Stimsonov govor izval proteste na Japonskem

Vojni urad ga je označil za novo provokacijo. — Japonsko časopisje urgira izstop v Lige narodov. — Odmevi Lytonovega poročila v Parizu.

Tokio, 4. okt. — Repräsentant vojnega urada je podal izjavu, ki jo je prineslo japonsko časopisje, v kateri pravi, da govor ameriškega državnega tajnika Stimsona, ki ga je imel prejšnji teden v Philadelphia, ograža prijateljske odnose med Japonsko in Združenimi državami.

Vojni urad pravi, da je Stimson s svojim govorom povno provokiral Japonsko, kar je zelo resna stvar. Urad vidi tudi tesno zvezo med govorom ameriškega državnega tajnika, objavo Lytonovega poročila glede japonsko-kitajskega konflikta v Mandžuriji in koncentracijo ameriške vojne mornarice na Pacifiku.

(Stimson je v svojem govoru v Philadelphiji pred člani Union League kluba dejal, da je predsednik Hoover formuliral uspešno politiko nepriznanja teritorijalnih pridobitev po oboroženi sili. Pristavlja, da je politika "odprtih vrat" potreba za ohranitev teritorialne in administrativne integralnosti Kitajske.)

Japonsko časopisje silno napada poročilo komisije Lige narodov, ki je proučevala situacijo v Mandžuriji z namenom, da ugotovi vzroke, ki so dovedli do japonsko-kitajskoga konflikta. Časopisje urgirajo izstop v slučaju, da bi Lige narodov usmerila svoje akcije v smislu Lytonovega poročila. Japonci nastri kritizirajo pripomočilo komisije, naj Mandžurija dobi samovladno pod suvereniteto Kitajske.

Zeneva, 4. okt. — Krog Lige narodov so bili iznenadjeni radi odmevov, ki jih je izvalo Lytonovo poročilo v francoškem in britiskem časopisu. Da je Pariz naklonjen Japonski, potrjujejo komentari o poročilu v francoškem časopisu.

Dasi je francoško-japonski pakt iz leta 1907, ki garantira medsebojno pomoč za ohranitev varnosti in miru v tistih pokrajinih na Dalnjem vzhodu, v katerih imata Japonska in Francija skupne teritorialne pravice, le vedno v veljavi, ni igral velike vloge v kontroverzi med Kitajsko in Japonsko glede Mandžurije. KRALJEVINA IRAK POSTALA NEODVISNA

Akcija proti papeževemu delegatu v Mehiki

Velika Britanija je odločila mandat in kraljevina je bila sprejeta v Lige narodov.

Zeneva, 4. okt. — Včeraj je kraljevina Irak postala suverena država in bila sprejeta za članico Lige narodov. Irak je bogata na olju in je bila pod pokroviteljstvom Velike Britanije od svetovne vojne sem.

"Po dolgih stoletjih tuje nadviše", je dejal Nicholas Politis, reprezentant Grčke, ki je predsedoval seji Sveta Lige narodov. "Je Irak dobil svobodo. Sedaj se bo lahko vrnil, ako to želi, v stare tradicije in civilizacijo, ki je prešla, a je vseeno zvezana z njegovimi starodavnimi mestci kot sta Babilon in Nineva. Od sedaj naprej se bo kraljevina pokorila le mednarodnim zakonom, ki so obvezni za vse. Velika Britanija je spet enkrat podala dokaz svoje velikodušnosti, ki je odločila mandat."

Vsi drugi govorniki so naglašali dejstvo, da je kralj Feisal razbremenjen od svojih mandatoričnih obligacij, ko je njegova dežela postala članica Lige narodov, in da bo sedaj prevzel obveznosti v smislu določenih mednarodnih pogodb.

Irak je prva država v Arabiji, ki je dobila svoje mesto na soncu preko Lige narodov. Dan je bil tudi migrij, da bo Iraku sledila Sirija, nad katero ima mandat Francija.

Kraljevina Irak je bila kreirana po svetovni vojni iz bivših turških provinc Mossul, Bagdad in Basra. Njena površina meri več kot 175,000 štirjaških milijonov kvadratnih kilometrov. Na podlagi cenzuma l. 1920 pa je takrat imela 2,849,282 prebivalcev.

