

Ohijski gubernator obtožil Hopkinsa kriminalnega obrekovanja v sporu

Zapretil mu je z aretacijo in sodnijskim postopanjem, če pride v Ohio

DRŽAVNI SENAT ODREDIL PRE-ISKAVO

Columbus, O., 19. marca. — Senzacionalni spor med federalno vlado in državno vlado, ki ga je izzvala obdolžitev o veliki korupciji v upravi ohijskega reliefa, pretresa Columbus in Washington.

Harry Hopkins, načelnik federalne reliefne administracije, ki ima zaslonbo pri Rooseveltu, je v pismu, ki ga je naslovil ohijskemu gubernatorju Martinu L. Daveyju, dejal, da ima nepoštne dokaze o veliki korupciji v upravi državnega reliefa. Med temi dokazi so zaprežene izjave, da je Daveyjev kampanjski komitej izsiljeval denar od trgovcev, ki so prodajali blago reliefne administracije. Hopkins je nato odzval, da je bil ohijski relifom gubernatorju in jo poveril C. C. Stillmanu, da jo upravlja v njegovem imenu.

Davey je nato naznanil, da smatra Hopkinsove obdolžitve za kriminalno obrekovanje. Pozval ga je, naj pride v državo Ohio, če ima pogum, kjer ga čaka aretacija in obravnava pred sodiščem. Sklepal je tudi izredno zasedanje državne legislature in zahteval preiskavo državne reliefne administracije. Višja državna zbornica je ugodila gubernatorju in na svoji seji soglasno sprejela resolucijo, ki določa preiskavo reliefne administracije od 1. 1933 do danes. Preiskovalni komitej bo tvorilo pet članov višje in pet članov nižje zbornice.

Potem, ko je Davey obtožil Hopkinsa kriminalnega obrekovanja, je slednji izjavil, da je predložil dokaze o korupciji v državni relifni administraciji ohijskemu generalnemu pravdniku Lucas in Franklin. Uradniki zveznega justičnega departmanta so objavili Hopkinsu vso podporo, toda on ne bo šel v državo Ohio in se izpostavil aretaciji.

Davey je bil izvoljen za gubernatorja v zadnjem novembur kot demokrat in prej je bil več let član nižje kongresne zbornice.

C. C. Stillman, ki je bil doslej pokrajinski direktor federalne reliefne administracije, je večerjal prezel kontrolo nad državnim relifno administracijo. Njemu je Hopkins poveril tudi dodatno vsoto dva milijona dolarjev za obrambo brezposelnih revežev v Ohio.

V svojem govoru pred člani državne zbornice je Davey zanikal obdolžitve, da je on zapleten v korupciji. Dejaj, da mu je Hopkins storil veliko krivico in zato se ne boji preiskave. On je prepričan, da bo preiskava izprala njegovo nedolžnost.

Cleveland, O., 19. marca. — Spektakularni konflikt med ohijskim gubernatorjem in načelnikom federalne reliefne administracije Hopkinsom, ki je rezultiral v federalni kontroli državne reliefne uprave; izvira iz zadnje volilne kampanje, ko je Davey kandidiral za gubernatorja na demokratski listi. Objubil je tudi, da se ne bo dotaknil clevelandske administracije, ko bo pričel z reorganiziranjem državnega reliefa, toda kmalu potem, ko je zasedel gubernatorski stol, je odločil F. D. Hendersona, direktorja državnega reliefa in postavil W. A. Wallsa na izpraznjeno mesto.

Demokratska organizacija v clevelandskem okraju je podpirala Daveyja v volilni kampanji, toda med njo in Rooseveltovo administracijo ni pravega prijateljstva. Na demokratski konvenciji v Chicagu je clevelandska delegacija vodila opozicijo proti nominaciji Roosevelta za predsedniškega kandidata. To deloma pojasnjuje sedanji konflikt med Daveyjem in Hopkinsom.

