Immigration and Naturalization

Question: My sister was naturalized as a United States citizen in 1922, more than 30 years ago. In 1951 she returned to live in the country where she was born. At that time she was 66 years old. She has been told by local authorities abroad that, by reason of her residence in her native land she has again acquired her original citizenship. Does that mean she has lost her American citizenship?

Answer: No, unless your sister has actually taken steps to expatriate herself—such, for example, as formally renouncing her American citizenship, taking an oath of allegiance to another country, or voting in a foreign political election. Under the law in effect before the enactment of the present statute in 1952, your sister would have lost her American citizenship if she resided for two years or more in her native country and thereby reacquired her original

citizenship. However, this is no longer the case. Under existing law, naturalized citizens lose their American citizenship if they reside continuously for three years in the country of their birth or former nationality, or for five years in any foreign country. There are a number of exceptions to these rules—for example, naturalized citizens who have their residence abroad because of employment by the U. S. Government, or because they are representing a bona fide American commercial or educational organization, or because they are prevented from returning to the United States by ill health or the ill health of a parent, child or spouse, etc. Also—and this is the exception that applies to your sister—the foregoing rules about loss of citizenship because of residence abroad do NOT apply to naturalized citizens who have lived in the United States for at least 25 years after their naturalization AND who are at least 60 years old when they establish their residence abroad. It is immaterial in such cases whether or not, by returning to the country of their birth, they re-acquire their original citizenship.

Stenographers are being sought from the Cleveland area by the U. S. Information Agency to work in Washington and abroad. THIS WEEK IN AMERICAN HISTORY

By the "dawn's early light" of September 14, 1814, Francis Scott Key, a young American lawyer, was inspired to write a poem about the successful defense of Fort McHenry in Baltimore. Key witnessed the bombastic warship which he had boarded to negotiate the release of a prisoner of war. While returning to the city, Key scribbled the poem on the back of an envelope. He showed it to his brother who had it printed immediately. By the same evening "The Bombardment of Fort McHenry" was being read by the people of Baltimore. Soon after it was being sung to the tune of an old French song—the same tune to which Americans sing it today. On March 13, 1931, Francis Scott Key's song—by then known as "The Star-Spangled Banner"—was proclaimed by Congress as the national anthem of the United States.

On September 15, 1789, James Fenimore Cooper, early American novelist, was born in New Jersey. In his youth, Cooper spent five years at sea, but after marriage settled down to managing his farms in Westchester County, New York. He began writing fiction after reading a book he disliked, and professing himself able to write a better one. His second attempt, *The Spy*, published in 1821, won immense popularity both in America and England. One of his famous books, *The Last of the Mohicans*, published five years later, dealt with Indians and pioneer life and is still widely read today. Cooper relied mainly on his knowledge of the Indian and of life at sea to write interesting

and exciting novels which have endured over the years. Among his other well-known works are *The Deerslayer*, *The Pathfinder* and *The Pioneers*. Though he continued to be a prolific writer all his life, Cooper's later books never achieved the popularity accorded his earlier works. He died in Cooperstown, New York, which his father had founded, in 1851.

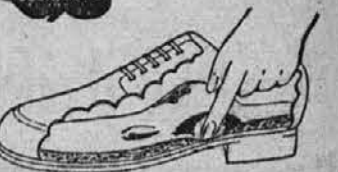
