Kerren, ki leži v 6,000 čevljev visokem gorovju, je branilo 40,000 Italijanov. — Od Harara imajo Angleži 35 milj do Addis Ababa železnice, ki jo bodo zdaj prerezali. — Pot zavojevanja Abesinije je zdaj prosta.

LONDON, 28. marca. — Abesinski cesar Halle Selassie, ki poveljuje svojim četam v vojni proti Italijanom, je objavil danes proklamacijo svojim vojakom, v kateri apelira nanje, naj se vzdrže vsake "krutosti" proti italijanskim ujetnikom. Njeguš je večeraj ustanovil svoj glavni stan v abesinskem kraju Burye, ki leži približno petdeset milj od italijanske vojaške baze Debra Markos in 170 milj od Addis Ababe. Kraj Burye so izpulle Italijanom zgolj njegove domače čete.

Italija mora kapitulirati
Richard Austen Butler, parlamentarni državni tajnik, je izjavil, da se Anglija ne more ozirati na nobene apele, da bi dovolila masno evakuacija italijanskih civilistov iz Etiopije, dokler Italija ne zaprosi za premirje in ne položi orožje.

Deset tisoč Francozov — mož, žena in otrok — je zasulo s cvetjem spominsko ploščo, ki označuje mesto, kjer je bil umorjen kralj Aleksander. "Živela Jugoslavija!" kriči navdušena množica.

MARSEILLE, Francija, 28. marca. — Danes je privrelo na tukajšnji Place de la Bourse, kjer je bil ubit pokojni jugoslovanski kralj Aleksander, 10,000 Francozov, moških, žensk in otrok, ki so iz vsega grla vzklikali "Živela Jugoslavija!"

Nepričakovana demonstracija, ki je nenehoma pridobivala na svojem obsegu, se je pričela, ko je spreletel mesto šepet, da se je Jugoslavija postavila po robu osišču ter formirala novo vlado.

Naval ljudi in cvetja
Zel zgodaj jutraj so pričeli prihajati ljudje, ki so metali cvetje na ploščo, ki označuje mesto, kjer je zadela kralja Aleksandra leta 1934 morilčeva kroglja. Pravo tako je ljudstvo nasulo cvetje pred spomenikom kralja Aleksandra, očeta sedanjega mladega kralja Petra II. Ko se je nabrala velika gora cvetja, je bilo poklicanih 200 mož policije, da ustavijo to početje.

Ljudstvo prepeva marseljezo
Na Place de la Bourse je ljudstvo prepevalo marseljezo ter aplavdiralo vsakokrat, kadar se je komu posrečilo zmuzniti se skozi policijo ter položiti na ploščo nov šopek cvetja. Enaka demonstracija se je vršila pred spomenikom, ki stoji pred palačo prefekture.

Demonstracije so dosegle višek, ko so prispeli na mesto spominske plošče člani jugoslovanske kolonije ter njihovi prijatelji, nekdanji francoski vojaki, ki so se borili v svetovni vojni na solunski fronti.

Jugoslovanski komunisti proti "imperialistični Angliji"

Demonstracije komunistov, ki nastopajo proti Angliji in zahtevajo pakt z Rusijo, je razgnala policija.

BEOGRAD, 28. marca. — Nova jugoslovanska vlada je nastopila proti komunistom, ki prirejajo antiangleške demonstracije, nakar si je pričela prizadevati, da premaga opozicijo Hrvatov. Hkratu je svetovala Hitlerju, naj slednji gleda, kaj dela, ako misli inforsirati gotove točke na Dnnaju podpisane pogodbe.

Vojaki in policisti so razbili demonstracije komunistov, ki so razpečavali okrožnice, v katerih napadajo "imperialistično Anglijo" ter zahtevajo takojšnjo sklenitev pakta z Rusijo.

NEW YORK, 28. marca. — Angleški radio naznanja, da je nemška vlada odpoklicala iz Beograda svojega poslanika in sicer po njegovem razgovoru z generalom Dušanom Simovićem.

Grška podmornica pogreznila italijanski transportni parnik

Parnik se je nahajal sredi močno zastraženega konvoja, ko ga je torpedirala in pogreznila grška podmornica Triton.

ATENE, 28. marca. — Danes se uradno naznanja, da je v nedeljo grška podmornica Triton pogreznila ob albanski obali velik italijanski, 5,451-tonski transportni parnik, ki je bil natrpan z vojaštvom in je bil torpediran sredi močno zastraženega konvoja.