Pristaniščni delavci izvojevali priznanje

New Orleans, La. — Pristaniščni delavci so te dni sklenili pogodbo z delodajalci, ki je prva od 1. 1917. Grožnja s stavko je prisilila delodajalce na kapitulacijo in priznanje unije.

30-urni delovnik sprejet v odseku

Washington, D. C. — Senatni justični odsek je v ponedeljek sprejel Blackov zakonski predlog, da se delovnik v industrijah skrajša na 30 ur v tednu, to je na šest ur in pet dni. Predlog bo zdaj priročen senatni zbornici, naj ga sprejme.

Kapitalisti srdito nasprotujejo temu načrtu in boj naj v senatu bo hud.

Klavniški delavci končali stavko

Sioux Falls, S. D. — Okrog 1300 klavniških delavcev, ki so zastavkali proti Morrell Co., se je vrnilo na delo, ko je pokrajinski vladni delavski odbor objavil, da bo upošteval njihove zahteve glede skrajšanja delovnih ur in starostnih pravic. Odbor je tudi odredil, da mora družba ponovno uposliti 30 delavcev, ki so bili odpušteni zaradi unijskih aktivnosti. Sentiment za stavko je še vedno močan. Delavci se tudi togote na gubernatorja Berryja, ki je poslal milicijske in stavkovno okrajne in s tem provocalni nemire.

VODITELJ JAPON-SKEGA DELAVSTVA OBIŠČE AMERIKO

San Francisco, Cal. — (FP) Kanju Kato, načelnik splošnega komiteja japonskih strokovnih unij, se je odzval povabilu Ameriške delavske federacije in bo prišel v Združene države proti koncu aprila.

Kato je aktiven v unijskem gibanju od 1. 1919, ko je postal organizator tiskarskih delavcev in je vodil stavko, ki je ustavila izdajanje vseh tokijskih dnevnikov za teden dni. Od 1. 1927 je predsednik kovinarske unije in njemu gre zaslug, da so vse japonske unije združile v splošnem komiteju strokovnih unij.

On je velik nasprotnik vojne. L. 1918 se je uprl pozivu, naj se pridruži japonskim četam, ki so bile poslane v Sibirijo proti ruskim boljševikom. Vodil je tudi opozicijo pozneje, ko je Japonska začela svojo militaristično kampanjo v Mandžuriji. Ameriška delavska federacija naznanja, da bo imel Kato predavanja v vseh večjih mestih z namenom, da se utrdi prijateljstvo med japonskim in ameriškim delavstvom.

ČASOPISNI DELAVCI IZVOJEVALI KONCESIJE

New York. — (FP) — Dva newyorška dnevnika — "Herald Tribune" in "Daily News" — sta pristala na koncesije, odklonila pa sklenitev pogodbe z gildom časopisnih delavcev. Predstavniki gilda so sprejeli koncesije, obenem pa naznanili, da bodo nadaljevali boj za priznanje.

List "Herald Tribune" je sprejel lestvico, ki določa minimalne plače za reporterje, odklonil pa je priznanje unije z motivacijo, da bi to oviralo razvoj sposobnosti in talentov posameznih reporterjev. Uprava "Daily Newsa" je izjavila, da je pripravljena reševati pritožbe nameščenec in razpravljati o delovnih pogojih na skupnih sestankih, da ne bo zapostavljala članov gilda, toda organizacije ne more priznati iz finančnih in ekonomskih razlogov.

Sodišče oprostilo voditelja železničarjev

Cleveland, O. — Prizivno sodišče je dalo popolno zadoščenje A. Johnstonu, načelniku bratovščine železniških strojevnikov, ki je bil obtožen raznih kriminalnih prestopkov kot direktor več korporacij, v katerih je bila njegova organizacija zainteresirana. Prizivno sodišče je razveljavilo odlok nižjega sodišča, v katerem je bilo rečeno, da je Johnston poveril večje vsote denarja iz sklada korporacij in ponaredil rekorde.

