LONDON, 2. avgusta.—Pred nekaj dnevi je prišlo v Franciji na površje vraščanje, ali naj Petainova vlada takoj pošlje bivšega podpremijera Chautempsa v Brazilijo, s katero misijo je v zvezi načrt za restoracijo monarhije v Franciji.

Pred razsulo Reynaudove vlade se je izvedelo, da je maršal Petain, ki je bil takrat poslanik v Madridu, že uveljavil stike z agenti grofa de Paris, pretendent za francoski prestol, o katerem se poroča, da je sedaj v Braziliji.

Tudi Weigand intrigira v Franciji se sodi, da je tudi general Maxime Weigand globoko zamočan v tej rojalistični intrigi ter da je v zvezi z aktivnostmi polkovnika Francois de la Rocquesa, načelnika fašistične organizacije Ognjeni križ.

Znano je, da je general Weigand že vsa zadnja leta prepričan, da je rešitev Francije mogoča samo pod vzpostavitvijo monarhije.

Konvencija je porazila oba predloga, namreč predlagane prispevke po 50c in \$1.00 za financiranje organizacijske kampanje, toda je sklenila, razpisati do 1. oktobra referendum za prispevke po dolarju.

Medtem pa je policija aretirala 14 delegatov tekom neke demonstracije v tovarni, ki je last družbe Century Electric Co., kjer se vrši že šest tednov stavka električarjev, delavcev pri radiu in strojnikov, ki so člani C. I. O. organizacije.

Chrysler in General Motors korporaciji je bil predložen predlog za masno produkcijo 37-milimetrovskih topov, katere že izdeluje v omejeni množini Colt Fifeams Co. tovarna, in lažjih, 20-milimetrovskih topičev za letala.

ANGLEŽI SO PODVZELI NAD 3,000 POLETOV NAD NEMČIJO

LONDON, 3. avgusta.—Lord Beaverbrook, minister angleške zračne sile, je postal danes član notranjega vojnega kabineta, v katerem bo najbrže ponudeno tudi mesto Lloyd George-u, angleškemu premijeru za časa svetovne vojne. Neville Chamberlain bo najbrž odstavljen iz kabineta.

Iz angleških avtoritativnih krogov se poroča, da je nemško pomorsko mesto Hamburg skoraj popolnoma v razvalinah, kar je posledica trimesečnega neprestanega bombardiranja od strani angleških letalcev.

Zadnje tarče angleških letalcev so velike nemške Kruppove orožarne v Essenu ter vojna skladišča in oljni rezervoarji v zapadni Nemčiji in Holandiji.

V četrtek večer so se soudeležili angleškega letalskega napanotranjega vojnega kabineta, v katerem bo najbrže ponudeno tudi mesto Lloyd George-u, angleškemu premijeru za časa svetovne vojne. Neville Chamberlain bo najbrž odstavljen iz kabineta.

Do danes so podvzeli Angleži nad 3,000 poletov v Nemčijo, kjer so bombardirali nad 1,000 važnih objektov. Angleži pravijo, da so njih lastna pristanišča ostala skoro nepoškodovana, dočim so morali nekatera izpostavljena pristanišča zapreti oziroma opustiti.

LONDON, 3. avgusta. — Francosko vojno sodišče je obsodilo na smrt francoskega generala Charlesa de Gaulle-a, načelnika provizorične francoske vlade v Londonu, ki je zapustil Francijo ter zbral v Angliji novo francosko armado za nadaljni boj proti Nemčiji. General de Gaulle je bil obsojen v odsotnosti.

Na to obsodbo je general odgovoril s tem, da je naznanil, da so francoski letalci, ki so pod njegovim poveljstvom, bombardirali Nemčijo.

Mladi, resni general, je podal poleg tega še sledečo izjavo: "Jaz smatram akt, ki so ga sklenili možje v Vichju, za popolnoma neveljaven. Z njimi bom obračunal po naši končni zmagi." De Gaulle je še pripomnil, da je Petainova vlada navadna lutka Nemčije.

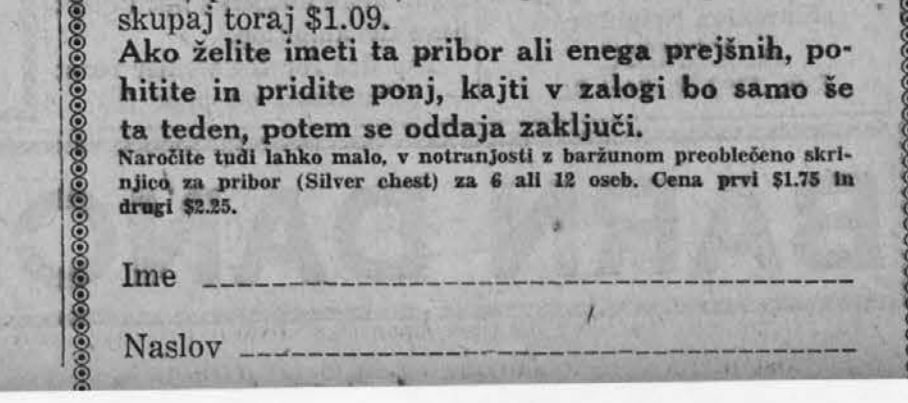

We chose him as our captain. Should he fail to heed his words while it is still time, we shall have to pay dearly, but ours will not be the consolation that those who were supposed to tell us the truth were derelict in their duty. The blame will be ours, and ours only.

First Directory Of Yugoslavs In City Is Compiled

By Theodore Andrica in The Cleveland Press

The first comprehensive directory of any nationality group in this city, the "Who's Who Among the Yugoslavs of Cleveland and Environs" was released today by Anthony J. Klancar of 1047 E. 67th Street, its compiler and head of the Yugoslav Pamphlet Press, publisher of the 94 page booklet.

Although the first issue is not fully complete nevertheless it gives an excellent idea of the accomplishments of the Slovenes, Croats and Serbs who started coming to Cleveland about 50 years ago.

In his introduction of the "Who's Who" Mr. Klancar states that the Slovenes in Cleveland number 35,000, the Croats 15,000 and the Serbs 2500. These figures include both the people born in Europe and their American born children.

Lists 500 Names

The booklet includes the names of nearly 500 Cleveland men and women of Yugoslav descent "who made a dent in Cleveland's varied life" and also the names and addresses of various organizations together with their presidents and secretaries.

According to the booklet the Yugoslavs in Cleveland have 27 attorneys, 13 city policemen, 13 dentists, 16 editors, 12 draftsmen, 13 engineers, 11 executives, 22 fraternal executives, 14 music teachers, 13 musical directors, 50 nurses, 15 physicians, 13 politicians, 16 singers, 26 teachers, eight deputy sheriffs, six deputy clerks, eight ball players, five bankers, nine pharmacists, 13 clergymen and six councilmen. Many other professions also are represented among Cleveland Yugoslavs.

According to the book the Yugoslavs of Cleveland have contributed more than \$20,000,000 in real estate and personal property to the wealth of Cleveland. Much of this is invested in the 11 national homes.

Publishing Center

Cleveland is also the center of the Slovene publishing business in the United States with two dailies, four fraternal weeklies and two monthlies. Cleveland Slovenes have four churches, the Croats have two and the Serbs have one.

"In all this maze of statistics and names one thing stands out: The Yugoslavs of Cleveland are hard working, clear thinking and progressive people. They have held on to their Old World culture and have assimilated it with that of the New World, bridging the gap by educating their sons and daughters in the American way," Mr. Klancar concluded.
