

SENZACIONALNO IZDAJSTVO NOR- VEŠKE ODKRITO

Zveza med izdajalcji in
nemškimi špioni
MAJOR NIELSEN OD-
STAVLJEN

Stockholm, Švedska, 16. apr.
Povest, ki pojasnjuje naglo
nacionalno osvajitev Oslo, glavne
norveškega mesta, vseh važ-
nih pristanišč in strategičnih
trdnjav na 9. aprila, je
bila pravkar razkrita. Norveški
prebivalci so bili prav tako pre-
senečeni kot so bili Belgiji l.
1914 in mnogi še sedaj ne mo-
rejo razumeti velike tragedije,
ki jih je zadeba zaradi izdaj-
stva.

Glavno norveško mesto in
važna pristanišča niso bila osvo-
jena z oboroženo silo. Nemci so
jih zasedli z bliškovočno naglico s
sodelovanjem norveških zarotni-
kov in izdajalcev. Ta zaraota, iz-
vedena z veliko predzravnostjo, se
ne more primerjati z nobeno
drugim v zadnjem stoletju.

Hitlerjevi agenti in špioni
so podkupili več visokih norve-
ških civilnih in vojaških uradni-
kov. Ko je prišla usodna ura, so
topovi na norveških utrdbah in
bojni ladji utihnili. Absolut-
na kontrola v rokah malega šte-
vila zarotnikov je omogočila na-
cijko okupacijo norveških pristi-
anišč in strategičnih trdnjav.

Zaraota je bila 90 odstotkov učin-
kovita. V nekaj urah so Nemci
nasledili Oslo, Bergen in Narvik,
tri glavna norveška pristanišča.

Vidkum Quisling, vodja nor-
veške nacija stranke, je bil v
Berlinu, ko je kovala zaraota
nemške okupacije Norve-
ške. V Oslo se je vrnil 6. aprila,
tri dni pozneje pa so Hitlerjeve
ete udile v to mesto in ga za-
sedile. Quisling je bil po nemški
invaziji imenovan za predsednika
takozvane narodne vlade, ko
so člani norveške vlade in kralj
Haakon pobegnili iz Oslo.

Vrhovno poveljstvo norveške
armade je sinoči odstavilo ma-
jorja Hochha Nielsena, poveljnja-
ka trdnjave Kongsvinger, ki le-
že severnozahodno od Oslo, in v
bilini Švedske meje, ker se ni
hote bititi proti Nemcem. Od-
stranitev Nielsena je razkrila
izdajstvo drugih norveških vo-
jaških častnikov v različnih kra-
jih, ki so sodelovali s Hitlerje-
vimi agenti in špioni. Nemške
ete so se sinoči približale tej
trdnjavi. Nekaj ur prej so pro-
drole obrambno črto, ki so jo
Norvežani zgradili na severni
strani Oslo.

Norvežani trdijo, da je Niel-
sen postal prostovoljec domov.
Pokažali na nobenega magnjenja
na močan odpor proti Nemcem.
On je tudi osvobobil nemške
mornarje, ki so zasegili ameriški
parnik City of Flint in so bili
internirani v trdnjavi. Z nem-
škimi jetniki je postopal kot s
svojimi gosti.

Novi poveljnik trdnjave Kong-
svinger se ni prevzel svoje službe.
Vprašanje je, ali se bo on
odločil upri nemški oboroženi
sil, ki prodira proti trdnjavi.

Iz Narvika je prišlo poročilo,
da so norveške čete s pomočjo
angliških bojnih ladij reokupi-
vale Narvik, severno norveško
mesto. Poročilo dostavlja, da se
je več angloških vojaških enot
iskrivilo v Narviku in drugih
norveških krajih.

Oslo, Norveška, 16. apr.—Tu-
kajšnja radiopostaja je sinoči
naslanila, da je Vidkum Quis-
ling odstavljal kot predsednik no-
ve norveške vlade, ki so jo usta-
novili Nemci po okupaciji Oslo.
Njega je nasledil Ingolf Elster
Christensen, governer te provin-
ce. Quislingu je bila povrjenja
izredna demobilizacija norveških
čet na ozemlju, ki so ga zasedle
Hitlerjeve čete. Christensen je
bil stotnik v norveški armadi,
justični minister l. 1926, pozneje
v obrambni minister.

