Anglija skuša ustaviti Hitlerjev pohod proti vzhodu

## RUMUNIJA ODLOŽI LA PODPIS PAKTA

London, 21. marca. — Premier Neville Chamberlain je pooblastil zunanjega ministra, naj v pojasi vladno politiko proti nemški Nemčiji zdaj, ko je Hitler anektil Češkoslovaško, stičasno je londonski tisk napisal, da skuša angleška diplomacija ustaviti enotno fronto proti Nemčiji, da ustavi Hitlerjev pohod proti vzhodu, a se ne bi polastil bogatega jinega polja v Rumuniji.

Velika Britanija, Francija in Sovjetska Rusija so v ospredju izbrana, ki naj bi rezultirati v stanovitvi enotne fronte in sklici mednarodne konference, kateri naj bi sledila vojaška potovanja med Rusijo, Veliko Britanijo in Francijo.

Chamberlain je včeraj odgovoril na vprašanja poslancev v parlamentu in pohovno izjavil, da njegova vlada smatra Hitlerjevo okupacijo Češkoslovaške in nelegalno in kršenje monarškega dogovora. Zunanji minister Halifax je podal alicenco v zbornici lordov.

Laboristska opozicija je zahtevala takojšnjo ustavitev pošiljanja surovega materiala v Nemčijo in izjavo, da se bo to zgodilo. Chamberlain je dejal, da je upošteval zahtevo in obljubil.

Bukarešta, Rumunija, 21. marca. — Revizija zunanjega politike se obeta kot posledica namnila, da bo Velika Britanija sodelovala trgovinsko misijo v Rumunijo in kupovala več rumunskega blaga. Naznani je bilo avdušeno sprejetje v Bukarešti, obenem pa je ustvarilo možnost, da bo Rumunija sledila demokratičnim državam, ne fašističnim.

Naznani iz Londona je prišlo po sklenitvi trgovinskega paktu med Rumunijo in Nemčijo in to je bilo vzrok, da je Rumunija odgovila podpis paktu. Rumunski vladni krogi, ki so se zadnjih tednih borili proti nemški ekonomski dominaciji, so takoj izjavili, da se je situacija spremenila.

## Japonska ofenziva pri Hangčou

Sanghaj, 21. marca. — Japanski čete so v novi ofenzivi pri Hangčou, kjer se odpira pot v province Cekiang. Vojne operacije so v teku na več milij dolgoravnini v Japonci se pripravljajo na napad na Kinhu, glavni stanovske obrambne sile na južnih strani reke Jangtse.

## Protižidovska stranka poražena pri volitvah

Curh, Švica, 21. marca. — Protizidovska stranka je bila poražena pri mestnih volitvah v Curihu, kjer Nemci tvorijo večino prebivalcev. Izgubila je šest sedežev v mestnem svetu.

Denver, Colo. — Krajevna United Packing House Workers (CIO) je zmagala pri volitvah in s tem postal predstavnik vseh delavcev, ki so uveljni v klavnicni Armour & Co.

## Ruska špiona obsojena v zaporu

### Plačati morata tudi denarno kaznen

Los Angeles, Cal., 21. marca. — Dva ruska špiona, ki sta bila na obravnavi spoznana za krivo, da so bila včeraj obsojena v zaporu in pascetev denarni kazni. Obsobo je izrekel federalni sodnik Ralph E. Jenney, ki je dejal, da bi oba odsodili v smrt, če bi bila vodila špionazo v vojnem času.

Mihaj Gorin, upravitelj ruske turistične agencije na zapanju, je bil obsojen na šest let zapora in plačitev kazni \$10,000. Hafis Salic, rojen v Rusiji, ki pa je postal ameriški državljan, je dobil štiri leta zapora in plačati mora kaznen \$10,000. Na obravnavi je bila predložena evdence, da sta ukradla tajne dokumente iz shramb mornarične deparmenta in jih poslala v Rusijo.

Sodnik je očetel Gorina, ker je zlorabil ameriško gostoljubnost in izjavil, da bo po prestapi kazni deportiran v Rusijo kot nezaželen tujec. Gorinova žena, ki je bila tudi obtožena špionaze, je bila na obravnavi oproščena.

