 - 1 1/2 cups rye flour)together
 - 1 teaspoon kimmel or caraway seed (optional)
- Scald the milk and pour over the shortening, salt caraway seed and sugar.

When lukewarm, crumble in the yeast, till yeast will float on top. (If using dry yeast follow directions on envelope).

Add about 1 1/2 cups flour, beat, add remaining flour, keeping out 1 1/2 cup for board or canvas.

Stir till all flour is absorbed.

Turn out dough on floured board and knead until dough is smooth and elastic. Grease top of dough and put in greased bowl. Cover. Let rise in warm place, until double in bulk, around 1 1/2 hrs. Punch down by kneading dough well.

Cover, let rest 20 min.

Shape into 2 loaves, let rise 1 hour. Bake 45 minutes in 375° over. Cool on racks.

The pork roast was excellent and very tender, the natural gravy was also very good, and the salad was fresh, crisp and tasty.

For dessert I had fresh-baked apple strudel (.60) which was comparable to some of the finest I had ever eaten.
