ANGLIJA HOČE SPORAZUM Z ITALIJO IN NEMČIJO

Stiri velesile naj bi ščitile mir v Evropi

CHAMBERLAIN POBJA OČITKE

London, 22. februar. — Ministrski predsednik Neville Chamberlain je, kakor vse kaže, uspel s svojo potezo, da je treba prijeti Hitlerju in Mussoliniju z rokavicami, ne z želesno pestjo. Preizkušnja, ki bo pokazala, ali parlament odobrava stališče ministrskega predsednika Chamberlaina, ki je potisnil zunanjega ministra Edena iz kabineta, ker je slednji odločno nastopal proti diktatorskim državam, bo prišla danes, ko bo dan predlog glede nezaupnice na glasovanje. Premier je gotov, da bo njegova vladu dovolj glasov in da bo nasprotniki njegove politike poraženi.

Voditelji močne konservativne stranke so imeli sinoč sejo in obljubili, da bodo podprli premierja. Liberalna stranka, ki ima v parlamentu 33 sedežev, jim bo sledila. Če ne bo prišlo do razkola med törji, bo dobil Chamberlain 416 glasov. Računati je treba z opozicijo laboritske stranke, drugo glavno stranko v parlamentu, toda ta razpolaga samo s 199 glasovi.

Chamberlain je odprto povedal v parlamentu, da se bo njegova vladu pričela pogajati z Italijo v svetu sklenitve sporazuma. Dejal je, da je naklonjen takemu sporazumu, "splošnemu pomirjenju Evrope." Angleški poslanik v Rimu je že dobil instrukcije, da se doseže ta cilj. Premier je predragal sklenitev mirovnega pakta med Anglijo, Francijo, Italijo in Nemčijo, ki naj bi odvrnil nevarnost vojne v Evropi. "Mir v Evropi zavisi od stališča štirih velesil — Anglije, Francije, Nemčije in Italije", je dejal Chamberlain. "Ako se bodo te države sporazumele, bo zaščiten mir v Evropi."

Spor med Chamberlainom in Edenom je izvral demonstracije v prilog slednjemu. Vmožica petstotnih se ohrabrala pred parlamentom in kričala: "Chamberlain mora iti!" in "Mi hočemo Edena!" Policija je razgnala demonstrante, toda ti so potem razpečevali letalek z zahtevo, da mora Chamberlain resignirati, vladu mora biti razpuščena in Anglia naj se združi s Sovjetskim uniom, da skupno vodita borbo proti diktatorjem.

Eden je v svojem govoru v parlamentu dejal, da je bil glavni vzrok njegove resignacije odpor proti razgovoru z Italijo o reševanju različnih problemov, ker ni hotel Mussoliniju odpoklicati svojih čet iz Španije in ustaviti protiangleško propagando na Blížnjem vzhodu. "Dogovori, ki so nekaj vredni, ne smejo sloniti na grožnjah", je dejal Eden. "Jaz ne verjamem, da je pomirjenje Evrope mogoče, ako klonimo pod pritiske. Čas je že, da Velika Britanija zavzame odločno stališče."

Clement R. Attlee, vodja laburistske opozicije v parlamentu, je govoril za Chamberlainom. Dejal je, da je angleška vladu kapitulirala pred bankrotom diktatorjem, kar bo imelo resne posledice zlasti v Ameriki.

Chamberlain je v odgovoru pobjjal očitek o kapitulaciji. Laborite je obdožil, da napačno tolmacijo situacijo. Velika Britanija ne more zahtevati važnih koncessij, dokler ne sklene političnih in trgovskih pakтов z drugimi državami. Premier je dalje rekel, da je konferiral z italijanskim poslanikom in da ga je informiral, da je Anglija pripravljena skleniti prijateljski pakt z Mussolinijevo vladom.

