PREMOŽENJE K. S. K. J. ZNAŠA NAD \$5,000,000

SLOVENCİ POROČAJO IZ BARBARSKÉ NEMČIJE

Cez 30,000 Slovencev je bilo s silo odvlečenih na Saksonsko.

Chikaška "Prosveta" z dne 4. februarja poroča sledeče:

"Rojak in član SNPJ iz Pennsilvanije je prejel pismo od očeta in matere, brata in sestre, ki se nahajajo kot izgnanci na Saksonskem v Nemčiji. Pismo, ki je datirano 19. novembra, 1941, je nacijska cenzura pregledala, toda pustila ga je skozi. Da zaščiti osebo, ki so to pisale, ne objavljamo njihovih priimkov, niti imena kraja, kjer je bilo pismo oddano. Pismo se glasi: "Ljubi nam sin!

"Damo Ti vedeti, da smo 12. novembra zapustili naš mili dom. S seboj smo vzeli le to, kar smo imeli na sebi, vse drugo je moralo ostati tam.

"Franki, srečen si, ker si tam! Tvoje pismo je hodilo mesec dni k nam. Nismo Ti mogli prej odpisati, ker ni bilo časa.

"Franki, sedaj nimamo doma več. Kje bo naš dom, ne vemo. Reza, Karolina in Ivan so šli z nami do Rajhenburga, potem pa ne več. Francka je šla teden dni prej iz Krške vasi in Čene, Marička ter Lojze iz Rake.

"Sin moj, žalostna je bila naša ločitev od doma, ki smo ga morali zapustiti za vedno. Tam smo morali pustiti dve breji kravi, junca, dva velika prašiča in tri mlade prašičke. Vina velik sod, polne skrinje vsakovrstnega zrnja in 60 mernikov pšenice. Ko smo mi odhajali s solznimi očmi, so že drugi odnašali našo pšenico iz skrinj in pili naše vino. Ko smo prišli v Rajhenberg, nam je povedal nekdo, ki je prišel za nami, da je naša pšenica in vino že vse šlo. Ne morem Ti povedati, Franki, kako mi je bilo hudo.

"In koliko drugih stvari smo izgubili. Tako smo skrbeli, delali in varčevali, sedaj pa moramo po svetu v capah in bosih ...

"Z žalostnim srcem Te pozdravljamo: jaz, Tvoj oče, mama, Vinc in naša mala Anica. Žalosten je ta pozdrav od nas popotnikov ..."

"Ljubi brat!
"Bratec Franki, žalostno novico Ti sporočamo, da smo morali zapustiti naš zlati dom in sedaj smo na potu v logarje v deželi Sachsen na Nemškem. Tam nas je že 30 tisoč Slovencev. In sedaj na zimo! Žalostno je to. Vsa naša zlahtja je šla, Jančar in Ajstar, Veličič Lojze in Čenč Jože iz Skopic, sploh vsi, vsa Slovenija je na potu ...

"Ne vemo drug za drugega. Do Rajhenburga smo šli skupaj, tam so nas pa raztrgali. Mi smo čakali dva dni in eno noč na transport. Z nami je sedem družin iz Drnove, ostali so pa štajerci iz Bizeljskega, skupaj nas je 145 oseb.

"Franki, če bo kako mogoče, mi bomo vsi prišli k Tebi, sedaj pa ne moremo nikamor, niti ne vemo, kaj smo ...

"Danes smo brez vsega. Pogoreli smo brez ognja ...

"Zbogom Franki naš! Voščimo Ti vesele božične praznike. Naši bodo žalostni.

"Tvoj brat Vinc, sestra Anica, ate in mama. Gudbaj!"

Natančen program shoda bo v listih pravočasno objavljen. To naj služi samo kot prednaznanilo, tako, da bo lahko vsak, ki ima še kako kapljico slovenske ali jugoslovanske krvi v sebi, določil svoj čas tako, da bo v nedeljo popoldne, dne 15. marca navzoč na shodu. Vsi ste vabljeni. Pridite vsi! Ne bo vam žal, ako se shoda udeležite, kajti slišali boste kako se ravna z našim narodom, kako trpijo naši bratje in sestre v stari domovini. Več o tem se sledi.

