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Slovenian Diplomats Run in Cleveland Marathon

Ambassador of Slovenia to the United States, His Excellency Samuel Žbogar and Consul General of Slovenia in Cleveland, Dr. Zvone Žigon, will run in the Rite Aid Cleveland Marathon and 10K, respectively, on Sunday, May 20.

Judge Klammer Receives National Honor

The American Bar Association will present to Lake County (Ohio) Probate Judge Ted Klammer and Lake County Bar Association its "Solo and Small Firm Project Award." This prestigious award will be given to Judge Ted Klammer on May 11 in Washington, D.C. in recognition of Judge Klammer's Third Annual Probate and Mental Health Conference.

The Probate and Mental Health Conference was an all day event held on October 26 for members of the legal profession and mental health professionals. The Conference provides a unique opportunity for lawyers to join with mental health professionals to discuss the issues confronting the mentally impaired. Participants learn how to effectively deal with mentally challenged indi-

viduals by meeting and interacting with legal and mental health professionals.

"As Lake County Probate Judge, I saw the need to create a collaborative joint effort among the Lake County Bar Association, mental health agencies, hospitals, legislative representatives, law enforcement, and the Courts to better understand and treat the mentally ill residents of Lake County.

"The mentally ill are placed in desperate situations in most instances without fault. These cases involve men and women of all ages who suffer from schizophrenia to anorexia to dementia. The Lake County Jail is the largest psychiatric facility in Lake County. Some of these individuals end up in jail not once or twice, but 10 times or more."

"We have begun the first phase of communicating common problems and seeking answers. Many probate judges including Judge Swift of Trumbull County recognize the plight of the mentally ill and the need for these types of conferences. Judge Trebits of the Mentor Municipal Court has instituted the first Mental Health Court in Lake County," Judge Ted Klammer said.

"I am pleased that the American Bar Association honors the Lake County Probate Court and the Lake County Bar Association, but this honor belongs to the attorneys, mental health agencies, mental health court as well as the enforcement agencies, without their involvement, none of this is possible," Judge Ted Klammer said.

Memorable Easter Week

My Easter Sunday was most memorable, not because of the delicious meal, not because of family, and not because of the frigid weather, but because I ended up in the hospital that evening. My blood thinner went haywire, and caused me to spend the next seven days in Parma hospital. I slept, I ate and I walked, and then I slept, I ate and I walked again. There were no wounds in my body from surgery, so I lacked the feeling of pain. I lay in bed feeling like a freeloader as I looked at people recovering from their illness, but they wouldn't let me go home, until the next Sunday afternoon.

During that week, mostly awake when the nurses checked on me, I was overwhelmed by the care given me, by both male and female nurses. In fact I think I fell in love with a couple of those beautiful nurses. It sure eases my stay, for I do not particularly enjoy hospitals, no matter

how necessary the stay. I left with not a single complaint.

After our Easter meal, I did not consume solid food until supper on Wednesday evening. My stomach did not call out to me as it was deprived of nourishment during this time as I experienced no hunger pains. But, my idle mind, with its imagination, continually lingered in our refrigerator, mingling with the leftovers from our Easter dinner. My mouth remained moist during most of these foodless days, causing no real discomfort, as I dreamed of sitting at home, in my chair, as my lovely wife, Therese, served me Easter food, and my taste buds emailed my stomach of the good things to come.

All caregivers in ICU on the 3rd floor, doctors, nurses and service people were part of why those seven days didn't seem like an eternity. I wasn't able to attend Mass, but I received the Sacrament of the sick and was free to pray as many Rosaries as I pleased.

Kamin, Ribič elected to represent United States in Slovenians Abroad

In accordance with the Law of Slovenians outside the borders of the Republic of Slovenia, the Consulate General of the Republic of Slovenia in Cleveland, along with the Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Washington, coordinated the first ever Convention of Slovenian organizations in the U.S. on April 13 at which individuals were elected to represent the United States in the Government of Slovenia, Board of Slovenes Abroad.

The most votes were awarded to Ivan Kamin (Slovenian Business Organization, New York). Second place went to Milan Ribič (Slovenska Pristava, Cleveland, OH). A tie for third place went to Anthony Hiti (Slovenian American Heri-

tage Foundation) and Joe Valencic (SNPJ).

The Embassy and The Consulate General have suggested to the Government of Slovenia that Ivan Kamin and Milan Ribič be appointed to the Board of Slovenes Abroad.

Though the organizational strategy of this first convention was experimental, the approach proved successful. The invited representatives of large Slovenian organizations demonstrated great interest, evidenced by the fact that even those representatives from Detroit, Pittsburgh, Lemont (Chicago) and New York came forth.