Roosevelt bo vetiral vsak vojaški bonus

Washington, D. C. — Predsednik Roosevelt je te dni sporočil kongresu, da bo zavrgel Patmanov ali Vinsonov zakonski predlog za bonus, če bo sprejet. Vsak tak zakon, ki določa takojšnje izplačanje bonusa bivšim vojakom, bo vetiran.

JOHNSON OŽIGOSAL VODITELJE V ODBORU NRA

Obsodil je "intelektualni carizem," ki je sedaj v sedlu

PRIPOROČA ODPRAVO NRA

Chicago, 19. marca. — General Hugh Johnson, bivši načelnik NRA, je v svojem večeršnjem govoru pred profesorji in dijaki univerze Northwestern in drugimi poslušalci silovito kritiziral Rooseveltove "braintrustere", ki so na krmilu NRA. Dejal je, da so ti zadržali zanko okrog vratu plavega orla in ga počasi duše. Drastične revizije zakona obnove, ki so bile uveljavljene po njegovi resignaciji iz odbora NRA, in eksperimentacije niso koristile industrijam in zato je najbolje, da se zakon odpravi.

Johnson je označil dogme sedanjih voditeljev NRA za "intelektualen carizem" in to je vzrok, da ne morejo pokazati nikakih uspehov. Uravo NRA je obdolžil, da je v zadnjih mesecih, ko je on izstopil iz vodstva, zavrgla njegove ideje in zato je NRA sedaj mrtva kakor ptič "dodo". Richberg, je dejal general, je podal troje različnih interpretacij točke 7 A in federalni delavski odbor četrt, kar je povečalo konfuzijo in zakon obnove nima danes nobenega pomena.

"Ne zanikam potrebe intelektualnega vodstva," je dejal Johnson, "toda ne sme biti intelektualni carizem. Izkušnje v zadnjih dveh letih kažejo, da je na odgovornih vladnih mestih dosti ljudi, ki imajo preveč močganov pod klobukom in pre malo takih, ki imajo srce na pravem mestu. Prvi niso sposobni vestnega dela in nočejo prevzeti odgovornosti za svoje akcije."

Trgovski klerki izvojevali zmago

New York. — Po trimesečni stavki, v teku katere je bilo nad 600 stavkarjev in simpatičarjev aretiranih zaradi kršenje injunkcije, ki je prepovedovala pke-tiranje, so trgovski klerki prisilili veletrojnovo Ohrbach na kapitulacijo. Pod vodstvom levičarske unije so izvojevali 40 ur dela v tednu, uposlitev vseh stavkarjev in izboljšanje mezde in delovnih pogojev. Stavkarje je podpirala unija voznikov tovornih avtov in druge delavske organizacije.

Kongresnik obtožen korupcije

Washington, D. C. — Kongresnik John H. Hoeppel, demokrat iz Kalifornije, je bil te dni obtožen, da je računal \$1000 nekemu 22-letnemu fantu za vstop v vojaško akademijo v West Pointu. Fant, ki se piše James W. Ives, je bil v tej oficirski šoli le pet dni.

MICHIGANSKI RUDARJI SE ORGANIZIRAJO

Ironwood, Mich. — (FP) — Unijsko gibanje je začelo prodirati tudi v to trdnjavo jeklarskega trusta. Okrog pet tisoč rudarjev, uposlenih v železnih rudnikih v tem distriktu, je v zadnjih tednih pristopilo v International Union of Mine, Mill & Smelter Workers. Trdnjava jeklarskega trusta je bila po 25 letih končno premagana. Rudarji so sigurni, da trust ne bo mogel razbiti njihove unije.

Na nedavnem zborovanju rudarjev v Bessemerju, Mich., kateretega so se udeležili uradniki in delegatje 11 krajevnih unij, je bila sprejeta resolucija glede enotne akcije. Izrekli so se tudi za volitve pod nadzorstvom federalnega delavskega odbora v posameznih rudnikih in za odpravo kontraktnege dela. Dalje je bil sprejet sklep, da rudarske unije sodelujejo pri organiziranju drugih delavskih strok.

