At this time we would like to call attention of all teams that the entries must be in by midnight of Feb. 10. Former KSKJ President, Pioneer in Fraternal Field, Dies in Ely, Minnesota

Ely, Minn.—This locality mourns the loss of one of the foremost pioneers in the Slovenian fraternal field, a former president of the KSKJ, Joseph Agnich who was past 82 years of age on January 15, the time of his death.

Born in Rožic vrhu pri Crnomlju April 1855, he spent his early days in Jugoslavia. At the age of 35 years he came to America and settled in Calumet, Mich., in 1880 where he remained four years before going to the Minnesota Range towns. He was one of the first settlers in the city of Ely, Minn.

The deceased was the first president of the JSKJ when that organization was founded in 1898. In July of the same year he was elected president of the KSKJ at the Fifth General Convention, and held the presidency until Aug. 16 when he resigned to hold only one supreme office. Two years later, when the KSKJ was incorporated, he was elected to the supreme secretaryship.

He is survived by the widow, Mary; sons, Joseph, Stephen, Math and Jacob; daughters, Anna and Margaret; brother Stephen, all of Ely, Minn.