At the closing discussion of the Convention, the future of the organization of the exceptionally varied Slovenian-American community

was addressed. Discussed was the necessity for a permanent body of representatives, which would represent the Slovenian-American community in its relations with U.S. institutions and with Slovenia, for the purpose of conducting and co-ordinating broader range activities. Members of this co-ordinative body ought to be elected by geographical region, and not by their membership in Slovenian organizations (KSKJ, SNPJ, SWUA, etc.). This would then create the need to establish Slovenian-American regions, whose number would correlate with the number of existing major Slovenian organizations. Therefore this governing body would consist of about 20 representatives.

Catholic Preschool in Slovenia Needs Help

Last summer my family and I visited our friend in Slovenia, a high school classmate of my husband's, Dr. Alojz Snoj. Fr. Snoj has been the parish priest at Škofja Loka for several years. Dr. Snoj is the nephew of Fr. Jože Snoj, whom we met when he was a priest in Fontana, California. What a small world.

A few years ago Fr. Alojz Snoj established a Catholic preschool in his parish at Škofja Loka. This is one of the first independent Catholic preschools in Slovenia. Fr. Snoj told us about the worries, hard work, red tape and obstacles thrown in his way by an unsympathetic bureaucracy. There was no space for the preschool, so they had to excavate the basement of the modest single family house serving as the rectory. Fr. Snoj showed us around, and everywhere one could feel order, care, love and just plain goodness. It brought tears to our eyes.

Under the communist regime in Slovenia, all educa-

tion was an exclusive domain of the government. The Catholic Church was not allowed to operate any schools except seminaries. The educational system was a tool of the government used to mold the Slovenian people, to indoctrinate them in the communist ideology and atheism. Even today, the educational system in Slovenia is secular, atheistic and essentially still anti-Catholic. There are a few Catholic high schools, but by the time children get there, they have been exposed to public schools and the official atheism. That is why it is so important to have Catholic preschools.

Fr. Snoj's preschool is a resounding success. There are many more applicants than they can accept. Fr. Snoj hopes to add more space to increase the number of children. He believes the preschool should be only the beginning. There is a void in Catholic education in Slovenia, since there are no Catholic elementary schools. His

next great hope is a Catholic elementary school.

We often ask ourselves, how can we make a difference in Slovenia so that its citizens can live in a more free and just society. We may think there is little we can do since we live so far away. Clearly, one area where we can help is supporting Catholic education in Slovenia. Catholic schools may be able to reverse the damage done to Slovenia by 50 years of communism. It is a critical time for the country.

This is a worthy cause, and the readers may want to make a contribution to Fr. Snoj's school. I would be happy to forward contributions to him. Please write checks to Fr. Revolution: War Thru Eyes of a Boy

This story is a gift to all who read it. I am honored to have been part of this process and to learn about my history. It is worth noting that Ata's memories of this time in his life are as clear as if the events happened yesterday. I tried to preserve his writing style as much as possible, only serving as editor and a probe for more information. I want to thank Ata for giving us all these memories that will last for generations to come.

Introduction

During World War II Slovenia and its people were caught in a fight for life. Slovenia an independent country since 1991, was once occupied by the forces of Italy, Germany and Hungary. Italian soldiers controlled Dolenska (the southern region of Slovenia) starting in 1941 until they capitulated in September, 1943. At this point, the Partisans came out of the woods and took control of the region.

The Partisans were native Slovenians who were communists. It was not long before Germany took control of Dolenska and the Partisans returned to the woods. In the

meantime, the communists killed the Slovenian Home Guard soldiers and burned the Turjak castle. The Partisans fought against the occupiers but were only looking out for their own international Communist interests.

They took this opportunity to start a revolution, and may never have gained any power in this region if it had not been for World War II. Germany was in power in our country until 1945 when they were defeated by the Allies. The towns people of Slovenia were the victims of four groups of careless, ruthless enemies. In one village alone, 235 men were killed. There were no children born for five years after the war.

To understand what was happening in Yugoslavia during the war and the communist revolution, you must know the ideology of the revolutionaries. The communists of Slovenia were mostly schooled in Moscow. They had participated in the Spanish revolution of 1936. Partisan communists were never friends of the allies, imperial England and America. Their god was Joseph Stalin. To quote Edward Kardel, head of the Slovenian communist party, "If the allies come up the Yugoslavian side, we are in hot soup." In other words, the communists would turn their guns on the allies, but they would be in trouble. Winston

Churchill, England's prime minister in 1943, wanted his offense to come up the Yugoslavian side instead of on Italian soil. This was strongly opposed by Stalin because he wanted Russia to come through Yugoslavia so that communism could take over. From a military point of view, it was a better idea at that time for Churchill. A meeting of the "Big Three" happened in Teran on July 10, 1943. Franklin Roosevelt was a sick man and did not know what was going on. He should not have been elected to this third term.

