RUSI NAPADLI FINSKO

HELSINKI, Finska, 30. nov. —Po znanem zgledu Nemčije je tudi Rusija pretrgala zvezo ali nenapadno pogodbo, in sicer s Finsko. Danes se je nad tem glavnim mestom Finske pojavilo številno ruskih letalcev, ki so metali bombe na mesto, kar je povzročilo požar in nepopisen strah med meščani. Pri tem je bilo ubitih nad 200 oseb, polovica mesta je v razvalinah. Vzrok tega napada je, ker Finci niso hoteli umakniti svojih čet 12 milj od svoje meje. Zaeno je začela Rusija z bojnimi ladjami in vojaštvom oblegati in obstreljevati Finsko na celi obmejni črti v razdalji 600 milj. Finska republika šteje 3,800,000 prebivalstva in ima v mirnem času 29,300 mož vojaštva, v vojni pa 200,000, med tem, ko šteje Rusija 180 milijonov prebivalstva in več milijonov vojaštva. HELSINKI, Finska, 5. dec. —Finska vlada se je preselila v neko drugo mesto, kajti tri petine prebivalstva je že izbežalo iz mesta pred sovražnimi napadi Rusov. Finci hrabro odbijajo napade na suhem in na morju; dosedaj je bilo že 64 ruskih letal izstreljenih bližju Mormanska in ubitih nad 2,000 ruskih vojakov.

But others have declared that their sons should die in a mad attempt to conquer... to conquer what? No one knows especially the son who lies shattered to death in a shell hole somewhere in France.

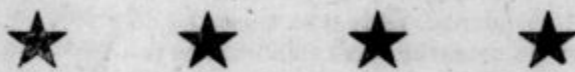

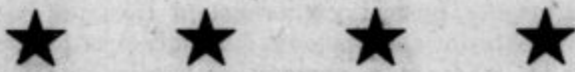

OUR PAGE COOKING SCHOOL

By FRANCES JANCER

If you are thinking of a small gift for a casual friend, nothing is better than a box of home-made cookies or candy. Believe it or not they are appreciated, too. Therefore, a variety of different recipes for cookies and candy will appear from now until the Yule season has passed away.

Date Almond Cookies

1/2 cup shortening, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, 5 drops almond extract, 1 1/2 cups sifted flour, 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 cup chopped almonds, 1 cup sliced dates.

Blend together the shortening and sugar and unbeaten egg. Mix the finely cut dates and almonds with the dry ingredients and stir into the first mixture. Shape the dough into a roll about two inches in diameter. Chill thoroughly. Cut with sharp knife into thin slices and place on a greased cookie sheet. Bake in a moderate oven ten to fifteen minutes until lightly browned.

Date Crunches

1 1/2 cups (1 can) Eagle Brand Sweetened Condensed Milk, 1/2 pound graham crackers, 1/2 pound pitted dates (1 cup), 1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Thoroughly blend together milk, graham cracker crumbs, chopped dates and cinnamon. Drop by spoonfuls onto buttered baking sheet. Bake 15 minutes in moderately hot oven. Makes 3 dozen.

Sweet Rocks

1 1/2 pounds English walnuts, 3/4 pound dates, 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar, 1 cup butter, 3 eggs (whites and yolks beaten separately), 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon allspice, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 3 cups flour, 2 tablespoons molasses.

Cream butter and sugar. Add yolks of eggs and mix. Add spices, soda, molasses, nut and dates. Mix again. Then mix in whites of eggs and last of all the flour. Drop from teaspoon on greased pans. Set well apart as dough spreads while baking. Bake in medium hot oven 20 minutes. Can be kept for months in closed jar.

Coconut Macaroons

5 tablespoons sugar, 2 egg whites, stiffly beaten, 3/4 cup chopped coconut, 1/4 teaspoon almond extract.

Beat sugar into egg whites and continue beating until mixture stiffens again. Beat in coconut and almond extract. Beat for at least 15 minutes. Drop by teaspoons on waxed paper or baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven 20 minutes, or until done. Cool slightly, dash cold water on under side of paper on which macaroons were baked. Remove macaroons with a spatula. Makes 18.

Date Cake

1/2 pound dates, 1/2 cup butter or margarine, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 cup boiling water, 1/2 cup walnuts, 1 to 1 1/2 cups flour, 1 egg, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Mix two sections separately and combine. Use 1 to 1 1/2 cups flour as necessary. Flours differ in texture, so you may need to experiment a little. However, I think it would be safe to use 1 1/2 cups of fine cake flour or if you use all purpose flour, cut the amount to 1 cup. Bake in a shallow pan in a moderate oven.
