz federacije, ki diskriminira proti črncem. Green je pa tudi njega izmaneviral, ko je po prvem glasovanju, ki je izpadlo ugodno za predlog, ponovno odprl debato z rezultatom, da je bil predlog pri ponovnem glasovanju poražen, čeprav je bilo to proti vsakemu parlamentarnemu redu.

Od tedaj je stara garda skrbela, da so govorili le "odgovorni" delegati. Progressivni element je bil brez "mašine" in že vsled tega porinjen v zadnjo klop.

Kljub temu je pa konvencija pokazala precej agresivnosti. Proti fašizmu je zavzela še bolj sovražno in odločno stališče kakor lanska konvencija. Do tega je nedvomno dosti pripomogel Walter M. Citrine, tajnik britskega Kongresa strokovnih unij in predsednik strokovne internacionale. Njegov mojsterski govor je na delegate napravil mogočen vtis.

Konvencija je tudi viharno aplaudirala Greenovim besedam, s katerimi je rekel, da je delavstvo v polni meri pripravljeno posluževati se stavk za izvojevanje svojih pravic in da se ne bo nikdar podalo tiranom. Konvencija je bila konservativno militantna. Z Ameriško legijo ni pretrgala stikov in je celo zavrgla resolucijo proti dejanju legionarjev v zadnji generalni stavki v tem mestu. Ni pa delala tako globokih poklonov legiji kakor na prejšnjih konvencijah.

Pri dveh najbolj perečih vprašanjih — o industrijskem unionizmu in povečanju eksekutive — so se izvršili boji in sklenili kompromisi za kulisami. Na oboje so voditelji močnih konservativnih unij, na primer Tobin od voznikov in Hutcheson od tesarjev, pristali, ko jim je bil zagotovljen sedež v povečani eksekutivi.

S povečanjem eksekutive se njena kvaliteta ni dosti izboljšala. Namesto 11 konservativnih delavskih voditeljev zdaj šteje 17 starogardistov in enega unije, pravi T. F. Murphy, tajnik unije mlekarskih delavcev v okraju Westchester.

Ogrski rudarji prišli iz Dr. Pavliča, voditelja teroristov, iščejo povsod

Pet dni gladovne stavke in grožnje masnega samomora jim je prineslo več mezde

Pečuh, Ogrska, 16. okt.—1200 rudarjev, ki so pet dni stavkali pod zemljo z gladom in žejo in zagrozili, da raje umrejo v jami, kakor da bi še nadalje delali izstradan, so danes zjutraj začeli prihajati na površje, ko jim je tajnik njihove organizacije prinesel vest, da so se lastniki premogovnika podali. Družba je kapitulirala pod pritiskom javnega mnenja, ko se je vsa javnost zavzela za nesrečne rudarje in njih družine. Družba je obljubila rudarjem en dan več dela v tednu in tri dolarje več plače čez zimo.

Nekateri rudarji so bili tako slabi, ko so jih privedli na površje, da niso mogli hoditi in nekateri so se obnašali kakor blazni; drugi so planili kakor volkovi na jed, katero so jim prinesle žene. Bati se je, da je nekaj rudarjev podleglo v jami. Zunaj jame so stale vojaške čete s strojnimi, toda niso bile potrebne.

Rudarji so držali besedo, da edino zmaga jih privede iz jame, drugače jih prinesejo ven mrtve. Vsi apeli in grožnje vlade, družbe in drugih niso nič pomagale. Sinoči je obiskal rudarje v jami socialistični poslanec Janoš Estergaljov in ko se je vrnil, je dejal, da takih prizorov ni še nikdar videl. Stavkarji so bili napol mrtvi in napol blazni in hekatere, bolj desperatne so sami privezali k stebrom, da se niso usmrtili; mnogo je bilo nezavestnih vsled strašne žeje.

Tako nato je rudarska unija naredila mogočen pritisk na Podonavsko parobrodno družbo, ki poseduje premogovnike in družba se je podala. Družba je pod kontrolo angleških in avstrijskih kapitalistov.

Pariz, 16. okt.—Silvester Zalni ali Malni, ki je spremljal atentatorja Kalemena v Marselj in drugi dan po umoru kralja Aleksandra ušel žandarjem, ko so ga hoteli prijeti na švicarski meji, je večerj padel v roke policiji v Melunu. Zalni, ves sestradan, je prišel iz gozdov, kjer se je skrival, v gostilno in se dobro najedel. Ko pa je dal natakarku visoko napitnino, je postal sumljiv in natakark je poklical policijo. Begun se je podal brez upora.

