## PRED OTVORITVIJO NOVE KAMPANJE MLADINSKEGA ODDELKA

Lansko leto sredi julija je naš brat glavni tajnik vsem krajevnim društvom poslal posebne okrožnice ali pojasnilo glede certifikatov ali zavarovanja članstva v mladinskem oddelku. Ker bomo z začetkom prihodnjega meseca (2. aprila) otvorili veliko kampanjo tega oddelka in da se lahko vsi starši natančno podučijo o različnem zavarovanju svojih otrok pri naši Jednoti, prinašamo danes na tem mestu ono okrožnico glavnega tajnika tudi na tem mestu. Priporočljivo je torej, da to pojasnilo ali ta članek pazno prečitata, da boste imeli popoln vpogled v tej zadevi.

Pri naši Jednoti imamo za mladinski oddelak štiri vrste certifikate in sicer:

1) Življenjski certifikat do starosti 16 let (Term to Age 16) Standard Industrial 3 1/2%. Te vrste certifikat se imenuje "Certifikat načrta "AA-JD."

2) Življenjski certifikat do starosti 18 let (Term to Age 18) Standard Industrial 3 1/2%. Te vrste certifikat se imenuje "Certifikat načrta "BB-JD."

3) Dvajsetletni življenjski certifikat (Twenty Payment Life) American Experience 3 1/2%. Te vrste certifikat se imenuje "Certifikat načrta "CC-JD."

4) Dvajset let "Endowment" certifikat "FF-JD." (Twenty Year Endowment Certificates), ki so v Jednotinih pravilih, stran 163 označeni.

Potom certifikatov načrta "AA-JD" in načrta "BB-JD" se članstvo lahko zavaruje za \$50 ali \$1,000.

Na podlagi certifikatov "CC-JD" in "FF-JD" pa se lahko zavaruje za \$250, \$500 ali \$1,000.

Člani mladinskega oddelka, ki dopolnijo 16. leto svoje starosti, lahko ostanejo pri Jednoti do starosti 18. leta, pod pogojem, da zamenjajo sedanje ali stare certifikate za certifikate načrta "BB-JD." Mesečni assement za člane od 16. do 18. leta znaša 25 centov za \$500 in 50 centov za \$1,000 zavarovalnine.

Zelo važno je pa tole: Državni zakon države Illinois določuje, da prosilci, ki so stari 15 let, šest mesecev in en dan, ne morejo biti sprejeti v mladinski oddelak. Zato pa se tudi onih članov in članic, ki dopolnijo 16. leto, ne more smatrati za člane mladinskega oddelka, pač pa morajo biti prepisani v oddelak odraslega članstva.

Vsak tak član, ki ima sedaj certifikat načrta "A" in nosi najvišjo smrtninsko zavarovalnino \$450, bo ob dopolnitvi 16-letne starosti prepisan v oddelak odraslega članstva in bo zavarovan za \$500. Za to zavarovalnino bo plačeval 25 centov mesečno do starosti 18. leta.

Člani sedaj zavarovani v mladinskem oddelku pod načrtom "B" bodo ob dopolnitvi starosti 16 let prepisani v oddelak odraslih in bodo zavarovani za \$1,000. Mesečni assement takih članov bo znašal do starosti 18 let 50 centov.

Te vrste člani in članice ne plačujejo posebnih stroškovnega asessmenta, zato pa tudi niso upravičeni do podpor v slučaju kake poškodbe ali operacije.

Ravno tako taki člani ne plačujejo posebnega stroškovnega asessmenta, zato tudi direktno Glasila prejemali ne bodo.

Ko tak član ali članica dopolni starost 18 let, mora postati aktivni član ali članica odraslega oddelka ali bo pa črtan.

To pravilo velja samo za one člane in članice, ki bi ob dopolnitvi starosti 16 let ne mogli ali ne hoteli postati pravi in aktivni člani ali članice odraslega oddelka.

Vsi oni člani in članice mladinskega oddelka, ki želijo ob doseženi starosti 16 let postati pravi in aktivni člani in članice odraslega oddelka, pa lahko v odrasli oddelak prestopijo ravno tako, kot v preteklosti.

Od strani glavnega urada se priporoča, da člani mladinskega oddelka ob dopolnitvi starosti 16 let prestopijo v oddelak odraslega članstva ter postanejo pravi in aktivni člani in članice. To se priporoča posebno še iz razloga, ker na ta način pre-

## RUSKO-FINSKA VOJNA KONČANA

MOSKVA, Rusija, 13. marca.—Nenapovedana vojna, trajajoča tri in pol meseca med Rusijo in Finsko, je bila z večerajšnjim dnem končana, ker se je sinoči med obema državama podpisalo tozadevno premirje, v veljavo pa stopi tretji dan, ko bo mir uradno potrjen in podpisan. Z bojevanjem se bo prenehalo dne 13. marca ob 4. zjutraj.

V tej vojni se smatra za zmagovalce Ruse, ker bodo na podlagi mirovne pogodbe pridobili ves utrjeni Karelinski polotok. Dalje bo Rusija imela v najemu hankovski Gibraltar v finskih zalivu, za kar bo plačevala za dobo 30 let Finski osem milijonov finskih mark.