Naš sobrat John Lovshin, član društva sv. Antona Padoanskega, št. 72, Ely, Minn., je imel svojega sina Viljema J. v ameriški armadi in ta je postal prva žrtev naših Jednotinih članov-vojakov v sedanjih svetovni vojni. Njegov oče je prejel koncem januarja iz glavnega urada mornaričnega oddelka v Washingtonu, D. C., sledeče sožalno pismo:

"Washington, D. C.,
"28. januarja, 1942

"Dragi mi Mr. Lovshin:

"Z globokim obžalovanjem vam naznanjam, da je bil Vaš sin Private First Class, William J. Lovshin, U. S. Marine Corps, katerega se je pogrešalo od japonskega napada na Pearl Harbor T. H. pod okoliščinami v zvezi s smrtjo uradno proglašen za mrtvega po našem oddelku in sicer z datumom 7. decembra, 1941. V ime-

nu njegovih številnih tovaršev mornarice in v mojem imenu vam izražam svoje iskreno sožalje vsled te izgube.

"Rad bi vam olajšal Vašo žalost, zato pa trdno upam, da boste potolaženi z mislijo in zavestjo na lep rekord Vašega sina v vojaški službi in zato, ker je junaško žrtvoval svoje življenje v izvrševanju svoje službe; to naj Vas v gotovi meri tolaži v tej bridki uri.

MALO POGLEDA V ZADNJE LETNO POROČILO K. S. K. JEDNOTE

KAKO SMO NAPREDOVALI ZADNJIH 10 LET

V zadnji izdaji Glasila ste lahko čitali po uradnem zapisniku letnega zborovanja glavnega odbora na minuli januarjski seji tudi občajno uradno poročilo našega brata glavnega tajnika o Jednotinem poslovanju minulega (1941) leta. Mislimo, da ko je brat Zalar sestavljal to ogromno delo in te milijonske številke, da je svoje delo z največjim veseljem zaključil, kajti tako ugodnega poročila pismo v našem uradnem listu še nikdar objavili. Koncem decembra, leta 1941 je namreč naša Jednota doseгла svoj višek tako v številu članstva in v dosegi svojega čistega premoženja. Osebitv v finančnem oziru smo tekom zadnjih deset let baš lani najbolj napredovali za celih \$313,279.22. Čisto naše denarno premoženje obeh oddelkov je namreč ob zaključku lanskega fiskalnega leta preokračilo že pet milijonov (5,058,374.18) dolarjev. V aktivnem oddelku imamo namreč \$4,820,708.23, v mladinskem pa \$237,665.95.

Članstva smo točasno imeli 27,428 v odraslem ali aktivnem oddelku v mladinskem pa 10,294, torej skupaj 37,722. Te številke prekašajo vsak naš dosedanji rekord.

Pa pogledjmo še malo, kako je K. S. K. Jednota tekem zadnjih 10 let finančno in v članstvu napredovala: V denarju vsega skupaj za \$1,931,260, v članstvu pa za 5,215; to je že precej lep napredek, posebno če pomislimo, da je deželo v tem razdobju trla večletna depresija.

Največji napredek v članstvu smo imeli leta 1933 in sicer za 2,254 članov in članic, tedaj se je vršila namreč znana zrakoplovna kampanja, in vršili so se tudi Jednotini dnevi; finančno smo pa najbolj napredovali lani, kakor že gor omenjeno.

V članstvu smo v tej dobi povprečno na leto napredovali za 521 članov in članic, v financii pa za \$193,126. Po naši skromni sodbi bi moral biti vsak naš Jednotar in Jednotarica vesel(a) tega lepega napredka in v takem razpoloženju naj bi v letošnjem konvenčnem letu še bolj deloval za našo drago organizacijo.

Sedanja jubilejna in predkonvenčna kampanja traja še dobrih šest tednov, do 31. marca. Še je čas za nekatera zaspana društva, da se zbudijo in rešijo svojo čast! Tako je še teh šest tednov prilika za one, ki so v tekmi za dosego posebnih denarnih nagrad \$110 ali \$100 in bodo vsi kampanjski zmagovalci tudi kot častni gostje na naši prihodnji konvenciji v Chicagu, Ill.