Rudarska konferenca je odobrila Lundeenov načrt socialnega zavarovanja in naznanila, da bo šla v boj za zvišanje plače na \$1.67 na uro in zahtevala, da mora vsak rudar delati najmanj 1560 ur v letu.

Profitni sistem je mrtev, pravi ekonom

St. Louis, Mo. — Kapitalistični sistem, ki zagovarja produkcijo za profit, je dobil smrtni udarec pred petimi leti. To je mnenje dr. A. M. Murphyja, znanega ekonomista. "Ako se bodo industrijski magnati še nadalje upirali prostovoljnemu znižanju profitov," je rekel Murphy, "tedaj je diktatura nezogibna. Nemogoče je, da bi šli po stari poti naprej, ko je znano, da 20 odstotkov ameriškega prebivalstva ni moglo celo v dobi "prosperitete" dostojno skrbeti za svoje družine."

Stavka v tovarni poljedelskih strojev

Racine, Wis. — V tovarni J. I. Case Mfg. Co. je izbruhnila stavka, ko so se pogajanja med upravo in delavci izjalovila. Stavkarji zahtevajo zvišanje mezde za 30 odstotkov in izboljšanje delovnih pogojev. Pravijo, da ima kompanija, ki izdeluje poljedelske stroje, veliko naročil in obratovati bi morala s polno paro več mesecev, da jih izvrši.

'Vojna prihaja!' svari Kalinin

Vojni pakt Nemčije in Japonske

London, 19. marca. — Iz Moskeve je prišla vest, da je sovjetska vlada uverjena, da Hitler sklepa militaristični pakt z Japonsko. General Sadao Araki, prejšnji japonski vojni minister, gre v Berlin, da podpiše pogodbo.

Moskva, 19. marca. — Mihael Kalinin, predsednik vsruskega centralnega izvrševalnega odbora, je rekel večeraj, da vojna lahko izbruhne vsak moment.

"Ni treba dokazov, da je Sovjetska unija proti vojni. Nobena druga vlada na svetu ni toliko manifestirala želje in teženje za mir, toda kapitalistični svet ne more živeti brez vojne. Zato mora biti naša armada-zmirom pripravljena", je rekel Kalinin.

Prvi sovjetski klavirji na trgu

Moskva, 19. marca. — Prvi klavirji, producirani v sovjetskih tovarnah, so prišli večeraj na trg. Cena klavirjem je 2400 rubljev — kolikor znaša mesečna plača najbolje plačanih specialstov — kljub temu je bila dolga vrsta kupcev pred državno prodajalnico.

PRI VELESILAH NI SPORAZUMA GLEDE NEMČIJE

Anglija se je omečila in Francija bo osamljena

MUSSOLINI POPUŠČA

London, 19. marca. — Evropska kriza zaradi oboroženja Nemčije je za Anglijo najbrž že končana. Angleška vlada je večeraj poslala protestno noto v Berlin in danes že ima odgovor. Hitler je odgovoril, da je pripravljen razgovorjati se o "garancijah za mir". Anglija je takoj sprejela Hitlerjevo stališče in angleški zunanji minister Sir John Simon ter kapitan Anthony Eden poldeta prihodnje nedelje v Berlin na "razgovor".

Ponovna oborožitev Nemčije s 36 divizijami, okrog 540,000 mož, je torej za Anglijo dovršeno dejstvo, ki se ne da več preprečiti. Anglija bi bila vsekakor dovolila Nemčiji to armado, ali malo manjšo, toda Hitler jo je prehitel in zdaj — kar je, je.

Pariz, 19. marca. — Samceta protestna nota Anglije je presežeta Francijo. Nota je dokaz, da med bivšimi zavezniki ni sporazuma niti nobenega programa enotne akcije napram Nemčiji. In dejstvo, da je Anglija priznala Hitlerjev samovoljni čin in se odzvala njegovemu vabilu na konferenco v Berlinu, je še večji dokaz neopazovanja. Francija mora zdaj priznati, da je Hitler zmagal v prvi bitki s versajsko mirovno pogodbo. Francija je ostala sama! Na Italijo se tudi ne more zanesti. In Francija sama ni edina doma!

