Izjava hrvatskega vođitelja Košutića na Dunaju

Atentat pomeni, da se je diktatura izjavila. Edino takojšnja akcija, da se vrne ljudstvu moč voliti svoje zastopnike, bo rešila položaj.

DUNAJ, 9. okt. — Atentat na kralja Aleksandra je na Dunaju povzročil silno razburjenje. Primerja se ga z umorom Franca Ferdinanda v Sarajevu. Hrvatski vođa August Košutić, ki se nahaja na Dunaju kot politični begunec, je danes izjavil, da je atentat direkten rezultat diktatorskega režima.

"Smrt kralja pomeni, da se diktatura definitivno izjavila," se glasi Košutićeva izjava. "Edino vladar brez odlašanja podvzame akcijo, da se ljudstvu vrne oblast voliti svoje zastopnike, se bo prepričilo resne nemire. Obžalovati je, ker se to ni storilo že prej. Dokler bo Hrvatska pod srbsko dominacijo, tolično čas ne bo miru. Želim pa vodariti, da niti jaz niti hrvatsko ljudstvo ne odobrava atentata."

V proti-francoskih krogih na Dunaju se pojavila misel, da umor kralja na francoski zemlji utegne primesti konec zavezništva med Francijo in malo entente. Opozarja se posebno, da si je Nemčija že več mesecov kako prizadevala, da bi pridobila prijateljstvo Jugoslavije.

Na tak certifikat si zamore član sposoditi denar za asesment, sprememiti ga za plačati dosmrtni ali plačati začasni certifikat, pod pogojem, da član za to zaprosi. 

And so we rode on thru that mantle of darkness, stopping once during the night for refreshments and rest, and stopping once again because the "Boo" said "I do not choose to run." With fingers crossed and lips that prayed we urged the vehicle out of its dilemma.

of the driver, who immediately applied the appearance over the eastern horizon, most of the occupants were trying as best they could, to gather some sleep. We had just left Montpelier twenty miles behind when the most disastrous incident of our trip occurred. We were rounding a curve at about forty-five per hour when the whole left rear of the bus seemed to fall thru the pavement with a loud bang. Instantly everybody was awake and crowding towards the exit. Cool-headedness

As the cold grey light of dawn made its brakes and manipulated the wheel in masterly fashion, averted more serious consequences. A check of the casualties revealed that Vic Tome was cut on the forehead by flying glass. A passing motorist was stopped and he was taken to a hospital in Montpelier to have the wound dressed.

Upon summing up our damage we found that the bolts holding the tire rim to the wheel had snapped as clean as tho they had been sheared. The fender was a tottered fragment and smoke was pouring from the under frame of the bus. How it could have caught fire was a mystery but in all possibility it was caused by the friction of metal. A dose from the fire extinguisher ended the smouldering. We then went to retrieve the tires, which to our surprise were far from the scene of the catastrophe. One of the tires lay about twenty-five feet away from the spot and the other had climbed a hill about a hundred feet and stopped within a few feet of a farm-house. Had this one hit the side of the house there would have been one sorry farmer. Both tires were cut beyond repair and one was so severely sliced that the inner tube was blown to bits.

There we were on the highway at 6:30 a.m., miles from nowhere and no hope of immediate aid. A chilly breeze was in the offing and we, miserable beings were cold and hungry. The driver managed a lift to a spot where he communicated with his superiors and then returned to labor as best he could with the wreck. We learned of a grocery store about a mile ahead and walked for our breakfast. Most of us had something to eat but there were a few individuals who were flat broke. Some good Samaritans in the crowd bought a quart of coffee and some sinkers, and fed the unfortunates.

How we withstood those trying moments and what we did during that delay, is hard to recall. Some tried playing ball in the cow pastures, others watched Nick the driver struggle with the lemon and still others huddled up inside the bus to sleep and keep warm.

About noon we began eating green apples from the farmer's orchard. By now some of the weary travelers were at wit's end. Four of the more courageous gentlemen in the group got a lift back to Montpelier and from there took the train to Chicago. At two o'clock in the afternoon we were finally picked up by another Chicago bound bus. We left our luggage behind as there was no room in the present bus. No sooner had we traveled about seventy-five miles than this vehicle began to breathe in gasps. Gas line trouble again. If I was superstitious I would believe a curse was upon us, but it was just plain rotten luck.

Seven miles from South Bend and this bus folded up. Stanley Tome again came into use after the driver's conceit had been subdued and after an hour's delay we went to South Bend. Another of our party left us and reverted to the trains to get home. Arriving in So. Bend we had a light lunch (those who could still afford it). From then on it was smooth sailing until we reached South Chicago at 9:30 p.m., just about thirty-one hours since we started. Ere long we were all home in bed.



I believe we could easily ring the bell if only the more active members went campaigning. What we need is some old-fashioned Slovene action. The S. S. P. Z. is the finest and most progressive Slovene fraternal beneficiary society and for that reason our members shouldn't need too many difficulties in selling prospects and the idea of joining. You've waited long enough "Gang"! The time to act is NOW! The way to get new members, and at the same time receive remuneration for work, is not by sitting by the fireside thinking and talking sweet nothings, but waking up to the fact that it is high time you were doing something useful for yourself, your lodge and the SSPZ. Get your dandruff up... Start ringing doorbells... It's hallowe'en season you know, and while you're at it stop long enough and talk convincingly enough that your friends and your friends' friends will understand that you're trying to do them a whooping big favor by having them become members of the most progressive society, offering the most modern form of fraternal insurance protection.

To my Pennsylvania Boosters... Let me remind you that I'm still a candidate for the GRAND PRIZE, "THE TRIP TO YUGOSLAVIA." Records show that I have reached the half-way mark and that there are sufficient voting certificates in District No. 1 to carry me across the Atlantic next summer. The Challenger Lodge, which I organized late last spring, now numbers 42 adults and 10 juveniles. It is no secret that the Challengers are out to surpass the Spartan membership and I'm sure they can and will within the coming year.

WHAT IS THE MATTER WITH OUR FRATERNAL SOCIETIES?

Why is it that year after year life insurance companies grow stronger and stronger financially and in membership, while fraternal beneficiary societies are gradually losing more and more ground? What is the reason for millions of our American people believing that they receive better protection with less risk from life insurance companies. Is it true that it costs less per \$1,000 insurance to be insured with life insurance companies? The answer is, emphatically, NO! Comparison of rates prove, without a doubt, that fraternal insurance is charge less and give more! Then, what is the answer to their success? Superior salesmanship based on modern methods and a wider knowledge of insurance facts. Fraternals have depended almost wholly on local lodge executives, usually the secretary, to promote field activity and enlargement of membership rolls. As long as loyalty and enthusiasm found presence among leaders of local groups everything went along in tip-top shape, but as soon as it died down a few degrees membership fell off until it was given another boost. This system of growth, based on loyalty and enthusiasm, worked alright and until the trained competitor stepped in and stole the show away from the fraternalists with his smooth line of propaganda. Almost immediately fraternals quit expanding, except in occasional jerks, while life insurance companies kept soaring higher and higher until today our fraternals are far in the rear. Because we dared not go out and seek business on an equal basis with our competitors (on the eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth basis) we have not only lost millions of dollars worth of insurance but are years behind in our system of selling insurance. Some suggest that our SSPZ send out organizers to stimulate interest where it is most lacking and necessary... A fine suggestion and one that merits inauguration.