Poročila naznanja, da je podmornica Triton nato torpedirala in poškodovala še nadaljni, manjši italijanski parnik, nakar je srečno pobegnila.

Italijanske izgube tekem njihove zadnje ofenzive znašajo 50,000 mož. Grško vrhovno poveljstvo naznanja, da so Italijani na albanski fronti zdaj popolnoma neaktivni in da ne razpošiljajo proti grškim postojankam niti več svojih patrolj.

Poročila iz Londona naznanjajo, da so začetkom tega tedna zaprosili Italijani Grke za začasno premirje, da bi mogli pokopati svoje mrtvece. Poročilo ne omenja, da-li so Grki privolili v to željo Italijanov ali ne.

Italijanski ujetniki sporočajo, da utrjujejo Italijani svoje pozicije v drugi črti, kar pomeni, da je njihov splošen umik neizogiben.

ISTANBUL, 28. marca. — Podpredsednik parlamenta je danes resno posvaril Nemčijo, da bo vzplamtel ves Bližnji vzhod v vojni, ako bi se Nemčija usodila ogroziti turško neodvisnost. Istočasno s tem svarilom pa napoveduje vse turško časopisje, da bi bile v tem slučaju potegnjene v vojno tudi Amerika, Rusija in Japonska.

Podpredsednik parlamenta S. Gunaltay je rekel v svojem govoru, da si Turčija ne želi vojne, da je pa nanjo pripravljena. Časopisje pa pravi, da je zdaj že toliko kot gotovo, da se bo vojna razširila na Ameriko, Rusijo in Japonsko.

ANKARA, 28. marca. — Neki nevtralni diplomat, ki je prišel nocoj iz Bukarešte preko Sofije, je izjavil, da je poslala Nemčija v Bolgarijo nadaljnjih 200,000 vojakov, ki bodo ojačili ormodo 300,000 vojakov, ki jih ima Nemčija že v deželi. Ta diplomat pravi, da morajo Nemci transportirati svoje potrebščine in drug vojni material s pomočjo konj in mul, ker so ceste sila blatne in kotanjaste.

MLADI KRALJ JE BIL ZAPRISEŽEN V KATEDRALI

WASHINGTON, 28. marca. — ulice, ker vedo, da bi bili prete-Predsednik Roosevelt je danes peni. v polnem obsegu priznal novo jugoslovansko vlado ter istočasno poslal mlademu jugoslovanskemu kralju svoje osebne brzojavne čestitke z željo, da ohrani neodvisnost in svobodo Jugoslavije ter da se upre vsakemu nadaljnemu pritisku osišča. Ta predsednikova brzojavka je položila vso težo odobritve na večerajšnje uradno zagotovilo ameriškega državnega podtajnika, ki je sporočil amerškemu poslaniku v Beograd, da naj slednji obvesti novo jugoslovansko vlado, da ji bo dala Amerika vso potrebno pomoč.

Pogodba je zavržena
BEOGRAD, 28. marca. — Jugoslavija je danes z dejanji zavrgla pogodbo zveze z osiščem, nakar je nova vlada izjavila, da bo Nemčija najbrže vsaj začasno počakala s svojim napadom na Jugoslavijo, katero bo poizkušala najprej zlomiti od znotraj na izven. Hitler si bo prizadeval doseči svoj cilj, pravi vlada, z izigravanjem starih sovražstev med Srbi in Hrvati.

Nad milijon mož na mejah Jugoslavije
Jugoslovanska armada, mobilizirana in broječa 1,200,000 mož, stoji pripravljena na mejah, včeraj pa je razposlala pozivnice zadnjim rezervistom, ki morajo nemudoma pod zastave, tako da bo štela celokupna armada poldrug milijon mož.

Dejstva govore
Nova vlada je obvestila Nemčijo, da ne bo pakt niti odobren niti preklican, temveč da bo obvisel v zraku, dočim bo vlada stremela za tem, da ostane nevtralna in da ohrani svojo popolno neodvisnost, integriteto in svobodo. Ko je nemški poslanik von Heeren zahteval od jugoslovanskega ministra zunanjih zadev Ninčića, naj slednji pojasni stališče Jugoslavije z ozirom na podpisani pakt in na odnošaje z Nemčijo, mu je Ninčić odgovoril: "Dejstva sama dovolj jasno govore, zato so odveč še posebna pojasnila."