Avstrija skuša ohraniti neodvisnost

Voditelji vladne stranke dobili instrukcije

Dunaj, 22. februar. — Schuschniggova vladu je pričela stopati nacija na prste, da ohrani neodvisnost Avstrije. Z odobritvijo Seyss-Inquarta, novega notranjega ministra, je vladu dala zupna navodila distriktnim voditeljem domovinske fronte, vladne stranke, naj pazijo na nacije. Ti morajo biti posvarjeni, da ne smejajo delati, kar hočejo, kajti vladna stranka, ki ima 2,500,000 članov, je še vedno sila, s katero je treba računati.

Naslednje odredbe še nadalje ostanejo v veljavji:

Naciji ne smejajo kričati: "Heil Hitler!" in pozdravljati prijateljev na tak način. Svastike, oficijske znake nacijske stranke, ne smejajo kazati. Izjemno je le, kadar pridejo obiskovalci iz Nemčije. Nošnja nacijskih uniform je prepovedana, kakor tudi prepevanje nacijskih pesmi, kadar tega izrečno ne dovolijo avstrijske autoritete. Govore voditelje nemških nacijskih naščin, da ne smejajo razkrivati po radiju, kako teh ne oddajajo avstrijske radioposte.

FRANCIJA KRITIZIRA STALIŠČE ANGLEŠKE VLADE

Anglija pustila centralne države na cedilu

REORGANIZIRANJE FRANCO-SKE VLADE

Pariz, 22. februar. — Govorce o reorganiziranju francoske vlade se širijo zdaj, ko se Francija povzeti s svojimi prijatelji glede revizije diplomacije, o vprašanju, ki je prišlo na površje zaradi resignacije Edena, angleške zunanjega ministra. Zunanjini minister Yvon Delbos, cigar politika je bila povezana z Edenvovo, bo morda resigniral, ako ne bo kmalu dosežen diplomatski sporazum z Anglijo.

Premier Camille Chautemps se je že posvetoval z nekaterimi ministri glede povečanja števila članov kabinetra, da bo v njem več konservativcev. To vprašanje je bo danes ponovno prišlo na dnevni red.

Delbos je v stalnih stikih s Sovjetsko unijo in Češkoslovaško. Včeraj je imel daljši razgovor s sovjetskim poslanikom v Parizu in reprezentanti češke vlade. Ameriški poslanik William C. Bullitt se je tudi oglasil v uradu francoskega zunanjega ministra, toda detajli razgovora niso bili objavljeni.

Social Legislation

MILWAUKEE, WIS.—Lodge Badgers, SNPJ, went on record to urge passage of the Schellenbach-Allen joint resolution which would provide jobs for every person who is at present unemployed. This is a very important piece of legislation, especially in these trying times with mass lay-offs in private industry and unemployment increasing by leaps and bounds. Although this is not a permanent cure for unemployment in this country, it will at least take care of the present day needs of the unemployed. The only cure for unemployment is production for use, but in order to gain that end the workers in this country will have to unite against reaction. Unity is hard to get because the capitalists devise ways and means to get the workers fighting amongst themselves. The sooner the workers unite to fight capitalism the better.

The present fight in the labor ranks is not doing organized labor any good. Most of the rank and file members in the labor movement want harmony, but it is the top leadership of the A. F. of L. who is responsible, particularly William Green who repeated the cry of the manufacturers in a recent statement, saying, "Leave business alone!" The policy of the A. F. of L. has changed tremendously since the C.I.O. came into existence, and now it seems that the struggle for power in the labor movement is becoming more important than getting the workers better working and living conditions. The practice of chartering company unions as is being done by the A. F. of L. is no credit to the labor movement.

The manufacturers are opposed to industrial unionism and the C.I.O. because it is educating the workers towards class consciousness. It seems that there is a lot of pressure being put on Secretary of Labor Perkins to deport Harry Bridges, militant Maritime Union leader on the west coast. If Bridges is deported it will mean a setback for the workers on the west coast. If they succeed in deporting Bridges, who will be next to either be deported or sentenced to a living death such as labor's martyr, Tom Mooney? If the workers allow such tactics Fascism, the enemy of true democracy, will gain a stronger foothold in the United States.

Isn't it time we began to think of social change, of public ownership of mass industries that are really social in character, of reorganizing our thinking and mode of life in line with the machine age? Let's bring our thinking up-to-date, away from the rugged individualistic type that belongs to the handicraft age, not to the machine age.

