

of the grim determination to fight to the death against our common enemy until victory is won.

Hitler too heard that Slavs were uniting and he was worried. There are 15,000,000 of them in America alone, and more than 300 million across the seas. More than 50 per cent of America's mass production workers are Slavs. Not a hair-pin, not a tire, not a tank is made without Slav sweat and muscle. It's a factor that the Axis might well reckon with. Hitler knows it. He tried to spread lies in a short wave radio broadcast about the Slav Congress, lies to keep us divided.

Yugoslav Chetniks heard about the Congress too and they sent greetings to American Slavs by short wave from the hills of Yugoslavia where they are daily defying Hitler and his murderous gangs.

Delegates to the American Slav Congress pledged to buy war bonds and stamps with at least 10 per cent of their wages to help pay for the weapons which will guarantee freedom for America and liberation for their Slav brothers and sisters in Europe. They pledged to conduct ever-vigilant war against the defeatists and fifth columnists in America who disrupt our war effort. They pledged to raise money for war relief for Poland, Yugoslavia, Czechoslovakia, and particularly for the heroic Russian people, upon whose brave army, in the words of our great general McArthur "rests the hope of civilization."

The Slav Congress voted to dedicate Sunday, June 21st to patriotic demonstrations of loyalty to America, to greater unification of Slavs, together with all other Americans, that victory may come in 1942, because the sooner America and the United Nations take the offensive against Hitler and his partners, the sooner he is caught in a pincers move between the Russian front and a second front in the West, the less blood will have to flow and the sooner there will be peace.

Because unified Slavs spell doom to Hitlerism, we must all forget our past quarrels and differences. The hours is too grave, our common enemy too powerful. He succeeded in the past so well only because he managed to divide us.

The Mayor of Cleveland, Frank J. Lausche, has proclaimed June 21st the American Slav Day to promote greater unity among Slavs in their contribution to America's war effort. He urged in the proclamation all citizens of the City of Cleveland to participate in the Parade. Mayors of Detroit, Chicago, Pittsburgh and other major Slav centers have done the same and similar demonstrations are scheduled to be held in all these cities.

In the name of unity for victory we now call upon every Slav organization to join in the "Win the War" Parade Sunday, June 21st. The Parade will start promptly at 12:30 p. m. at Euclid Avenue and East 21st Street and will march down to Public Square where Mayor Lausche and a speaker from Washington will address the meeting briefly. After this meeting everyone will go to the Sokol Gardens at 4314 Clark Ave. to join with the Czechoslovak "Dan Odboja" in celebration.

We call upon every other citizen of this community to join in this demonstration with costumes, bands, banners and floats to march for victory of

America. Patriotic organizations, labor unions, Red Cross, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars—all will take their place in this patriotic demonstration. In this "Win the War" Parade Sunday, June 21st we shall proudly say to the Axis: Slavs stand shoulder to shoulder, together with other Americans. Every blow of the hammers they wield in America's war industries is a blow against the Axis. Every cent they spend for war bonds and stamps helps to buy bullets for our enemies. Our unity on the production line and on the home front is our answer to Hitler. We have learned to work together. All of us are in the front lines for the duration. We shall take the war to the enemy. We have learned to forget our past quarrels. We have learned that only through unity of Poles, Russians, Yugoslavs, Czechoslovaks, only in unity with all freedom-loving peoples can victory be achieved. We say to Hitler: we are determined to smash your might, just as our brave brothers and sisters in Europe are determined. You will see this in our "Win the War" Parade on June 21st and you will tremble in the sight of our united might.

I want to introduce now several leading representatives of the United Slav Committee who will say a few words in their native language. Mr. George Tenesy will speak in Slovak; Mr. Charles Hronek in Czech; Mr. Vatro Grill in Slovene; Mr. John Pawlek in Polish; Mr. Harry Lubeshkoff in Russian, and Mr. Michael Marinkovich in Serb, addressing themselves to all Slavs of Cleveland. ## "THE EAGLE OF JUGOSLAVIA"

"He clasps the crag with crooked hands . . . he watches from his mountain walls, and like a thunderbolt he falls."

With these words, written of an eagle, Time Magazine, in its issue of May 25th, 1942, glorifies the exploits of Famous Yugoslav General Draja Mihailovich, who with his band of over 150,000 Chetniks in the mountains southwest of Belgrade has denounced as a lie Hitler's statement of a year ago that Yugoslavia was conquered.

