Hoover zadržuje z republikanci podporo namenjeno sirotnim farmarjem

Washington, 29. januarja. — Pred nedavnim je kongres Zedinjenih držav dovolil \$25.000.000 podpore, ki naj se izplača iz zvezne blagajne za farmarje v državah Arkansas, Missouri in ponekod drugod, ki so bili silno prizadeti po zadnji suši. Ta denar naj bi se izročil Ameriškemu Rdečemu križu, ki naj bi skrbel, da dobijo prizadeti pomor. Toda v ogromno začudenje demokratov v kongresu, je vodstvo Rdečega križa zavrnilo \$25.000.000, rekoč, da ima dovolj sredstev in prostovoljnih darov, da lahko pomaga vsakomur, kdor prosi za pomoč. John Barton Payne, predsednik Ameriškega Rdečega križa, je prišel pred odsek za dovolitve in izjavil, da je centralni odbor Rdečega križa glasoval proti sprejetju \$25.000.000. Očividno je, da je predsednik Hoover vporabil svoj vpliv in svetoval, naj se denarja ne sprejme. Vodja demokratov v senatu zborinic, senator Robinson iz države Arkansas, kjer je pomanjkanje najhujše, je skočil s svojega sedeža, ko je zaslišal novico, in je zahteval, da kongres ustanovi svoj lasten urad, preko Rdečega križa, in pomaga deliti podporo potrebnim. Senator Robinson je bil oni, ki je predlagal, da se dovoli \$25.000.000 podpore. Predsednik Hoover se brani iz dveh vzrokov, da podeli svoje dovoljenje za 25 milijonov dolarjev. Predsednik trdi, da vlada ne sme dati nobenega denarja za podporo, pač pa mora denar priti iz privatnih rok, kajti sicer se bodo podpore potrebnih ob vsaki priliki obračali na kongres, kar bi povzročilo ogromne davke. Drugič, Hoover je mnenja, da naj samo farmarji dobivajo podporo, ne pa tudi prebivalci v mestih, kjer je dovolj dobrodelnih organizacij. Toda radi tega bo še hud boj. Senator Robinson je napadal predsednika, češ, da je dovolil \$100.000.000 ameriškega denarja za lačne Ruse, dočim nima 25 milijonov dolarjev za lačne Amerikance.



Chicago, 28. januarja. V Chicagi so zadnje čase dobro pometli z gangeži in zločinci.

Diktator Musso zanikuje trditve ameriškega generala Smedley Butlerja

Washington, 29. januarja. — Laški ministrski predsednik Mussolini je poslal laškemu poslaniku v Washingtonu kabelgram, v katerem odločno zanika, da bi on dirjal z avtomobilom, v katerem se je nahajal tudi neki Amerikanec, in da bi pri tem povozil nekega otroka in se ne zmenil za njegovo usodo. To zadevno se je izjavil ameriški general Smedley Butler v nekem govoru v Philadelphia. V kabelgramu pravi Mussolini: "Jaz se nisem še nikdar vozil s kakim Amerikanecem po Italiji, niti ni moj avtomobil še kdaj povozi kakega otroka, moža ali zeno." Laško poslanstvo v Washingtonu je silno razburjeno radi izjave ameriškega generala, ki baže imo to navado, da rad govori. Najbrž je moral Butler vedeti, kaj govori, sicer se ne bi izjavil, da bo najel zagovornika in svoje dokazal.

Najnovejše poročilo o tem dogodu je: državni tajnik Stimson je šel k laškemu poslaniku in ga prosil odpuščanja, rekoč, da ni bil namen ameriške vlade žaliti Mussolinija ali laški narod. Medtem je pa mornariški tajnik Adams zapovedal arretacijo generala Butlerja, ki pride pred vojaško sodnijo. Butler je izjavil, da bo najel zagovornika in svoje dokazal.

