Canonsburg Society Adds To 22 Years' Work By Enriching Lodge, KSKJ Community

Of 2,000 Citizens, 400 Are Members of KSKJ in Strabane

Dedication Program Lists Prominent Speakers, Officers

WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA BOOSTER CLUBS PLEDGE SUPPORT IN MARKING MEMORABLE DATE

Canonsburg, Pa.—Climaxing 22 years of hard and zealous work on the part of its members, St. Jerome's Society, No. 153, will be rewarded for its work in the name of KSKJ on Labor Day when it will dedicate its new lodge home at Canonsburg, corner of Charities and Alexander Aves., Strabane.

The home will be very modern in its design and will be the most attractive building in Strabane, this very active community of Slovenians. Involving an expenditure of \$15,000, this home has created a new interest in KSKJ circles in this part of the community. This program is right in line with progressive attitude of KSKJ members in this district.

Have 400 Members
Starting with only a few members in April, 1914, at the Bevec home in Strabane, the St. Jerome's Society has now grown to total a membership of 275 members in the adult and juvenile divisions. Branching out from this lodge was the Queen of May Society, No. 194, with a membership of approximately 120 in both divisions. With the two lodges in existence, this town of Canonsburg now has enrolled nearly 400

members. Early in the '20s the lodge moved its headquarters from the Bevec residence to the present location, where stands the original homestead of all the surrounding lands and which has been the official meeting place of KSKJ members in this vicinity. The present building occupied by the lodge was built in 1832 and is still the landmark of this Slovenian settlement of some 2,000 Slovenians. St. Jerome's has upheld the traditions of this building in such a way that this landmark will continue to remain as a landmark in KSKJ history in Canonsburg.

Add Active Group
Within the last year or so, another active organization was the result of the fine and true spirit of KSKJ in Canonsburg. This new active combination organized only a year ago, last February, was the Kay Jay Booster Club. This club of young KSKJ members has given a great impetus to the program that was inaugurated by St. Jerome's. The club has been behind the movement 100 per cent and has done everything possible to make this program another record for KSKJ history. In every way

possible the club has been cooperating. Along with the club has been the Associated Booster Clubs of Western Pennsylvania who have given every backing possible toward this building program of St. Jerome's of Canonsburg. This work is greatly appreciated and the boosters assure the other clubs of Ambridge, Pittsburgh and Presto that this interest and spirit in our development will not be forgotten.

Praises Founders
The Kay Jay Booster Club does not forget that this step in the progress of St. Jerome's would not have been possible had it not been for the founders of the organization. To them they owe every bit of gratitude and appreciation for what they have made possible to be enjoyed as an asset of the organization. The boosters assure the founders that they will continue to do their share in upholding the honor and prestige that St. Jerome's has established in the local community as well as in KSKJ circles.

Preliminary Program Sunday
The dedication exercises will open on Monday morning with a preliminary entertainment in the new home on the Sunday before Labor Day. Those visiting the day before Labor Day will gladly be taken care of when they reach Strabane. The official program as set for Labor Day is the opening of the day's program with High Mass to be celebrated by the pastor and assistant pastor of St. Patrick's Church in Canonsburg. Following the Mass the members will have a general get-together at the new home until the afternoon, when the speaking program will be heard. Representing KSKJ will be Matt Pavlakovich, second vice president; Mrs. Agnes Gorisek, member of Board of Jurors; Frank Lokar of the Supreme Board of Auditors; Rudolph Rudman of the Board of Finances; John Decman of the Board of Jurors, and Ivan Zupan and Stanley Zupan, editors of the Glasilo and Our Page, who will make prominent addresses for the day. Climaxing the speakers' program will be Anton Grdina, former supreme president and an active KSKJ member. In the earlier days of the lodge's existence, Mr. Grdina was a guiding light in the steps of progress for St. Jerome's. On Labor Day he is to see accomplished a move that has been a direct result of his encouraging words to KSKJ members of this lodge. The program is to be interspersed with selections by the juveniles of KSKJ and the Pitt Kay Jay Booster Glee Club. Immediately after the program dancing and entertainment will be started and continued until the late hours of the night. Featuring the day will be a souvenir book published by the Kay Jay

ST. JOSEPH'S KSKJ BAND TO OPEN INTERLODGE EXPO BILL THURSDAY

Program Is First to Be Sponsored by Younger Set of Nationality Group

Cleveland, O.—The Interlodge Day at the Great Lakes Exposition Thursday evening, Sept. 3, will be opened by the St. Joseph's KSKJ Band and promises to be one of the biggest affairs of any nationality group, indications showed today.

The varied program which will be presented from the International Circle, Streets of the World, at 8 p. m., should attract several thousand people. The Slovenian Tavern in the Streets of the World, where the Interlodge will celebrate after the program, is being enlarged this week. The entire program will be carried through an amplifying system so that it will be heard clearly all around the circle.

This will be the only program presented by any nationality group handled and presented by the younger set.

Other acts to appear are: Frankie Yankovich's Accordion Trio, Johnny Pecon's Orchestra, the Germ Brothers, accordionists and the Slovenian dancers regularly seen in the International Revue; the Zarja Male Quartet; Beanie Modic in an exhibition comic wrestling

Booster Club.

With delegations coming from Ambridge, Presto, Burgettstown, Pittsburgh, Rankin, Johnstown, Aliquippa, Beaver Falls, Universal, Cleveland and other sections, a full day of entertainment is assured for everyone. MISSOURI TOPS AS NORTHERN STATE MAKES GOOD THREAT IN GOLDEN BOOSTER CAMPAIGN

Seven States Show Increase as Active List Is Boosted to 118 Societies

FIFTEEN STATES NOW IN RACE

Ohio Society Promises Surprise as Drive Goes Into High Speed

Fulfilling its promise of only a week, Montana nudged strong Ohio from second place, according to the campaign report issued by Golden Booster Secretary Zalar.

Montana's advance in the state standings was largely effected by the increase made by No. 14 and the addition of No. 16. Two more Montana societies are to be heard from to make the northern state's participation 100 per cent.

Incited perhaps by Montana's promise to gain, seven other states increased their total points. They are Ohio, Wisconsin, Indiana, Colorado, Illinois, Pennsylvania and Minnesota.

Of the total 186 societies in the Union, 118 are active in the drive. Societies of 15 states have joined the campaign, while six states are yet to join this big membership drive.

Unofficial news reports an Ohio society will shortly spring a surprise.
