4. Sec'y J. Tavcar, Slovene National Home, is to request the Directors' permission to provide a meeting place for the Council at nominal charge.
5. Councilman Pucel be requested to advise type of manufacturing that is going into the present Buckeye Ribbon plant on E. 55th St.
6. Mr. Louis Majer to be contacted to inform the Council what his plans are for the building he purchased on the corner of E. 62nd and St. Clair Ave.
7. Mr. Louis Majer and the committee on E. 64th St. to inform the Council the final outcome of their fight as regards the building next to the Croation Home on E. 64th St. Also, if it is their intention to reimburse the treasury of the Council with all or part of the funds provided for legal fees.

Mr. Grdina and Mr. Cesnik both deplored the lack of more members in attendance, especially the younger folks, who should be principally interested as to what will become of the property owned by their parents.

The above mentioned items will be brought up for further discussion at our Feb. 28th meeting. Set this date aside and let's attend in full force.

Boy Scout Week
FEBRUARY 8 - 14

The 15,000 Cubs, Boy Scouts and Senior Scouts of Greater Cleveland together with their leaders will join the almost two million members of the Boy Scouts of America in observing Boy Scout Week from February 8 to 14.

This year marks the 36th anniversary of the founding of the Boy Scout Movement in America and this year in keeping with world efforts towards peace and rehabilitation the Scouts have chosen for their theme "Scouts of the World Building Together."

Towards this end a special fund has been created by the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, and is called the "World Friendship Fund." Through voluntary contributions to this Fund, from Cubs and Scouts, real help is being extended to fellow Scouts in other lands less fortunate than ours. Already the Boy Scouts of the Philippines (once a part of the Boy Scouts of America, and now an independent Association) has received a shipment of Scout supplies and \$12,500. In all, thirty-seven shipments, mostly Scout literature, have been sent to twenty countries. The need is great and the World Friendship Fund will continue until the needs are met. Many Greater Cleveland Scout units have already contributed to the fund.

What Every Good Driver Should Know

The fact that you have been driving an automobile for the past ten years does not necessarily qualify you as a good driver. A good driver is one who knows the traffic rules and regulations and conforms to them at all times. In addition to knowledge of the written laws there are many situations that arise in traffic that the law book does not cover. The answer to these traffic problems is the use of common sense, and courtesy which has prevented many an accident.

Just how good a driver are you? To determine this test yourself on the questions listed below by answering true or false.

Five correct answers qualify you as a good driver. Three to four correct and you could stand some "brushing up" on your traffic rules. Any less than that figure in the "wrong" column makes you a potential contributor to the accident toll.

1. Safe drivers expect elderly pedestrians and children to make mistakes, and approach them, so slowly that they can stop in time if necessary.
2. Hand signals are considered important in the safe driving of automobiles.
3. The safe driver always depends on the other man to obey stop lights and signs.
4. A left turn on a four-lane highway should be made from the lane nearest the center line.
5. Most intersectional accidents cannot be avoided.

Changes in Yugoslav Cabinet

Belgrade, Yug. (AP)—Feb. 1—Yugoslavia became a Federated Republic under a new Constitution setting up a government with Marshal Tito as Premier.

Before packed galleries, the country's Constituent Assembly unanimously accepted the new basic law and as its first act called upon Marshal Tito as "the moving spirit of the new Yugoslavia" to form the government.

William Fraleigh, second secretary of the United States Embassy was among a score of diplomats who heard the proclamation that ended the monarchy and formally approved a number of changes in progress since Yugoslavia was freed from the Germans and Marshal Tito assumed power.

In addition to abolishing the throne, it divides Church and State and provides for redistribution of the land to those who work it.

Marshal Tito kept the office of Defense Minister and named Stanoje Simich, Yugoslav Minister in Washington, as Foreign Minister, the Belgrade radio reported. Edward Kardelj, Vice-Premier, retains that post and is also president of the Control Commission. Jasa Prodanovitch, formerly Minister for Serbia, becomes second Vice-Premier.