Norveška objavila Hitlerjev ultimat

Vlada ga je dobila
tri ure po invaziji

Stockholm, Švedska, 16. apr.—
Norveška vlada je sinoči iz-
javila izvoz pšenice v tujezemstvo in

blaga, so stopile takoj v vel-
javno. Po naznalu, ki ga je ob-
javil premier Tatarescu po seji
članov svoje vlade, ostanejo ob-
stoječe pogodbe med Rumunijo
in drugimi državami še nadalje
v veljavni.

Povodnji, slabo vreme in vzdr-
ževanje armade milijon mož pod

odobra v Oscar E. Hewitt, ko-
misar javnih del, nakar je bila

cago svoje agente, da ugotove, ali
je on v zvezi z monopolisti v
trdnjavi. Preiskovalci so že dognali, da Carrozzi v leti-
ni dohodki znašajo \$240,000. On
kontrolira 25 unij, ki imajo 15,-
000 članov.

Newark, N. J., 16. apr.—Na
letni konferenci metodistične cer-
kve, ki se je pričela v tem mestu,
je bila sprejeta resolucija s poz-
vom na Roosevelt, naj takoj od-
poklic Myrona C. Taylorja, svo-
jega osebnega "poslanika" v Va-
tikanu. Kopija resolucije je bi-
la posljana Rooseveltu. Ta nagla-
sa, da je imenovan Taylor za p-
risnimi ameriškimi demokratičnimi
principi in federalno ustavo.

njena. Tu trdijo, da bosta An-
glijci in Franciji izdali milijar-
doljarjev za ameriška letala
najnowejšega tipa, ki razvijajo
silno brzino, v prihodnjih tednih.

Berlin napoveduje veli-

ANGLEŠKE ČETE NA NORVEŠKEM

Berlin, 16. apr.—Hitlerjeva
obožena sila na morju, kop-
nem in zraku se pripravlja na
veliko ofenzivo, da potisne an-
gleške čete in Narvika, norve-
škega mesta na severu, in po-
novno zasede to mesto. Ofenziva
na široki podlagi se bo pričela
kakor hitro se bo vreme, ki zdaj
o vira in militarične operacije,
spremenilo.

Vrhovno poveljstvo je sinoči
naznalo, da so se nadaljnje
nemške čete, topniške in letalske
enote izkrcale v norveških lukah
na jugu. Nemški vojaki, ki so
zadnji teden invadirali norveško
ozemlje, utrijejo svoje pozicije.
Poveljstvo je tudi naznalo,
da so Nemci pognali norve-
ške čete iz vseh krajev. Časopis
je poroča, da je 3000 norveških
vojakov pobegnilo čez mejo na
Švedsko pri Haldenu. Švedske
avtoritete so jih takoj interni-
rale.

Nemci poročajo, da sta bili na-
daljnji angleški podmornici po-
topljeni tudi pri Skagerraku. V zadnji
dneh so Angleži izgubili se-
dem podmornic. Druga vest se
glasla, da so Nemci zasigli nor-
veško torpedinsko čolo Hval.

London, 16. apr.—Uradno
poročilo pravi, da se je veliko
število angleških vojakov že iz-
krcalo v norveških krajih. Veli-
čina Britanija in Francija sta mo-
bilizirali svojo oboroženo silo, da
udarita Nemci, ki so prisilili nor-
veško obzorno torpedinsko čolo Hval.

Gibanje britiskih čet je orisal
londonski list Herald. "Ladje in
parni" vse vrste so natrpani z
vojaškimi četami, orožjem in
strelivom in na poti preko Se-
vernega morja proti Norveški".
Piše ta list. "Vsi razpoložljiva
sredstva so bila uprežena za po-
spešitev transportacije vojaških
čet. Vojaška taborišča v Angliji
so izginila čez noč, ko so jih vo-
jaki zapustili in odpotovali v pri-
stanišča, kjer so se ukrali na
parnike in odrinili proti norve-
škim lukam."

Anglija in Francija sta se kaže-
li, da so angleški letalci ponov-

On Bowling--and Our National Tournament

Two weeks from now, large contingents of SNPJ keggers will be converging on Waukegan where, on May 3, 4 and 5, the annual National SNPJ Bowling Tournament will take place, attracting hundreds of members and friends.

Two preliminary sectional bowling tournaments have already been held, one in Chicago and the other in Cleveland, both enjoying a record number of participants; the midwinter SNPJ Duckpin tournament held annually on New Year's Day in Western Pennsylvania is a contest all its own holding the spotlight of the members mainly in the East. However, the outstanding sports event of the year in the SNPJ world, is undeniably our National Bowling tournament which winds up the bowling season.

