Brief Health Facts

Great progress has been made in the last few decades in the control of diphtheria and smallpox, and more recently of whooping cough. This has been accomplished only through the cooperation of parents who provide the security of immunization for their infants and children. The reduction in the number of cases and deaths from diphtheria and smallpox is spectacular.

In 1920, in Cleveland, there were 1,528 cases of diphtheria as compared with eight in 1949 and there were 134 cases of smallpox as compared with none for the past six years. Vaccination against smallpox is a safe and simple procedure. Children can be protected against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough and other diseases by measures so simple that it would seem criminal to deprive them of the protection. Take your child to the family doctor for vaccination and immunization, or if the services of a private physician cannot be secured, to a Division of Health Child Welfare Clinic. Call the Newton D. Baker Health Center, UT 1-2000 for information about immunization services.