Washington, 29. januarja. — Predlog senatorja-a Wowella iz Nebriske, da se za mesto Washington naredi posebna prohibicija postava, je zaenkrat propadel. Senatorji so pravkar odglasovali, da predloga ne sprejemo v tem zasedanju na znanje. S tem so mokri senatorji dobili eno prvih zmag v kongresu. Dasi se je mnogo republikancev zavzemalo za predlog, pa so prisli nasprotnikom prohibicije na pomoč demokratje, ki so odločili, da se predlog ne vpošteva. Obenem se je naredila strategična poteza v tem, ker niti mokri, niti suhi niso hoteli imeti odločilnega boja v tem času, kajti debata bi se tako zavlekla, da bi morale izostati vse druge zadeve, in bi bilo zborovanje kongresa prej zaključeno, kot bi se morda prito do zaključka. Kongres mora namreč prenehati z zborovanjem 4. marca, in vsi kongresniki se boje izrednega zasedanja, ki bi sledilo, ako bi se sedaj začelo razpravljati o predlogu senatorja Howella-a, da se "posuši" glavno mesto Washington. Torej ga bodo v Washingtonu še naprej in skoro nemoteno pili.



'Vidi' received his first football letter, although at present he is acting captain of the basketball squad and is earning his third letter. Both have played prominent parts in their school's athletic activities and are seriously expecting to continue their studies at the University of Dayton.

"Not to forget others, Frank and Anthony Zakrakaj, brothers, on the St. Ignatius basketball team. Here's for a little more space about high school lads, who are Slovanes and are starring on their respective teams. Yours truly."

Well, Mr. Reader, you beat us to it. You see, we had a writeup about the Latin High School stars and were all set to give the Slovenian boys a nice hand. But as events turned out we were very hard up for space and were forced to omit the story along with a few others. This continued until the present day so now we are devoting this particular space to it.

Then, too, your bit of news concerning the scholastic futures of Pozelnik and Vidervol is quite interesting as it starts us thinking (if possible) about some more Yugoslav luminaries who starred at Dayton U.

Going way back to the year 1917 we have the first of a line of Virant stars at the Down State institution. The Rev. Ludwig Virant was the Slovenian pioneer at the Brothers of Mary School, captaining the football team in the fall prior to the signing of the Armistice.

Next in line came "Fighting Leo" Virant who led one of the school's most powerful football squads through a successful season in 1924. Leo played guard and at present is dividing his time between running his home town of Lorain, O., as councilman, and captaining the Ohio Ice pro football team of that city.

Following Leo came little brother, (6 feet 3 inches), Johnny, who though only two years at the school played guard on the varsity eleven.

Belanich Now Coach

Then in the class of '27, Frank "Box Car Bill" Belanich headed the athletic limelight. The Euclid boy started at tackle at the institution for four years and was captain of the '26 team. Bill also had his hands in the school's baseball and basketball teams. Following graduation Bill stayed Down State, coaching the fresh eleven, since then he has been moved to varsity line coach and head coach in basketball.

Debesis Most Valuable

Following Belanich came Johnny "Wep" Debesis, a Clevelander and former Latin star. Besides captaining the basketball team in his senior year, Debesis played the pivot sack and shortfield for the university nine and end on the gridiron squad. Undoubtedly he was one of the best all around athletes ever turned out by the Dayton Flyers, earning the most letters in his senior year and winning the school's annual award for the most valuable athlete.

Then we can't forget our own boss (oh Yeah!) Ray Jay, himself. You know Ray was some walker in his day. This is evidenced by the fact he established national collegiate walking records in the quarter and half-mile distances, while a member of the school track team. Ray lost only one race, and that his first, in 1925 when the 1924 Olympic champ beat him by a few steps. Incidentally a new world's mark was set that day by the winner.

Doljack Starred

Johnny Doljack, well known local baseball and basketball tosser, enjoyed two good years at the Dayton school in both of these sports. Pro baseball called and Johnny turned in his books.

Coupled with "Pozy" and "Vidi" we have a couple of Slovenian Lorain High boys who are figuring on entering the University of Dayton. They are Joe and Bernie Urbas and worked at ends of that city's state scholastic championship squad. The latter was chosen all-Lake Erie League flanker for the 1930 season.

Joe is as much a swimmer as he is a football player, copping third place in a five-mile open race sponsored by the city, when only 15 years old.

Does Trick Twice

An od story is connected with this feat. Fearing his own ability Joe swam the course the day before the race, so as to assure himself he was capable of doing it. As previously mentioned he took third in the event.

The future certainly looks bright for Dayton if our Slovenian high school athletes fulfill their intention of continuing their activities there.