Ali bi ne bilo tudi res umestno in častno, da bi do tedaj vsi člani in članice razveselili našega vrla glavnega predsednika z izvršitvijo njegove iskrene želje: 40,000 članstva do konvencije! V teh šestih mesecih bi morali vsak mesec pridobiti vsi skupaj ali 182 krajevnih društev po 380 novih članov in članic obeh oddelkov, oziroma 400, kajti vsak mesec nam jih smrt odvzame okrog 20. To je sicer res precej veliko število, toda z dobro voljo in skupnim nastopom bi pa lahko izvedli željo brata glavnega predsednika. Poskusimo!

Japonci zavzeli Singapore

Po 10-tedenskem obleganju britanskega polotoka Malaya se je Japoncem posrečilo zavzeti vse važne obrežne točke tega polotoka, pa tudi glavno mesto in trdnjavo Singapore; to ozemlje in Singapore, ali Gibraltar v Orientu, kateri je zadnjih 123 let spadal Veliki Britaniji, je padlo v japonske roke dne 15. februarja. Brezpogojna vdaja je bila podpisana po našem clevelandskem času ob 9. dopoldne. Sodi se, da so Japonci zajeli do 60,000 mož močno angleško in avstralsko armado, zaeno so zapolnili tudi nekaj angleških bojnih ladij.

Z zavzetjem trdnjave Singapore katere utrdbе je veljala nad 200 milijonov dolarjev, imajo sedaj Japonci ključ do Indije in Avstralije; zdaj nameravajo še napasti otok Sumatra in Java.

SLOVENIA UNDER THE NAZIS

Nazis Seize Churches and Monasteries in Slovenia / Document Reveals Shrine Desecrations and Many Thefts of Sacred Vessels

Washington, (NC) — Seizure of Church properties in Slovenia, a country 97 per cent of the population of which is Catholic, followed immediately upon the German invasion of Yugoslavia, it is revealed in a document of assured authenticity which has been received in this country.

Chapter House Seized Just before the Easter holidays in Maribor, the several German agencies (Gestapo, Blackshirts, Storm-troopers and others) seized the Cathedral chapter house, including all the furnishings, driving the canons away. Bishop John J. Tomazic of Lavant was confined to his episcopal residence in Maribor. The German agents then seized the diocesan seminary and school of theology. Mobs which roamed the streets were permitted to carry away the books from the academic library of the seminary.

German agents also seized all Church property in the Diocese of Ljubljana. Parish houses were looted of money, food and furnishings. There were numerous instances of theft of sacred vessels.

After the religious had been imprisoned, Nazi agents seized all monasteries and religious houses, together with all their possessions, including those of the Franciscans in Maribor, near Sveta Trojica in Slovenske Gorice, in Brezice, in Nazarje, in Ročanj, in Kamnik and in Prezje, where the Franciscans supervised the Slovenian national Shrine of the Blessed Virgin.

KSKJ MEMBER LOST AT SEA

Joseph, 22 years old, a third class radioman in the United States navy, was flying as the radioman gunner of plane in Bombing Squadron Six when the tragedy occurred. His parents were advised that he had lived and died "in a manner upholding the finest traditions of the naval service."

The letter telling the fatal story was written by W. R. Hollingworth, lieutenant commander, USN, from the U.S.S. Enterprise (CV6) Bombing Squadron Six, in care of the postmaster, San Diego, Calif., and dated Jan. 19. It follows: "I deeply regret to inform you that your son, Joe John Ivantic, radioman third class, U. S. navy, was lost at sea on Saturday, Jan. 17. He was flying in his official capacity as the radioman gunner of a plane of this squadron which had a forced landing in the water. Your son and the pilot both got clear of the plane before it sank, although they had been severely shaken by the crash landing.

While together in the water, he told the pilot that he was unable to inflate his life jacket, and the pilot although suffering severe lacerations and contusion about the head held on to him. The pilot held on as long as he was able and only lost his grip as the rescue boat approached. A sailor in the boat saw your son start to sink, and dived in to save him, but most unfortunately could not reach him. The pilot was rescued, and is recovering rapidly.

Joe joined this squadron April 15, 1941. He was greatly respected and admired by his shipmates, and in the knowledge of what a fine young man he was, it is readily understood what a great shock and loss this is to you. His character, personality, and appearance were exemplary, and I wish you to know that he lived and died in a manner upholding the finest traditions of the naval service.

"I hope you will feel free to call on me for any services or information that I can furnish you."

Father Loan Official. Joseph was born in North Chicago on Jan. 26, 1920, his father's birthday. His father is secretary of the North Shore Building and Loan association.