Turški poslanik predlaga zvezo
Turški poslanik je predlagal premirje generalu Simoviću sklenitev turško - jugoslovanske vzajemno - obrambnega pakta.

Beg Nemcev iz Jugoslavije
Rečeno je, da so se Nemci odločili, zateči se k svoji vojaški sili z ozirom na Jugoslavijo šele kot k zadnjemu sredstvu, toda istočasno odhaja iz Jugoslavije skoraj 3,000 nemških trgovskih delegatov, ekonomskih strokovnjakov in časnika. Nemški civilisti, ki žive v Beogradu, bodo odpotovali v ponedeljek z ladjo, ki jih bo prepeljala po Donavi na Dunaj.

Poslaništva zastražena
Poslopji nemškega in italijanskega poslaništva sta zastražena po vojaštvu. Nemško poslaništvo je prenatrpano z Nemci, ki so pribežali pod njegovo zaščito, dokler ne odpotujejo iz dežele. Nemci se boje stopiti na lim!

Kako izbirajo letalce

Zanesljivih načinov za izbiranje osebe, ki naj bi bile sposobne za vodstvo letal, je dovolj. Vendar so nekateri posebni primeri, ko je težko reči, da-li je nekdo za letalskega pilota res sposoben ali ne.

Če je nekdo nagnjen k epileptičnim napadom, ga gotovo ne bodo potrdili za letalskega pilota. A kaj je s primeri, da ima nekdo to nagnjenje skrito v sebi, da se še ni izrazil in bi se utegnulo potem pokazati v primeru nevarnosti?

Tudi za takšne primere imajo danes posebno metodo, in sicer jo preizkušajo v Kanadi, v slovitih fiziološkem zavodu torontskega vseučilišča. V tem zavodu so odkrili inzulin, sedaj pa tuči poseben način za ugotavljanje skritih epileptičnih nagnjenj.

Po tem načinu proučujejo električne valove, ki izvirajo iz možganov. Ti električni valovi so pri vsakem človeku različni. Sprejemati in zabeležiti jih je mogoče s posebnimi pripravami, a če jih potem medsebojno primerjamo, vidimo, da so med njimi individualne razlike kakor pri prstnih odtisih. Pri tem se je izkazalo, da imajo možganski valovi epileptikov svoje posebnosti, ki valovom drugih ljudi nedostajajo.

Te posebnosti izkazujejo tudi valovi osei, ki imajo skrito nagnjenje do padavice ali pa se jim le zavest lahko nenadno zmede, ne da bi se pri tem pojavljale kakšne telesne spremembe.

Kdor hoče razbrati razlike, mora imeti seveda že veliko izkušnje. Doslej so na omenjenem zavodu preiskali glede možganskih valov že okrog 1500 oseb in pri tem so odkrili da je imelo pol odstotka teh oseb skrito epileptično nagnjenje. Pri presoji imata ulogo tako oblika kakor pogostost možganskih valov.

V eni uri umre na svetu 4,600 ljudi, rodi se jih pa 5,400. Zgodi se 198,000 zločinov vseh vrst, od od teh učaka kazen 177,000 zločinov. Ljudje pojedjo 30 milijonov kg krompirja, 25 milijonov kg kruha, 3,6 milijona kg mesa, 3,5 milijona kg rib in 10 tisoč ton sladkorja.

Raziskovalci izrečno navajajo, da nimajo ti valovi nobene zveze z duševnimi sposobnostmi in mišljenjem. So tako rekoč samo "stranski proizvod delovanja možganov kakor slišno tiktakanje ure."

Nasprotno pa si sedaj prizadevajo, da bi našli kakšno zvezo med lastnostmi možganskih valov in lastnostmi značaja. Raziskave v tem pogledu se niso dosti napredovale, vendar upajo, da bo v bodoče na tej podlagi z laboratorijsko preiskavo mogoče ugotoviti, da-li je nekdo n. pr. bolj pripraven za napadalnega borbenega letalca ali za mirnega letalskega opazovalca.

Samo ob sebi je umevno, da so na podlagi možganskih električnih valov uporabili že na kanadskih letalskih solah in da sledijo v tem oziru Kanadi tudi Zedinjene države.

