C. Lausche Hits 278 High Game, 759 Singles; Lausche Team Hit 1402 in Doubles

Val Ferluga Clouts 585 in Singles; Clairwood Girls Regain Team Event Prize With 2322 Pins

Smashing the maples with amazing regularity, the France Prešeren, Clairwood and E. Star teams returned home with the bacon from the Third Annual S. D. Z. Bowling Tournament.



Singles and doubles event honors were well taken care of by the Lausches, Kogoy, Rose Millavec and Val Ferluga.

An interesting point of the tourney is the fact that all bowlers who participated in at least two events will be eligible for prizes ranging from \$1 to \$10.

In the three days of the Third Annual classic, 939 lines were rolled. This set a new record in SDZ bowling annals.

Your columnist brings you highlights of the SDZ Bowling Tournament held at Clairwood Alleys at a glance.

The tournament began with a terrific pace set by the France Prešeren bowlers. The 3078 total pins garnered by the No. 17 lodge cinched first place money, the first day of the tourney.

The all events prize money was gobbled up by Charley Lausche who totaled 2049 maples in his three events. He also inserted a high game of 278. He missed a perfect game, when he spared in the sixth frame.

Barth Alich also scored a 278 game that helped him place second in the singles event with a 693 series. He teamed up with F. Udovic and finished fourth in this event.

Joe Kogoy's 696 in the singles event was worth \$10.00, that being the first prize. He added \$5.00 more when he finished second in the all events.

Harold Lausche's 617 score placed him sixth in the singles event. He came in for a share of the all events money with a grand total of 1879 and third place. Teaming with Charley in the doubles, the brothers walked away with the honors in this event with a 1402 score.

Max Traven won a little bet when the Clairwood girls defeated the Supreme Board team that consisted of Mr. Ponikvar, Mr. Okorn, Mr. Shuster, Mr. Surtz and Mrs. Yerman.

Additional scores in the girls' events were: Clairwoods 2322 for first place in the team event. In the doubles Frieda Breskvar and J. Strobel garnered 918 pins for first place. Rose Millavec and Jean Skander totaled 898 for second place. Marie Messe and Min Kogoy finished third with an 897 score.

After bowling their doubles event, Jack Nagel and Stanley Robinhood started to warmup for next year's tournament. They rolled about 18 more games that afternoon. The Supreme Board team took no chances with the Clairwood girls' team.