Our Juvenile Program

CLEVELAND, O.—It seemed of particular significance, insofar as the Juvenile Campaign is concerned, that last week's issue of this page carried two articles, one containing excerpts of reports on vital statistics in the SNPJ and an editorial regarding the juvenile campaign. Two facts stand out: first, that the editor, speaking for the administrative officers, frankly admits that the latter are at a loss to know what to do with the Juveniles once they are in the society; secondly, we know for the first time the extent of the juvenile membership and its distribution according to sex. These statistics would be of still greater value in planning programs if they furnished a distribution according to age groupings and according to localities in which juveniles are most concentrated.

Without meaning any offense, the writer wonders if anyone interested in planning programs of this kind for our organization has visited settlement houses located in our larger centers of population and has observed the character of juvenile groups at play, under-controlled conditions and in situations which would be similar to what we are contemplating; if anyone has observed their interests and provisions for these, the practical aspects of work with children on a large scale, and the extent to which it is possible to influence their thought and behavior in the way in which we envision. The writer is well aware of the work that has been done in Pennsylvania and in Chicago and Cleveland, but it seems to him that there are yet other things which might be learned in connection with our proposed plans.

In announcing the proposed establishment of Circles for the juveniles the editor has a good principle in that "the initiative for such groups must come from the children themselves and not from adults delegated for this matter"; but in posing the question that children from the ages of six to thirteen or fourteen will be sufficiently interested, and in large numbers, to read about and to become actively interested in the Circles without some prodding by parents and follow up work seems a difficult and somewhat futile way in which to formulate these juvenile nuclei. There is the danger also that the children may be prejudiced against the Circles if the latter procedure is followed.

Almost everyone will admit that children as a whole are little interested in reading preferring instead to be active, to be doing things, going places, and seeing and experiencing the world about them. This they do most naturally in the company of their close friends in school and in their immediate neighborhoods. Insofar as we are able to appeal to our juveniles as well as their friends we will be successful.

Some provision must first of all be made to house any kind of permanent programs which the different locals will plan. Then adequate provision should be made to supply games which will be of interest to the juveniles and finally, someone or some group must be interested and self-sacrificing enough to devote time and effort to the prosecution of the task of maintaining an active interest in the Circles. The dignity and the importance of the activity into which we are about to project ourselves is nowhere better expressed than in the following excerpt from

Comments On This and That

KEEPING BUSY WITH JUVENILE CAMPAIGN, THEN REMEMBERING SPAIN

Soon we will slide into spring—and various outdoor activities, but no matter what we plan or do during the approaching spring and summer, the SNPJ juvenile campaign must not be neglected or overlooked.

Month by month as we meet and thrash out numerous problems confronting us within the Society, whether petty local affairs or matters of wider importance, we must not forget that our chief duty this year is to get as many new juveniles into our lodges as is possible in all circumstances.

No other local activity of any kind—athletic or any get-together designed to show off the new spring or summer fashion outfit—should hinder us in this cardinal purpose.

As for methods of getting juveniles, anything old and already tried and any new experiment can be employed—anything honorable, anything short of tricking and deceiving. The SNPJ is big enough and strong enough to afford an honest campaign.

And, after all, you really do not need to be untruthful. You can say, with perfect confidence, to any father and mother of the prospects that the SNPJ offers the best insurance for the children; you can tell them that our Society gives the children the Educational policy for less payments than any insurance company in the country—and you will tell no falsehood.

Along with this thought we might consider another. Miss Byington points out that our immigrant parents "have been living here for several decades and are conscious of deepening roots." Further, "they live in communities of their own devising within the setting of the American industrial community as a whole. The danger which arises is that their organizations serve not as a healthy, transition device, but as a compensatory device for escape from American life or as a means for exercising group pressure upon it. . . . There is, nevertheless, evidence of the hunger for greater participation in American community life—for opportunities and for self-expression which will bring recognition not only of the individual but also of his group and of the value of his cultural inheritance."