Francoška policija še vedno išče Egona Kvaternika in Marijo Vudrihovo, ki sta v zvezi s teroristi. Iz Zeneve poročajo, da je tudi švicarska policija zelo aktivna z zasledovanjem sumljivih hrvaških in macedonskih emigrantov. Dognano je, da so se teroristi, ki so imeli nalogo ubiti Aleksandra, najprej sešli v Curihu v Švici, kjer jih je čakal njihov vodja. Kdo je vodja, ni še danes znano javnosti, splošno domnevanje pa je, da je to dr. Ante Pavlič, ki je bil zadnje čase v Italiji, a tik pred atentatom je nekam izginil. Policija ga išče po vsej zapadni in srednji Evropi.

Drugi, ki ga skrbno iščejo, je Gustav Perčec. O njem pripovedujejo, da je na Ogrskem vezbal hrvaške teroriste v streljanju in metanju bomb.

Iz Beograda je prišla vest, da so tamkaj spoznali v Petru Kalemenu macedonskega vstaša, ki se je pisal Vlada Jurjev Černozevec.

Francija pošlje vse prijete osumilce v Jugoslavijo čim se ugotovi, da so bili v zvezi z umorom kralja Aleksandra.

Hauptmann je bil zaslišan v razpravi, ki ima odločiti, če je newjerseyska obtožnica dovolj podprta, da upravičuje izročitev obtoženca sodnim oblastem države New Jersey. Generalni pravdnik države New Jersey, David T. Wilentz, je direktno vprašal Hauptmanna, če je ubil otroka, Hauptmann je pa s svoj ženo in drugimi pričami dokazoval, da je bil v noči 1. marca 1932, ko je bil Lindberghov otrok uropan, nekje drugje v New Yorku.

Toda njih posebna lega ob površju, njih zveze s prebavnimi in dihalnimi organi in končno dejstvo, da pošiljajo skozi sluznico stalno brezbarvna krvna telesa v ustno votlino, nam kažejo, da imajo bezgavke še posebne naloge. Posebno ulogo morajo imeti v mladih letih, kajti pozneje polagoma okrnevajo. Kakšna bi bila ta posebna uloga, še ni natančno znano, gotovo pa je, da s svojo tekočino, ki je usmerjena v usta, uničujejo bolezenske kalli. Danes smatrajo mnogi bezgavke naravnost za vhodna vrata raznih bolezenskih klic, a če tako slabo opravljajo svojo glavno nalogo, si lahko razlagamo tudi s tem, da so iz tega ali onega razloga obolele in izgubile svojo zaščitno moč.

polagati okoli uda in hladijo bolj enakomerno. Včasih je potrebno, da se vrečica ne položi neposredno na bolno mesto, temveč da se obesi tako nad njim, da se le rahlo dotika kože. Mehur z ledom leži lahko neposredno na koži, a bolje je, da damo vmes tenko flanelo ali kos gaze. Na koži leži potem toliko časa, da dosežemo omilitve bolečine, kar se zgodi po 15 ali 30 minutah — če to z ledom sploh lahko dosežemo. Bolnik naj bi nikoli ne zaspal z ledom na sebi. Zelo prijeten učinek ima led na glavi pri vnetju možganske mreže. V mnogih primerih se uporabljala led sugestivno. Pri pljučni krvavitvi polagamo led n. pr. nad vršičke ne zato, ker bi to krvavitve ustavilo, temveč zato, da se bolnik vede mirneje. Glavni namen polaganja ledu je pač ublažitev bolečin.

SE EN ODKRITELJ BACILA RAKA. Francoski zdravnik dr. Revelis pravi, da je odkril bacil raka pred prof. Brehmerjem. Diskuzija o vprašanju, ali se je berlinskemu dr. von Brehmerju res posrečilo odkriti povzročitelja raka ali ne, še ni zaključena, kljub temu pa se že oglašajo učenjaki, ki si lasti prioriteto v tej zadevi. Ta zdravnik je Parizan Louis Revelis in pravi, da se je njemu že pred Brehmerjem posrečilo enako odkritje. O najdenem bacilu raka je tedaj poročal francoski Akademiji znanosti.

