Some even die of fright when hearing the air-raid alarm after having had a close call during the preceding raid.

"In this morning's raid a bomb, evidently destined for the barracks across the street fell short of its mark and landed only thirty feet from

The Purificator

"You Knights have often helped the priest vest for Mass. After vesting, the priest arranges the chalice. Before him on the vestment case is the chalice and over the top of it he drapes a folded linen cloth called the purificator. This purificator cloth is from 12 to 18 inches long and nine or ten inches wide. It is folded in three layers so that when placed over the chalice its width is about three inches. Now what is the purpose of the purificator? Just what its name implies. It is used for cleaning or purifying the interior of the cup before wine is poured into the chalice; it is used for cleaning the paten after the Pater Noster before the Sacred Host is placed on it; and it is used for drying the priest's lips and purifying the chalice after the priest's communion."

After all, singing is by no means a mere prayer of the mouth, even if the singer at the moment does not remember the meaning of what he is saying. For example a child who recites a verse before some celebrant or for some occasion does not usually understand the meaning, but instead, learns the words as they follow each other, this, nevertheless, does not take away from the meaning of the verse as a person listens to it. So, as you go up into the choir make your good intention—that you shall do your bit for the honor and glory of God.
