Official Visit To South Australia By Slovenian Ambassador To Australia Helena Drnovšek Zorko

The South Australian government organized an Official visit to South Australia for Her Excellency Ms Helena Drnovšek Zorko Ambassador of Slovenia to Australia, in early March 2016.

During her visit to Adelaide Ambassador Helena Drnovšek met with the Slovenian community, and with a number of government and private enterprises. The purpose of the visit is to strengthen relationships between Slovenia and South Australia.

The following pictures gives an idea of the scope of the Ambassador's visit and highlights the level of interest between the two countries.

Day 1 - March 5, 2016

Adelaide was in festival mode at the time of the Ambassador's visit to Adelaide, with both the Adelaide Festival of Arts, and the Fringe Festival in full flight. During the day the

Ambassador sampled Adelaide's festival atmosphere by visiting the Jam Factory, and the Art Gallery of South Australia.

Speaking of the Adelaide Festival of Arts, the Ambassador in her previous posting to the Slovenian Embassy in Australia, at the turn of the century, was instrumental in securing Slovenian Matej Andraž Vogrinčič as the artist-in-residence for the 2000 Adelaide Festival of Arts. Mataj's installation project was called "Car Park - Members Only" in which he pasted thousands of toy cars on a wall in Rosina street in the city. Visiting the site, 16 years after the installation, amazingly the vast majority of the cars are still glued to the wall. Slovenia still maintains a vital presence in Adelaide's culture.

The most intensive program runs for 60 weeks and costs \$140,000. This fee is covered by the Commercial airline which sends the student.

Do you qualify for a Slovenian European Union passport?



Australian citizens of Slovenian descent can apply for Slovenian citizenship and then for a Slovenian European Union passport. People living in Australia can have dual citizenship ie Australian and Slovenian.

A Slovenian European Union passport allows you to free right of movement and residence in any of the states of the European Union.

Slovenia has 12th best passport in the world 01 Mar 2016 STA

Slovenia places twelfth in the visa restriction index put together annually by UK consultancy Henley & Partners and the International Air Transport Association (IATA).

Germany tops the ranking, as its citizens may travel visa-free to 177 countries and territories.

Sweden is second, as its citizens can travel without restrictions to 176 countries and territories. Finland, France, Italy, Spain and the UK share the third place with visa-free travelling to 175 countries and territories.

Slovenia shares the 12th spot with Malaysia and Liechtenstein, as their citizens may travel without restrictions to 164 countries and territories around the globe.

At the bottom of the ranking is Afghanistan (unrestricted travel to 25 countries).

Opening of new SAMEAC office premises





Goriška gubanca, a Slovenian treat

The gubanca part of the name is connected with wrinkled (layered) dough ('gube'), which separates the fillings. Gubanca does not have the hole in the middle that is so characteristic of its younger relative, 'potica'.



Filo pastry dough: 500 g rough butter 500 g white flour 4 yolks lemon juice (1 lemon) 3 spoons white wine

Filling:

1 kg walnuts (or 250g almonds and 750 g walnuts) 500 g raisins (dipped in rum one day before use) 500 g sugar 200 g rough butter 150 g pine nuts 5 yolks whipped 5 yolks vanilla 2 orange peels lemon peel cloves cinnamon rum

Preparation method:

- 1. Prepare the filo pastry dough out of the ingredients.
- 2. Mix all the ingredients for the filling.

3. Roll the dough thinly and spread the whisked yolks on the dough.

4. Cover the dough with the filling.

5. Roll the dough and put it spirally in the round or quadrangle fatty baking pan.

6. Bake on the moderate temperature for approx one hour.