Stalin got everything he wanted from Roosevelt, such as post-war Europe. Churchill received all of his aid from America, and could not oppose Roosevelt. Churchill understood communism, but Roosevelt did not. Slovenian author Louis Adamic was a good friend of Eleanor Roosevelt. He had a left leaning ideology and had a huge influence on her. She then used this influence on her husband. The U.S. state department had a lot of left leaning, communist minded men. Louis Adamic was murdered by Yugoslavian secret police in New York City in 1954. The crime is still unsolved. He was murdered because he changed his mind about communism. He had been deceived and was now convinced of the truth.

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Slovenia's President Seeks Meaning of Life

LJUBLJANA — Looking for the true meaning of life? Slovenia's president may be able to help.

Janez Drnovsek's self-help books have won admiration from many, including Brigitte Bardot, but the veteran leader's eccentricity is embarrassing some in Slovenia as the tiny Alpine state seeks a role in the European mainstream.

A vegetarian who bakes his own bread, the president was one of the architects of Slovenia's independence. His unorthodox lifestyle, fight for animal rights and apparent disdain for traditional politics have made him a popular figure.

For six months last year, he advised readers about their daily problems in a popular women's magazine. He is now writing his third new book on awareness.

Although diagnosed with cancer in 1999, he stopped visiting doctors a few years ago and now claims to be healthy, saying he no longer seeks political power but deals with moral values.

"I want to raise people's awareness... help them to change their lifestyle. That is why I write books," said Drnovsek in a recent interview with local daily *Delo*.

"We need statesmen with a higher level of awareness who do not care mainly about personal interests and prestige. We need people without a big ego... who will dare to set limits to capital and profit," Drnovsek wrote in one of his books.

Taking up a vegetarian diet since the cancer diagnosis, he left his home in the capital for a village on a hill near Ljubljana where he lives alone, grows his own vegetables and often fasts. He is unmarried.

France's Brigitte Bardot wrote to him last year, saying, "If only we had a candidate (in the French presidential election) like Drnovsek, or even a shadow of him, the world would quickly become less intolerable."

Essence of the World

Last year Drnovsek published two books, "The Essence of the World," and "The Thoughts on Life and Awareness," which became instant best-sellers and were translated into German, English, Croatian and Bosnian.

"Oh, you would not be able to find these books in our library easily. They are a hit and are always lent out," said a clerk in one of Ljubljana's largest libraries.

Drnovsek started his political career as the last but one president of the former Yugoslavia and was prime minister of Slovenia for 10 years before becoming



president in 2002.

Extremely thin and looking older than his 56 years, he has said he is unlikely to run for another political office after his current one expires in December.

"Drnovsek is eccentric at times. But he is popular particularly because of this eccentricity, because of his promotion of healthy living and alternative approaches which are not usual among politicians," Borut Hocevar, an editor at daily *Dnevnik*, told Reuters.

His refusal to see doctors has angered local health officials who argue his behavior could lead to general distrust of western medicine.

"After his illness Drnovsek became more human, kinder. I would vote for him if he ran for president again, though his conflicts with the government are hurting Slovenia," said Nada Praprotnik, a 56-year-old botanist, on the streets of Ljubljana.

In 2005, a woman with whom he had an affair in the 1980s told him he had a hitherto-unknown grown-up daughter, and in his own words he was truly happy about the discovery.

Last year Drnovsek quit his center-left party but he has been at odds with the government ever since 2004, when a conservative victory ended 12 years of mostly center-left rule.

Despite his popularity, his dabbling in foreign affairs and a row with Prime Minister Janez Jansa are, some say, clouding Slovenia's image.

Denovsek's domestic disputes embarrassed Slovenia this year, when parliament rejected two of his candidates for central bank governor.

The stand-off left the bank without a governor only three months after Slovenia became the first east European state to adopt the euro. Some analysts believe the government may now leave the post empty until Drnovsek leaves office in December.

His attempt last year to mediate in Sudan's violent Darfur region foundered when the envoy he sent was arrested and accused of spying. The envoy was released after a few weeks diplomatic activity.

Drnovsek also canceled a scheduled appearance at the

United Nations General Assembly after the government refused to grant him extra funds, claiming he had blown too much money on trips to third-world countries.

But others argue his foreign policy moves show Slovenia in a favorable light.

"His proposals are relatively successful considering the size of the country he is coming from," said Grega Repovz, chief editor of weekly *Mladina*.

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Mysterious Cave World of Slovenia

AMERIKA DUMOVINA, MAY 5, 2001

This Is Slovenia

Slovenia may not be large in terms of territory, but it is so full of variety, so rich in geographical and natural phenomena, and so beautiful, that it could easily be the envy of many much larger countries. Every region of Slovenia – the traditional regional division, which has no political or administrative significance, of course, is as follows: **Gorenjska, Dolenska, Koroška, Štajerska, Prekmurje, Posavje, Bela Krajina, Notranjska, and Primorska** – is host to its own set of attractions. One invites us with its mountains and lakes, the second with its vineyards, the third with its endlessly expanding plains, the fourth with its idyllic valleys.