If we would make our juveniles better members of our Society; if we would aid them to maintain their self-respect, to feel more secure in the knowledge that we are behind them and are willing to help them to make an adjustment in the culture in which they find themselves, and if we would give them an opportunity to gain satisfaction from wholesome activities with other children of their own ages in the activities which they most prefer it seems that we might well consider their results of tried and successful methods of dealing with problems such as those we are planning and almost reluctantly venturing to handle. Women's Round Table

A Study in Psychology

The topic isn't exactly current nor perhaps timely. Still it is one of the most interesting fields of study and an excellent subject in everyday discussion and observation. The motivating force behind this article was the fact that there has been an increased popularity of the subject lately, as quite a number of the new psychology books printed in popular editions have been found on the book market. This all goes to show that the study of psychology is becoming popularized and more and more in demand.

Dale Carnegie's "How to Win Friends" is at the head of the list of best sellers. Daily newspapers carry his columns which are read by thousands. Dorothy Dix is also famous for filling pages with her love-lore advice. Other books and magazines from a dime to a dollar on astrology, physiognomy and phrenology containing false information based merely upon assumptions and not scientific facts collect a large percentage of the public's money.

Psychology, as a science, is the study of human behavior. It is a comparatively new science, but since the time of William James, called the father of psychology, many different theories have been advanced and taught. With the study and experimentation of John B. Watson, early in the 1900's, an entirely new theory known as the behaviorist theory arose.

Up to this time, the study of the subject was dualistic in character, that of the soul and that of the body. Since the soul had never been seen, tested in laboratories or experienced, it was evident that it had no place in scientific research. Since early days medicine men, prophets, soothsayers used fear as a means of subjecting their theories. Later this fear was used to advantage by organizations such as churches, temples, cathedrals in the form of religion. Without element of fear, religion would not survive very long.

With the new version in psychology, a new concept was drawn. That is, it dropped many of the static elements such as consciousness (another word for soul) and introspection and concerned itself with the scientific study of human behaviorism. As most sciences are related, we find that physiology is perhaps the most closely related to psychology.

Psychology has a definite place in the world today. Practical application is found in the testing of intelligence. The first intelligence tests were given in 1904 and since have become revised and standardized. During the World War, army recruits were given tests in order to know in which rank to place them. Since then, the measurement of ability has had a great deal of importance in schools classifying and selecting students and thus dividing them into lower and brighter classes. These tests are also used in the selection of workers in industries, for it is a recognized fact that all occupations need a certain amount of intelligence.

Psychology is a vital asset to the physician who can convince the patient that he is really helping him. In a case where a person is only mentally ill, assurance from the doctor wins confidence and aids greatly in regaining health. The lawyer in his treatment of laws and criminals must know of the motives behind criminal acts before arriving at a fair judgment. Education, salesmanship, and industry are all equally linked with this subject.

That physiology should be so interlinked with psychology can be readily seen. Each individual reacts differently to objects because of the different makeup of his body. Such organs as the sense organs, muscles, glands, nervous system all play an important part in the way the body works. A deficiency in any of these organs would also have an influence in thinking and the makeup of one's system.

We find, therefore, that psychology includes a wide range of subjects and topics ad that much experimentation and accumulation of statistics is necessary before conclusions are drawn. Among some books written by contemporary authors, along the psychological lines, are James Farrell

with 347 delegates, representing 423,447 members; 335 labor unions sent 413 delegates to represent 1,622,231 members. Delegates present were from the American League, Social, Educational and Cultural, Youth, Civic and Political, Chinese and Spanish Aid, Women, Civil Rights and Defense, Unemployed, Religious, Peace, Farm and Cooperatives, Professional, Anti-Fascist Veterans. Foreign representatives were from England, Canada, Cuba and Mexico.

Despite the growing menace of foreign war and domestic tyranny, the mood of the Congress was not of despair but of realistic determination to mobilize the people of America in defense of democracy and peace.

It is in this spirit that the People's Congress after long and earnest deliberation adopted the new program as the concrete expression of its aims. In clear, unmistakable words, it sets forth what the American League proposes to do. It is a platform broad enough for all those who hate war because they love peace and oppose Fascism because they cherish democracy.