Besides devoting its front page cover to General Mihailovich, Time Magazine carries a two-page story covering the exploits of this famous general and his people in their battle against Hitler's Nazis for the freedom and liberation of Yugoslavia.

So much has been written of General Mihailovich and his world reknown band of guerrilla Chetniks that he can well be likened to America's General McArthur. His exploits will live in legend as long as World War II is remembered.

Highlights of Mihailovich's campaign against Hitler as outlined by Time Magazine are listed.

Last fall Mihailovich kept as many as seven Nazi divisions chasing him through his Sumadija mountains.

Mihailovich's swarming raiders have preserved an "Island of Freedom" which for a time was 20,000 square miles in area, with a population of 4,000,000.

Mihailovich's annihilation of Axis detachments, bombing of roads and bridges, breaking of

homeland and is trying to destroy our culture. Slovaks remember his murders. Hitler will never defeat us. We shall march in the Parade June 21st to speed the day of his destruction and liberation of our kin across the seas.

Hronek—The Czechs in Europe are sabotaging Hitler's war industries. He is killing them, defaming them, raping them. We know this. We shall march in the Parade June 21st and send him our undying declaration to fight with our European brothers until the day of victory.

Grill—Slovenes face practical extermination at Hitler's hands in Europe. They are resisting dauntlessly. We shall remember his crimes when we march in the "Win the War" parade June 21st and shall send Hitler our undying word of hatred.

Lubeshkoff—The Russians, Ukrainians and Carpatho Russians have earned the respect of the entire world by their courageous stand against Hitler's hordes. They will never surrender. We shall march June 21st in the parade to tell Hitler that in America too we will show him no quarter.

Pawlak—Every Pole knows what Hitler did to their homeland. The Polish Army is fighting him, they will never quit fighting until their homeland is free. We shall march in the parade June 21st together with our brother Slavs and other Americans, united to help spend the day of Hitler's doom.

Marinkovich—The Serbs, Croats and Slovenes have vowed never to lay down their arms until Hitlerism is wiped out. The Yugoslav Chetniks, in their defiance of Hitler, daily perform feats of heroism in battle against our common enemy. We shall march in the parade June 21st to send Chetniks our greetings in one united voice with brother Slavs and Americans, and a vow of hatred to Hitler.

Lewandowski—June 21st, on American Slav Day, we shall march in unity, Americans all, that our beloved country—America—may remain free and the world may be liberated from the Hitler scourge.

communications and stealing the ammunition have been so widespread that the Nazis had to declare a new state of war in their "conquered" territory.

Last October the Nazis even asked for peace. When Mihailovich refused, they priced his head at \$1,000,000.

When the Nazis desperately needed troops in Russia, they tried to leave Mihailovich to the forces of their Axis partners and stooges. But Italian, Bulgarian and Rumanian soldiers could not deal with him, and the Nazis went back. Only last week the Russians announced that a Nazi division had arrived at Kharkov fresh from Yugoslavia—where it had certainly not been stationed for a rest.

Mihailovich's example has kept all Yugoslavia in a wild

anti-Axis ferment. The Axis has resorted to executing untold thousands, but the revolt continues. Last month the Nazis said they had seized Mihailovich's wife, two sons and daughter, threatened to execute all relatives of Mihailovich's army and 16,000 hostages if the General did not surrender within five days. He did not.

Mihailovich's only direct contact with the democracies of the world has been through smugglers and a mobile radio transmitter which he concealed somewhere in the mountain fastnesses.

Even so, he has already become a great symbol of unknown thousands of supposedly conquered Europeans who still resist Adolph Hitler, and also of many American-Yugoslavs who rejoiced at his successful defiance against Nazi Legions who have terrorized and killed untold numbers of Yugoslavs, among them many of their own relatives and friends.

Mihailovich was born 47 years ago in Chachak, Serbia, in the craggy lands which he now clasps. His parents died and he was raised by an uncle, a musical Serbian Colonel. Draja Mihailovich plays the mandolin excellently. He entered Belgrade's Serbian Military Academy at 15, has been a lifelong soldier, an officer who received his training under fire.

Tales about Mihailovich, apocryphal or smuggled out of his mountains, abound in Yugoslav circles. It is said that he has done some of his own espionage, eating with German officers in a tavern where the host, devoted to him, was panicky with fright. Nazi officers are said to have driven up to a farmhouse where Mihailovich and friends were staying. When he had convinced the Nazis of his innocence, one of his friends remarked: "That was a close one." Mihailovich replied: "It was close for them, too." He pointed to a bush behind which a guerrilla machine-gun crew had been ready for the Nazis. The General is also rumored to have done a brisk trade exchanging Italian prisoners for Italian gasoline at the rate of one Italian private for one can of gas, one colonel for 50 cans.