V oficilnih krogih Francije sta dva bloka. Prvi blok še vedno upa na mednarodno sporazumljenje, dočim drugi blok drzno zahteva, naj Francija takoj sklene vojaški pakt s Sovjetsko unijo in nastopi odločno proti Nemčiji. Prvi blok bi rad imel enotno akcijo velesil in hoče, da se takoj snide svet Lige narodov. Iz tega notranjega konflikta vsekakor ne pride drugega kakor francoska protestna nota, ki bo poslana v Berlin.

Rim, 19. marca. — Mussolinijeva vlada ne pričakuje kakšne velikopotezne akcije s strani velesil proti Hitlerjevemu dekretu oboroženja Nemčije in rekrutiranja 36 divizij vojaštva z obvezno vojaško službo. Mnenje italijanske vlade je, da je najbolje počakati, da se razkadi prva razburjenost. Italija se še ni odločila za kakšno protestno akcijo, bodisi sama ali skupaj z drugimi velesilami, proti Nemčiji.

Berlin, 19. marca. — Nova nemška militaristična mašina je že v teku. Organiziranje nove armade se začne takoj prihodnji teden. Hitlerjeva privatna armada napadalnih čet bo zdaj razpuščena, to se pravi, da bo prešla v novo redno armado. Hitlerjev režim smatra, da je vprašanje oboroženja in enakopravnosti Nemčije rešeno in na konferenci z angleškim ministrom ne bo več govora o tem! Konferenca se mora baviti le s predlaganim paktom za yarnost na vzhodu in s problemi splošnega mira.

Varšava, 19. marca. — Poljska vlada se prav nič ne razburja zaradi dogodkov v Nemčiji. Predstavniki vlade pravijo, da kdor ni spal, je lahko videl, kaj prihaja.

Grandsons. A novel by Louis Adamic, author of "The Native's Return." Založba Harper Bros., New York. Cena \$2.50. Danes je izšla gori omenjena povest Louisa Adamiča v angleščini. Knjiga ima 370 strani in je fino vezana ter drugače opremljena. Delala bo vso čast vsaki knjižnici.

O vsebini te knjige smo že poročali. Pisatelj opisuje življenje treh vnukov slovenskega priseljence Antona Galeja iz Gatine na Dolenskem, ki je prišel v Ameriko leta 1875. Gale se je naselil v Montani in se oženil z Indijanko, deset let kasneje je pa bil ubit v "anarhističnih" izgrelih v Chicagu. Njegova dva sinova se preselita z materjo in hrvaškimi očimom Krmpotičem vred v Pittsburgh, kjer umreta med svetovno vojno; eden je ubit v varni, drugega pobere pa španska "flu". Eden teh sinov je zapustil dva sinova in drugi enega. Ti trije vnuki so junaki Adamičeve zanimive novele.

Vnuki — Peter, Andy in Jack Gale. — so docela Američani in različni značaji. Peter je žurnalist, pesnik in idealist; miren in mehkega značaja. Udeležil se svetovne vojne in potem hodi od službe do službe pri časopisih v Californiji. Andy je tip Caponeja, raketir in gangster, Jack je pa revolucionar one vrste, ki so se vsi zbirali pri IWW.

Okoli te trojice Galejevih vnukov je Adamic narisal velik kos ameriškega življenja v splošnem z močnim socialnim ozadjem. Delavska stran razrednega boja je živo naslikana zlasti v Californiji.

V tej Adamičevi knjigi je tudi kosček zgodovine ameriških Slovencev in iz tega razloga je za nas še posebej zanimiva. Priporočamo knjigo našim čitateljem. Kdorkoli lahko čita angleški — in teh je danes dosti med nami — naj ne preze tega najnovejšega Adamičevega literarnega dela.