Last year 59 teams entered the tourney in Cleveland, six more than in 1938, and there were 172 singles and 100 doubles entries. Total awards amounted to about one thousand dollars. This year's tournament in Waukegan promises to break all entry records, and again the SNPJ will offer prize awards to the winners, the actual sum depending on the number of teams entered.

Bowling is an old game, widely played in the United States for decades, and officially played in the SNPJ since 1927. In total participants its increase towers above that of any indoor sport. For instance, in 1936, there were about ten thousand bowlers in the country--this year it is estimated that more than ten million men and women are scattering the maples! Bowling is a relatively expensive sport, costing about 25 cents per game; if the bowler buys his own ball, it costs him from \$15 to \$25. Yet bowling is on the gallop! It is estimated that three million of 1940's bowlers are women, with their own national association and tournament. The American Bowling Congress, reflecting national interest in the sport, reports a record entry of 30,000 for its tourney now being held in Detroit. Once considered on the same social plane as a pool room, bowling alleys are now highly respectable. The rapid increase of interest in the sport is ascribed to the fact that it offers exercise in mild form and to social and economic changes.

Our English Speaking Lodges have been holding bowling tournaments on a small or larger scale since their beginning. These contests, when serving our fraternalism, are worthy of our support, and the bowling classic to be held in Waukegan a fortnight from now will, no doubt, prove to be a fraternal and social success.

My Week Forward, Loyalites!

I am fully aware of the fact that most of our young people are not greatly concerned with the present European conflict. To most of us, the actual meaning of the fight against totalitarian slavery is not quite clear because we are "too far" from the scene of brutal reality.

What is happening in Europe at the moment and what is likely to happen within the next few days and weeks, of course, is mere speculation and conjecturing. However, one thing is certain: last week's events showed that the war took a lightning turn for the worse.

Norway's unhappy lot of yesterday may very easily become the lot of the Balkans tomorrow. But it is also possible that the events may turn the tables suddenly. It is known now that all of Norway's strategic points were occupied not by the so-called blitzkrieg but solely by betrays from within and by German spies. It was because of this fact that the Nazis were able to occupy the country's capital or nearly 300,000 inhabitants with an unbelievably small force of approximately 1,500!

This proves anew to what base tricks the Nazis stoop in order to achieve their aims. It was mainly through vicious propaganda that they crushed Austria, Czechoslovakia and Poland. This time they resorted to conspiracy, betrayal and treason.

Is it necessary for us to pay any attention to the European war other than satisfying our hunger for its news? Many are of the opinion that we have no stake in the conflict, it is not our war and we should stick to our hands-off policy. I think that when democracy of any country is threatened and the people enslaved, that it is our business to come to its defense morally and materially.

Last week by an overwhelming vote of about 127 the Socialist Party went on record as opposing any economic aid to the Allies in their fight against totalitarianism. I do not agree with this stupid policy enacted by a party which is in the past has always championed democracy. Only 22 voted against the proposal while 55 of the delegates stood on the fence.

The Chicago SNPJ Federation is very busy these days putting final touches to its preparations for its anniversary celebration on April 28. The main attraction will be Mme. Milanov, operatic star of Jugoslavians and more recently of the Metropolitan opera. I remember 'way back in 1928 when Pavla Lovis of the Ljubljana opera thrilled audiences in many of our communities with her interpretation of classical and folk songs. We are looking forward to another such treat at this affair.

Waukegan Hears 4 Good Programs

WAUKEGAN, ILL.—The motto: "Make America safe for differences," has been explained by Louis Adamic recently at Lake Forest in a well received speech.

He pointed out that prejudice of old stock Americans against the immigrants, and the same applied by one nation against the other, does the damage to this country. He believes that Ellis Island should be considered as good background of a nation as is Plymouth Rock. We must synthesize the Liberty Bell with Statue of Liberty. This could not be done with tolerance alone. The word tolerance means only inactive intolerance, or a pretense to endure something we don't like. The solution for Americans is to get acquainted, accept each other and disregard all the differences. Such words as Niger, Wop, alien, etc., should be forgotten.

Instead of using the word minority, the word Americans should be used oftener. He believes if we all tried to cultivate ourselves in this spirit, many present conditions would be improved. He is looking forward to the time when a man will be judged just for the man that he is, regardless of nationality, religion and other differences. Thus our America will become "A teeming nation of nations," or just one highly cultured American nation.

He spoke highly of immigrants and said that in all American goods, in every American dollar is represented immigrant effort. Of course we have faults, we are only human.

Prejudice is one of the worse, inferiority complex is another, which some of us developed because of the misbehavior of the countries abroad.