Republika Chile dobila nov kabinet

Santiago, Chile, 4. okt. — Član novega kabinka v vladu provizoričnega predsednika Abrahamia Oyanedala, ki je že peti predsednik republike v zadnjih štirih mesecih, so bili včeraj zaprisenjeni. Oyanedala, blivši načelnik državnega vrhovnega sodišča, bo ostal na vladnem krmilu do 30. oktobra, ko se vrne splošne volitve. On je nasledil generala Bartoloma Blancha, ki je strmoligal vladu predsednika Carlosa Davila pred dvema tednoma, sedaj pa se je moral tudi on umakniti, ko je bila revolta proti militaristični vladni v severnih provincah uspešna. Novi čilski premier je postal Javier Angel Figuez. Njegov kabinet tvorijo reprezentanti vseh političnih strank.

Svedski komunisti v agitaciji za oprostitev Mooneyja

Stockholm, 4. okt. — Nepravilen incident je pokvaril obisk vlaškega princa na Svedskem. Skupina komunistov je namreč naločila letake na njegov avtomobil, ko se je on udeležil predstavitev v državni operi. Letaki so vsebovali poziv, naj prisneže vpliv pri ameriški vladni, da bo izpolnil Toma Mooneyja in Warren K. Billingsa iz državne jetnišnice v Kaliforniji, in da britiske avtoritete osvobode indijske anarhiste.

Angiški laboristi zagovarjajo trgovino s Sovjetom

Leicester, Anglija, 4. okt. — Na tukajnem letnem zboru angiške delavskih strank je bila včeraj sprejeta rezolucija, ki obsega vsak prelom med Veliko Britanijo in sovjetsko Rusijo z ozirom na trgovinski pakt kot je bilo priporočeno na ekonomski konferenci britskega imperija v Ottawi.

Brezposelnost v bogatih mestih

Miami, Fla. — Brezposelnost v tem mestu, kamor prihaja po zimi ameriška plutekratija, se je povečala za petsto odstotkov. Rusija, naj podlje svoje reprezentante vse svetovne države, ker je komisija povabila tudi Rusijo, naj podlje svoje reprezentante. Datum otvoritve je določen.

Milica poslana proti rudarjem

Božjani pred novimi izredi se je povprašala, ko je bil eden učnički rudar obstreljen.

Canton, Ill., 4. okt. — Semkaj je senci prispeva kompanija narodne garde iz Peorije pod poveljništvo kapetana Amerika Bonjeana, da prepriči grozeče nemire. Militski je zahteval serif okraja Fulton C. Pickett potem, ko je bil neki učnički rudar nevarno obstreljen. Militski so zasedli vse važne pozicije na cestah križiščih. Polozaj je postal krščen po poskušnem umoru rudarja in saradniku ne počoka, ki se je pojavil med sovražnimi rudarskimi skupinami, ki je zadnje soboto rezultiral v izgred. V tem okolišu prebiva najmanj tisoč rudarjev, od katerih se je dvesto izreklo za vrnitev na delo na podlagi nove mednarodne konvencije.

Rudar, ki je bil obstreljen, se piše Robert Pollitt. On in njegova žena sta bila na podlagi stvarjanju Charlesa Pachirera, ki laštuje enega od tukajnjih predsednikov. Ko sta se ustavila pred Pachirerovo hišo, je priseljil mimo drž avtomobil, v katerem je sedež vodnikov. Otvorili so ga in ena krogla je zasedla Polista v pleča. Rudar se je takoj tekoč ranjen zgrudil na tla. Deputirani Ben Hunter, ki je stal v bližini, je hitro pobral ranjeno rudarja in ga odpeljal v bolnišnico, kjer je zdravnik Mark S. Nelson izvrnil nujno operacijo.

Tako po tem incidentu je bilo deputiranih več mož, ki bodo pomagali milici vrediti red. V slednjem, da se pojavi novi novembar, je dejal Green: "Učinkne degeneracije, izvirajoči iz svetovne vojne, so vedno čutimo v našem narodnem življenju, toda posledice sedanja katastrofe bodo daleko teže in trajnejše. Ostalo bo do rane na telesu milijonov ljudi. Beda in bolezni — morala, ki izvira iz brezposelnosti, izvirajoči življenjsko silo ameriškega naroda."

