98 LODGES IN GOLDEN BOOSTER CAMPAIGN

KERZAN LEADS BATTERS AS CHI-STEPHENS POUND OUT HITS FOR 15-6 WIN OVER ST. JOSEPHS

First Victory of Season Bolsters Chicagoans' Spirit; Set for Second Round Chicago, Ill. — Thoroughly chagrined at the previous futile attempts to score a victory in the current Midwest league, members of the St. Stephen nine on June 28 trekked to Waukegan determined to subjugate the St. Joes, who were equally determined not to be the first victims of the locals. In this battle of determination the Chicago boys were the victors, however, for they proceeded to unmercifully pound the opposing hurler and completely submerge their North Side cousins under a barrage of 16 hits to score a smashing 15 to 6 triumph.

Leading the attack for the locals was Kerzen, who had a perfect day at the plate by hitting safely four times and scoring three runs. Close on his heels was Bogolin, who pounded out three safeties, two singles and a double. Basco and Smyth each touched the enemy hurler for two hits. In fact, all members of the team contributed their share in pounding out this first victory of the season at the expense of the Waukegan boys. Although the affair was very one-sided, the Chicagoans did not leave unscathed. Smyth, despite yielding only eight hits, was erratic in his hurling and in constant hot water. He issued seven passes, five of which came at start of separate innings. Only tight fielding by his teammates prevented a possible defeat. Whether he eased up under his wide lead is a moot question. As a result of this highly needed triumph, the morale of the locals was considerably bolstered. They now look to their forthcoming tilts with an eagerness that would do justice to the St. Florians. They now talk not of their past defeats, but of their future revengeful triumphs over their enemies. As Manager Mack Terselich so aptly put it, "No more defeats!" Whether this optimistic prophecy comes true only the next month will tell.

Twelve States Show Marked Increases

St. Christine's, No. 219, Golden Booster, Doubles Quota to Lead Field

With 12 states showing a total gain of 5,849 points, the latest report on the KSKJ Golden Booster Campaign issued by Golden Booster Secretary Joseph Zalar, is the most encouraging since the inception of the campaign three months ago.

A noted improvement in the roster of competing societies was made by the addition of nine new societies, making the total of active workers now 98. The new lodges are Nos. 38, 57, 86, 113, 166, 184, 207 and 224.

Outstanding gains for the past week were led by No. 219 with 5,704 points; No. 101 in its first appearance on the records registered a 3,268 count; No. 70, Missouri leader, tallied 2,725; No. 165 augmented its total by 2,325; No. 115 added 2,101, and No. 169 annexed 2,029.

Society, forged ahead for top honors. After having made quota, Campaign Manager George Kaliope and his workers set out to double their mark. Their efforts were not in vain, for the society has to date more than doubled its quota and wrote more than \$30,000 in new insurance.

Lorain's No. 101 with its last week's register nudged itself into third place in the Ohio standing. No. 169 holds second.

Leading the parade of Illinois boosters, No. 119 of Rockdale is doubling its forces to keep in the lead. Keen competition is expected from Nos. 143 and 29.

A change in the report for next week may or may not be affected in the Colorado standing, as Nos. 55 and 56 are separated by only 564 points. The same holds true for Michigan, where Nos. 30 and 249 are parted by a mere 25 points.

"How are you going to pass your final examination?" a friendly professor asked the youth.

"What examination?" asked the student in amazement since it was not the examination period.

"The one we professors and students both take on the Day of Judgment."

"I never heard of it," the student protested.

"If it will help you to pass," the professor continued, "I shall gladly give you the question."

"Sounds foolish to me—getting the questions in advance," remarked the student.

"Yes, but this is so important that the Divine Master didn't want us to make a mistake."

"What are the questions?" the young man asked with awakened interest.

"They concern the works of mercy. From the Judge Who never errs you will receive this challenge: I was hungry and you gave me to eat, thirsty and you gave me to drink, naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me—"

"That's fine," the student said, "we doctors ought to register on that."

"Certainly," the professor continued, "but you are not going to be 'among the doctors' unless you learn one thing—when you grind away today in college at biology and chemistry and spend hours necessary to prepare you for ministering to the sick, you are visiting the sick effectively, if not affectively, and the Divine Master is as much pleased with

you as if you were performing a great surgical feat."

"Why, that means," the student continued in a tone of bewilderment, "that even a college student can do things while in school."

"Every study and every hour of honest endeavor," continued the professor, "can be linked up with its proper place in the Divine Scheme of Mercy.