The main part of this article will be devoted to the region of Primorska, or rather to a particular part of that region called Kras, and to the karstic phenomena most commonly found in that part of Slovenia (although they can also be found in some other regions to a lesser extent). It was the Slovenian region of Kras that this type of phenomena appearing all over the world was named after – Karst. Karstology derives its name from the Slovenian name Kras, also called Karst. Slovenian scientists from this field have greatly contributed to the development of karstology as a science.

The rocky karstic topography is pocked with numerous *skinhiles* or deep dolines interspersed with the black gaping holes of deep ravines and entrances to mysterious caves in which the many mysterious beauties of the karstic terrain have been discovered.

In cold, dark, eternal silence, nature has taken millions of years to create jewels of incredible beauty in the shape of cave formations, and explorers have even discovered living beings adapted to living in eternal darkness – the most famous among these is the so-called "human fish" (*Proteus anguinus*), certain species of cave-dwelling beetles, etc.



300 Years of Cave Exploration

The first treatise of the Slovenian subterranean world was published in *The Glory of the Duchy of Carniola* in 1689 by Janez Vajkard Valvasor. The book featured a plan of the cave of Podpeška jama, the first record of this kind in Slovenia. It has been discovered that individuals had entered and explored the subterranean caves even before this. The oldest signature in the Postojna Cave is believed to date back to 1213.

There is a long tradition of potholing as a means of exploration of karstic caves for hobbyists, scientists and sports enthusiasts, and the first Slovenian Spelunking Society was founded in 1889 in Postojna. Today, cavers with modern gear explore the horizontal and vertical caves, measure them, map them, and take notes on their shape and content, gather samples of various kinds and collect all other documentation on caves, and quite often visit similar research sites abroad.

Special attention is devoted to researching cave climate and subterranean flora and fauna. In the scientific sense, caves are studied by speleologists, and it is because of this rich tradition that Slovenian speleologists are highly esteemed in international circles.

It is thanks to Slovenian potholers that numerous Slovenian subterranean caves are accessible to casual tourists who never fail to be amazed by the incredible beauty of the Slovenian caves which is unmatched anywhere else in the world.

Postojna

The first Slovenian cave to enjoy international fame was the Postojna Cave, the largest of Slovenia's tourist caves, and at the same time one of the most famous karstic caves in the world. It is particularly famous for the richness of its cave formations, the complex cave systems and great tourist appeal.

The explored part of the network of tunnels known as Postojna Cave spans about 20 km, but even now explorers are finding out more of its secrets. The pathways take visitors to some of the most beautiful parts of the cave, where they find a fairytale world of spectacular cave formations, giants and curtains glittering with a thousand pearls, large underground caverns where concerts, masses and other events can be organized. Among other events, a live nativity scene is performed in the cave every year.



The first visitors to the cave used torches, candles and other illuminating devices to light their way, but electric lights were installed as early as 1884.

The heyday of the cave tourism began after the construction of the railroad connection between Vienna and Trieste (1857) which runs through Postojna.

In 1924 a cave train began to take visitors into the cave, and in 1964 a circular line was constructed so that 12,000 guests per day can visit the cave on six trains. Today, the trains are pulled by smaller electric engines. The tourist train route is 5,300 meters long. The cave has a constant temperature of 8°C Celsius.

Cave explorers have discovered that the first visitors to Postojna Cave were ice-age hunters, which is supported by archaeological finds, and the walls of the cave's 'name tunnel' have signatures from visitors from as early as the 13th century. Besides the speleologists and amateur cave explorers, we must also mention the Emperor of Austria, who first visited the cave in 1816, followed by a number of other famous rulers and travelers.

It should be noted that visitors to this cave usually take a look at Predjama Castle, standing about 10 kilometers from the entrance into the Postojna Cave. The castle was built into the side of a 100-meter-high rock wall, making its picturesque appearance particularly exceptional.

The castle hosts a nicely outfitted museum with a rich collection of artifacts from the prehistoric and various historical periods.

To Slovenians, the castle is best known for its romantic story of Erasmus of Predjama, who lived there. This is why local tourist workers regularly put on well-attended knights' tournaments. There is also a cave under the Predjama Castle managed by the Postojnska jama company.

Škocjan Caves

Many bored tourists who have been to a cave or two in the past are simply dumbfounded at the total beauty of the Škocjan Caves. This is the collective name for sinkholes formed by the River Reka, which are considered one of the greatest landmarks of the Slovenian Karst. It is because of this outstanding universal value for the

world's natural heritage that they were included on the UNESCO List of World Heritage Sites. For this reason, the Republic of Slovenia established a special institution called the Škocjan Caves Regional Park which takes special care of the protected environment of these caves.