Ena ura dogodkov

Osrednji statistični urad v Stockholmu je po dveletnem delu, ki je veljalo več milijonov švedskih kron, izdalo med drugim svoje izsledke o vprašanju, kaj se v šestdesetih minutah zgodi na zemlji. Najvažnejši izsledki nove statistike bi bili sledeči:

Potem je pa svojemu zastopniku v domovini poslal notarijalno overovljeno pismo, s katerim ga je pooblašča, da ga sme zastopati pri poročnem obredu in je istočasno priložil ponošeno rokavico skleniti tuj zakon. Ta pomen je imela rokavica dolga časa na Holandskem.

Zastopnik je ponese rokavico zaročenki, povedel jo je pred oltar, pri poročnem obredu je ro-

uri odide med ljudi 1.700.000 izvodov. Kinematografskega filma porabijo ljudje v tem času 57 km, pisem napišejo 1 milijardo, 200 milijonov brzojavk pa oddajo 115.000. V tej uri preleti sonce 107,000 km, nad zemljo se izdriže 1800 neviht in nanjo pade 400,000 meteoritov.

'Petnadstropne hiše' na morju

Vedno znova beremo v poročilih o viharjih na morju, ki so dvigali "kakor hiše visoke valove". Marsikdo tem poročilom ne verjame brez nadaljnega. Znanost pa se je pobavila tudi s tem vprašanjem, in to ne brez praktičnih razlogov, saj za ladje, ki plovejo po oceanih, ne more biti vseeno, kakšne nevarnosti jih lahko tam čakajo.

Z merilom in kotnikom v roki so raziskovalci potovali prek morja in so s svojimi ekspedicijskimi ladjami, dočim se vse ladje viharjem drugače rajši izognejo, obiskovali baš središča najhujših viharjev.

S pomočjo tako zvanih merilnih komor, ki so bile opremljene z umnimi pripravami, je profesorju Weinblumu v dveh izredno viharjih dneh na Atlantskem oceanu uspelo točno izmeriti višine valov. Po meritvah prof. Weinbluma je znašala največja višinska razlika med vrhom in dnom valov nič manj nego 18,5 m, kar pomeni že višino petnadstropne hiše.

Dolžine najdaljših valov pa so znašale 200 do 300 m, med tem ko so doslej mislili, da ne presežajo 140 m. Celotno strmine valovnih hribov je ugotavljal omejen raziskovalec in dognal, da so manjše, nego bi bilo pričakovati iz razmerja med višino in dolžino, kajti valovna oblika je sličila tako rekoč bolj premi črti nego krivulji. Ta oblika pa velja seveda le za glavni val, na katerem pa se tvorijo spet številne valovne kopje, ki imajo pogostoma zelo strma "pobočja". Baš ta različen valov pa je tista, ki predstavlja posebno nevarnost za manjše ladje.

Young was a formidable man. The Mormons had come westward to find isolation, and this they could find only in isolated lands. The beckoning, promising lands of the west would soon be settled by others than the Mormons, and again they would not find peace. Here was their land and here they were going to stay. The weary people bowed their heads in submission and began building their small cabins. They raised their tired arms to wield a pick and shovel, and many a one fell down from the hard labor, and many a pick was broken trying to cut thru the hard, dried earth.

Brigham Young saw that the land had fertility but lacked water so he had his men dig ditches from the mountains. These ran through their land and irrigated the soil, so that the first irrigated farming was known to exist. That summer they waited patiently for their crops. They hoped for a good harvest so that for once their stomachs would be filled. As the wheat became ripe and the corn was doing nicely, whole swarms of grasshoppers came to eat the crop. The settlers were frantic, in desperation they tried to beat them off, even setting fire to whatever they dared, to chase them, but to no avail. At last in discouragement they fell down on their knees and with great tears rolling down their sweat-soaked faces they prayed to God for help. If they didn't get help they were sure to starve that winter because their resistance was so low from all the hardships that they had already withstood that they would not be able to endure another winter in hunger.

As if in answer to their prayer a cloud covered the sky. And as they looked up they saw a swarm of seagulls swoop down on the fields and clean up all the grasshoppers until there were none left. Then as they had come so they left. None knew from whence they had come.

To this day in the center of their garden stands the only statue known in the United States to be dedicated to a bird. The Mormons' troubles were not yet over, however. Bravely they built themselves a temple to worship, hauling the great trees from the mountains, tying them together with sinue and pegs which were dipped in glue. This temple stands with a seating capacity of 2,000 people. Their organ which was built at the same time, still stands with additions to it, but at that time they hauled logs from three-hundred miles away. This organ can be heard every Sunday on the Mormon program with 2,000 singers.