Today Draja Mihailovich seems legendary, but he is a legend with a big basis in fact: the fact that he has kept from five to ten Nazi divisions at a time fighting to conquer the country which they destroyed twelve long months ago.

American - Yugoslavs are proud of Mihailovich and his band of 150,000 and more fighting Chetniks and like MacArthur, General Draja Mihailovich will inspire Americans in the fight against the Axis which will not end until the enemy is beaten into complete submission.

# June 21 to Be Slav Day in Cleveland and Other Large American Cities

(The following is the text of a radio speech on Friday, May 29, by Councilman John Lewandowski in connection with the celebration of Slav Day.)

Fellow Americans: I greet you in the name of American Slavs who comprise practically one-third of the population of Cleveland.

A great historic event will take place in this community on Sunday, June 21st. For the first time in the history of Cleveland all Americans of Slav descent, the Poles, Russians, Czechs, Slovaks, Croats, Slovenes, Serbs, Ukrainians, Carpatho Russians, Bulgarians, Macedonians, together with other nationalities, will march down Euclid Avenue to Public Square in a "Win the War" Parade.

Never before in the history of America has there been such unity of purpose and action. Why is this? The answer comes daily in brief accounts of torture and murder being committed by Hitler agents throughout the continent of Europe—torture, death and rape by a monster who has now turned against not only the Slav nations of Europe but against the entire civilized world and our own country.

American Slav are uniting as never before to destroy this monster of Nazism. They will demonstrate this unity in the

Parade and meeting on June 21st. This unity was achieved in the American Slav Congress held in Detroit, April 25-26, where 2,500 delegates, from all Slav nationalities, from trade unions, churches, cultural and fraternal organizations came together to pledge their loyalty to America and their indomitable will to produce for an offensive against our common enemy, Hitler and the Axis.

This unity of Slavs at the American Slav Congress in Detroit echoed all over the world. Greetings to the Congress came from our great President, F. D. Roosevelt, from all major Slav organizations in America, from eight international unions, from South America, Canada, Australia, the Soviet Union, from members of the Yugoslav government in Kuibishev, from Slav seamen who were even then delivering war materials to the fighting fronts of the United Nations—all of them speaking

## "The Slovenes Want to Live"

"The Slovenes Want to Live" is the title of a 48-page pamphlet published by the Yugoslav Information Center in New York. Its author is Joseph Clissold, former attache at the British consulate in Zagreb, Yugoslavia.

The booklet is divided into eight compactly written chapters in which the author tells, who the Slovenes are, what territory they originally inhabited, when they settled on lands occupied by them today, how they suffered and what they accomplished in their long history; how they were first partitioned after the first World War, and what tortures are being inflicted upon them by their German and Italian conquerors today. The text is accompanied by several diagrams, maps and photographs.


It is an excellent little handbook and should be widely read by the second generation Slovenes and the American public at large.

## Telenews Theatre

Pictorial exposition of the strength of Free China and of her value to the United Nations as a "western front" is the theme of "China Under Fire" a documentary film which arrived at the Telenews Theatre Friday. The picture opened with panoramic shots of America's effort as the "Arsenal of Democracy" to supply the western nations with war material prior to this country's entrance into the war. America, at that time, "forgot her Western Front," as the sound narration tells.

Of timely interest in "China Under Fire" are scenes of China's armies in the field; her aviators in training; her industrial workers in factories which were carried 1,500 miles into the interior; the bombing and burning of Chungking, Free China's wartime capital. Close-ups of Generalissimo and Mme. Chiang Kai-shek complete the film, which is a dramatic exhibition of China's past accomplishments and growing might.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 1.—Henry Morgenthau, Jr., Secretary of the Treasury, today made known June War Bond quotas for the 3,070 counties in the nation to all State and County War Savings Staffs.

The county quotas, based upon a substantial increase over May quotas, are expected to reach ten per cent of income when the nation goes on a billion-dollar-a-month War Bond basis in July to help meet the war cost. "Everybody, every pay day, ten per cent," is the battle cry throughout the country. You can buy War Bonds at your Bank, Building & Loan Association, Post Office and at many department stores.