Green naglaša, da bi se del velik del razpadanja prepričal, da sedaj, ako bo delodajalc oboperiral z delavstvom, skrajšal delovni čas, ustvaril ved del in sbrali skide za podpiranje državnih depresij. Armada brezposelnih je v avgustu naraščala na 115,000, kar pomeni, da se je v enem mesecu povečala na stopnjo Green je ugotovil, da so se stroški za oskrbovanje bednih v 125 večjih ameriških mestih povzročili v avgustu v primeri z istim mesecem lanskega leta. "Nedvomno bo prihodnja zima prinesla trpljenje za milijone ljudi, kakršna ta dežela se ni poznala, in nobenih načrtov, ki bi preprečili, ni na vidiku," je rekel Green. "Dokler ne bodo ustvarjene prilike za zapošljitev delavcev, kar se more izvršiti le s skupno kooperacijo, bodo morale milijonske organizacije podprtati na milijone družin."

Green v svoji izjavi nikjer ne omenja sklado \$300,000,000, katerega je Kongres na zadnjem zasedanju aprobitiral za podprtje brezposelnih v bližini uradne mestne pomočne agencije. Brezposelnim so se sbrali tam, da protestirajo proti krivični delitvi podpora.

Washington, D. C. — Zvezni senator Hiram Bingham je označen v okrožnici, ki jo je poslala organizirano delavstvo v državi Connecticut. Ameriška delavška federacija "kot najzagovorenejši sovražnik, ki ga ima delavstvo v senatu". Okrožnico je podpisal predsednik federacije Green in drugi člani eksekutivne uprave.

Philadelphija, Pa. — Nad petdeset moških in žensk je odneslo krvave praski, ko je policija razstrelila mirno zborovanje brezposelnih v primeri z istim mesecem lanskega leta. "Nedvomno bo v državah vseh 260 tovarn v evropskih in drugih državah. Vrednost izvoza ameriških produktov je bila v tekuku rasprave o Grundyjevi carinski zakonodaji v Kongresu. Ameriški koncerne so od meseca maja 1932 do maja 1933 zgradili 268 tovarn v evropskih in drugih državah. Vrednost izvoza ameriških produktov je bila v mesecu juniju 1930, ko je Grundyjeva carinska predloga postal zakon, \$294,000,000, v juniju tega leta pa je padla na \$115,000,000.

Eina stvar je gotova. Doigov na farme se morajo znizati ali celo iztrati. Agrarna produkcija mora priti pod aktualno kontrolo, očititi je treba farme zadruge, vse to pa vodi k stabilizaciji in ljudskemu lastništvu zemlje. Ti problemi zahtevajo resno upoštevanje.

Red Lodge, Mont. — Iz načrta se malokateri oglaši v slovenskih listih. Nihče rad ne piše o žalostnih novicah, veseljega pa ni kaj poročati. Tako sem se namenila, da se oglašim vsaj enkrat na leto v naši prijedolni Prosveti. Če hočem obljubo izpolniti, moram priceti z delom, kajti istico se nagiba h koncu.

V Prosveti je bilo že sporočeno, da so tukajšnji edini premogovnik zaprli; da ga bodo še kdaj obnovili, ni nikakega upanja več, ker je kompanija vzel stroje in drugo opravo iz jame. Naložili so vse na železniške vozove in odpisali v kraj (meni nepoznam), kjer ima Northwestern Improvement Co. svoje podjetje. Zadnji dan dela je bilo samo s kratkimi besedami povedano delavcem, naj poberejo svoje orodje iz jame, ker kompanija dotednega rudnika ne misli več odpreti. Delo je zgubilo kakih 185 delavcev. Niso všetki oni, ki so bili še prej brez dela.

Neka zanesljiva oseba je rekel, da so zato prenehali z delom, ker se jim dotočno podjetje ni več izplačevalo, da ni bilo dobiti trga za premog, ne pravene za istega. Meni se zdi, da zadnji jem je delalo največ preglavic. Ce ni doleti dobri, potem lastniki nočejo, da bi tako podjetje obratovalo. Kajti danes je glavno doblek, potem še le pride potreba. Delavec ni nihče vprašal, če so si kak cent prisadrili, da jim bo lajšal življenje toliko časa, da najdejo kje drugod kako delo, še manj pa kak spomin na one tovariste, ki so dali življenje v omenjenem rudniku za sveto počasnost.