Upon arriving from the direction of Divača, a visitor can see the 160-meter deep valley created by the River Reka, with a spectacular waterfall disappearing underground. This is also the entrance to the cave. This watery cave is the fruit of the labor of the river over many thousands of years.


The visitor enters the grandiose halls, which inspire awe and amazement at the unusual beauty. Compared to the Postojna Cave, with its charming bounty of cave formations, the Škocjan Caves are wild and romantic. We can look at the underground rock canyons, enormous walls, howling chasms and mighty underground caverns through which the wild Reka roars; here we can find the largest underground cavern in Europe, with a cross-section of 12,000 square meters, and a volume of 2.2 million cubic meters. The Reka runs underground for almost 40 kilometers and drains into the sea as the River Timava in the Bay of Trieste.

Among the other caves open to tourists in the Slovenian karst we should also mention the Vilenica Cave near the town of Sežana (famous, among other things, for the eponymous international literary award ceremony which takes place there every year). Dimnica Cave, Otroška Cave, Pivka Cave, Crna jama (Black Cave), Planina Cave, Zelška jama Cave and Križna Cave, near the town of Lož. There are also a few caves which are not suitable for tourists.

The Taborska Cave, or Zupanova jama (Mayor's Cave) near the village of Tabor pri Grosupljem is extremely popular. This cave is closest to Ljubljana, which is why it is always full of visitors.

It is also possible to visit in the summer Krška jama Cave located nearby above the source of the River Krka near the village of Krka; and lower down the course of the Krka is the Kostanjevica Cave, located near one of the oldest cities in Slovenia, Kostanjevica na Krki.

In the Štajerska region, there are two caves open to tourists, the cave of Pekel (Hell) near Šempeter in the valley of Savinjska dolina; the nearby town of Prebold hosts the Snežna jama (Snow Cave); and the Rotovnikova jama (Rotovnik's Cave) located in the settlements of Skorno pri Sostanju. A peculiarity of this cave is that its entrance leads directly through the house of the Rotovnik family, after whom the cave is named.



1,000 Slovenian Students to Study in Foreign Universities

Seven Slovenian higher education institutions will send some 1,000 students and over 140 professors to foreign universities within the Erasmus student exchange program this year, while 700 foreign students will come to Slovenia, Higher Education Minister Jure Zupan told the press in Ljubljana on Tues., April 10.

When Slovenia joined the program in the 1999-2000 academic year, four higher education institutions sent 171 students and 42 professors abroad, while 20 foreign students came to Slovenia.

The number increased to 900 students in the last study year, Zupan said at a press

conference marking the 20th anniversary of the Erasmus program.

Due to the increasing number of participating students, the state earmarked about EUR 2.9m for the program this year, seven times more than in 2000, Zupan said.

The head of the European Commission's Representation Office in Slovenia Mihela Zupancic meanwhile said that Erasmus was one of the programs in which the results of European unification was most visible.

King's Kopitar a relaxed rookie

Los Angeles Kings (hockey) center Anze Kopitar had to beat the odds and his own geography to become one of the NHL's hottest rookies this season.

He's the first NHL player from Slovenia, a country with a population of a little more than 2 million. Kopitar was nearly 3 when Slovenia established independence from Yugoslavia in 1991.

"The thing that I love most about Kopitar is that you can tell that he loves being at the rink," said Kings general manager Dean Lombardi. "So many kids today have been told they were great since age 15, and I sense that so much is put on them even before the draft that it becomes a burden. But because of where he has come from, Kopitar is well-grounded."

Kopitar leads a strong NHL rookie class in scoring with three goals and nine assists in 11 games. That's a scoring rate similar to what Alex Ovechkin of the Washington Capitals and Sidney Crosby of the Pittsburgh Penguins were displaying at this time last season. They ended up with more than 100 points each.

"It's still early, but Kopitar has the potential to be a special player," Lombardi said. "He has a lot of tools. How he develops as a man and a player will determine how far he goes."

The son of a hockey coach, Kopitar, 6-4 and 220 pounds, had to play with a Swedish team to find quality competition when he was a teenager.

Former Kings general manager Dave Taylor drafted Kopitar, 19, with the 11th overall pick in 2005. He had impressed NHL scouts with a strong performance playing for his country's senior national team at the 2005 world championships. He was just 18 at the time, but Detroit Red Wings general manager Ken Holland recalls, "He was their best player."

Kopitar isn't speedy, but his vision and playmaking skills have impressed the Kings. Although he was fired as GM, Taylor still works for the Kings. "And I told him the other day, you left a gem here," Lombardi said.

Disputes Carantania Claim

Editor,

As much as I recognize and appreciate the many accomplishments of my forebears in Slovenia, the claim in the recent article that "Carantania was the first democracy in Europe" is silly.

I think we as Slovenian-Americans should be accurate with what we say about Slovenia and Slovenians, lest we appear to slight the accomplishments of other nations and peoples.

