NEW CHARTERS AND EMBLEMS

Recently we have forwarded to the secretaries of our subordinate lodges new Charters under the name of the American Fraternal Union. It is recommended that the Charters be put into an appropriate frame and exhibited on the wall of the lodge meeting room.

The local secretaries will also receive samples of the new Union's emblems or buttons which have been approved by the Supreme Board on the occasion of the semi-annual meeting last August. Each and every lodge will receive two samples, one for men and one for women. These samples are sent gratis.

For men's buttons we shall charge the lodges 20 cents each, for women's buttons 30 cents each. The lodges will sell to the members men's buttons at 25 cents each and women's buttons at 35 cents each.

We are prepared to fill orders at once. For the cost of the buttons we shall bill the lodges on the statement of monthly assessments.

Know Your By-Laws

Facts derived from actual experiences between members and our Supreme Office have revealed surprisingly that many of our members, particularly the English Speaking groups, are not familiar with the by-laws of our American Fraternal Union. If they had, many general misunderstandings could have been avoided.

Our English-Speaking groups are enthusiastically active in promoting social and sports activities which are highly beneficial to our society. Their concerted efforts have been an immense factor in promoting goodwill and a good name for the AFU.

But suddenly a difficulty may arise. Perhaps a situation that demands a knowledge of the by-laws before it can be properly settled. Not knowing the rules governing any particular case, a member may become bitter and morose, and if not satisfied, may verbally condemn disposition of his particular case. Had he been familiar with the by-laws, he would have known the disposition of his case before submitting it to the proper authorities. And if he felt his right in contending a more favorable settlement in his own behalf, he could after action by the Judiciary Committee of his lodge submit it to the Supreme Judiciary Committee whose duty it is to investigate the case from all angles and pass judgement on same.

Many dissatisfied members can trace their organization troubles to their own failure to read the by-laws. Therefore, it is essential and a necessity for every member of our American Fraternal Union to have a complete concise knowledge of the by-laws. Individual and general progress of the subordinate lodge and society in general depends on this knowledge, which if kept in mind, will help to maintain a closer coordination between lodge officers, Supreme Officers, Supreme Office, and members.

For in this little blue-book, adopted and approved by the highest governing tribunal — the Quadrennial Convention — every rule and regulation, providing for every single member is clearly defined. It can be called the "Heart of the AFU." Without it, our organization could not survive. Printed in both Slovene and English texts, it is easy to read and to understand.

Beginning with the next issue, the editorial staff of Nova Doba, will begin a series of articles explaining portions of the by-laws. It is intended to arouse interest of members in helping them know the fundamentals of our AFU.

Given a machine, a new employee, in order to be advanced or promoted to higher pay ranks, will get to know every little phase of it to see how he can increase his production. He will study it; keep it in the best of condition. For if it breaks down — so does his wage decrease.

Machine of every AFU member is the little blue book of by-laws. Know it well, and you will better appreciate being a member of this wonderful society, and will be better able to derive from it, everything it has to offer.