Protest proti komunistični 'čistki'

### Izjava načelnika sovjetske propagande

Moskva, 21. marca. — Andrej Aleksandrovič Ždanov, načelnik biroja sovjetske propagande, je včeraj na kongresu vseruske komunistične stranke zahteval ustavitev masnih izključeval članov komunistične stranke. Pred delegati je izjavil, da je čas prišel, ko je treba zavreči biologično stališče napram članom in jih soditi le po zasluzenu kot posameznike.

"Maršikateri dober komunista je prišel v nemilost ne zaradi svojih činov, marveč zaradi svojih sorodnikov," je rekel Ždanov. "To po končni analizi pomeni, da predniki lahko uničijo kariero svojih potomev po več generacijah. Tako stališče nima nesnar skupnega z marksizmom."

Praga, 21. marca. — Protizemita kampanja je v teku v Slovakinji, Češki in Moraviji. Pričela se je s konfiskacijo židovskih avtomobilov in zahtevami, da morajo židje dati posojilo.

Avtomobile je zasegel generalni štab slovaških gardistov. Praški List, ki vodi protizemito agitacijo, je prišel na dan zahteva, da morajo židje plačati odškodnino \$300,000, "ker so ropli Čehe zadnjih dvajset let. Živelj so razkošno, dočim so morali Čehi stradati."

Autoritete v Moraviji in na Češkem so prepovedale transferiranje židovskih podjetij v druge roke. Tajna policija je istočasno informirala konzule, da ne bo izdajala dovoljeni židom, ki se hočejo izseliti. Izjemne veljavje je za žensake in otroke.

Ceški vojaki se vračajo iz Slovakinje v Prago brez orožja. Vsi vojaki, ki so bili postani v Slovakinje, se bodo vrnili domov ter teden.

## AMERIKA OBSOILA NACIJSKO OKUPACIJU ČEŠKE

### Razprava o amendiranju neutralnostnega zakona

### POSLANIK CARR POZVAN DOMOV

Washington, D. C., 21. marca. — Ameriška vlada je v ostri noti nacijski Nemčiji obsodila Hitlerjevo okupacijo Češkoslovaške in izjavila, da ne bo priznala roba. Nota je bila odgovor na nemško noto, ki je bila poslana v Washington zadnjih petek in je vsebovala naznanilo, da je Hitler razglasil "protektorat" nad Češko in Moravijo.

Vsebina ameriške note bo objavljena danes. Besedilo je v skladu z deklaracijo državnega podtajnika Wellesa, v kateri je oglasil unileenje svobodčin neodvisnega in svobodnega češkega ljudstva po nacijski Nemčiji in nepostavne čine oborožene pesti. Welles je včeraj naznani, da je bil Wilbur J. Carr, ameriški poslanik v Pragi, pozvan domov k posvetovanju. Poslaniške posle je prevzel ameriški konzul v Pragi.

Prelog glede amendiranja neutralnostnega zakona tako,

da bo predsednik Roosevelt zavzel določeno stališče v slučaju izbruhova vojne v Evropi, je izvral viharno debato v senatu. Rooseveltovi pristaši so se revizijo zakona prilagodili Angliji in Franciji, da bosta lahko dobivali orožje in bojni material iz Amerike, ako se bosta zapletli v vojno s fašističnimi državami.

Amendment je uključen v načrtu, katerega je predložil senator Key Pittman, načelnik senatnega odseka za zunanje zadeve. Senator Clark je argumentiral proti amendiranju zakona, ker bi Anglija in Francija lahko dobivali bojni material iz Amerike in to bi bila v bistvu vojaška zveza, ki bi potegnila Ameriko v evropski konflikt.

"Govorimo o potrebi pomoči evropskim demokracijam, kar je nesmiselno," je rekel Clark. "Francoski parlament je dal diktatorsko oblast premierju Daladierju in zdaj ne moremo več izbirati med demokracijami in diktaturami. Izbira je le med Daladierjem in Stalinom na eni strani ter Hitlerjem in Mussolinijem na drugi in vsi ti so diktatorji."

Situacija v poljskem koridorju je napeta. Berlin je že posvaril Varšavo pred persekcijo Nemcov v koridorju. Poljska politika asimilacije Nemcov ni uspela, čeprav je Varšava zaprla več nemških šol, konfiscirala lastnino in izgnala nemške paristorje.