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ZALOSTEN KONEC ZALOSTNIH JUNAKOV. Konec avstrijskega krščanskega socializma. Vak član naše organizacije ima pravico imenovati za dediče svoje zavarovalnine one, ki pridejo v smislu predpisane določbe zakona v poštev in te pravice se članom ne more odreči. Vendar smatramo za potrebno člane opozoriti na gotova dejstva, ki se v vsakem primeru pojavijo po njihovi smrti in dedičem pokojnih povzročajo znanosti.

Tako na primer v nekaterih slučajih še opazimo, da soprogi in ali žena in mati v svoji oporoki imenujeta za dediče tudi otroci, imenovani v certifikatu kot dediči, polnoletni ob času smrti očeta ali matere, je stvar enostavna, izplača se jim delež dediščine, ki so predloženi vsi zadevni papirji kot jih predpisujejo zakoni. Drugo vprašanje pa je, če so taki otroci še nedoletni. Tedaj, prej ko sme jednota izplačati njihovo zapuščino, mora biti strokom postavljen "varuh" (guardian), pa če tudi oče ali mati živita.

V teh slučajih so redki oni, ki pustijo denar nedoletnih v oskrbi dedičev do njih polnoletnosti, ker ga večini primanjkuje, toda v mnogih primerih ga more samo, kot že omenjeno, od sodišča postavljeni varuh, kar se pa ne da izvesti brez stroškov, pa če je tudi postavljen strok hitro so slabše je pa tam, kjer je za tako mesto imenovan tujec, ali kot zahteva zakon države Pennsylvania—kjer ima dedičina največ članov—Trust kompanije, katere ne storijo niti ena stopinje brez odškodnine na račun deleža dediča.

Ker naši člani niso posebno visoko zavarovani, je potrebno paziti pri oporoki, tako da se dediči obvarujejo vsakih nepotrebnih stroškov, jim v več slučajih baš veliko ne ostane. Če mož in oče, ki je živ, zaupa vzgojo otrok ženi, materi, ni razloga zakaj bi se ne zaupal tudi po smrti in napravil vso smrtnino nanjo, ali ženi ali materji. Ako so otroci nedoletni in dediči smrtnine, pa naj se ostanejo v oskrbi matere ali očeta, če bo ta brez sredstev, bo prisiljen eden kot drugi zahtevati njihov delež. Zakaj povzročati nepotrebne stroške, ker je zato izhod kot omenjeno?

Njih telesa so najboljše kemiki beljakovin na svetu. Ta reakcija je tako natančna, da ne razlikuje samo beljakovin posameznih človeških vrst, temveč celo beljakovine posameznih organov. Kri "ve", dali smo ji primešali beljakovine iz jeter, možganov, vranice, mišice ali katerekoli organa ter ustvari v vsakem primeru specifične razkrojne fermente proti jetrom, možganom, vranici itd. Prof. Abderhalden pa je odkril, da razlikuje ta reakcija celo starostno stanje beljakovine.

Postopek je v principu zelo preprost. Poskusnemu kuncu vbrizgamo beljakovine mladega človeka. V kuncevi krvi se bodo tvorili razkrojni fermenti, ki so protivni specialno mladi človeški beljakovini. Če sedaj primešamo krvi ali seči tako prepariranega kuncve beljakovine mladega človeka, se bo ta hitreje razkrajala nego beljakovina organsko starejšega človeka. Na ta način lahko ugotovimo, dali izvira beljakovina od otroka, mladega, zrelega, starejšega ali

Letos 9. julija je dr. Revelis po lastni izjavi predložil Akademiji natančen opis bacila, ki povzroča raka ter je tudi opisal njegovo kemično sestavo. Že lani v decembru, pravi Revelis, se mi je posrečilo vcepiti poskusnim živalim bacil raka in tako povzročiti rakaste oteklino. Poleg tega meni dr. Revelis, da je iznašel tudi serum proti raku. Pri poskusih na miših se je serum zadovoljivo obnesel. Revelis pravi, da je bacil raka v mnogem sličen bacilu tuberkuloze.

Our Growth in September

More Than 2300 New Members in Seven Months

Our production for the month of September, seventh month of the SNPJ Jubilee Membership Campaign, has come up to our expectations when 268 certificates were issued to our new members. Of this number—151 are new adult members and 117 new juvenile members.

