Angleški bombniki strahovito napadajo italijanske postojanke po Libiji. Bombardirali so glavna italijanska pristanišča v Afriki, Bardia in Tobruk.

30,000 ITALIJANOV JE ŽE ZAJETIH

Kairo, 13. dec. — Angleški avijacičarji so poleteli globoko v Libijo in bombardirali italijanske postojanke, zrakoplovne pristanišča, zlasti pa obe glavni pristanišči Bardia in Tobruk. Angleška armada pa brez postanka pritiska za Italijane in jih podi iz egyptovske ozemlja. Zajeli so nadaljnje tisoče italijanskih vojakov včeraj, med njimi dva generala. Vsega skupaj so Angleži zajeli že nad 30,000 Italijanov.

Ob tem času se še ne ve, če bodo Angleži samo izgnali Italijane iz Egipta, ali bodo šli za njimi preko meje v italijansko Libijo. Kakor se sudi, bi bil zdaj ugoden čas, da se podi Italijane kar naprej, ko so že v galopu.

Angleška armada v Afriki, ki se stoji iz utrjenih čet Angležev, Avstralcev, Novo Zelandcev, Indcev, Poljakov in Francozov, je že več tednov godrnjala radi brezdelja. Zato se je pa zdaj radostno vrgla na Italijane, ko je prišlo povelje za naskok.

Iz te ofensive se pripravuje sledenje zanimivem dogodku. Nek angleški bojni tank, ki je zasledoval Italijane, je postal po radiju na poveljstvo sledenje nujno prošnjo: "Okrog mene je 500 Italijanov, ki vsi mole roke krišku. Toda sam jih ne bom more dolgo držati. Pošljite naglo nekaj infanterije, da mi jih odvzame!"

Miss Frances Knezic, 2258 Lexington Ave, was married recently to Mr. John Ribich, 3112 Norfolk Ave, in St. Vitus Church of Lorain, O.

Mr. Klancar just recently published his "Who's Who Among the Yugoslavs in Cleveland and Environs." All his experience in compiling this work, which is the first of its kind among the nationalities groups in Cleveland, will go into the making of his new work.

"I would like to get the co-operation of every professional, cultural and business man, so that the work I am undertaking now will not omit one single person who deserves to be in the directory. My directory will list every club, society and organization and their officers. It needs the help of every Yugoslav in the City of Greater Cleveland," said Mr. Klancar.

The ceremony, witnessed by scores of clergy, Ursuline Sisters, many of them former teachers, and hundreds of parishioners and friends, was the first important step realized by the parish in its great undertaking—the building of a new church. The church is rapidly nearing completion and is expected to be dedicated during the early part of 1941.

The new \$90,000 edifice located on the site of the old church is of the Tudor-Gothic type and will have a steeple. It will seat 600 people in the church proper and 100 in the choir.

The frame building which the new church replaces was more than 50 years old. During the early years of 1870 and 1880, mass was celebrated in private homes, the history of the parish reveals. As the population of the Village of Girard gradually increased, it was found necessary to build a church which was begun around 1891, under the leadership of a committee of men, the pioneer organizers. The late Rev James J. Stewart came from Cleveland, Ohio, to serve as first pastor, remaining for 18 years. He was succeeded by the Right Rev Monsignor Edward A. Kirby who was pastor for 15 years and under whom the school building was completed. Msgr Kirby is at St Cecilia's Church in Cleveland, Ohio. Rev. Michael J. Coan who came to serve as pastor in 1923 succeeded Msgr Kirby. Our assistant pastor is Rev. George P. Murphy.