Več važnih točk je označenih v tej mirovni pogodbi v prid Rusije:

- 1.—Karelinski polotok in Mannerheim obrambna črta.
- 2.—Porušeno mesto Vipori z bližnjim otočjem vted.
- 3.—Vse obrežje velikega jezera Ladoga.
- 4.—Hanko utrdba za rusko mornarico.
- 5.—Del Sredni in Rybacht polotoka v arktičnem oceanu.
- 6.—Gotovi otoki v Finskem zalivu.
- 7.—Velik del ozemlja v severozahodnem delu Finske, vpoštevši Koularjavi.
- 8.—Rusija bo lahko zgradila svojo železnico, da zveže Belo morje do Bothnia zaliva.
- 9.—Rusija bo lahko brez carine pošiljala svoje blago čez severni del Finske do norveške meje.
- 10.—Finska bo pač lahko imela svoje bojno brodoge v arktičnem vodovju.

BERLIN, 13. marca.—V Nemčiji vlada veliko veselje vsled sklenjenega miru med Rusijo in Finsko, kajti s tem pri-čakuje Nemčija bolj lahko in več pomoči od svoje zaveznice Rusije v sedanji vojni z Anglijo in Francijo.

Rusi so v tej vojni izgubili okrog 400,000 vojakov, ali približno 4.000 na dan.

Cleveland, O. - Slovenski narodni muzej v Clevelandu, O., stoji danes pred tremi alternativami in te so: Prvič, zbrati skupaj z ameriškimi Slovenci čim več mogoče zanimivosti, predmetov za v muzej, to je vsakovrstnih stvari, kot: čim popolnejša zbirka vseh slovenskih časopisov in revij, ki so kdaj v Ameriki izhajali, kjerkoli; vsakovrstne slovenske knjige, brošure, papirlete, programe dramskih, pevskih predstav in drugih priredb; zapisnike in slike konvencij naših podpornih, kulturnih in političnih organizacij; zapisnike in slike

vine, kot tudi vsakovrstne druge predmete in stvari, ki niso zgoraj navedene, pa imajo pomenu za v Muzej.

Iz tega zbranega materiala se bo pozneje sestavilo kolikor mogoče kompletno zgodovino ameriških Slovencev, da ne bo vaše delo in prizadevanje na društvenem, kulturnem in gospodarskem polju utonilo v morju pozabljaja.

Brez zbirke Muzej ni mogoč, ker ne bi bilo kaj razkazovati javnosti. Zato prosim sodelovanja za Muzej vse ameriške Slovence, ker slovenski Muzej je zadeva vseh Slovencev in le s skupnim sodelovanjem bomo res nekaj reprezentativnega ustvarili in ohranili spomin na naše velike aktivnosti.

Druga naša naloga je: zbiranje finančnih prispevkov za razvoj in utemeljitev Muzeja. Ta naloga je torej na drugem mestu, ker, ako ne bi nabrali skupaj stvari in predmetov za Muzej, tudi ne bi potrebovali denarja za ureditev zbirke.

Zato potrebujemo in sicer resno potrebujemo denarne pomoči za ureditev in pripravo prejetih stvari za razkazovanje javnosti, za nabavo opreme Muzeja in nekaj malega za pisarniške potrebščine.

Tretji problem pa je za sedaj: primerna dvorana za Slovenski muzej, kjer se bodo čimprej mogoče pripravile zbrane stvari za ogled javnosti. Sedaj muzej namreč še ni odprt javnosti.

Nadaljne korake, določitev prostora za Muzej za nekaj prihodnjih let bo gotovo podzvel direktorij S. N. Doma, ko pride čas za to. Slovenski narodni muzej je bil ustanovljen na delniški seji S. N. Doma 12. januarja, 1939, in je pod direktnim nadzorstvom direktorija, sestojega iz 21 oseb.

Vodstvo Slovenskega narodnega muzeja se je že pismenim putem obrnilo na večjih slovenskih bratskih podpornih organizacij v Ameriki, nekatere pa pridejo v najkrajšem času na

vrato, v prvi vrsti za prispevek zgodovinskih predmetov in pa stvari za v Muzej, v drugi vrsti pa tudi za finančno pomoč, če je mogoče tej ali oni organizaciji nekoliko pomagati, da se Muzej izvede in odpre čimprej mogoče.

Slovensko dramsko društvo Ivan Cankar v Clevelandu, eno najaktivnejših slovenskih dramskihih društev v Ameriki, ki obstoja že nad 20 let in ki je podalo v tem času nad 150 različnih iger na oder, je prvo, ki je sklenilo pokloniti predstavo v korist Slovenskega narodnega muzeja v Clevelandu.

Za tajzreden dogodek je bila izbrana tudi izredna, popolnoma nova igra "Naši domači-tujci", v treh dejanjih, katero je spisal Andrej Kobal in katere pozorišče je Cleveland in Madison, Ohio. Igro režira Mr. Vatro J. Grill.

Igra kaže naše družinske odnose med otroci in starši, ki so si v mnogih primerah tuji, ker eden drugega ne razumejo dobro. Starši ne znajo dovolj angleško, da bi se uživali v ameriško življenje, ki je otrokom lastno, in otroci ne znajo dovolj slovensko, da bi zapopadli običaje roditeljev.
