SNPJ FINANCE COMMITTEE

Meeting of March 14

Meeting was called to order at 8:30 a. m. All members of the committee were present except Sec'y Vidar, due to illness.

Minutes of the Feb. 14 meeting were approved. Chairman Petrovich reports it has not been possible to sell the Ohio Forge and Foundry Co. stock, the best price being about sixteen.

Annual statement of operations of the Lake Ports Supply Co. for the year of 1941. The income for 1941 was \$4200, expenditures \$2635.39, balance of \$4490.70 Dec. 31, 1941.

Tausig, Day & Co. offer to dispose of our Kansas City Crushed Stone Co. stocks and bonds at \$5.90; a dividend of \$1 is to be paid on these units. Petrovich is to check over the report of this company and make a recommendation.

Mortgagor Enoch Peterson, FHA loan 63, Chicago, asked for the reduction of interest, which is granted. Mortgagor Lawrence Connor asked for the reduction of interest on his FHA loan from 5% to 4 1/4% and the elimination of the service fee; original loan was \$5500, unpaid balance is \$3939. It was unanimously agreed that the request be granted upon payment of usual fee.

Seddon-Morfat, Harvey, Inc., offer to dispose of our Edinburg (Tex.) bonds. Petrovich will secure more information before we sell these bonds. Seddon-Morfat, Inc. offer to sell our \$1000 City of Bessemer (N. C.) bonds. Decided to secure more information before they are sold.

The property with loan 107-S, 2737 Evergreen Avenue, Chicago, is being sold for \$9000. They ask us to take back a loan of \$4900. Decided to accept the full payment with a 3% prepayment fee or make a loan equivalent to 50% of the appraised value for the new mortgagor.

A letter of appreciation was read from John Yeran on the reduction of interest for the Slovene Workers' Home in Indianapolis, Ind., and filed. The Six Point Realty Co. is being repaid in quarterly payments under previous terms and conditions. Amity Federal Savings and Loan Association offers to sell \$75,000 FHA loans at 10%. Carried that we purchase these loans, providing the assn. relinquishes the servicing agreement.

Pres. Chinkar reports on the property at 5134 W. 25th Street, Cicero. The contract purchaser has made some extensive repairs and might require some additional advances. Decided to leave the matter in his hands to be worked out with the contract purchaser.

We have \$90,000 to invest. By unanimous consent it was decided to purchase \$25,000 of State of Arkansas Highway 3 1/4% 1965 maturity bonds at 98, which will yield 3.35, through M. B. Vick and Co.

The remaining \$65,000 was ordered placed in U. S. Treasury 2 1/2% 1972 maturity bonds to yield 2.47 by all the members present.

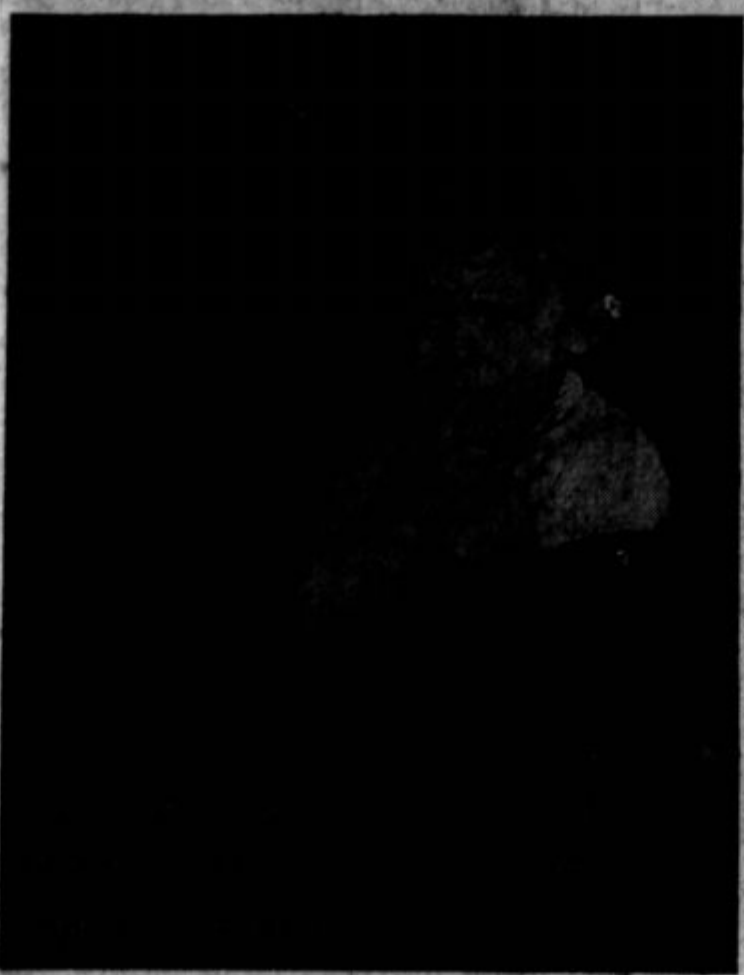

This new color poster, which soon will be seen throughout the United States, emphasizes a new theme in the War Bond sales campaign. The present goal of the Nation wide drive is to persuade all citizens to invest 10 percent of income in War Bonds and Stamps.

Woolen Bathrobes

Woolen robes, housecoats, negligees, lounging pajamas and beachcoats for women are out for the duration, according to WPB. From now on they will be made from quilted cottons, chenilles, corduroys and other cotton and rayon materials.

And to save materials, these garments, like other feminine apparel, are limited to shorter belts and hems, no outsized sleeves or hoods, and one pocket only. Long robes and housecoats will not be eliminated but they will be less sweeping than the pre-war ones. WPB expects the elimination of frills to result in a saving of 14,500,000 yards of fabrics.

No Sales Tax—Yet

The House Ways and Means Committee has announced it will send the new tax bill to the floor of the House by July 6. It reached this decision last week after 4 months of dawdling when President Roosevelt reminded the Committee that its continued delay was depriving the government of sorely needed war revenue.

The bill as sent to the floor will still be over \$2,000,000,000 short of the \$8,700,000,000 requested by the Treasury. Despite Administration and Treasury pressure, the Committee refused to tax corporations to the limit of their excess or undue

profits. And just last week the Committee contemptuously turned down the President's proposal to hold individual incomes down to \$25,000 after payment of taxes. Chairman Robert Doughton gave the strange excuse that the Committee "did not want to take the responsibility for enactment of such a measure" at the present time.

Chairman Doughton also announced that the Committee would not include a general sales tax in the bill it sends to the House. That is a real victory for everyone who wrote letters to the Committee and Congress urging them to reject sales tax proposals that would lower living standards and have inflationary consequences.

But the fact that the bill is to be sent on \$2,000,000,000 short of its goal raises the distinct possibility that Congressional reactionaries may be preparing to slip over a sales tax in the future as a way of raising the additional revenue.

The pretext that only a sales tax can raise this needed revenue could be pressed either during the House debate or when the Senate considers the bill. Write your Congressman again: urge him to vote against any sneak attempt to put over a sales tax.