Ker že ocenjujemo najnovejšo Adamičovo knjigo, je vredno omeniti še nekaj, kar se je Adamičeve prednje knjige "The Native's Return". Belgrajski literarni žurnal "Srpski Književni Glasnik" je v februarju 1935 ocenil omenjeno knjigo in med drugim piše tudi tole: "Tu pa tam je nekaj pomot, ali v glavnem je tako kakor je on (Adamič) videl, ko je obiskal našo državo pred letom dni. Iskreno navdušenje za preprosti kmetijski narod in življenje v Jugoslaviji je redko pri onih, ki so dolgo let živeli v velikih mestih; pri pisatelju knjige The Native's Return je pa to navdušenje nalezljivo".

To se ne pričakovalo sliši iz Belgrada, torej iz središča Jugoslavije, kjer je omenjena knjiga prepovedana. Če je kritik to zapisal knjigi težki cenzuri, si lahko mislimo, kaj vse bi pisali v Jugoslaviji — in tudi v Ljubljani! — v prilog tej knjigi, ako ne bi bilo cenzure!

Praggodovina v Ameriki
Severnoameriška praggodovina je bila dolgo časa prava pastorka znanosti. Dočim je raziskovanje prastarih indijanskih kultur v Južni in Srednji Ameriki spravilo na dan čudovite stvari, nismo vedeli o praggodovini Severne Amerike nič. Toda sedaj so arheologi v Nevadi in Arizoni, v puščavah obeh držav, ki jih imenujejo z značilnim imenom "Ameriška Gobi", odkrili stvari, ki ne zaostajajo prav nič za najdbami v azijski puščavi Gobi.

O najdbah okostij dinosavrov, mamutov, velblodov, konj smo svoj čas že obširneje poročali, arheologa dr. Byrn Cummings in dr. Mark Harrington pa sta odkrila v globini 4 do 8 m pod plastmi lave ostanke pradedne kulture, ostanke mogočnega ljudstva, države in kulture, ki jih pa do sedaj še niso mogli razprotneti. Na drugih krajih so našli ribe iz ledne dobe, ki predstavljajo slonu podobno žival. Zanjde odkritje se nanaša na ostanke praggodovinskega človeka, ki mu strokovnjaki starost cenijo na 125 milijonov let. Ti milijoni let so gotovo pomota in gre brčkone za tisočletja, vsekakor nam pa te najdbe dokazujejo, da je bila Amerika obljudena v najbolj davnih časih človeškega rodu kakor ostale celine in da ji je namenjena važna vloga pri raziskovanju skrivnosti o njegovem postanku.

Material se da uporabiti tudi za notranje opazne sten. Iz njega se zgradijo več poslopij.

Timely Topics

Official Proceedings

Since it is the duty of every active member to read and digest all the official documents, proceedings and conclusions tendered by the Supreme board, we feel certain that none has neglected the opportunity of reading in last week's supplement of the organ the excerpts from the official proceedings of the Supreme board's yearly session, held in Chicago on February 7-8-9, 1935.

From the various detailed reports submitted by the different committees and officials, as summarized on page 16 of last week's organ, the members were able to draw a clear picture of the upward trend of the Society made by its various departments.

The jubilee campaign for 1934 brought excellent results; the net gain, after deducting the losses sustained by deaths and other causes, in both departments being more than one thousand new members. The assets have mounted over the five hundred figure. The total assets are in excess of the six million mark.

The reports submitted at the annual meeting of the Board clearly indicate that the Society is steadily progressing.

The E. S. L. Anniversary

Among other important decisions and enactments passed by the Supreme board at its annual session is a motion which directly concerns our English Speaking branches. A motion was carried "to declare 1935 as the English Speaking Lodges' Tenth Anniversary Year everywhere." And further, to urge officially the promotion of 10th anniversary celebrations throughout the jurisdiction, in every community and locality where such ventures are envisaged to bring favorable results. This of course calls for the cooperation of all English Speaking branches, to carry out the project of celebrating our 10th anniversary in the most fitting manner possible. Moreover, the project calls for the united effort and cooperation of our Senior branches likewise.