The Congress could do no more than lay the foundation, the structure is still to be reared. New forces must be drawn in; broader alliances must be forged; a faster tempo must be set and maintained. These are the mandates given by the People's Congress to the American League for Peace and Democracy. Their fulfillment rests with membership.

Therefore, the American League for Peace and Democracy invites to its membership all organizations (except political parties) and all individuals who desire to—

Protect and extend democratic rights for all sections of the American people;

Keep the United States out of war and help keep war out of the world.

Program of the League for 1938: Organize emergency citizens' committees for labor's rights wherever those rights are attacked either by employers or by public officials. Defeat legislative attempts to compel incorporation of unions and to control or inspect union-finances by governmental or other outside agencies. Press for an anti-lynching law; and measures to guarantee full rights for the Negroes and the foreign born. Oppose vigorously the propaganda of race prejudice and discrimination.

Support the nationalization of the manufacture of arms, ammunition and implements of war, forbidding export except when ordered by Congress, in cases of countries invaded by an aggressor. Promote the people's boycott of Japanese goods. Seek to remove and prevent restrictions on the access of the governments of China and Spain to our markets, applying regulations to purchases and shipments designed to remove the risk of our becoming involved in war.

Demand a foreign policy based on: 1.) The distinction between the aggressors and their victims. 2.) The necessity of denying our economic resources to the warmaking, treaty-breaking aggressors and opening them up to their victims under conditions designed to remove the risk of our being drawn into war. 3.) The necessity of concerted action to quarantine aggressors.

The People's Congress unanimously adopted 48 resolutions. Following are several of the more important resolutions passed: Resolution on the Defense of Labor's rights; resolution that Congress call upon the A. F. of L. and G. I. O. to come to mutually acceptable settlement of their differences; resolution on Fascist Training Camps, Japanese Boycott, Aid to China and Spain; plea for United front to oppose Vigilantes, Unemployment, Political and Labor Prisoners, Tom Mooney, Defense Action in Scottsboro case.

Dues of national organizations affiliated to the League shall range from \$10 to \$100 annually. Organizations having more than 100,000 members shall pay the maximum of \$100. Org. between 50-100 thousand members shall pay \$75. Those having between 10-50,000 members shall pay

THE INCREASE IN LIGHT BILL

CHICAGO.—Our light bill has increased approximately 8.88% or nearly 8.9% in the city of Chicago. The public in general has probably felt the increase, although some of the consumers of light have not.

About six months ago the utility company had decided to increase the voltage from 115 volts to 120 volts. This has reference to the voltage at the sockets, or outlets where appliances can be connected to. This was partly done to increase their reserve capacity in their distribution system.

For example, a 100 watt lamp rated at 115 volts, placed on a 120 volt service, increases the wattage of the lamp to 108.885 watts. It means you are receiving more illumination for the increase of 5 volts, also lamp renewals will be more frequent. At present the utility company furnishes its consumers with 120 volt lamps.

is abolished and is supplanted by the cooperative one. Never was that dictum more forcibly impressed upon us than now. Nine long years of depression—and still worse: no knowledge of its end. Millions willing to work but factories closed because owners cannot profitably run them. A world so rich and bountiful—potentially vastly richer—but millions are poverty-stricken. What's the matter?

I do not propose barricades, bloody revolution, "shoot the capitalists." Emphatically, no. That would be still worse. If we are to get out of this sad mess, we will do it not by feverish emotionalism or revenge, but by clear thinking, reasoning, and understanding—and democratically, too.

Let's build a solid foundation first. Let's enlarge and strengthen our labor unions against the threats of war and fascism, and for general economic and social betterment. Above all, let's pervade the air with the cooperative spirit and engage in the formation and growth of producers' and consumers' cooperatives which will dominate our economic life and whose sole aim will be to serve human wants and needs. The profit system will have to give way to a cooperative one in which things are made to give a fuller life, to enrich our lives, to eliminate drudgery and poverty, in short—to serve humanity.

But more sometime again.