During the seven months of the campaign 2384 new members were initiated into the Society; 1324 adults and 1060 juveniles.

It is evident that the drive will come up to our expectation and hit the 3000 mark by the end of the campaign. That is our goal—to reach that number, so that the campaign will bring in a total number of three thousand or more new members before its conclusion, Dec. 31. We hope to reach that number, and with the help of our enthusiastic and energetic young men and young women we certainly will.

In September, Lodge 641 of Euclid, O., and Lodge 680 of Verona, Pa., procured the greatest number of adult members. Both of these two lodges belong to the younger group. It is the third and fourth time that English Speaking lodges gained the highest number of newly-acquired members in one month. On two previous occasions it was Lodge 699 of Ambridge, Pa.

Lodge 295 of Bridgeville, Pa., succeeded in September in securing the greatest number of juvenile members, while Lodge 464 of Midland, Pa., captured second place for that department. This indicates that our campaign workers were most active in Pennsylvania and Ohio. Will the lodges located in other sectors of the country lag behind, or will they surprise us in the two remaining months of the campaign?

And now for the final goal—three thousand new members by the end of the year. Remember that a good word spoken now and then to your friends about the SNPJ, will help greatly to reach our goal—3000 new members by Dec. 31, 1934. Your effort will help us in attaining our expected growth during the remaining two months of the jubilee campaign. With your united help we can not only reach the set goal but even surpass it.

The 30-Hour Week

The demand of the American Federation of Labor for a 30-hour work week has dethroned the "liberals" who would like to one foot on the Labor band wagon and rest of their bodies on the Capitalist system.

Thus we find the "liberal" Philadelphia Record telling Labor that its plan will work, that "manufacturers simply are in a position to pay for the decreased efficiency of having more men do less work."

The fact of the matter is that, considering itself, the 30-hour week is of doubtful value. Today there are many millions of people who have a no-work week and whose living standards have not been perceptibly elevated by increase of their leisure. Something other than lowering working hours must be done if the workers of this nation are going to attain the prosperity and security which America's great productive resources could easily provide.

What must be done is indicated in the Record's objection. It is true that private industry cannot stand the added expense of a systematized economy under government control. Therefore, the thing to do is to demand that the government take over the industries, eliminate competition and provide for use and not at all for private profit.

While Socialists aim to free the workers from the slavery of private Capitalism, they are bound to admit that workers are presently inconsistent in their demands. Therefore wrong. That is the case when workers demand increased leisure and still tolerate upon a competitive economic system which is conducted for private profit.

If the owning class is to get the benefits of machine production, then workers simply must not have it. Conversely, if workers are to receive those benefits in the way of shorter hours and longer living standards, then they must forget altogether about the profit of the owners.

In short, the time has come for workers to demand that industry be socialized. Under a socialized economy a shorter work week will be logical. For then human activities could be systematized, the wastes of competition could be eliminated, wealth could be produced for the benefit of the producers and labor could be based upon the needs and desires of the people rather than upon the profit-advances of employers.

It's just too bad that organized workers refuse to go all the way by demanding complete abolition of the profit system. For by refusing to do so—and to organize to provide for use instead of for profit—they give substance to such objections to needed reforms as the Record now offers.

A Poor-Farm

If you want an example of the effect of absentee ownership under capitalism on a large scale, consider the case of the upper peninsula of Michigan. It is beautiful country, sportsman's paradise, once enormously rich in timber, copper and iron. Yet not merely a playground of our Socialist comrades but one of the directors of relief told me that the upper peninsula bade fair to become a glorified poor farm with from 40% to 80% of the people on relief in desperate need of relief before the onset of the winter and no satisfactory work prospects in sight. Most of the wealth of the peninsula has been taken away by absentee owners. The timber barons devastated the prime forest with no thought of scientific reforestation. Then the iron and copper mine owners, most of whom live in Boston and New York in Cleveland, Buffalo and Detroit, took their toll. Timber is slowly growing up again, vigorous demand may yet open the iron mines.

The fate of the deep copper mines, in the face of South African and South American competition, is more doubtful. Meanwhile Michigan is like an orange squeezed dry by its absentee owners. I found, however, considerable awakening among the school teachers and I met some fine Socialist comrades. report that Comrade Larsen, our candidate for Governor, is making an excellent campaign.
