Italija spet steguje roke po Slovenskem primorju

Italija je bila članica NATO in je uradno uživala vso podporo te vojaško-obrambne skupnosti. Italijanske čete so bile oborožene z ameriškim orožjem in strelivom, NATO oborožene sile so jim bile trdno zaledje, saj so imele ZDA in Velika Britanija v samem Trstu še vedno skupno 10,000 vojakov.

Jugoslavija se je potem, ko jo je Stalin pognal junija 1948 iz Komuniforme, začela pomirjati z Zahodom in iskati boljše odnose s tremi velikimi zahodnimi silami. Te so ji pomagale z gospodarsko in vojaško pomočjo, da se je obdržala in se mogla uspešno upirati sovjetskemu pritisku. ZDA so dobavile Jugoslaviji večje količine orožja in druge opreme, da bi jo usposobile za odporn proti morebitnemu sunku v vzhoda. Sedaj se je to ameriško orožje v jugoslovanskih rokah pojabilo na italijanski meji proti sličnemu orožju, ki so ga ZDA dobavile Italiji.

Ameriški državni tajnik John F. Dulles je zato 27. oktobra izjavil, da zaveznički ne bodo izpolnili svoje namere takoj, ampak bodo počakali, da pride do dogovora med prizadetimi. Kriza je začela popuščati in v Londonu so se začela pogajanja, ki so se končala 5. oktobra 1954 z "londonškim sporazumom". V tem je bilo Svobodno tržaško ozemlje razdeljeno med Italijo in Jugoslavijo v glavnem tako, da je Italija dobila cono A s Trstom, Jugoslavija pa cono B z nekaj malimi popravki razmejitve med obema conama v korist Jugoslavije. Dodaten sporazum je zagotovil slovenski narodni manjšini na Tržaškem njene narodnostne in kulturne pravice. Jugoslavija pa je dobila tudi dodatno ameriško gospodarsko pomoč.

Londonški sporazum je bil očitno veliko ugodnejši za Italijo kot za Jugoslavijo. To je razumljivo, če pomislimo, da je bila Italija članica NATO skupaj z ZDA in Veliko Britanijo, Jugoslavija pa komunistična država, ki je kljub svojemu sporu z Moskvo še vedno neprestano gledala proti vzhodu in poudarjala svojo zvestobo komunizmu. Leta nato je prišel Hruščev v Beograd in se pomiril s Titom.

Londonški sporazum je Svobodno tržaško ozemlje razdelil, ni pa uradno spremenil pariške mirovne pogodbe med zavezničkimi v Italijo leta 1947. V tej pogodbi se je Italija odpovedala vsem svojim pravicam do Svobodnega tržaškega ozemlja, njena suverenost nad njim je tedaj pravno prenehala in ni bila nikdar obnovljena. Pravno Svobodno tržaško ozemlje še vedno obstaja, ker pariška mirovna pogodba iz leta 1947 ni bila uradno nikdar spremenjena.

To velja seveda tudi za Jugoslavijo. Tudi Jugoslavija je le dejanski gospodar cone B Svobodnega tržaškega ozemlja, pravno pa ne, četudi jo je priključila SR Sloveniji in jo smatra za njen neločljiv del.

Londonški sporazum oktobra 1954 je bil mišljen kot končni sporazum, ki naj spravi s sveta mejne spore med Italijo in Jugoslavijo ter ustvari možnost za razvoj mirnih in dobrih sosedskih odnosov med njima.

Cetudi so se italijanski nacionalisti ponovno oglašali s svojimi zahtevami po Istri in je zunanjji minister Aldo Moro pred let celo izjavil v parlamentu, da cone B Italija SFRJ uradno ni priznala, so bili v Beogradu in v Ljubljani mirni in zadružani, nihče ni več zahteval Trsta, geslo "Življenje damo, Trsta ne damo!" je bilo že davno pozabljeno. Odnos med obema državama so se kar lepo urejevali in meja med Italijo in Jugoslavijo je bila ena najbolj odprtih meja med kako komunistično in nekomunistično državo.

Med obema državama se je razvila obsežna trgovina in gospodarsko sodelovanje, ki prinaša koristi obema. Skozi skoraj 20 let je bilo na tej meji mirno sožitje in Jugoslaviani so v množicah prihajali v Trst kupovat blago, ki ga doma niso imeli ali so mislili, da ga nimajo.

Italija je v svoji noti od 11. marca 1974 zapisala, da se "jugoslovanska suverenost nikoli ni razširila na italijansko ozemlje, označeno kot cona B neunesničenega Svobodnega tržaškega ozemlja".