I think all your readers know that the first democracy in Europe was in Greece; indeed, as everyone knows, "democracy" is a Greek word. The Greek democracy occurred well before the birth of Christ. What took place in Carantania occurred over a millennium later. Greece has historically been a part of Europe, even the cradle of European civilization, so it indeed was the first democracy in Europe. (The Romans also had

periods of democracy, of course.)

Some have suggested that the true significance of the Carantanian ducal investment ceremony is that it was one of the first enunciations of what French philosopher Bodin called "the social contract," the contract between the governed and their ruler that the ruler had some obligations to his subjects, such as being just and taking care of widows and the poor, while the subjects had the usual obligation of fealty to the duke.

While this is an interesting chapter in European history, and may have given Thomas Jefferson some modest support for certain passages of the Declaration of Independence, it does not displace the Greeks as the first to practice democracy in Europe.

Zahvalna sv. maša bo to nedeljo, 6. maja, ob 11h dop., pri kateri bo David prvič pridigal in opravljaj njenovo liturgično opravilo kot diakon.

Beseda diakon izhaja iz grške besede *diakonos*, ki pomeni strežnik ali pomočnik. Škof diakona posveča s polaganjem rok, ki tako prejema prvo stopnjo sv. reda. Večina stalnih diakonov je poročenih in ima svojo družino. Njihova prva dolžnost je še vedno svoji družini, potem svojemu poklicu, potem služenju Cerkvi.

Diakon je poklican za opravljanje duhovne službe v Cerkvi, to je služiti Bogu in Cerkvi. Po na-

ročilu krajevnega škofa s pomočjo zakramentalne milosti posvečenja v Cerkvi opravlja službo na treh področjih: besedno in liturgično bogoslužje ter socialne oziroma karitativne dolžnosti.

V besednjem bogoslužju oznanja evangelijskih pridiga in uči v imenu Cerkve.

V liturgičnem bogoslužju pomaga škofu ali duhovniku pri maši, pri obhajanju euharistije, pri obhajanju bolnikov in tistih, ki so na dom priklenjeni. Deliti sme zakrament krsta, blagosloviti novoporočenca in poročati ter opravljati cerkvene pogrebne obrede.

Slovenci v ZDA zastopani v Svetu Vlade RSlovenije za Slovence po svetu

CLEVELAND, O. – V skladu z Zakonom o Slovencih zunaj meja RS sta Generalni konzulat RS v Clevelandu in Veleposlaništvo RS v Washingtonu v petek, 13. aprila, v Clevelandu pripravila prvo konvencijo slovenskih skupnosti v ZDA, na kateri so bili izvoljeni predstavniki za Svet Vlade RS za Slovence po svetu.

Največ glasov je dobil Ivan Kamin (Slovenska poslovna skupnost New York), drugo mesto je zasedel Milan Ribič (Slovenska pristava, Cleveland), tretje mesto pa sta si delila Anthony Hiti (Slovenian American Heritage Foundation) in Joseph Valenčič (SNPJ).

Ambasada in Generalni konzulat sta Vladi predlagala, da sta v Svet Vlade imenovana Ivan Kamin in Milan Ribič.

Čeprav je bila prva konvencija tako glede seznama vabljenih kot glede same organizacije po svoji naravi poskusna, se je pristop izkazal za pravilnega. Vabljeni predstavniki večjih slovenskih ustanov so pokazali velik interes, o čemer priča tudi dejstvo, da so se ses-

tanka v Clevelandu udeležili tudi predstavniki in predstavnice iz Detroita, Pittsburgha, Lemonta (Chicago) in celo New York.

V vsebinski razpravi o prihodnji organizaciji slovenskih skupnosti v ZDA, ki so izjemno raznolike, se je izkazalo, da bo v prihodnje potrebno oblikovati stalno predstavnisko koordinacijsko telo, katerega vloga bo predstavljanje slovenske skupnosti navzven (v odnosih z zveznimi organi v ZDA in s Slovenijo) ter medsebojno usklajevanje dejavnosti.

Člani takega koordinacijskega telesa bi morali biti izvoljeni po teritorialnem – regionalnem načelu, ne glede na njihovo pripadnost različnim krovnim organizacijam (KS-KJ, SNPJ, SWUA...).

To pomeni, da bo v prihodnje potrebno določiti "regije", ki bodo zajemale približno podobno število slovenskih ustanov. Iz celotnih ZDA naj bi bilo približno 20 regij oziroma njihovih predstavnikov.

Z Ameriško Domovino ste vedno na tekočem z dogajanjem v slovenskem svetu

Bodo v državnem zboru zastopani tudi slovenski izseljenci in zamejci?

Diaspora v parlamentu?

Razprava o vključitvi predstavnikov Slovencev zunaj meja države v državni zbor je dobila nov zagon. V prejšnjih mesecih so pobudo za spremembo ustave pripravili v Novi Sloveniji, zdaj pa se je oglasila Konferenca SSK za Italijo.

