UPOR TOVARNARJEV PROTI ODREDBI ROOSEVELTA

Tovarnarji bombažnih oblačil so se uprli predsedniškovi odredbi za znižanje delovnih ur ob starih mezdah. Bodo odredbo ignorirali.

NEW YORK, 28. avg. — Industrija bombažnih oblačil, ki šteje 4000 podjetij, ki obratuje v 42 državah, je danes odprto revoltirala proti odredbi predsednika Roosevelta, da se delovne ure zniža za 10 odstotkov, mezde pa zviša od 10 do 11 odstotkov.

Naznanilo tovarnarjev je tako sledila izjava delavskih voditeljev, da bodo s stavko izsilili Rooseveltovo odredbo, če ne bo šlo drugače.

Predsednikova odredba ima znižati delovni čas iz 40 na 36 ur na teden, mezde pa imajo ostati nespremenjene.

Upton Sinclair dobil govnersko nominacijo

Socijalistični pisatelj porazil ostale demokratske tekmece v Californiji. Frank F. Merriam, ki je nasledil umrlemu gov. Rolphu, nominiran od republikancev.

SAN FRANCISCO, 28. avg. — Socijalistični pisatelj Upton Sinclair, ki je v Californiji kandidiral na demokratskem tiketu ter v svoji kampanji razvil obširen program za odpravo brezposelnosti potom zemljiških kolonij in zaplembe bankrotiranih privatnih podjetij, je danes dobil demokratsko govnersko kandidacijo. Njegov najbližji tekmeec George Creel, demokrat "Wilsonove šole," je ostal daleč za njim.

Na republikanskem tiketu je bil nominiran za govnerja Frank F. Merriam, bivši podgovner, ki je pred nekaj meseci, ko je umrl govner James Rolph, prevzel govnerski urad. Merriam je zagrezen reakcionar, ker je zlasti pokazal tekom generalne stave v San Franciscu, katero je pomagal zdrbiti s pozivi k nasilnosti proti militantnim delavskim elementom.

Senator Hiram Johnson, neodvisen republikanec, ki je pred dvema leti javno agitiral za izvolitev Roosevelta, je kandidiral na tiketih obeh strank ter na obeh zmagal, dasiravno so mu demokrati dali večjo večino kot pa republikanci.

FALSE AGE

It is surprising how many false ages are found at the time of death of our members.

In each case of death of a member the Society is trying to establish his or her correct age. The former By-Laws did not require such procedure, except in suspicious cases. It is interesting to note that in no case did the insured state a higher age at the time of entry, but always lower. Through lower ages of insured the Society is losing annually quite a bit of money in the assessment.

Since our By-Laws do not require that the age of a dead member be established at the time of death, the defect was corrected when the new class B certificates were introduced. Item 7 under *Benefits, Conditions and Privileges* of each certificate of class B contains the following clause:

"Mistake of Age. Proof of age will be required with proof of claim. If after the death of the member it is proven that the member's age at entry be understated, the difference between the total premiums paid and total premiums which should have been paid for the correct age, together with interest at six per cent per annum, will be deducted from the death benefit payable, provided that, if such correct age at entry be over fifty years no death benefit shall be paid and all premiums paid to the Society shall be forfeited to the Society. In case of over-statement of the member's age at entry the amount of death benefit payable hereunder shall be such as the correct premium for the correct age would have purchased and the difference between the total premiums paid and the total premiums which should have been paid shall be paid to the beneficiary."

This is a fair clause, both to the members and the Society. They both are protected with the same rights and duties.

Each member should comply with it. Those members who believe that they do not pay their mortality rates at the correct age, should verify the facts and should not wait until their beneficiary will straighten out the "mistake."

It should be remembered before all that the Supreme Board will carry out the provisions of the above stated requirement exactly as stated in the clause. No death benefit shall be paid prior to the establishment of member's correct age at the time of entry.