The same motion embodies a provision whereby the official organ, in cooperation with the local branches, is requested to publish a list of all pending 10th anniversary celebrations sponsored by the English Speaking Lodges which will take place this year. These notices or announcements are to be published in the English Section of the Prosveta weekly.

Therefore, all English Speaking Branches which are planning to celebrate the anniversary, are asked to submit their celebration announcements for publication in these pages in advance of time. The notices will be featured under a special caption, similar to the one running in this column during the Society's anniversary year in 1934. It is necessary, in order to offer prompt and efficient service by the organ to all participant locals, to write relative announcements on a separate sheet of paper, stating the date, place, nature of the celebration, outstanding feature or attraction, and of course the name of the lodge with its number.

Character of Celebrations

The character of these celebrations should always be dignified, worthy of the occasion. By this we do not mean that the whole program should be a serious undertaking devoid of any entertainment; but the entertainment should in no case tend to cheapen the event. It can be sufficiently dignified and entertaining without stooping to either extremes; it should always conform with our principles and purpose.

Above all, make your anniversary celebration one that will be remembered well by all participants as a worthy event; one that will attract all potential and prospective members into your circle. The "New Deal" Flops

Events have justified the gloomy prophecies concerning the so-called "New Deal" which have appeared in this column for the past years. There is scarcely any thoughtful person left who is optimistic enough to hope that any real change is destined to come from the present federal administration.

From the beginning of the NRA we warned our readers that President Franklin D. Roosevelt meant well—by the owning class. We have been consistent in our declaration that nothing would be done to halt the legalized graft which enables the owning class—which is Roosevelt's class—to prey upon and profit from the labors of the working class. In this, however, we were scarcely prophets; smiling Franklin himself told us what to expect when he repeatedly expressed his determination to preserve the private profit motive.

Now we find the codes abandoned. With respect to intra-state business they are to be abandoned officially. But the big business buckaneers whose interests extend across state borders have never been actually hampered by their provisions.

The kernel of the "New Deal" nut is found in the fact that living costs have been advanced, profits increased, mass purchasing power reduced—and the number on relief steadily extend. So far as the great mass of Americans are concerned, things are worse now than ever before. And the end of the depression is nowhere in sight.

We refer to our stand against the "New Deal" and against the codes which were essentially racketeers' pacts in order to again impress upon the workers of America the fact that poverty has not been ended because the abolition of poverty and insecurity was not the PURPOSE of the administration.

Mr. Roosevelt has made it plain that his chief concern is the salvation of the profit system. If some way could be found to make that system work . . . and if the big owners of industry would co-operate to regulate their racket . . . then perhaps workers could be better cared for. But not otherwise.

What we have been saying for two years or more others are now beginning to say. Last week Donald Richberg, successor to the blatant Johnson, spent a busy hour defending the N. R. A. from attacks launched by liberal and conservative elements. But while those attacks were well warranted by the results of the "New Deal," most of those who launched the mare were no more willing than Franklin D. Roosevelt to apply the remedy for poverty.

We have pointed to the cure of our social ills so often that we bore ourselves by repeating. Nevertheless, Socialism points the way—the ONLY way—in which workers can obtain economic security. Therefore we say again: There is no necessity for poverty in these United States. This nation has everything to supply abundance and security to everybody. The only reason why misery continues is because those who are in control simply WON'T take over the industries and operate them for use instead of for profit.

But, more important, the majority of America's workers have always persisted in placing the powers of government in the hands of forces who uphold the profit system. They WON'T vote for Socialism and the disaster which has come upon them and the dictatorship which lurks "just around the corner" is the logical consequence of their action.

Many parents came along with their young ones and many expressed complete satisfaction in the entire program on the conduct of the whole affair. It was a big and important night with a fine meeting, a good program and delicious refreshments (cake and ice cream, no beer for a change.)

Mary Jugg was in charge of the program, which included several songs, recitations, piano solo, vocal duet, reading and the skit of the Social Study Club players. Every bit of the show was applauded lustily. The young Pioneers put on most of the show, but the reading and the skit were rendered by our adults.