Ljubljana – Konferenca Svetovnega slovenskega kongresa (SSK) za Italijo, ki je imela v Gorici svoj občni zbor, je sprejela resolucijo, s katero zahaja spremembo slovenske zakonodaje. S tem bi omogočili izvolitev dveh poslancev – predstavnika zamejcev ozioroma Slovencev po svetu – v državni zbor Republike Slovenije. Poslanci NSi so že novembra lani predlagali spremembo nekaterih členov ustave, ki bi bila podlaga za sprejetje zakonov, s katerimi bi nato omogočili zastopanost Slovencev zunaj meja v slovenskem hramu demokracije.

Poseg v ustavo

Šlo naj bi za spremembo 5. in 80. člena Ustave RS ter njeni dopolnitev s členom 63. a.

S prvo naj bi omogočili "posebne pravice in ugodnosti", ki bi jih v Sloveniji uživali izseljenci, zdomci in zamejci brez slovenskega državljanstva.

Ključen pa je dodatek k 63. členu, po katerem so avtohtone slovenske narodne manjšine v sosednjih državah ter slovenski izseljenci in zdomci neposredno zastopani v državnem zboru.

Z 80. členom bi se točneje opredelila nova sestava DZ, ki bi ga sestavljalo 94 poslancev, od tega po en poslanec madžarske in italijanske manjšine v Sloveniji, po dva poslanca slovenskih manjšin v sosednjih državah ter po dva poslanca izseljencev in zdomcev.

Za vložitev ustavne pobude bo potrebnih vsaj 30 poslancev (pod njem se je podpisalo vseh devet predstavnikov NSi), za kasnejše sprejetje predloga pa kar dvetretjinska večina ozioroma 60 poslancev.

Podobno je v tujini

V poslanski skupini NSi so se za predlog ustavnih sprememb odločili, potem ko so "potipali"

razpoloženje rojakov iz tujine. Sami poudarjajo številčnost slovenske diaspre in interes, ki ga Slovenija nedvomno ima z vključevanjem le-te v gospodarsko, politično in kulturno življenje nacije.

V poslanski skupini NSi ob tem navajajo resolucijo 1035 Parlamentarne skupščine Sveta Evrope o Evropejcih, ki živijo v tujini, iz leta 1994 ter Priporočilo 1410 te skupščine iz leta 1999, ki govori o povezavah med Evropejci, ki živijo v tujini, in njihovimi državami izvora.

Oba dokumenta izražata pozitivne učinke izseljencev pri krepitevi vezi med narodi in vladajočimi elitami.

Kot primerjavo iz bližnjega sosedstva pa v NSi navajajo italijanski primer, kjer v tujini živeči Italijani lahko volijo tako člane rimske poslanske zbornice kot senata. Izseljenci tako izberejo 12 poslancev in šest senatorjev. Ob tem je treba opozoriti, da italijanska poslanska zbornica šteje kar 630 članov, senat pa 315.

Naj dodamo, da v 140-glavem hrvaškem saboru poled osmih pripadnikov na Hrvaškem živečih manjšin sedi tudi pet predstavnikov hrvaške diaspre.

PERRY, O. - Sredi manda sedanje demokratične vlade Slovenije se zdi, da se kažejo jasni obrisi ne le resničnega položaja v državi, temveč tudi bodočega razvoja. Država je v zadnjih dveh letih pod vladom Janeza Janše vsekakor dosegla pomembne in vidne uspehe.

Ti so najbolj otpljivi na gospodarskem področju, bolje na finančnem, saj se je Slovenija edina med novo sprejetimi članicami Evropske unije gospodarsko dvignila do take stopnje, da je bila sprejeta v denarni sistem "evra". šega finančnega ministra v Evropi. Posmehovanja in napadi nanj so zdaj ponehali.

Ta finančni uspeh države pa je imel tudi svojo senčno stran. "Terenško delo" teh prizadavanj - če se tako izrazim - je opravil direktor Banke Slovenije Mitja Gaspari. Bilo bi torej naravno pričakovati, da bodo tudi njemu priznane čisto dočlene zasluge za ta uspeh, kar pa se ni zgodilo.

Gaspari, ki je svoje finančno znanje izpopolnjeval v Washingtonu na Svetovni banki, izhaja iz politično leve družine (njegov stric je bil jugoslovanski veleposlanik na Tajskem) in je bil zato v sedanji vladni kombinaciji zadrževan nekje ob strani. Ljudje, ki so se zanimali za razpoloženja raznih vladnih funkcionarjev, pa naj bi o njem odkrili negativne oz. nepremišljene postavke. Za-

to nadaljnji mandat kot direktor Banke Slovenije mu parlament ni podelil. Vprašanje, kdo bo novi direktor še danes ni rešen.

