Many a basket has been shot, and by the way, many a free throw has also been missed since the very first game which originated this series. That was the tussle of Feb. 3, 1934, between the St. Mary's girls of Waukegan and the St. Stephens of Chicago. The Waukeganites, managed by J. A. Cankar, have

this first victory to their credit. KSKJ basketball therefore has a history.

In looking over the past records, one may be tempted to ask: "Which community has carried away the lion's share of honors?" In the matter of championships, South Chicago has three heavyweight victories; two by the St. Florians and one by the St. Michaels. South Chicago likewise has all five lightweight championships, these the proud possession of the St. Florians.

Waukegan boasts of championships in the girls' division on two occasions; St. Annes winning in 1934 and the St. Marys in 1936.

Joliet has to their credit two heavyweight championships, those of 1937 and 1938, plus three victories in the games of the fair sex in the years 1935-37-38.

This compilation of victories still does not settle the basketball supremacy in the KSKJ, unless we devise some norm of comparison by which we may gauge their relative achievements. For this reason it has seemed fair to us to adopt a point system by which we will credit a championship team with 10 points and the team