Iz teh besed je očitno, da smatra Italija cono B še vedno za "italijansko ozemlje". Razumljivo je, da je moral Beograd protestirati, kar je storil v, kot že omenjeno, dosti pohlevni noti 15. marca 1974.

S svojo trditvijo je Italija v nasprotju tako z mirovno pogodbo v Parizu kot z londonškim sporazumom. Res je, da jugoslovanska suverenost ni bila nikdar pravno raztegnjena na cono B Svobodnega tržaškega ozemlja, toda italijanska suverenost je nad vsem Svobodnim tržaškim ozemljem prenchala 16. septembra 1947 in ni bila nikdar obnovljena.

Če si torej lasti sedaj Italija suvereno pravico nad cono B, si jo z enako pravico lasti Jugoslavija nad cono A.

Končno je bil Trst skozi stoletja pristanišče zaledja, del Avstrije, povezan s slovenskimi deželami, katerim se je ob koncu srednjega veka sam priključil, ko se je čutil ogroženega od italijanskih Benetk. Sam ustanovitelj moderne Italije in njen zedinitelj Cavour je svaril italijanske nacionaliste, ki so hrepeneče že tedaj gledali proti Trstu, Istri in Dalmaciji, da Italija s strogo narodnega vidika nima nič iskati na vzhodni obali spodnjega Tilmenta.

Italija je sprožila mejni spor z Jugoslavijo verjetno iz notranjepolitičnih vzrokov, razmre tam niso ravno rožnate, ko se pripravljajo na ljudsko glasovanje o potrditvi ali razveljavitvi zakona o zakonskih ločitvah, ni pa izključeno, da je pri tem mislila tudi na evropsko varnostno konferenco, ki naj bi uzakonila vse sedanje meje v Evropi, torej tudi jugoslovansko-italijansko. Moskva pritiska, da bi bila konferenca končana že letos in išče podporo za to med drugim tudi v Washingtonu, v Rimu po vsem sodeč tem predlogom niso naklonjeni.

Franca Puca st. iz Westmonta, Ill.: "Pravkar sem dobil obvestilo — 15.30 je ura —, da je p. Lojze Demšar 5. marca umrl v Borovnici. Pokopan 7. t.m. v Ljubljani. Brat p. Janko je pa tudi v Bolnici. Pozdrav F. Puc." (15. marca 1974.)

Upam, da bomo o rajnem brali kaj več lahko izpod peresa kakega njegovega sošolca ali dolgoletnega dobrotnika. Pred menoj je cela vrsta zanimivih pisem, v katerih o Lojze razglasljiva in kramlja o mnogočem. Ko mu je srce odpovedalo, je 21. sept. 1972 sporočil iz Kharjija v Indiji: "Postal sem nesposoben za misijonsko življenje in me bodo vzel iz aktivnega dela ter poslali za eno leto na popolni počitek kam v Kalkutto ali drugam. Sem se menda preveč gnal in garal čez moči, pa je šlo! Zdravnik mi je rekel, da sem si srce pokvaril, leva stran ne deluje več. Dve zaklopki sta 'out of order', ena še nekako vleče in črpa kri iz srca, a druga pa pušča, in ta stvar se vsak mesec širi in širi, dokler vse ne bo spuščalo... Treba bo misliti na večni mir in pokoj!

Kaj hočemo, imel sem dela čez glavo, pa sem ga hotel storiti in pomagati dušam. Dve fari lahko oskrbovali, in to v taki vročini, kot je bila letos. Štiri mesece nisem mogel spati ponči. Samo sapo sem lovil vsako noč, pri oknu sedeč, ob hladni sapici. Mislil sem, da je le vročina in nadaljeval sem delo kot prej. Pa je le bilo preveč in šel sem k zdravniku, ki mi je rekel, da sem si zdravje pokvaril in da ni več pomoči. Počasi bo šlo dol. Sicer je dal zdravila, pa nič ne pomagajo. In na koncu je rekel, da rabim celo leto popolnega počitka in zato bom šel v 2 tednih v St. Xavier's College, v Kalkutto, kjer bo sedaj moj novi naslov. Kako dolgo bom tam, ve samo Bog. Torej čez dva tedna odhajam in mlat Indijec iz Krale bo moje delo prevzel. Torej Bog z Vami in Bog plačaj za vso Vašo ljubezen in pomoč, v teh dolgih letih mojega misijonskega življenja. Bog z Vami in Mati Marija, Vaš hvaležni Lojze Demšar."