America is on the threshold of a new era. Passage of the lease-lend bill to give all material aid to Britain and her Allies in the battle against totalitarianism marked its inauguration.

This measure is a concrete expression of the view held by the vast majority of American citizens that victory for the Axis powers would constitute a direct threat to the whole American way of life. It would end free enterprise as a factor in world trade. It would leave all international relations at the mercy of dictation by the victor. No longer would there be equals in the world, but only the Axis masters and those they dominated either directly by occupation with military and police forces or through their control of the bulk of economic power. America will not realize the full opportunities of this new era if its citizen view the con-

flit solely as one designed to fortify their own position. The United States cannot be free unless the rest of the world is free. It cannot function as an independent state, as a citadel of democracy, in a world which has been overrun by the new tyranny.

The most will be made of it if American citizens accept their full responsibilities in the war between despotism and freedom.

Fire Prevention! "Zarja" To Present Colorful Program

A good book in a comfortable bed, is one of life's pleasures. But, add a cigarette to this book-bed combination, and the pleasure becomes a perilous one. Reading in bed, no matter how good the book, almost invariably induces sleep, and to fall asleep while smoking is bad business. The lighted cigarette, falling among the bed clothes, starts the covers smoldering and soon the bed is ablaze. If the sleeper does not wake in time, he may never wake. All too frequently a bed is the smoker's funeral pyre. Sometimes the victim is fortunate enough to be alive when firemen arrive at the scene, and after he is removed from the bed-room he may receive first-aid treatment and be transported to a hospital. Often, however in cases of this kind the person succumbs enroute to or at the hospital. In fact, far too many cases are beyond medical aid and are removed to the morgue.

Bed, however, is not the only place where people fall asleep while smoking. Many such accidents occur in the living room. Many persons who would never think of smoking in bed for fear of the consequences, forget that overstuffed furniture is also a fire hazard, for the smoker may drop a lighted cigarette in the cushions and after waking not think about it. The cigarette smoldering unseen in the chair or dayenport, probably does not burst into flame for some time. Perhaps everyone is out of the room and the fire gains sufficient headway before being discovered to cause considerable property damage and possibly loss of life, before it is extinguished.

The facts add up this way: Smoking in bed is the easiest way to burn down your house and yourself with it. Bed is for sleeping and the odds are against you staying awake while smoking in bed. Hardly a day passes in which the fire department does not respond to an alarm of fire caused by a careless cigarette smoker. We, as firemen, bring this to your attention thru the columns of this newspaper, because we consider it our duty and a part of our job.

recently in a fashionable nightclub when she asked the waiter to bring a "Martinelli cocktail." At another time she greeted a group of friends she hadn't seen for a long time with an enraptured, "Ah, goodbye!"

Everything in America, she declares is "fabelheit"—which means colossal. The subway is "fabelheit" and so are the department stores, double-featured

movies, Times Square and American ice cream.

A handsome robust woman she resembles Helen Morgan. She started singing "Habenera" from Carmen when she was thirteen years old. By the time she was thirteen her voice had developed to a full soprano, and she began her vocal studies a year later.

She was as precocious in the kitchen as in the conservatory and cooking today remains one of her greatest pleasures. Her friends attest to the success of her burek, which is like an apple strudel with chopped onion in place of apples; "sarajevski"—rolled, stuffed cabbage; "raznice,"—pork chops cooked on a spit.

She is very fond of American food, particularly shrimp and lobster, which she says are not obtainable in her native Yugoslavia. She is amazed at the variety of vegetables on sale in New York stores.

Her weight has given some concern, and she reports twenty-five pounds during three months preceding her arrival in this country. However after a look at some of her Amazonian colleagues at Metropolitan, she decided to indulge in a dish of cream now and then.

Her husband, Predgrad, is with her in this country, a well known actor on the Continent. He also acts as a dramatic coach.

26 Killed

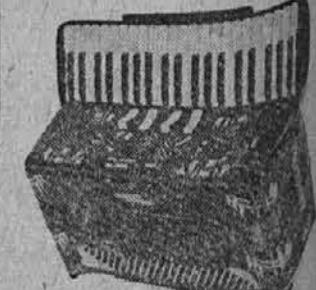