Delni vzrok temu je zmeda, ki že vse od zadnjih parlamentarnih volitev vlada na politični levici. Ko je "liberalna demokracija", ki se je podzavestno že pričela obnati kot stranka, ki bo odslej odločala o slovenski prihodnosti, doživelva poraz, se je nenadoma pokazala vse njena strukturalna šibkost. Začela je razpadati; drug za drugim so stranko začeli zapuščati ljudje s političnimi "imeni".

Glavni razlog za to je bila politična nesposobnost bivšega premiera Antona Ropa, da bi poražene kostrune obdržal v svoji čredi. Do kraja pa je razpihal ta položaj evropski poslanec Jelko Kacin, ki si je nadel dolžnost rešitelja stranke in predvideval, da bo ta rešitev v njenem povratku v leninistično čistost. To je bilo preveč celo za pravoverne socialiste.

Tako se je pričel vzpon predstavnika drugega krila politične levice - Borisa Pahorja. Tudi njega so politični opozovalci v preteklosti opisovali z rahlo mero posmehovanja. Veljal je za človeka, ki se je rad elegantno oblačil, ni pa imel kakšnih posebnih briljantnih socialnih navdihov.

Pahor je predsednik Socialnih demokratov, kot se zdaj nazivajo nekdanji komunisti. SD je neposredna naslednica Zveze komunistov, v teh krogih pa si pripisuje najmočnejši vpliv Milan Kučan.

Tudi Kučanu so se štrene pošteno zameštrale. Ko je po zadnjih volitvah ustanovil "Forum 21", je bilo na splošno pričakovano, da bo iz tega nastala nova stranka pod njegovim vodstvom. Možnost tega je še vedno navzoča, čeprav se zdi, a je manjša iz dneva v dan. (V neznano se je izgubil tudi opozicijski "Forum za republiko" pa Drnovškova "srečanja" za razpravljanje o prihodnosti Slovenije.)

Kučan je pač vstopil v tisto starostno dobo, ko čas dela proti človeku, ne zanj. Njegov vpliv je bil še dovolj močan, da je svojemu protežirancu Zoranu Jankoviču zago-

Odziv SDS na poročilo State Departmenta

Ljubljana - Na poročilo State Departmenta o človekovih pravicah za leto 2006, ki se je med drugim dotaknila Slovenije, se je odzvala poslanska skupina Slovenske demokratske stranke oz. SDS. Tako je v njenem imenu poslanec Branko Grims na tiskovni konferenci 21. marca presodil, da je poročilo generalno gledano zelo ugodno.

Kot je dejal, poročilo kaže napredek na področju svobode medijev, čeprav še vedno prihaja do nekaterih primerov samocenzure. Kot primer le-te je navedel molk medijev o izredno dobrem stanju na gospodarskem področju.

"Glede na dejstvo, da imamo najvišjo gospodarsko rast od osamosvojitve dalje, da smo v evroobmočje vstopili brez inflacije, je nerazumljivo,

da takšni dosežki niso predstavljeni javnosti," je dejal Grims in dodal, da ne smemo prezreti napisanega, da so bili neodvisni mediji aktivni in so predstavljali različne poglede brez bistvenih omejitev.

Poročilo State Departmenta po njegovo tudi kaže, da je uveljavitev novega zakona o medijih in zakona o RTV Slovenija očitno pridobitev za svobodo medijev, kar pa je bilo v poročanju o omenjenem poročilu očitno prezroto. Enako velja tudi za znižanje RTV naročnine.

Že dan pred tiskovno konferenco SDS je imela svojo tiskovno konferenco Liberalna akademija. Presodila je, da se medijski svoboda v Sloveniji čedaže bolj omejuje in krči. Po mnenju dr. Darka Štrajna naj bi bili mediji v državi pod posrednim vplivom vlade, povečujejo se tudi politični in ekonomski pritiski, še zlasti tam, kjer ima država lastniški delež.

Dr. Boris Vezjak pa je problematiziral dejstvo, da so nekateri mediji očitno prezrli poročilo State Departmenta ali pa so o njem poročali zelo skopo. Po njegovem mnenju vlada ni izpolnila predvolilnih obljub o pluralizaciji in uravnoteženju medijev.

državni zbor bodisi v državni svet," pravi Zver, ki se hkrati dobro zaveda težavnosti pri doseganju kompromisa.

"Dejstvo je, da stranke levega oziroma levosredinskega bloka prav zradi t. i. političnih kalkulacij niso naklonjene morebitni vključenosti zdomev in zamejcev v naš zakonodajni organ, opozarja minister.

Naš sogovorec prav tako izpostavlja dobre odnose, ki jih sedanja vlada goji do rojakov v tujini. "Eden od dokazov za to je prav gotovo to, da smo dvignili rang vodje urada za Slovence v zamejstvu in po svetu na raven državnega sekretarja in mu s tem dali pomembno vlogo in mesto.