Na Washoe in Bearcreek so začeli z delom 15. avg., kakor hitro je bila podpisana nova pogodba med delavci in lastniki. Dela se slabo — 2 do 4 dni na teden. V omenjenih naselbinah je še tudi dobiti brezposelnih. V domačem listu je bilo povedano, da je vsem v celiem okraju do 1000 (en tisoč) brez dela. Te številke so velike za tako malo okraja.

Novo cesto, katero so začeli graditi lani septembra in ki bo peljala iz tega mesta v narodni Yellowstone park, še ni gotova. Delo se z veliko nagleico nadaljuje. Domačinov je male uposlenih. Kontraktor je večina delavcev s seboj pripeljal, ko je z delom pričel.

Delo je menda trdo in neverno; je bilo že nekaj delavcev več ali manj poškodovanih. Držati se morajo tudi nekih gotovih pravil. Nekemu delavcu ni bilo po volji, ker je delal čez urni čas, ne da bi dobil plačano; je go drnjal preglašao, tako da je tudi boss zvedel. Pa so mu hitro povestali, da naj pobereš sila in kopita in naj gre od koder je prišel. "Delaj in molči. Ce se temu povelju nočča pokoriti, potem ves kaj se s teboj zgodi!" Nezdovoljenev ne marajo. S pomocjo judečev gospodarji z luhkoto uženejo svoje nepokorne delavce, posebno dane, ker je na razpolago toliko človeškega blaga.

Kmalu bi pozabili povedati, da imamo v našem mestu tudi tovarno za prezerviranje sočivja. Vkuhavajo največ fiziola in graha in nekaj malega tudi druge zelenjave. Obratuje od 10—12 tednov v letu. Upozlenih je kakih 50 oseb, največ ženskih, in najraje so dall očenjenim ženskim delo. So rekli, da so bolj zanesljive in bolj pridne kot dekleta. Tako je staršem najprej treba hčeri poiskati ženina, potem je žele sposobna za delo. Cudne čase smo doživel.

Kot se vidi iz listov, tudi po drugih krajih so delavci v slabem položaju. Marsikatera žena oziroma mati s strahom gleda v bodočnost in se na tihem vprašuje, kaj bo? Žima prihaja, šola se je začela, otroci potrebujejo tople obleke, tečne hrane in tople sobe. Kje vse te preporebne stvari dobiti, ker ni denarja? Mož — oče 2 meseca, morda 1—2 leti brez stalnega dela. Nikdo tega ne ve, kako boli, kot mati, če mora gledati žalostne in nezadovoljne obraze svojih otrok.

Dolžnost staršev je, da se bori proti tem nezmožnim razmeram, katere vladajo dane med revnim ljudstvom. Delavke žene se vse premašijo brigajo, da bi se izobrazile v delavski politiki. Tukaj odpade tudi ne-

A CALL FOR MERGER OF LODGES

As stated in one of our previous notices published in Prosveta, a regular Convention of the Slovene National Benefit Society must be held every four years, or quadrennially. It is so provided in our constitution. Our last regular Convention was held in 1929, and, accordingly, in the month of May, 1933, we have to convene again.

Every lodge—be it large or small—existing for more than four months has a right to be represented at our conventions; provided, however, that the small lodges merge for the purpose of attaining the prescribed number of members and elect one delegate jointly.

Because of the inability to pay, we have lost many good members during the present economic crisis, and there are a great number of lodges which this time will not have enough members for election of a delegate by themselves, and which will have to merge if they wish to be represented at the Convention.

All mergers of lodges for this purpose must be carried out in a prescribed manner in order to be valid, and we, therefore, call special attention to the provisions of the By-Laws governing such election, which may be found in Section 1, Article V, and which reads as follows:

ARTICLE V.

