## Dvajsetletnica sara-jevskega umora

Jutri poteče 20 let, odkar je v Sarajevu počil strel, ki je izval svetovno vojno

Dvajset let! Dne 28. junija 1914 je Gavro Princip, član tajne srbske nacionalistične organizacije, v Sarajevu ustrelil avstro-ogrškega kronprinca nadvojvoda Franca Ferdinandina in njegovo ženo. Mesec dni kasneje je vlada Avstro-Ogrske naslovila ultimat na Srbijo. Dva dni pozneje je Avstro-Ogrska napovedala vojno Srbiji. Srbija je apelirala na Rusijo za pomoč. Ruski car je odredil mobilizacijo petih vojnih zborov. Nemški cesar Viljem je takoj poslal ultimat carju, nakar je sledila napoved vojne. Tedaj je Francija napovedala vojno Nemčiji. Nemške čete so udarile skozi Belgijo proti Franciji, nakar je Anglija napovedala vojno Nemčiji. Pet dni so švigli ultimati in vojne napovedi sem in tja in pet velesil je skočilo v pokolj. Ki je trajal štiri leta in štiri mesece. Leta in leta so se velesile pripravljale na ta pokolj: Gavro Princip je le sprožil pravljeni vzmet.

Dvajset let zdaj poteka od teh epohalnih dogodkov—in posledice strašne svetovne vojne, največje v zgodovini do danes, so še vedno tu. Dva strela sta počila v Sarajevu in ta dva strela sta zapalila ves svet imperialističnih sil, ki so že komaj čakale. Prvimi državami, ki so se spopadale, so kmalu sledile Turčija, Italija, Japonska in končno Združene države poleg cele vrste manjših državic. Dvanajst milijonov mož je bilo ubitih na bojiščih in osem milijonov mož, žena in otrok je umrlo v zaledjih vsled lakote in bolezni. Vojna — katero so imenovali "vojna za demokracijo in za odporno vojno" — je uničila štiri cesarstva, razbila avstro-ogrško monarhijo, prinesla celo kopico novih, nacionalnih držav in državic ter povzročila v carski Rusiji socialno revolucijo, iz katere se je porodila prva proletarska država.

Vojna "za demokracijo in odpravo vojne" je razlila morje človeške krvi in uničila za 150 milijard dolarjev človeškega dela—danes je pa na svetu manj demokracije kakor pred to vojno in priprave za novo vojno so stokrat večje kakor so bile prej! Zakaj? Zato, ker stupidne in krivočene sile, ki so provocirale pred dvajsetimi leti svetovno vojno, še danes vladajo pet šestinstik sveta...

Preiskava na parniku glede Podržajeve afere

Podržajeva kabina na Olympicu bo korenito preiskana

New York. — Policijska preiskava v New Yorku v zadnji izginole Agnes Tufversonove, ameriške neveste slovenskega inženirja Ivana Podržaja, se zdaj raztegne na angleški parnik Olympic, na katerem je Podržaj odpotoval iz New Yorka 20. decembra 1933. Omenjeni parnik je pristal v newyorkski luki 26. junija in preiskava se je takoj začela.

Policija bo zaslišala moštvo parnika in sploh vse osebe na parniku, ki so imelo kak dotikljaj s Podržajem. Kolikor je doslej znano, je Podržaj imel s seboj štiri velike kovčuge, ko je odpotoval v Anglijo in ves čas na morju je prebil v svoji kabini. Ameriška policija sumi, da je Podržaj usmrtil svojo ameriško ženo, razsekal njen truplo v kose, jih stlačil v kovčeg in jih potem zmetal v morje skozi okno svoje kabine.

Angleška policija je zadnje dni obvestila newyorkško policijo, da je v zadnjem aprili Podržaj osleparil nekega Johna McKenna in več drugih oseb v Londonu za \$6350 pri izmenjanju dolarjev.

Commendable and necessary as is insuring of adult lives by fraternal associations, it is in my opinion surpassed in importance by insurance for the children thus learn the essential necessity of preserving the interests of the individual and the social and moral truths exemplified in the juvenile ritual impresses itself far more firmly, on the tender and immature mind, than that of the mature man or woman, because of the zest and interest of youth. Every junior lodge should have a rector of high moral and intellectual character, preferably a woman, for, after all, the ninies need the motherly sympathy and influence of a woman, who is always in the natural sphere of activity in instructing the dren, and proves far more satisfactory man.

Every juvenile lodge should stress the value of business; "good of the order," and this caption there should be discussion of personal experiences of the members of the lodge, which will result in inculcating a sense of social and fraternal interest among the members that will arouse the best in their expression and performance. Reciting of these experiences of home, local community will call attention to incidents of happy thought, that will lead to golden deeds of meritorious performance of this will naturally come real inspiration to an awakened conscience, for desire to do and to zealously excel in the social and natural work of the order . . .

### Respects for Rights of Others

In these days of increased crime and social problems, it is absolutely necessary that the youth of the country should have the benefit of capable guidance. The best source of such direction and advice can be given through the juvenile fraternal lodge system, where the child learns the lessons of group cooperation and the ability of co-operation of all in life, for the common good and welfare of all. These experiences of the youth room are of a practical as well as of a spiritual quality. They represent the day that the Scotch poet, Robert Burns, predicted "When man to man the world o'er brithers be for 'a that," is approaching inevitably. If this universal brotherhood comes to realization, it must owe its inspiration to the juvenile fraternal organization for they alone can make it a reality. The room is the one place where juvenile adults alike meet upon a common level, this is conducive to the teaching of the respect for the rights of others, in the spirit of human tolerance, that tends to a common cause.

Yours will be for 'a that,' is approaching inevitably. We now possess as a result of less than a century of labor, over one million children that have been garnered in the sacred bonds of fraternity, and the field is vast that this first million has scarcely scratched the surface of the unlimited future prospects and possibilities. When we enroll children, we render at once a valuable service to the fraternal cause, for the members of today will be the adult members of tomorrow.

## The Reveliers' Column

Ambridge, Pa.—Knowing that writing of the society's membership campaign is a likely subject to elicit at least a few readers' attentions, I'm going to mention the progress being made by the Reveliers in this respect.

This recital is more for the purpose of adding to the interest attached by the society to the campaign at hand.
