## NASILJE V STAVKI NEWYORŠKIH GROBARJEV

New York. — (F. P.) — Kravni krst je zadnja faza v stavki newyorških grobarjev na Calvary pokopališču, katerega dominira rimskokatoliška hierarhija. Tragedija se je dogodila, ko je prišlo do prvega spopada med stavkovno stražo in skebi. V spopadu so se stavkarji poslušali opeke, skebi pa samokrešev. Rezultat boja je: eden mrtvev in eden ranjen. Ranjen je bil neki skrb, ki je bil zabet v roko z opeko.

Mrtvev je pa stavkar Zasadzinski, ki zapušča ženo in štiri otroke. Kot morilec je bil prijet Nunziati, delovodja na pokopališču, ki je imel posebno piklo na ubitega Zasadzinskega. Ko je prišlo do spopada in so stavkarji priceli bežati pred streli, ki so bili oddani iz skebskega buša, je za,bežecim Zasadzinskim skočil Nunziati in mu pognal pet krogel v hrbot. Pobojnik se nahaja v zaporu pod obtožbo umora prve vrste.

Rimskokatoliška hierarhija evidentno namerava zdobiti stavko s skebi in nasiljem. Takтика, ki se poslužuje, je enaka taktiki vseh trdoravnih delodajalcev. Najela je število pobojnikov, ki spremjam skrbe na delo in iz dela in najela je večje število profesionalnih stavkovkov. V to svrhu se poslužuje Joe Kleinove uposlovne agencije, katera zalaže s skebi iz človeških nizin tudi Public Service kompanije v New Orleansu.

Med delavstvom je ta brutalni humor katoličana po katoličanu povzročil veliko ogorčenje. Ambulančni in pogrebni vozniki so sklenili, da začnejo s simpatično stavko, ako odgovorni cerkveni funkcionarji ne pristanejo, da se stavka grobarjev izvravna v par dneh. Vodstvo stavke morebitne prevzame centralna delavska unija, ki se je v tem oziru že posvetovala z novo organizacijo grobarjev.

## Lodge Leadership

Every lodge of every society in the fraternal benefit system would be a success if it had a real leader. Such as this statement may sound to some, its truth may be substantiated from the convincing arguments found in the history of fraternalism. It was leadership which founded the fraternal system; it has been leadership which has carried it through its many trials and vicissitudes, and it will be leadership which will carry it forward to greater accomplishments.

A real leader need not of necessity be an officer in the lodge. One thing he must be, and that is, a man who wins the support of friends readily; and a man with ideas and the executive ability and courage to put them into execution. There is too much today of the "let George do it" attitude. A leader will see that George isn't alone held responsible for this or that undertaking. He will see that every member is interested in helping George to "do it" and, furthermore, considers it a privilege to have the opportunity.

There are always a number of members in a lodge who will arise and propose this plan, offer that suggestion or venture an opinion. Somehow, these thoughts, valuable as they are at the time, fall of ever culminating in action. They are a good deal like beautiful, iridescent soap-bubbles from a child's blowpipe. They are exhilarating for the transient moments they float through the air into which they eventually vanish. A real leader takes these same brilliant thoughts and accomplishes definite, material things with them, if they are at all practicable. If not he modifies them and so shapes them that they are available to accomplish some real purpose.—Fraternal Monitor.

## Victor Berger Passes On

The passing of Victor Berger, former Socialist member of congress, is an event of more than ordinary importance.

Mr. Berger was a man of intellect, courage and character. It was these qualities in large measure that were responsible for his election to the nation's law-making body despite his espousal of an unpopular cause.

But Berger possessed something finer than intellect. He had a heart as tender as that which caused William Lloyd Garrison, Wendell Phillips and Owen Lovejoy to champion the cause of the enslaved black men. Every sufferer from injustice enjoyed Berger's sympathy and often this sympathy caused the temporary depletion of his pocketbook.

Berger was the first American Socialist to sit in the congress of the United States. He was first elected in 1910 following the great Socialist victory in Milwaukee which put Emil Seidel in the mayor's chair and gave the workers control of the city council.

A union of Democrats and Republicans prevented Berger's return to congress until 1918 when he was again chosen. This time the "patriots" were able to prevent his being seated. Congress by almost unanimous vote declared the seat vacant. But the voters of the Fourth Wisconsin district decided that it was their prerogative and not that of congress to say who should represent them and accordingly Berger was re-elected at a special election in December, 1919.

Mr. Berger was, however, not allowed to take his seat and it was not until March, 1923, that the two old party machines acquiesced in his being seated.

The workers of the United States have sustained a great loss in the death of Mr. Berger. His championship of their cause in congress and through the columns of the Milwaukee Leader was an aid that cannot today be duplicated by any other single person's efforts.—The Union Advocate.

## World Labor Movement

Recent figures given out by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics show that the total trade union membership of the world was 46,104,500 on Jan. 1, 1928.

This is a large membership. There is tremendous power represented in an organized body of more than 46 million workers. Moreover, the government figures show that this represents an increase of approximately 10,000,000 members in three years.

It is interesting to note how the world-wide labor movement is progressing. In some countries there has been a growth in labor membership that is simply amazing. In a few countries, however, conditions have caused the movement to decline.

Australia has perhaps the largest trade union membership based upon population. There were on Jan. 1, 1928, 911,652 members of organized labor in that country. This was an increase of nearly 180,000 over 1925.

Soviet Russia is in the lead in total membership with Germany a strong second. The Soviet Union had, according to the government figures, 10,248,000 trades unionists on Jan. 1, 1928, as against a membership of 6,604,004 on Jan. 1, 1925. Germany had 8,217,923 and 6,900,000 on the same dates. The trades unions of Russia gained more than 60 per cent in three years while those of Germany gained at the rate of about 20 per cent during the same period.

Austria, Hungary, New Zealand and Great Britain show losses. Unfavorable economic conditions are no doubt responsible for the decline.

The United States reports a gain in trades union members of more than 900,000 in the three-year period covered. There were 5,606,752 members of organized labor on Jan. 1, 1928, 4,241,842 on Jan. 1, 1925. This represents a fairly healthy growth, though it is apparent that on the basis of total population, workers' organization in the United States is still far below the position attained in some other lands.

### WORLD'S PRIZE TITLE

The death of Edward Carpenter in England the other day recalls his great book entitled "Civilization: Its Cause and Cure." That was one of the world's prize titles and the book lived up to its name. It is a keen ironical criticism of the hypocrisies and idiocies of a business civilization.

Dr. Raymond Pearl maintains that brilliant children generally spring from undistinguished parents. When listening to proud parents we ourselves have been struck by this.