Representation and Election of Delegates

1. Each local branch, having one hundred to two hundred fifty members, shall be entitled to a representation of one delegate; branches having more than two hundred fifty members are entitled to one more delegate. No local branch shall send more than two delegates. Branches not fully four months in existence at the time of election shall not be entitled to a delegate. Branches having less than hundred members each shall be called upon by the Supreme President within the first week of the month of October prior to the convention year to unite in order to have the necessary number of members by February 1st following for electing a delegate. Local Branches so united must notify the Supreme President of their combination by the 15th day of February of the convention year in order that it may be valid. Such combined Branches may hold elections of the delegate simultaneously on the same day as agreed by them at their regular meetings in the previous month at which the candidates have been nominated. The secretaries of the combined Branches shall inform each other concerning this action by the last week of the month set for nomination of the candidates. Any election of the delegates not carried out as provided by this Section shall be null and void.

According to the above quoted provisions every lodge having one hundred or more members may send one delegate to our Convention; a lodge with two hundred fifty-one or more members may have two delegates; and lodges having less than one hundred members may also be represented, but they must merge for election—two or more lodges—and have together at least one hundred members.

Said section provides, also, that lodges having less than one hundred members shall be called upon by the Supreme President within the first week of October prior to the Convention to unite. Our records show the following lodges as having less than one hundred members:

West Penn Federations

Ambridge, Pa.—The next conference of the Western Penn Federation of English Speaking lodges of the SNPJ will be held at the Sloane Hall (51st and Butler st.) in Pittsburgh on Oct. 16, convening promptly at 8 p.m. E.S.T. Notices pertaining to the conference have been sent to each of the sixteen E. S. lodges in the locality. Credentials accompanying each notice must be properly filled out. There is need that each lodge within the Federation properly instruct their delegates to act in a truly representative manner.

Some proceedings of the Ambridge July 17 conference that may be of value to all delegates are:

- An amendment to Article V, Sec. 4 and Sec. 8 of the Federation By-Laws was enacted whereby only duly elected delegates had the power to cast votes in all conference proceedings. The Fed. officials deprived of voting privileges have retained right of voice in all matters; and, no restrictions were placed upon them prohibiting them to serve as delegates—thereby if they are duly elected delegates by their respective lodges they have the right to vote.

(b) Each lodge should instruct its delegates to be fully prepared to discuss the society's By-Laws, presenting the individual lodge's viewpoint on the subject. Each delegate should bring a copy of the SNPJ By-Laws to the conference.

(c) The report of delegate Prijsal of his trip to the Westmoreland County Federation session last July 24 should be submitted to the conference. Likewise the reports of delegates Swirian and Boile of their representation at the Library conference of July 24.

There have been instances in the past wherein lodges cooperated to the extent that social dates caused no friction within the Federation. The most recent magnanimous instance of this cooperation was demonstrated on the part of the Veronians when they, of their own accord, postponed their Aug. 21 picnic date so that the Clairtonians could hold their picnic without any competition on the part of an E. S. lodge in the locality. Future social dates of the Fed. lodges for non-competitive negotiations thereof are officially requested by the Universal Comets for Oct. 29, Strabane Pioneers for Dec. 31, and Ambridge Revelers for Dec. 31. All lodges of the Federation are asked to hold these dates open.

The Oct. 16 conference is the last regular Federation session for 1932. At the outset of the Federation the officers were elected and installed at the January session to serve for one year. The present terms will soon expire.

Additional items of interest to the delegates and lodges. Sports, particularly bowling, may be a topic of interest to some. Some convention talk may arise—particularly of lodges' consolidations in forming the required 100 membership to select convention delegates.

There will be special stress laid on this item at the conference. Each lodge within the Federation is required to pay assessments of 1¢ per adult member per year; unless a satisfactory reason of non-payment or of inability is given. At the January conference a time period extending through the year until the October session for payment of these dues was made. Majority of the lodges within the Federation have already complied with the ruling. The few lodges who to date have not settled this matter must do so at the Oct. 16 conference, or prior to its convening.

The Federation auditors, vis. Victor Jackovac, John Liker and Martin Urranker, and Treasurer August Rink are to meet at 1 o'clock at the hall in order to check on the finances of the Federation.

At times difficulty is experienced at the conference because of the tediousness of the proceedings. Discomfort is felt and a speedy adjournment is sought by some. That some sessions are tiresome is true; that interest lags after a few opening discussions is obvious. For a successful, satisfactory termination of a conference patience is required plus a whole-hearted cooperation for an orderly business procedure. An attentive, sincere delegation is superior to obtaining good results than an inattentive, indifferent assembly.
