Apple Strudel

4 cups flour, 2 eggs, 1 tsp. salt, lard or butter the size of a walnut, 1 1/4 cups (about) warm water. Mix five ingredients together in a bowl using hands.

Cheese Strudel

Make dough as for Apple Strudel, when rolled let stand until dough is dry. Spread cream or melted butter over dough.

Cream Strudel

Make dough as for Cheese or Apple Strudel. Cream 1/4 lb. or more butter, add 3 egg yolks, a few drops of vanilla extract, 1 pint sour cream, enough sugar that the mixture will be sweet.

Cherry Strudel

Make dough as for Apple Strudel. Cream 1/4 lb. butter, add 2 egg yolks, 2 tbsp. sugar or more, 1 pint whipping cream, 2 egg whites beaten stiffly.

Walnut Strudel
